4 1 2 PROCE DINGS 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good morning. I'd 5 like to call the Franklin County Board of Elections meeting to order. I will do the roll call. 6 7 (Roll call taken; D. Priesse absent.) 8 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We have a quorum. 9 Since Doug was not able to make it today, Kim, you 10 are now the chair. The first item on the agenda is Approval 11 12 of the Meetings from several meetings, November 17, 13 November 20, November 24, and December the 1st. 14 MR. HAAS: I move the Board approve the 15 meetings minutes of the November 17, 20, and 16 24 meetings and the December 1 meeting of the 17 Franklin County Board of Elections as submitted. 18 MR. SINNOTT: Second. 19 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor. 20 (Vote taken; motion passed.) 21 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carried. 22 The next item on the agenda is the 23 re-certification of the November 4, 2014, General 24 Election based on the outcome the post-election 25 audit.

1 MR. WALCH: As you all know we have to do 2 in Presidential primaries, Presidential generals, and 3 Gubernatorial general elections, we have to conduct a 4 post-election audit. We did that in accordance with Directive 5 2014-36, and the results of that came up with one 6 7 vote difference with the voting locations we had 8 pulled, and per the directive, if there is any 9 difference, we have to amend our certification in the 10 same way we did the original one, so there was one less vote for John Kasich for Governor. I believe 11 12 that is correct, is the way it netted out. In the 13 end there was one less vote for Governor Kasich. MR. MACKEY: One fewer ballot cast. 14 15 MR. WALCH: So before you, you have the 16 amended results that do take into account the audit 17 to be certified. 18 MR. SINNOTT: That was a mistake of one 19 ballot out of how many audited? 20 MR. MACKEY: About 16,000 ballots 21 audited. 22 MR. SINNOTT: That's not bad. 23 MR. MACKEY: Something like 24 99.95 accuracy rate. 25 MR. WALCH: Which is well within the

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6 margin of error as prescribed to us by the Secretary 1 2 of State's office. 3 MR. SINNOTT: Fair enough. 4 I move that the Board amend and resubmit its certification of the official results of the 5 November 4, 2014, General Election based on the 6 7 outcome of the post-election audit. 8 MS. MARINELLO: Second. 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor. 10 (Vote taken; motion passed.) DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion passes. 11 12 MR. WALCH: This is something I will pass 13 around for the members of the Board to sign. 14 And, Bill, you also sign it, too. This is the certification. 15 16 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The next item on the 17 agenda, Madam Chair, is that we had several employees 18 we feel did an exemplary job for us this past year, 19 one of them being Suzanne Brown, who is sitting to my 20 right in the chair there. 21 We had asked her to step up and take the 22 lead on moving us from the 280 East Broad Street address to the 1700 Morse Road address. We had 23 24 her -- basically putting her in charge of the whole 25 move effort, which wasn't that hard of a task. She

1 got it in her sleep.

2	I digress. What I meant to say, it was a
3	monumental task of moving our operations from Broad
4	Street to here, to 1700 Morse Road. And then if that
5	wasn't enough, we then asked her to have the task of
6	moving our warehouse from Alum Creek to this same
7	location, and she stepped up to the plate.
8	It was a lot of work trying to organize
9	all of our staff, to get all of our stuff moved and
10	get everything in the office. And she also then
11	became our primary contact with the construction
12	company to make sure that all the items in this
13	building were done, and if there were stuff that
14	needed to be done, she was the point person, and
15	she's still doing that because there's a lot of items
16	that still need to be straightened out in this
17	location.
18	As a result of that, we are asking and
19	Dana will talk a little bit about Darlene. For that
20	we are asking to give her a one-time supplemental pay
21	of \$5,000.
22	MR. WALCH: The other employee that we
23	are making the same recommendation for is Darlene
24	Tompkins in our Absentee Department. As you know, we
25	have been without a manager there. We were without a

manager there throughout the 2014 General Election. 1 2 Darlene really stepped up for us and really played 3 the roll of the manager of that department through 4 the 2014 election, took care of all the reporting 5 that we have to do to the Secretary of State's office throughout the election, and our recommendation on 6 7 this one -- for both of them, really, is Suzanne 8 taking on the specific project, which she did 9 extremely well, Darlene really working out of the scope for what her normal duties are and really just 10 picking the ball up and running with it, we felt both 11 12 of these employees were extremely worthy of 13 recognition for that. In Absentee, Darlene really 14 picked the ball up and ran with it and did a great 15 job for us. We feel they are both deserving of some 16 recognition. 17 MS. MARINELLO: Absolutely. 18 MR. SINNOTT: Bill, we are voting for 19 both the bonus and the amount. 20 MR. WALCH: Yes. 21 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yes. 22 MR. SINNOTT: Tim, we are confident we 23 can do that. 24 MR. LECKLIDER: Yes. 25 MS. MARINELLO: I move that the Board

authorize the Director and Deputy Director to provide 1 2 a one-time supplemental payment of \$5,000 for Suzanne 3 Brown and Darlene Tompkins for their exemplary work 4 during 2014. 5 MR. HAAS: Second. DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor. 6 7 (Vote taken; motion passed.) 8 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: That motion carries. 9 The next item on the agenda, we have 10 several seasonal employees, Julie Kyle and Kevin Bramer that have been here awhile, and they do 11 12 exemplary work as well. They work -- they have just 13 been doing a lot. Jewel has been here, I don't know, 14 now six years or so? And we would like to pay up to 15 what -- bring it up a little because their pay, you 16 know, is way below what they were doing for us. 17 MR. WALCH: They are deserving of an 18 increase. 19 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Thank you. 20 MR. SINNOTT: What is Julie and Kevin 21 making now per hour? 22 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Julie is making \$14.88 23 and Bramer is making \$14.30. So this is about a 24 5. --25 MR. WALCH: It's about a 5 percent

10 1 increase. 2 MR. SINNOTT: I move that the Board 3 increase Julie Kyle's rate of pay to \$15.706 per hour 4 and Kevin Bramer's rate of pay to \$15.033 per hour 5 effective December 29th of this year. MS. MARINELLO: Second. 6 7 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor. 8 (Vote taken; motion passed.) 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: That motion carries as well. 10 That concludes our business for this, our 11 12 last meeting. 13 MR. WALCH: If I may have one second. 14 This wasn't noticed so we can't really delve into it 15 too much, but I do know at the last meeting you all 16 had expressed when we talked about the issue that we 17 had with our counting software, we have received a 18 response from our vendor, Election Systems & Software. 19 20 I wanted to give you a copy of this. 21 Here's what we are going to do. We are looking to 22 bring a representative from ES&S into our 23 January 5 meeting. The other reason we wanted to 24 hold up on talking about it too much at this point, 25 it is our understanding that Delaware County had a

1 similar issue.

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2	We have been talking with our friends in
3	Delaware County at the Board of Elections there. We
4	will share our information with them. We asked them
5	to share their information with us. As of now they
6	have not received a response from ES&S. what we
7	wanted to do was compare notes before we had ES&S
8	come and speak to you, answer any questions you might
9	have.
10	I do have for you all, if you would like,
11	a copy of the response they did provide to us that
12	you can each have.
13	MR. HAAS: Thanks.
14	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: With that, a motion is
15	in order to adjourn.
16	MS. MARINELLO: So moved.
17	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?
18	MR. HAAS: Second.
19	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We stand adjourned.
20	(The meeting adjourned at 11:22 a.m.)
