## Absentee Voting for March 17th Primary Election Begins Week from Today

**(Columbus)** Absentee voting, both in-person and by mail, begins February 19<sup>th</sup> for the March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Primary Election. In-person voting will run from Wednesday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020 through Monday, March 16, 2020 and take place at the Franklin County Board of Elections located at 1700 Morse Road at the following times:

Weekdays, February 19<sup>th</sup> through March 6<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday, March 7<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Final week, March 9<sup>th</sup> through March 13<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Sunday, March 15<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Monday, March 16<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
