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Page 3 1 2 PROCEEDINGS 3 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I would like 4 5 to call the Franklin County Board of 6 Elections meeting to order. 7 May we have the roll call. 8 MR. WHITE: Mr. Colley? 9 MR. COLLEY: Here. 10 MR. WHITE: Ms. Marinello? 11 MS. MARINELLO: Here. 12 MR. WHITE: Ms. Petree? 13 MS. PETREE: Here. 14 MR. WHITE: Chairman Anthony? 15 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Here. 16 We have a quorum present. 17 MR. WHITE: The first item on 18 the agenda, Mr. Chair, is the 19 certification of the Special Election. MS. PETREE: Mr. Chairman, I 20 21 move that the results of the February 6, 22 2007 Special Election in the Village of 23 Riverlea be certified as canvassed and 24 reported.

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            CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there a
 2 second?
 3
             MS. MARINELLO: I second.
             CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in
 5 favor, say aye.
 6
              (Unanimous aye.)
 7
             CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion
 8 carries.
             MR. WHITE: The next issue for
 9
10 the Board is the certification of
11 candidates to the ballot.
12
             I would like to ask Peggy Howell
13 to present her report to the Board.
14
             MS. HOWELL: Peggy Howell,
15 H-o-w-e-l-l.
16
             We have checked all the
17 petitions for the candidates that filed
18 for the primary and/or general election.
19 We have some questionable petitions that I
20 think we need to go through prior to
21 certifying the entire list, which is
22 second in your paperwork.
23
             The first question that we have
24 to rule on is Steven Raimo, candidate for
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1 Gahanna mayor. The only error Mr. Raimo 2 had was he inserted his voting precinct is 3 in C, and in reality he is in E precinct 4 of the First Ward.

5 Because he is running for a 6 city-wide office and did show the correct 7 address and ward on his petition, previous 8 rulings by this board have been that they 9 do not consider this to be a fatal flaw in 10 the petition and that Mr. Raimo should be 11 certified to the ballot.

12 Do you want me to go through 13 them or do you vote on each category? 14 MR. WHITE: What is your 15 preference, Mr. Chairman? 16 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Why don't we 17 go through the ones we should vote on. 18 That would be that one then? 19 MR. WHITE: Any questions on 20 the past practice of the Board? 21 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I move that 22 Steven Raimo, R-a-i-m-o, be certified to 23 the ballot. 24 Do we have to do that?

1 MR. WHITE: You don't have to 2 unless there is a concern by the Board. 3 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there a 4 second? 5 MS. PETREE: I second. 6 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All in favor, 7 say yes. 8 (Unanimous yes.) 9 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion 10 carries. Then he is on the ballot. 11 MS. HOWELL: The next six 12 candidates listed on your Questionable 13 Petitions and Issues for Election are all 14 candidates. I will take them one at a 15 time. Each of them had an insufficient 16 number of valid signatures. 17I have given you a work sheet 18 that shows the number of petitions they 19 filed, the number of signatures that were 20 on those petitions, the number of 21 signatures they needed to be validated for 22 certification, and our finding by category 23 to the problem petitions. 24 Walter Downey, Republican

1 Candidate for Hilliard Council, 2 insufficient number of valid signatures. 3 Willis Spencer, Non-partisan 4 Candidate for Mayor of Whitehall, 5 insufficient valid signatures. 6 Carmen Allen, Non-partisan 7 Candidate for Columbus Board of Education, 8 insufficient number of valid signatures. 9 John Tracy Broaddus, 10 Non-partisan Candidate for Columbus Board 11 of Education, insufficient valid 12 signatures. 13 Joy Marshall, Non-partisan 14 Candidate for Columbus Board of Education, 15 insufficient number of valid signatures. 16 Michael Winston, Non-partisan 17 Candidate for Columbus Board of Education, 18 insufficient number of valid signatures. 19 In each case we were not able to 20 get the minimum required valid signature 21 number that would permit them to be 22 certified to the ballot. 23 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: These folks, 24 once we vote them off, they do have appeal

