Less than One Week Remaining until the Close of the 2020 Primary Election

(Columbus) In less than a week, Ohio's 2020 Presidential Primary Election will finally conclude on Tuesday, April 28th. To date over 172,000+ registered Franklin County voters have either cast a ballot in-person between February 19th, 2020 and March 16th, 2020 or requested a ballot be mailed to them. The Board has been abiding by House Bill 197 and working with the Ohio Secretary of State to administer this postponed all-mail ballot election.

Important Vote-By-Mail Deadlines:

Saturday, April 25th, 2020, 12:00 noon – Application deadline – No ballot will be sent for any application received after noon on Saturday.

Monday, April 27th, 2020 – Postmark Deadline for ballots mailed to the BOE. Ballots postmarked by April 27th must still be received by May 8th.

Tuesday, April 28th, 2020, 7:30 PM – Deadline for hand-delivery of completed ballots to the BOE at 1700 Morse Road, Columbus.

In-Person Voting:

A voter, who was registered to vote in Ohio as of February 18th, 2020, **AND** has **NOT** already voted in the 2020 Primary Election, is eligible to vote in-person at the Board of Elections **if the voter belongs to one of these two categories:**

1. The voter has a disability, and the voter wishes to cast absent voter's ballots using a direct recording electronic voting machine or marking device that is accessible for voters with disabilities, including nonvisual accessibility for the blind and visually impaired, in a manner that provides the same opportunity for access and participation, including privacy and independence, as for other voters; **OR**

2. The voter is unable to receive mail at the place where the voter resides or at another location.
