Accessible Sample Ballots for Visually Impaired Voters Available Online

(Columbus) Absentee voting for the primary begins in eight days, but Franklin County's registered voters can already see what their ballot will look like when they vote early or on Election Day. Registered Franklin County voters can visit <u>https://vote.franklincountyohio.gov/search/</u> to view their sample ballot.

Accessible sample ballots are also available to residents with visual impairments. These sample ballots are formatted to be screen reader friendly. Election Day and absentee formatted ballots can be viewed or printed from the link just below the accessible sample ballot.

Franklin County will have 625 different ballot styles this primary election in its 255 voting locations countywide. <u>Please note this primary election is not a full countywide election</u>. Communities that will hold elections on May 7 are: City of Columbus-Bond Issue, Canal Winchester Local Schools-Tax Levy, Groveport Madison Local Schools-Bond Issue & Levy, Licking Heights Schools-Levy, City of Gahanna-Mayor & Income Tax Issue, Hamilton Twp.-Levy, and City of Reynoldsburg-4th Ward Republican Primary.

Voters must request and submit an application for an absentee ballot to be mailed to them in order to vote absentee in the May 7, 2019 primary election. Applications are available online at our website or by calling the board of elections at (614) 525-3470. In-person early voting begins at the Board of Elections, 1700 Morse Road on Tuesday, April 9th, 2019. Early voting hours are uniform across the state and can be viewed on our website.