1 rights; is that correct? 2 MS. HOWELL: They will be 3 notified and they will have five days to 4 come and appeal. 5 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I will 6 entertain a motion for those six 7 individuals to put them off the ballot. 8 I move that we do not certify 9 the ballots of Walter Downey, Willis 10 Spencer, Carmen Allen, Jon Tracy Broaddus, 11 Joy L. Marshall, and Michael D. Winston 12 for not having valid signatures. 13 And they will be notified how? 14 MS. HOWELL: They will 15 be notified by mail tonight. 16 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: And have how 17 many days to appeal? 18 MS. HOWELL: They have five days 19 in which to appeal or protest. CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there a 20 21 second on the motion? 22 MS. PETREE: I second. 23 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in 24 favor, say aye.

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1 (Unanimous aye.) 2 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion 3 carries. MS. HOWELL: The next one is a Δ 5 little different. I don't know, I think 6 you would probably have three ways you can 7 go on this one. We have Candidate W. Shawna 8 9 Gibbs, who filed as a non-partisan 10 candidate for Columbus Board of Education. 11 There is a question regarding 12 her registration. 13 We could find no one registered 14 as she completed her petition. There is a 15 Weirdella LaRay Gibbs registered at the 16 address stated on W. Shawna Gibbs' 17 petition. 18 If we can ascertain that she is 19 a registered elector of the school 20 district you can either invalidate her now 21 until she can come in and prove she is 22 registered, or explain if the one we have, 23 Weirdella LaRay Gibbs, is in fact her, 24 then make an explanation that you would

1 have to consider to recertify her, or you 2 can continue it until such time. That's 3 your free choice. 4 MR. WHITE: Do we know if that 5 is her? 6 MS. HOWELL: No, we don't at 7 this time. 8 MR. WHITE: Do any Board members 9 know? 10 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Fortunately, 11 I do know her. I have known her for a 12 long time. I knew her father. The father 13 14 was Weir D. Gibbs. He named the daughter 15 Weirdella and she refuses to go by that 16 name. She has always gone as Jessie and 17 W. as her father did. Her father's name 18 was Weir and he also went by W. as his 19 name. 20 I have known her as W. Shawna 21 Gibbs for pretty much all her life. I 22 have known the family for a long time. MS. HOWELL: I don't know where 23 24 this LaRay comes into it, but I think we

1 need more clarification.

2 You can either not certify her 3 at this time or continue it until such 4 time as she can give you documentation and 5 then vote at that time. You can not 6 certify her until she can give you 7 documentation that may make you 8 reconsider. It's your choice. 9 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Did she file 10 a change of name? MS. HOWELL: No. 11 We have hunted 12 high and low. The copy of the 13 registration that I have attached behind 14 the copy of the petition is the only thing 15 we have on her. 16 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I did talk to 17 her about this. She would like to go on 18 the ballot as W. Shawna Gibbs instead of 19 Weirdella. That's why she did the 20 petition. I thought she told me she had 21 filed a name change. 22 MS. HOWELL: If she could come 23 in and prove it. 24 MR. WHITE: How did she sign her

1 pre-registration card? 2 MS. HOWELL: As Weirdella. 3 There was no middle initial. I looked 4 that far. 5 MR. WHITE: What is the Board's 6 preference? 7 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: It's a tough 8 one for me because I do know her. 9 MR. WHITE: The main thing is, 10 you know, you know that it is her. 11 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes. 12 MR. WHITE: The main thing is to 13 find out how she wants her name to go on 14 the ballot, then the Board would decide 15 whether that's a proper name or not. 16 We have had people run by 17 different names if that's what they go 18 by, or if it's close to -- like a Robert 19 would run as Bill. 20 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Any 21 discussion? 22 MS. PETREE: Yes. What if we 23 would invalidate it and then notify her so 24 she could come in?

