4 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I would like
5 to call the Franklin County Board of
6 Elections meeting to order.

7 May we have a roll call?

8 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Mr. Colley?

9 MR. COLLEY: Here.

10 MR. DAMSCHROEDER:

11 Ms. Marinello?

12 MS. MARINELLO: Here.

13 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Ms. Petree?

14 MS. PETREE: Here.

15 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: And Chairman

16 Anthony?

17 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Here.

18 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: All members

19 present.

20 Mr. Chairman and members of the
21 Board, the first item on the agenda is to
22 address a resolution that was enacted by
23 the Franklin County Commissioners
24 yesterday morning. The resolution

1 requests the removal of the Senior Options
2 levy from this spring's Primary and
3 General Election ballot.

4 As you know had the Senior
5 Options levy remained on the ballot, about
6 700 precincts in this county would be open
7 just for the purpose of voting on that
8 single question. The Commissioners felt
9 that it was in the interest of fiscal
10 prudence to remove that question from the
11 ballot this spring and cast ballots on it
12 this fall when all precincts would be open
13 and not just for this issue. This
14 resolution for the Board to accept the
15 request of the Commissioners is really a
16 formality.

17 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I will
18 entertain a motion.

19 MS. PETREE: Mr. Chairman, I
20 move to remove the Senior Options levy
21 from the May 7th, 2007 Primary and General
22 Election ballot pursuant to the request of
23 the Franklin County Commissioners.

24 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there a

1 second?

2 MS. MARINELLO: I second.

3 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in
4 favor, say aye.

5 (Unanimous aye.)

6 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: The motion
7 carries.

8 The next section of the agenda
9 has to do with two letters that were
10 received by the Board from candidates who
11 filed petitions seeking the office of a
12 member of Columbus Board of Education.

13 The first letter is from Joy
14 Marshall, who was a candidate for Columbus
15 Board of Education. In her letter she
16 basically asked for an appeal to the
17 finding of insufficient valid signatures
18 due to lack of voter participation and
19 opportunity as many registered voters were
20 denied a voice and participation in the
21 electoral process because of a change of
22 address, and in addition many voters were
23 denied because the signature did not match
24 exactly that used in registration.

1 Based upon the foregoing request
2 of the appeal against certification of her
3 on the ballot the Board staff has reviewed
4 the petitions that was submitted by
5 Ms. Marshall and it is still the opinion
6 of Staff -- and we are talking the County
7 Prosecuting Attorney's Office -- that the
8 reasons outlined in the recommendation by
9 Staff for disqualification of signatures
10 based on deciding how many had registered
11 not being registered at the address shown
12 on the petition as the address the voter
13 was registered at, signers printing their
14 name, signers living outside the district,
15 signers not including addresses, all of
16 those are inconsistent with law as
17 directed by the Secretary of State's
18 Petition Requirements and Candidate
19 Qualifications Guide.

20 I don't know if Ms. Marshall is
21 here today and would like to speak.

22 (No audible response)

23 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: If not, the
24 request for the Board's consideration is

1 to put her back on the ballot, but the
2 Staff's recommendation would be not to.

3 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Is there
4 anyone here representing Ms. Marshall?

5 (No audible response)

6 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: The next
7 candidate who filed a letter asking the
8 Board to reconsider its decision against
9 certification is Weirdella Shawna Gibbs.

10 The question at the time of the
11 last Board meeting was that the name that
12 appeared on the petition was inconsistent
13 with the name that Ms. Gibbs had provided
14 on her registration. At the time it was
15 the Staff's recommendation to deny
16 certification for that reason.

17 It is my understanding that
18 Ms. Gibbs is here today and represented by
19 counsel. I think it would be appropriate
20 to have Mr. McTigue make a presentation to
21 the Board at this time.

22 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes, sir.

23 MR. MCTIGUE: Good afternoon. I
24 am Don McTigue.

1 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Good
2 afternoon.

3 MR. MCTIGUE: Mr. Chairman and
4 members of the Board, as the Director
5 said, the original Staff recommendation
6 was based on an inconsistency in name on
7 the petition and the registration form for
8 Ms. Gibbs.

9 Ms. Gibbs' registration form has
10 her first name, which is Weirdella; and
11 then I believe it had the middle initial
12 L, which is LaRay or stands for LaRay, and
13 the last name Gibbs. The petition is
14 signed W. Shawna Gibbs.

