Shall bonds be issued by the Teays Valley Local School District for the purpose of CONSTRUCTING ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AT WALNUT AND SCIOTO; TO CONSTRUCT A CAFETERIA AND LIBRARY AT ASHVILLE ELEMENTARY; TO CONSTRUCT A CAFETERIA, MUSIC FACILITY, AND CLASSROOMS AT THE MIDDLE SCHOOL; TO CONSTRUCT A VOCATIONAL FACILITY AT THE HIGH SCHOOL; TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT AND APPURTENANCES; AND TO RENOVATE ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL FACILITIES in the principal amount of \$23,281,920 to be repaid annually over a maximum period of twenty-eight (28) years, and an annual levy of property taxes be made outside the ten mill limitation, estimated by the county auditor to average over the repayment period of the bond issue 6.7 mills for each one dollar of tax valuation, which amounts to \$0.67 for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation, to pay the annual debt charges on the bonds, and to pay debt charges on any notes issued in anticipation of those bonds commencing with the 1999 tax year?
