Most Franklin County Precincts Open for Primary Election Tomorrow

(Columbus) Franklin County holds a primary election tomorrow with candidates and issues at stake for most, but not all voters.

More than 640,000 registered voters will have an election while another 215,000 will not because there are no local issues or not enough candidates in their precinct to require a primary.

Local ballots will show races for city council in Columbus, Hilliard and Reynoldsburg, a proposed tax increase for Gahanna and a levy for Groveport Madison Local Schools.

Franklin, Jefferson and Norwich Townships have fire levies. Madison and Prairie Townships have energy purchasing plans on their ballots as well. There's a bond issue for golf course improvements in Minerva Park. Voters in Brice will decide whether to create a village charter. Five liquor options will be on local ballots. A few voters in precincts shared with surrounding counties will see a tax issue for the Village of Lithopolis and levies for Licking Heights and Madison- Plains Local Schools on their ballots.

Voters are encouraged to inspect their <u>Sample Ballot</u> on our Web site to find out if they have an election tomorrow. Precincts with an election will be open for voting from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Election results will be posted online after the polls close and updated throughout the evening.