1 MR. WHITE: It's your call. 2 MS. HOWELL: Bill has verified 3 it is her, so we know it is her. 4 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: That is 5 definitely her. 6 MR. WHITE: Since we know it is 7 her, I think it's a matter of the Board, 8 bottom line, deciding what name she should 9 have on the ballot. She has to do a 10 request form for that. 11 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I have no 12 idea how it works. 13 MS. HOWELL: My recommendation 14 would be not to certify her. She would 15 have five days to come in to protest or 16 appeal, and we will just set a hearing 17 date for the Board to hear any candidates 18 that file a protest and appeal. And she 19 can come at that time and submit her 20 arguments and you can rule either yea or 21 nae at that time. 22 MR. WHITE: The reason we are in 23 this position, Bill, is because our legal 24 counsel is tied up in another legal matter

1 and not here.

2 However, what reason do we have 3 to disqualify her from not being a 4 candidate? MS. HOWELL: We have no one 5 6 registered by that name. Even though Bill 7 has said that is her, it does raise a 8 question for which we need clarification. 9 MS. COTTON: Her initial listed 10 on her registration form is different from 11 S. for Shawna. Because of that 12 inconsistency we can't determine whether 13 it is or isn't her. 14MS. PETREE: My problem is with 15 it under the statement of candidacy she 16 did have W. Shawna Gibbs, and that's the 17 way she signed the petition. CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I don't have 18 19 the petition. 20 MS. HOWELL: Here is the 21 original. 22 I have asked the Prosecutor for 23 their opinion also, but they have been 24 tied up in court and weren't able to

1 provide it for this meeting. 2 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: One of the 3 problems I have is when do we have to 4 certify this? 5 How much time? MS. COTTON: You have the 6 7 five-day appeal process regardless. 8 MR. WHITE: We could ask the 9 Secretary of State's Office. It is 10 awkward because our legal counsel has been 11 tied up. 12 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I am out of 13 town from the 10th through the 17th. The 14 earliest I could meet would probably be 15 the week of the 8th or the 19th. 16 Would that give us enough time? 17 MR. WHITE: There is no 18 requirement for this? 19 MS. HOWELL: For them to ask for 20 an appeal, there is, but for you to set a 21 hearing, no. 22 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Then we will 23 go ahead and do it for lack of legal 24 counsel then.

1 MS. HOWELL: We are finished 2 with the problem petitions. 3 Now, we can go back to your 4 candidates list because you are going to 5 have to certify either to the November or 6 to the primary. Different offices have 7 filed petitions. Some will go straight to 8 the General Election in November. Others 9 will go through a primary. 10 On your list I have written for 11 Judge of Franklin County Municipal Court 12 there is no primary. 13 MR. WHITE: Peg, do we need a 14 motion for the record of the ruling to get 15 her off the ballot? 16 MS. HOWELL: Yes. 17 MR. WHITE: Do you want to do 18 that before going on to the other stuff? 19 MS. HOWELL: Yes. 20 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes. 21 MS. PETREE: Mr. Chairman, I 22 move to disqualify W. Shawna Gibbs and not 23 have her certified to the ballot because 24 of the discrepancy in the name and on her

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1 registration card.

             CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there a
 3 second?
             MS. MARINELLO:
                             Second.

             CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All in favor,
 6 say aye.
 7
             (Unanimous aye.)
 8
             CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion
 9 carries.
10
             MS. HOWELL: Would you like to
11 go through the certified for the primary
12 election now, those offices?
13
             On your candidates' list judge
14 of Franklin County Municipal Court, no
15 primary; Columbus City, no primary; City
16 of Gahanna, there will be a mayoral
17 primary, but you will need to certify
18 that.
19
             The City of Hilliard will have a
20 partisan primary with the exception of the
21 candidate Walter Downey, who has been
22 disqualified. The City of Reynoldsburg
23 does have a primary. Whitehall will have
24 a primary in mayoral only with the
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1 exception of Willis Spencer, who was 2 disqualified. Columbus City School District 3 4 with the disgualification of Allen, 5 Broaddus, Gibbs, Marshall, and Winston 6 will not face a primary. They are listed 7 at this time to be nominated. If there 8 are eight or less, they do not face a 9 primary. There will be no primary at this 10 time in Columbus City School District. 11 We recommend at this time that 12 you certify to the ballot those 13 municipalities with the exception of the 14 names I called out to be certified to the 15 May primary ballot. 16 MS. PETREE: Mr. Chairman? 17 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes. 18 MS. PETREE: I move that those 19 candidates, having timely filed valid and 20 sufficient petitions be certified to the 21 ballot. 22 MS. MARINELLO: Second. 23 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in 24 favor, say aye.

