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4 1 PROCEEDINGS 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good afternoon, 5 everyone. I would like to call the Franklin County 6 Board of Elections regular monthly meeting to order. 7 I'll do the roll call. 8 Kimberly Marinello. 9 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here. 10 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Gregory Haas. 11 BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Here. 12 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Douglas Preisse. 13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here. 14 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And Bradley Sinnott. 15 BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Here. 16 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Mr. Chairman, we have 17 a full contingency of well-abled Board members 18 present. 19 The first item on the agenda would be the 20 approval of the minutes for our April 7th and 21 16th Board meetings. 2.2 BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board 2.3 approve the minutes of the April 7th and 24 April 16th meetings of the Franklin County Board of

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Elections as submitted.
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BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: There is a motion on the floor and it's been properly moved and seconded.

All those in favor, say aye.

(All ayes heard.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Nays?

(No response.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries. I'll pass along that for everybody to sign.

The next item on the agenda is the withdrawal of the Jefferson Township JEDZ. Dana, did you want to add something?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Much like what happened in Perry Township, the Jefferson Township trustees met last week or so and decided that they no longer wanted to keep their JEDZ issue on the ballot. So they submitted all the proper paperwork to us of the resolution that they passed, asking us to remove it from the ballot for May 6th.

So we added that to our list of other candidate withdrawals or issue withdrawals that were included in all the absentee ballots from that point forward and will also appear on all the voting

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1 | machines also on Election Day.
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BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move the Board accept the request of the Jefferson Township Trustees to withdraw the Jefferson Township JEDZ issue, and that no votes cast for the issue will be counted on the May 6th, 2014, Primary Election ballot.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I'll second that, but I have a follow-up question after resolution.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah, I was going to ask if there's a discussion. You've seconded it. Is there discussion?

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I have a question.

Political subdivisions are assigned a certain

percentage of cost of a particular ballot, right?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: In a special election.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Only a special, but not in a primary.

20 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: No.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: That's right.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Okay. All right.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Good question.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Or the general.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Right. I thought a primary --

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: This is a regularly-scheduled primary election that would appear whether the Jefferson Township issue was on the ballot or not. So the subdivision doesn't get charged for that.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: It's been properly moved and seconded.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Anybody want to speak to the issue in the audience? No? Yes? No? Any other questions or comments?

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: I will call the question, Mr. Chairman.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

(All ayes heard.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Opposed, same sign.

18 (No response.)

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DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The motion carries.

The next item on the agenda is the voter registration -- there's two voter registration challenges. They're pretty similar in nature.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Yeah, we had two separate challenges filed by two separate people.

The first was filed by a Mr. Jesse Hathaway against, and I'm going to do my best on this, Ashagere Wube. Mr. Hathaway lives at 3382 Brooke Colony Drive, and challenged Mr. Wube, saying he doesn't live here.

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The second was a challenge filed by

Mr. Nicholas Wallace at 5560 Chesterview Drive in

Galloway, against Mr. Bryan Cochran, purportedly of

the same address with the same reasoning; Mr. Wallace
saying I live at this address and Mr. Cochran does

not.

Staff researched both of these and the suggestion is -- we do have phone numbers and other addresses for both of these challenged voters. Our suggestion to the members of the Board is that the staff try to contact these people to see if they need to update their voter registration address.

Both of them are scheduled, per our requirements in the National Voter Registration Act, to be purged this summer due to inactivity. So our proposal to you all is to have the staff try to contact them to see if there is a means by which they undate their registration and, if not, then let them purge out over the summer.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board

staff attempt contacting Ashagere Wube and Bryan

Cochran to update their voter registration addresses,

and that if the staff is unable to contact them that

these two voters be purged from the list of

registered voters in Franklin County.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

(All ayes heard.)

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DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries.

The next item on the agenda is the Adoption Assistance Reimbursement Program.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: This is something I brought to you at one of the last meetings. The county does — the County Commissioners do have a program that offers adoption assistance reimbursement to county employees in the case of if they adopt a child or not. And I e-mailed all of you the information from the county on this and you also have a copy in front of you today.

It's something I could not find that the Board, in the past, had adopted, and I was bringing it before you today if the Board would consider joining the County Commissioners in this program. I

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think it's a worthy program. We do have an employee that would be able to take advantage of this. So I put it to the Board.
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BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the Franklin County Board of Elections adopt the Board of Commissioners Adoption Assistance Reimbursement Program and allow any qualifying Board employee to participate in the program.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor,

say aye.

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(All ayes heard.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries.

The next item on the agenda would be the remaking of absentee ballots.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: The Absentee

Department is busy taking care of everything for

tomorrow, but we do, as we have had in the past,

prior to the election we are permitted to open and

begin scanning in, not counting, but scanning in

absentee ballots ahead of time. We have come across,

at this point, four absentee paper ballots that have

come in through the mail that do need to be remade.

Per SOS directive, we are not permitted

to remake any of those without Board approval. So we bring to you four ballots today that we ask for you to give authorization for us to have our bipartisan teams go through and remake those.

There's a variety of different reasons for them. They get mangled -- I think all four of these got somewhat mangled in the mail for lack of a more technical term, but we can decipher what we believe the votes were intended to be. So we ask for your approval on allowing staff to go through and remake those ballots as is standard operating procedure.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: All right. I move that the Board authorize the staff to remake four absentee paper ballots and that these remade ballots be tabulated and included in the unofficial canvass on election night.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor,

say aye.

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(All ayes heard.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries.

The next item on the agenda is the

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provisional ballot process. As you know, each year
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     we come before you -- each election cycle we come
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     before you to lay out how we plan to count and verify
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     provisional ballots. Do you need additional
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      information on that?
