(Columbus) Absentee voting, both in-person and by mail, begins February 19th for the March 17th, 2020 Primary Election. As of yesterday over 6,100 absentee ballots have been requested in Franklin County. Those will begin hitting the mail tomorrow to coincide with the first day of early voting. Below are the inperson voting hours that registered Franklin County voters can vote at 1700 Morse Road Columbus.

Weekdays, February 19th through March 6th from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday, March 7th from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Final week, March 9th through March 13th from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Saturday, March 14th from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sunday, March 15th from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 16th from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Voters planning to cast a ballot by mail must request one by noon on March 14th. Applications are available online at <a href="http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov">http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov</a>, at public libraries or by calling the Board of Elections at (614) 525-3470.