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(Unanimous aye.)

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2 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion 3 carries.

MS. HOWELL: The next move is to 5 certify those candidates that filed that 6 will be certified directly to the November 7 general election, which is all the 8 judgeships and Franklin County Municipal 9 Court, all the candidates for City of 10 Columbus and, as it stands now, all the 11 candidates for Columbus City School 12 District. 13 I recommend that you, with the 14 exception of those names we disqualified 15 in Columbus School District, that you do 16 order them to the November general 17 election ballot or certify them to that 18 ballot. 19 MR. WHITE: You can use that 20 same motion again. 21 MS. PETREE: Mr. Chairman? 22 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes, Ms. 23 Petree. 24 MS. PETREE: I move that those

1 candidates having timely filed valid and 2 sufficient petitions be certified to the 3 November general ballot. CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there a 4 5 second? MS. MARINELLO: Second. 6 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in 7 8 favor, say aye. 9 (Unanimous aye. 10 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion 11 carries. 12 MS. HOWELL: You have in your 13 packet an issues list that was received 14 for Jefferson Township, Mifflin Township, 15 Truro Township, New Albany Plain Local 16 School District, Westerville Public 17 Library District, Franklin County Senior 18 Options, City of Upper Arlington Public 19 Library District, and City of Upper 20 Arlington Police District. 21 I just spoke with the 22 Prosecutor's Office, and they recommend 23 that all are approved with the exception 24 of Westerville Public Library District in

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1 that they did fail to file by the deadline 2 of 4:00 p.m., February 22nd. They did 3 file at 9:25 a.m. on February 23rd, but 4 they also have a problem with an 5 incomplete filing, in that they did not 6 file with their levy resolution an 7 Auditor's Certificate as required by law. 8 MR. WHITE: Karen, do you have 9 anything on the issues? 10 MS. COTTON: On Local Option 11 Questions that were submitted, which is on 12 page 2 of issues that were filed, we have 13 checked all five of the filings. They all 14 do qualify for the ballot as having enough 15 valid signatures to qualify for the 16 ballot. 17 However, only the Whitehall 2-B 18 question can go on the ballot in the 19 primary election, because the Ohio Revised 20 Code requires that there be candidates on 21 the ballot to place a local option 22 questionnaire. 23 We can go ahead and rule that 24 the -- an order that the Whitehall 2-B

1 question be printed on the primary ballot 2 and the Local Option Questions for 76-D 3 and the three separate questions, actually 4 three separate projects, two questions 5 each for Columbus Board 82 Precinct G, 6 would go to the November ballot. 7 MS. PETREE: Mr. Chairman, I 8 have a question. 9 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes, ma'am.

MS. PETREE: Karen, on the local 11 option are you saying Columbus 76-D, 82-G, 12 82-G, and all the rest of 82-Gs are to go 13 on the November ballot?

MS. COTTON: Yes, because the requirement is that there be candidates on the ballot for Local Option Questions, and inasmuch as the Columbus Board of Ed will not be presented, there will be no candidates in the City of Columbus even if Senior Options are on there as candidates. We cannot place the issue on the ballot at this time. CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I know there the Someone here from the Westerville

1 Public Library.

2 Would you like to address us? MR. SUMMERS: Mr. Chairman, 3 4 first of all thank you for the opportunity 5 to address the Board. Let me say on 6 behalf of the library you are in a 7 position to make a decision on the levy as 8 it is. Q As you may or may not know, this 10 levy is crucial to the Westerville Library 11 and represents 30 percent of their 12 operating funds. As you can imagine we 13 are looking at major layoffs and some 14 other things. 15 I think you may have noticed the 16 library board certainly did everything in 17 its power and certainly in a timely and 18 proper manner to file all paperwork. In 19 fact all the paperwork, including the 20 Auditor's Certificate, was delivered to 21 the school board on January 21st. 22 And the school board also 23 performed their duties in a timely and 24 efficient manner, which they passed all

1 necessary resolutions on Jan 29th. I
2 guess my point being this is clearly a
3 substantial completion of the requirements
4 under the statute.

