General Election Tomorrow

(Columbus) More than 798,000 voters are registered for tomorrow's general election in Franklin County.

Polls will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. as voters elect candidates for judge, school board, city and village council, township trustee and determine the outcome of local issues.

Columbus voters will see a school levy, a proposal to create an independent auditor for the city's school district and four bond issues. Upper Arlington has a school levy as well. City income tax increases are before voters in Gahanna and Reynoldsburg. Bexley and Worthington have library levies. There are two charter issues in Whitehall. Township and village ballots throughout the county will list issues about fire protection, road maintenance, zoning and energy purchasing programs. Liquor options also will be on local ballots. There are no countywide issues on the ballot in this election.

Voters will need to show identification to cast a regular ballot. Acceptable forms include an Ohio driver's license or government document-other than one from the board of elections-showing the voter's current name and address. Pay stubs and utility bills with current name and address are also valid.

Voters are urged to visit our Web site http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov/ and inspect their sample ballot for a listing of the candidates and issues in their precinct. Election results will be posted on the site after the polls close and will be updated throughout the evening.