15 What was not known at that time
16 by the Board Staff is that Shawna is
17 actually part of her lawful name and not
18 recently but the day she was born. We
19 have her birth certificate, and you should
20 have copies of that.

21 The birth certificate is a
22 little unusual in that she has five names,
23 Weirdella LaRay Shawna Marie Gibbs.
24 I think that -- and I hope I am not being

1 unfair here, but I think that if the Staff
2 had had this information prior to the
3 Board's meeting that you may have had a
4 different recommendation last time,
5 because there is nothing in the law that
6 says you have to put your name on a
7 petition and sign it.

8 The law doesn't actually say you
9 can't use variations of your full name.
10 The law doesn't say you have to register
11 your whole name.

12 In fact the Secretary of State's
13 guidelines on filling out petitions states
14 that the name a candidate uses in the
15 statement of candidacy may be any
16 combination of the first and middle names
17 or initials; but then what it says on
18 nicknames is you can only use natural
19 derivatives.

20 We are not talking about a
21 nickname here. Shawna is her name. So
22 she used the initial on the petition, W,
23 she used Shawna, which is a middle name.
24 She has a couple of different middle

1 names. She used her middle name and she
2 used her last name.

3 Plus at the time she filed her
4 petition she filled out the card that the
5 Board asks all candidates to fill out as
6 to how they would like their name to
7 appear on the ballot. She writes, "I
8 would like my name to appear as W. Shawna
9 Gibbs. I am registered as Weirdella
10 Gibbs." She actually signed it Weirdella
11 Gibbs here.

12 At the time she filed her
13 petition, the Board had who this person
14 was. That matches her registration as
15 well.

16 Although she signed it that way,
17 when the Board took her money, the Board
18 filled out a receipt for her as Shawna
19 Gibbs. And it should also be noted that
20 if you compared the signature on the
21 petition, the W and the Gibbs, compare
22 that to the signature on the voter
23 registration card, they match. It's the
24 same handwriting. I don't think there is

1 any question that it's the same person.

2 I would cite, one, there is not
3 a whole lot of case law on this point.
4 Maybe that's because the law, again,
5 doesn't say that you have to put your full
6 name.

7 One case in particular that some
8 of the Board members may remember, or
9 maybe this was before any of you were on
10 the Board, it's an Ohio Supreme Court case
11 Green versus Casey. In that case the
12 Supreme Court said with regard to defects
13 in names that the standard for reviewing
14 technical defects in the declaration of
15 candidacy and petition papers is whether
16 the defect would cause the signer who
17 signed that petition to be deceived or
18 misled.

19 In fact if she had probably
20 filled it out as Weirdella Gibbs that
21 would have confused and misled people
22 because no one calls her Weirdella Gibbs.

23 She was born in Columbus 33
24 years ago. Her friends, her family, her

1 co-workers, her colleagues, her bosses,
2 her neighbors, everybody calls her Shawna
3 Gibbs. You could probably count on one
4 hand the number of people who even know
5 what her first name is.

6 She is running for School Board.
7 She went through twelve years of school in
8 Columbus Public Schools and every single
9 teacher called her Shawna, not Weirdella.

10 I would also point out just to
11 back up what I have just said, we have a
12 couple of exhibits. One is her business
13 card, her employment. On every business
14 card she has ever had -- she is with the
15 Girl Scouts right now as Director of
16 Public Relations -- it says W. Shawna
17 Gibbs.

18 E-mail -- I guess e-mail is
19 really how we determine a name now. Her
20 e-mail is wshawna@coho.org. Her previous
21 employment was at Comocko with a picture
22 of W. Shawna Gibbs. Her checking account
23 has always been and still is W. Shawna
24 Gibbs. When she pays her bills she pays

1 as W. Shawna Gibbs.

2 So within the community she has
3 always used the name open and notoriously
4 Shawna Gibbs or W. Shawna Gibbs. That's
5 how people know her. No one is misled by
6 the way she filled out the petition.

7 Based on all this I would ask
8 that you respectfully reconsider your
9 decision and certify her petition for the
10 ballot.

11 Ms. Gibbs is here if any member
12 of the Board would like to ask some
13 questions.

14 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Thank you.

