DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I will take
roll. But prior to that, I want to remind
everybody to state their name so that our court
reporter, Carla Castle, can capture everything and
attribute it to the right person. So I will take
roll.
Kim Marinello.
MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.
MEMBER SEXTON: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Brad
Sinnott.
MEMBER SINNOTT: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Doug
Preisse.
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We indeed
have a quorum.
The first item on the agenda is to
hire Laurie Gatton as a PEO clerk. And I've known
Laurie for the seven years that I've been here at
the Board of Elections. She's been here as a PEO,

1	a Precinct Election Official, trainer for nine
2	years. She has a bachelor of arts degree from
3	Cedarville University. She's an interpreter for
4	the deaf, which helps us at our polling locations
5	as well as our early vote center. We utilize her
6	often for that. She was a part-time teacher at
7	Worthington Christian High School where she taught
8	American Sign Language; and she's an independent
9	captionist, which is like an interpreter. And
10	she's a PEO trainer and a BOE Board of Elections
11	Youth at the Booth coordinator.
12	So I'm going to give up my seat and
13	let Laurie have the seat so you can put a face with
14	a name and hopefully she can garner four votes for
15	support.
16	MS. GATTON: Hi, I'm Laurie.
17	MEMBER MARINELLO: Hi, Laurie.
18	MEMBER SEXTON: Hi, Laurie
19	MS. GATTON: Hi. How are you guys
20	today? Thanks for having me.
21	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Didn't take you
22	long to get to the Deputy Director's chair.
23	MS. GATTON: It's a record.
24	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I guess I'll
25	entertain a motion to hire Laurie.

1	MEMBER SINNOTT: This is Sinnott. ]
2	move that the Franklin County Board of Elections
3	hire Laurie Gatton as a full-time clerk in the
4	precinct election officials' department beginning
5	April 30, 2021, at a salary of \$40,040 per year or
6	\$19.25 cents per hour.
7	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a
8	second?
9	MEMBER SEXTON: This is Michael
10	Sexton and I will second.
11	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
12	properly moved and seconded to hire Laurie Gatton
13	as a full-time PEO clerk. I will take roll.
14	Kim Marinello.
15	MEMBER MARINELLO: Yes.
16	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.
17	MEMBER SEXTON: Yes.
18	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Brad
19	Sinnott.
20	MEMBER SINNOTT: Yes.
21	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Doug
22	Preisse.
23	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.
24	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Fantastic.
25	That's four for four. Congratulations, Laurie.

1 MS. GATTON: Thank you very much. 2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next 3 item on the agenda is candidate replacement in the 4 office of Columbus City Council. I will turn this 5 over to Jeff Mackey for some explanation. 6 MR. MACKEY: On February 16th the 7 Board met and certified Mitchell Brown as a 8 candidate for Columbus City Council. Subsequently, 9 on April 2nd, 2021, we received written 10 notification from Mitchell Brown that he was 11 withdrawing as a candidate for Columbus City 12 Council. And on April 19th we received 13 certification of selection of candidate to fill 14 vacancy and nomination from the committee of five 15 that appeared on Mitchell Brown's petition for 16 Columbus City Charter, Section 41-6. They're 17 allowed to choose a candidate to replace him on the 18 ballot, and they selected Nick Bankston to replace 19 him. We recommend the Board certify that 20 replacement for the November general election, 21 then. 22 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Are there 23 any questions for Jeff regarding the candidate 24 replacement? 25 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Jeff, you and the team there have checked and double checked, as you always do, all the paperwork and deadlines and all the filings appear to have been submitted in a timely and correct fashion?

MR. MACKEY: Yes. Everything appears to have followed the Charter and the Revised Code.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. We have been made aware that there may be a member of the public who wishes to address the Board briefly on I think it may be the subject at hand. So if that is the case, I would like to suggest we make a few moments available to that member of the public at this time.

MS. HIERS: Chairperson Preisse, if I may, before that, --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Uh-huh.

MS. HIERS: -- my name is Amy Hiers.

I am with the Franklin County Prosecutor's office,
and I would just like to say that Mr. Mackey sent
both the certification of selection of candidate to
fill vacancy, the nomination, and the acceptance of
nomination. Our office has reviewed the Revised
Code and the Columbus City Charter and any
applicable code regulations related to this.

1	Everything appears to be in order, and I just
2	wanted to put that on the record. Thank you.
3	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you.
4	Antone or David or others here who
5	are helping us manage the call, do we have
6	confirmation that somebody wishes to speak here at
7	this time?
8	DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah. This is
9	Director White. I believe Joe Motil wishes to
10	address the Board. I see him on the call now.
11	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
12	MS. HIERS: And if I may, this is
13	Amy Hiers again I would ask that Mr. Motil
14	please be placed under oath before he addresses the
15	Board.
16	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That sounds all
17	right here.
18	You okay with that, Joe?
19	MR. MOTIL: Absolutely.
20	MS. GIBBONS: Carla Castle is here,
21	I believe, to administer the oath. Carla.
22	(Witness sworn by reporter.)
23	MR. MOTIL: Thank you, Chairman
24	Preisse, Board Members, Director White, Deputy
25	Director Payne.

I'm speaking today so that I am on
the record to state what I perceive and what many
others throughout Columbus to be considered
election fraud and deception of Columbus voters of
those who signed the declaration of candidacy
petition, a Shannon Hardin, Mitchell Brown,
Pricilla Tyson, Lourdes de Padilla, and Nick

Bankston.