5 Secondarily, it is clearly my 6 opinion, and I hope you will take into 7 consideration, that this is merely a 8 clerical error. The paperwork was stuck 9 on the treasurer's desk of the school 10 district and it was simply not filed. 11 When he was notified at 4:30 on the 22nd, 12 he was down here at 9:25, which I think 13 you mentioned, was on the 23rd.

14 What I am saying is the library 15 board and the library and the citizens of 16 Westerville should not be disenfranchised 17 of their right to take action on this 18 important levy,

19 And, secondly, the library 20 itself should be held harmless. We 21 completed all the things in a timely and 22 thoughtful manner. 23 I think you may agree that it is

24 simply a clerical error. We certainly

1 regret the mistake. Certainly the school 2 district regrets the mistake. 3 I would also like you to 4 consider that we all have policies; we all 5 have statutes to follow. I think from 6 time to time we have to take a look at 7 what is in the best interest not only of 8 our customers but also the people of 9 Franklin County. 10 The denial of Westerville being 11 on the ballot will basically force the 12 Westerville Library to be on a special 13 election and will ultimately cost our 14 taxpayers thousands of dollars for the 15 special election, not to mention all the 16 volunteers we will need and all those

17 kinds of things.

I would hope you would take 19 those into consideration. I certainly 20 understand the position you are in, and 21 certainly that that might establish some 22 sort of precedent that you don't want to 23 do.

On the other hand, I think it is

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1 clear that it is simply a clerical error.
 2 I think the library board upheld all its
 3 statutory responsibilities and the school
 4 board upheld all of its statutory
 5 responsibilities. It simply was not
 6 brought down here at the time it should
 7 have been.
 8
             I hope and pray you will take
 9 that into consideration prior to making
10 your decision.

             MR. SUMMERS: Yes, ma'am.

23 fact I have a copy of it here.
                                   Ŵе
24 actually filed it on time. We gave it to
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1 the school board, the school 2 superintendent, in the packet with the 3 library board resolutions that were 4 passed, the resolutions that the school 5 board passed, as well as the Auditor's 6 Certificate. We received -- the auditor 7 signed off on that certificate on December 8 6th. The library board can't make their 9 resolutions until we have the certificate 10 from the auditors. 11 I think in the haste once the 12 school board noticed that they didn't file 13 on the 22nd in time, I think in the haste 14 to grab his papers the only thing I can 15 think of is he left the certificate on his 16 desk as well. 17 I do have a copy. I just now 18 became aware just a couple of hours ago 19 that the certificate was not filed with 20 the papers. 21 It was clearly approved on 22 December 6th. Again, all the paperwork 23 and legalities were performed on November 24 29th, over three weeks before any

1 statutory deadlines. 2 I hope you would consider that 3 this is in no way an attempt to place an 4 issue on the ballot at the last minute. 5 This is in no way the fault of the library 6 board or school board. It is simply a 7 clerical error. 8 I would certainly hope and pray 9 you take that into consideration. 10 MS. HOWELL: May I ask a 11 question? 12 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes, ma'am. 13 MS. HOWELL: I want to 14 understand you aren't saying that you 15 filed the certificate, the Auditor's 16 Certificate, with our office. 17 MR. SUMMERS: No. I am saying 18 the school board failed to file that 19 certificate when they filed the paperwork. 20 We received that from the auditor on 21 December 6th. By statute the library is 22 not allowed to file. The school district 23 has to file. 24 I hope you can appreciate that

1 the library -- we did everything we were
2 supposed to. It was all simply an error
3 by the school district.

4 MS. HOWELL: All dictated by 5 statute.

6 MR. WHITE: Mr. Chairman, I 7 spoke to Director Damschroeder this 8 morning on this matter. Your legal 9 counsel, the County Prosecutor's office, 10 has advised us not to certify this ballot 11 for the two reasons you are stating in 12 your minutes there.

