KELLY: And I will cover both 8 the 10th District Democratic primary race as well 9 as the county central committee race all with this 10 report. 11 Good afternoon. By order of the 12 board, the operations and absentee departments 13 conducted recounts for two races from the March 19th, 2024, primary election that fell within 14 15 the mandatory recount range. The race -- two races 16 were, number one, the republican member of the 17 county central committee for Columbus Ward 4, and the second race was the democratic primary race for 18 19 state representative in Ohio House District 10. 20 Each recount was conducted by using 21 a four-person bipartisan hand recount team which 2.2 consisted of four full-time staff members from the Board of Elections on each team. And the recount 23 24 was conducted starting -- it started on Friday,

April 12th, with observers from campaigns present.

In the race for republican member of the county central committee for Columbus Ward 4, every ballot was -- that was cast in that race was recounted by hand since the race was exclusively between two write-in candidates and there was only four precincts involved in the contest in total.

In the race for the democratic candidate for the Ohio House District 10, a random 5 percent sample of all ballots cast underwent a hand recount and then a machine recount to verify the results of the 5 percent sample. Once those results were verified, the remaining 95 percent of all ballots cast were scanned by machine to verify the total results for that contest.

The results of both recounts are as follows, and they are included in the recount results exhibit that should be before the board.

In the recount for the republican member of the county central committee Columbus Ward 4, write-in candidate Lucas Denney received five votes, write-in candidate Jay Hout received five votes. Non- -- a nonvalid write-in candidate received one vote.

And if you remember, during certification on April 5th, candidate Hout was declared the elected winner by method of coin toss.

In the recount for the democratic candidate for Ohio House of Representatives

District 10, democratic candidate Sarah Pomeroy received 2,309 votes, two-three-zero-nine, and democratic candidate Mark Sigrist received 2,329 --2,329 votes.

In both recounts, there were no changes in the official results that were certified by this board on Friday, April 5th, 2024. And the declared -- declared winners of those contests, as per the certification, are confirmed. Therefore, there is no need to amend the certified official results for the March 19th, 2024, primary election.

However, we will submit the official recount results summary that's before you. We will submit that to the Ohio Secretary of State's office upon board approval of these recount results.

And that is all, unless there's questions.