The fact that these City Hall insiders, Nick Bankston and Lourdes de Padilla, hold petitions to run against three incumbent City Council members immediately drew a red flag that some type of fix was in the works. Anyone who follows city politics in Columbus knows that City Hall cronies do not run against City Council incumbents.

Nick Bankston was Mayor Ginther's former director of community affairs and resigned from the City earlier, and in January was appointed as CEO and President of the Gladden Community House. Bankston's appointment to a nonprofit fit right into City Council's musical chairs playbook, just as Michelle Mills, Pricilla Tyson, Matt Habash, and Andy Ginther, who all work for nonprofits as well. His appointment to Gladden

House was prearranged, we feel, to help beef up
Bankston's resume with the help of its public image
and the collection of \$58,000 part-time City
Council salary once he is most likely elected to
City Council.

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Pricilla Tyson and Mitch Brown's retirement announcement after the fact that their declaration of candidacy petitions were certified by the Board of Elections was a predetermined ploy to avoid decades of criticism of City Council and going through the sham of selecting someone through the normal City Council appointment process. Pricilla Tyson and Mitch Brown intentionally deceived those who signed the petition, while knowing all along that they would be withdrawing their names from the November ballot. While basically serving as placeholder candidates without letting those know who signed the petition, Tyson and Brown most likely kept other potential candidates from getting on the ballot. They were more interested in running against lesser-known challengers than those going up against the three incumbents, Hardin, Brown, and Tyson.

Nick Bankston never publicly expressed any genuine heartache over the fact that

he did not get enough signatures to get on the ballot, knowing that his fate would be sealed with the announcement of Mitch Brown's request on April 2nd that his name not appear on the November 2nd, 2021, ballot. On Sunday, April 18th, 2021, Mr. Bankston was selected by the Hardin, Tyson, Brown nominating committee to replace Mitchell Brown on the ballot and Mr. Bankston immediately accepted the nomination that same day. The following day, Monday, April 19th, 2021, the vacancy selection and acceptance of nomination paperwork was filed with the Board of Elections and later that same day City Council President and candidate, Shannon Hardin, made a bombshell announcement to the media -- and I say that sarcastically -- that he, Mr. Bankston, and Lourdes de Padilla would be running as a team. And what a big surprise that was. The two new candidates along with City Council President, Shannon Hardin, will run as a team while benefiting from Hardin's financing of the campaign and more than likely the cherished sample ballot endorsement of the Franklin County Democratic Party. All the while Hardin, Brown, Tyson, Lourdes de Padilla, and Nick Bankston deceived the public and especially those that signed the petitions were not aware of

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1 the behind-the-scenes alleged scheming that had 2 been decided months ago that would create the 3 Hardin, de Padilla, Bankston campaign change. 4 Thank you very much for the time. 5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you, 6 Mr. Motil. 7 Well, if there are no questions for 8 Mr. Motil, -- we've had our presentation from 9 Jeff -- I think we can proceed, Director. 10 MEMBER SEXTON: Thank you, 11 Mr. Chairman. Michael Sexton. I move that the Board accept the April 19th, 2021, appointment of 12 13 Nicholas J. Bankston by the committee of five whose 14 names appears on the face of the nominating 15 petition for the slate of candidates, namely, 16 Mitchell J. Brown, Shannon Granville Hardin, and 17 Pricilla R. Tyson for the office of member of 18 Columbus City Council to replace the vacancy by the 19 withdrawal of Mitchell J. Brown, and that the name 20 Nicholas J. Bankston shall appear on the November 21 2nd, 2021, general election ballot. 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse. Ι 23 second the motion. 24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been 25 moved and seconded to replace the name of Mitchell

1	Brown with Nicholas Bankston. I'll take roll.

15	B. Fink consulting contract, and I'll turn that
16	over to Director White for some explanation.
17	DIRECTOR WHITE: Hi. Good
18	afternoon. This is Director White. This is our
19	standard agreement to contract with vendor B. Fink
20	Consulting to perform election cost allocation and
21	recovery of services otherwise known as
22	charge-backs for the May, August, and November 2121
23	elections.
24	Since 2015 the Board has contracted
25	with vendor Maximus to perform these services. The

1 account manager at Maximus that managed our account 2 and performed our services left that company in 3 2020 and joined B. Fink Consulting. We valued her 4 service so much to the Board that we made the decision to switch to B. Fink Consulting. B. Fink 5 6 Consulting provides the same service for 16 other 7 counties in Ohio and the pricing is lower than what 8 we contracted with Maximus. For example, Maximus 9 charged us \$20,000 for a general election, while B. 10 Fink Consulting charges us \$17,500. These services 11 provide a tremendous value to the Board as it 12 accurately calculates all election cost and for 13 each election properly prorates the cost back to 14 the subdivision pursuant to Ohio Revised Code, and 15 they also provide all of the necessary reporting 16 and supporting documentation required by the 17 Franklin County Auditor. 18 And unless there are any questions, 19 I would ask for authorization to enter this 20 contract. 21 MEMBER MARINELLO: I don't have any 22 questions. 23 This is Kim Marinello. I move that

the Board authorize the Director and Deputy

Director to enter into a contract with B. Fink

1	Consulting in an amount not to exceed \$26,000 for
2	election cost allocation and recovery of services,
3	charge-backs, for the May, August, and November
4	elections of 2021.