13The process is set up. And I14 explained it to the library folks here15 that there is an appeal process set up to16 where you can investigate all these17 matters to see where the problem lies.18I would recommend and it's the19 Director's recommendation that you follow20 your legal counsel's advice on this21 matter. Their safety valve is there is an22 appeals process. You can schedule a23 hearing and all of this stuff can be24 digested and your decision can be reversed

1 or confirmed.

2 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Would this go 3 on the May primary or November? 4 MS. HOWELL: On the May primary. 5 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: What is our 6 time line? MS. HOWELL: The time frame to 7 8 get it on the ballot? 9 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes. 10 MS. COTTON: About two weeks 11 max. 12 MR. WHITE: There could be 13 information the Prosecutor's Office is not 14 aware of that you brought up today that 15 could change their opinion. That's what 16 the appeals process is set up to do and 17 how it works. 18 MR. SUMMERS: I have just one 19 other point, and I am not an attorney. 20 Not to be sinister but there are 251 21 public libraries. 212 of those are school 22 district libraries. 23 Not to be sinister, but we all 24 know that when people have issues on the

1 ballot we don't necessarily like the 2 competition on the ballot, for example. 3 The school board is going to be 4 required to place operating issues on the 5 ballot. If for any reason they didn't 6 want the competition, the library board 7 would do everything they need to do 8 statutorily. Simply by filing late that 9 would keep public libraries off the 10 ballot. I think to me, that's a far more 11 12 dangerous precedent than the precedent of 13 granting us to be on the ballot. All the 14 paperwork was filed and done appropriately 15 and just not delivered by the school 16 district. 17 At least in my opinion that's a 18 far more dangerous precedent than allowing 19 the Westerville Library to be on the May 20 ballot. 21 MS. HOWELL: I would like to 22 also point out to the Board that if they 23 aren't certified for the primary, they 24 still have an option of the August special

1 and then the November general. 2 MR. SUMMERS: But again that's 3 very extensive and I think it 4 penalizes the citizens in Westerville 5 simply for clerical error. We all make 6 mistakes. We all make clerical errors. 7 I have never made a \$65,000 8 clerical error. I think that's an 9 unreasonable requisition on the citizens 10 of Westerville. 11 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Thank you for 12 your comments. 13 One of the things that 14 basically is our responsibility and why we 15 have legal counsel is, we have to rule a 16 certain way all the time. 17 Something like this happened 18 before in the Southwest School District, 19 and they were able to appeal and get it on 20 the ballot on time. I think with your 21 explanation you may be able to reverse 22 that. 23 At this point we don't have a 24 choice but to offer it to the Staff.

1 MR. SUMMERS: Again, I thank you 2 for letting me come down here to speak. 3 We probably will follow that 4 process. Again, I certainly understand 5 what your obligations are to the taxpayers 6 and what your obligations are as members 7 of the Board of Elections as well. I also 8 appreciate that. Thank you. 9 MR. WHITE: We are here to work 10 with you through this process, but we have 11 statutes we have to follow. 12 MR. SUMMERS: It is what it is. 13 Thank you. 14 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: You are 15 welcome. Thank you. 16 MR. WHITE: We need to certify 17 the issues first and the options next. 18 MS. COTTON: You can combine 19 them all together. 20 MR. WHITE: That's fine. 21 We need a motion to certify the 22 issues recommended in our packet. 23 MS. HOWELL: All issues on the 24 list with the exception of the Westerville

1 Public Library. 2 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I move that 3 the Westerville Public Library be excluded 4 from this motion as an insufficient 5 ballot. 6 I move that the Board certify to 7 the May primary and Special Election 8 ballot all issues that were timely filed 9 and found to be valid and sufficient and 10 the options. 11 Is there a second? 12 MS. PETREE: I second it. 13 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All in favor, 14 say aye. 15 (Unanimous aye.) 16 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: The motion 17 carries. 18 MS. HOWELL: Do you want to 19 certify the Columbus Local Options for the 20 November election? 21 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I move that 22 we certify the Columbus Local Options, 23 options 76-D and then three sets of 24 82-Gs, a total of six, to the November
