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1 PROCEEDINGS 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good afternoon. I 5 would like to call the Franklin County Board of 6 Elections meeting to order. I'll do the roll call. 7 Kimberly Marinello. 8 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here. 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Gregory Haas. 10 BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Here. 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Douglass Preisse. 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And Bradley Sinnott. 14 BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Here. 15 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Mr. Chairman, we have 16 -- everyone's here. We do have a quorum. The first 17 item on the agenda would be the approval of the 18 minutes of the May 5th and May 22nd meetings. 19 BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I move the Board 20 approve the minutes of the May 5th and May 22nd meetings of the Franklin County Board of Elections as 21 2.2 submitted. 2.3 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 24 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

5 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor? 1 (All ayes heard.) 3 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Opposed? (No response.) 5 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries. 6 passing the statement that you all have to sign. 7 The next item on the agenda is the 8 withdrawal of the Jefferson Township Fire Levy. 9 MR. MACKEY: The Jefferson Township 10 trustees passed a resolution rescinding their 11 resolution to place it on the ballot and asked for it 12 to be withdrawn. BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the 13 14 Board accept the request of the Jefferson Township 15 trustees to withdraw the Jefferson Township tax issue 16 from the August 15th, 2014, Special Election. 17 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 18 BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: There is. DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor? 19 2.0 (All ayes heard.) 21 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries. 2.2 The next item on the agenda, we will 2.3 still have a August Special, and for that Special we 24 need to have several locations. Jeff is going to

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explain what we're going to do for the August

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locations that serve voters in Licking Heights Local School District. One of them only has 220 voters. We're asking for permission to relocate them to one of the locations that has significantly more voters, especially in an election that will have only roughly 10 percent turnout which a third of them will vote absentee. So having the place open for 16 voters doesn't seem to be --

MR. MACKEY: There are four of our

MR. MACKEY: It is on the far east side, north of Reynoldsburg, east of Gahanna.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The district bleeds
17 into the county.

MR. MACKEY: Yes. They file it in Licking County.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: So how many polling places are there now?

MR. MACKEY: There are four that service them. We're asking to close the one with the 220 voters and reassign them to one of the three

remaining locations.

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BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: So we're going from four to three. And how will the affected voters know where they're supposed to go to vote?

MR. MACKEY: We will notice them on a mailing, and we'll also notice them on the back side and remind them to go back to their other location for the General Election.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: So you send a postcard and you'll also post something, a sign, at the old location?

MR. MACKEY: I imagine.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Does it make sense to send someone to the old location to direct people?

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We have done that in the past.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Well, not for a Special, but we certainly can. The turnout is going to be, I mean we could send folks, there's about, what, four or five locations that we --

MR. MACKEY: There will be three open.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Three open.

MR. MACKEY: We're just closing the one.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We could have someone

posted out there at the unopen place and we will put signage there as well.

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BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: It will only take one person to do it for a single day.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: You're correct.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Something to consider. In any event, I'll move the Board approve the plan submitted by staff for the relocation of voters for the August 14, 2014, Special Election, in the Licking Heights Local School District.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

(All ayes heard.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries.

The next item on the agenda will be the certification of the May 6th election recount for the Franklin Township Gas Aggregate Issue.

MR. MACKEY: Last Wednesday we performed the audit per the LIDS that we drew in the last meeting and we found no discrepancies between the audit and the official count. The official count was correct. We can certify that.

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Good. I move

that the Board certify the results of the recount conducted on May 28th of the Franklin Township Gas Aggregation Issue as submitted by the staff.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: There is.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

(All ayes heard.)

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DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries.

The next item on the agenda is we need to set the early voting in-person hours for the August 5th Special Election. We are going to have the election at the 1700 Morse Road site. Exactly the specific location at the site, I'm not sure, but we will have a room set up at that site. We also intend to move, begin to move there by July 11th, but I could talk more about that after we do this.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So this -- I see that.

You are saying this early vote -- where will this early vote be?

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: It will be at 1700 Morse Road, beginning July 8th.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So even before we move.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Right. We move on

July 11th. We start moving that Friday July 11th through the whole weekend. We will have to have a — and we've talked to the folks doing the construction and PFM. We will have Dana and all the stuff we need to have one area of that place with an occupancy permit to allow us to use it as an early in-person voting location.

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BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I move the Board set in-person absentee voting hours for the August 5th Special Election for 8:00 to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning July 8th, 2014, and ending August 1st, 2014, and Saturday, August 2nd, 2014, from 8:00 a.m. to noon, at the 1700 Morse Road site.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

(All ayes heard.)

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Now to give you a little more -- we are -- we've been working with PFM and Pizzuti, who is basically, I forgot, they're the project management team for our relocation. We will start getting -- we will -- the scheduled date for us to move is July 11th. They're going to come over here July 10th and do some training on how to move.
