Board of Elections Certifies Issues, Liquor Options and Non Partisan Candidates for November Ballot

(Columbus) The Franklin County Board of Elections today certified petitions for issues, liquor options and candidates for non-partisan state board of education offices to place them on the Nov. 4, 2008 general election ballot.

Columbus and eight suburban school districts will be on the ballot with levies or bond issues. City of Columbus voters also will decide six bond issues. Clinton, Franklin, Mifflin and Plain Townships will ask approval of police and/or fire levies. Mifflin Township will have a levy for roads and bridges as well. Upper Arlington voters will deal with zoning and trash disposal questions. Westerville will have a tax issue for city services.

Charter amendments will be on ballots in Gahanna, Grandview Heights, Obetz and Whitehall.

Forty-seven liquor options were also certified for local ballots throughout the county. Petitions for four others failed due to a lack of valid signatures.