15 Any questions for legal counsel?

16 Ms. Gibbs, would you like to say
17 anything?

18 MS. GIBBS: Mr. Chairman and
19 members of the Board of Elections, just
20 very short and sweet, I thank you for the
21 opportunity to appeal this decision. As
22 Mr. McTigue said, I have been here 33
23 years born and raised. You may have seen
24 me on TV and numerous places as W. Shawna

1 Gibbs.

2 I just hope that with the
3 evidence that was presented today that you
4 will consider this petition favorably and
5 that I can continue to work on behalf of
6 the students, their families and the staff
7 of Columbus Public Schools. Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Thank you.

9 Any questions of Ms. Gibbs?

10 (No audible response)

11 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Any

12 discussion?

13 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: I would add,
14 Mr. Chairman, as Mr. McTigue did raise the
15 notation from the Petition Requirements
16 and Candidate Qualifications Guide from
17 the Secretary of State. Prior to the
18 meeting I spoke with Nick Soulas, the
19 Assistant Prosecuting Attorney in the
20 Prosecutor's Office.

21 It was his advice or at the
22 conclusion of his research that there was
23 nothing in the law that either precluded
24 or supported the placement of Ms. Gibbs on

1 the ballot based on the situation and the
2 difference between the name by which she
3 was registered and the name she placed on
4 her petition, and that if the Board either
5 tied or voted against placement, that it
6 was likely the Secretary of State would
7 break the tie in favor of ballot access as
8 would the courts under the substantial
9 compliance doctrine.

10 So in his opinion the Board
11 should gave her ballot access. And if
12 that was not enough, to avoid unnecessary
13 litigation it was almost certain to be
14 filed against the Board.

15 It was his recommendation to put
16 Ms. Gibbs on the ballot as a candidate for
17 Columbus School Board, using the name W.
18 Shawna Gibbs.

19 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Any
20 discussion or questions for Matt?

21 I just want to go on the record
22 to say I have known her since she was a
23 very tiny girl. Her dad's name was Weir
24 Don. She was fortunate enough to take her

1 dad's name, so now if nobody knew it they
2 will know now.

3 At this point I would like to
4 make a motion. I move that the Board
5 certify Weirdella L. Shawna Gibbs to the
6 ballot as a candidate for Member of the
7 Columbus School Board of Education for a
8 full term.

9 Is there a second?

10 MS. MARINELLO: Second.

11 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in
12 favor, say aye.

13 (Unanimous aye)

14 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: The motion
15 carries.

16 We should probably have a
17 separate motion, Mr. Chairman, on how she
18 will appear on the ballot.

19 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I make a
20 motion that she will appear on the ballot
21 as W. Shawna Gibbs.

22 Is there a second?

23 MS. MARINELLO: Second.

24 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All those in

1 favor, say aye.

2 (Unanimous aye)

3 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: The motion
4 carries.

5 It might also be good to note
6 for the record, Mr. Chairman, that the
7 Board may want to ask Ms. Gibbs to amend
8 her voter registration so we don't run
9 into this issue in the future.

10 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Have you done
11 that?

12 Have you amended your voter
13 registration form?

14 MR. MCTIGUE: We are about to do
15 that.

16 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Thank you.
17 (Ms. Gibbs and Mr. McTigue
18 exit.)

19 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: The next item
20 on the agenda, Mr. Chairman and members of
21 the Board, is a generic issue relative to
22 approval of travel reimbursement for the
23 Director.

24 I was asked to serve on a

1 committee for one day in Washington, D.C.,
2 with the United States Elections Systems
3 Commission on the committee they have to
4 develop Best Practices for Early Voting
5 and Absentee Voting. All of the expenses
6 for that travel were paid for by the U.S.
7 Elections System Commission except for my
8 time, which I didn't charge the Board
9 overtime for.

10 The other request is, I was
11 asked last Friday by Minority members of
12 the House Committee on Administration to
13 testify yesterday before their Elections
14 Subcommittee on top of House Bill 811, an
15 election reform bill that among other
16 things federally mandates voter verifiable
17 paper audit trails, as well as creates a
18 separate elections bureaucracy in addition
19 to the Board of Elections run by the State
20 Auditor to audit all the elections that
21 the Board runs and certifies.

22 I was there testifying on
23 Franklin County's experience using the
24 VVPAT in the 15 congressional districts.

1 I am providing each Board member a copy of
2 that testimony.

3 I would seek to have both of
4 those activities deemed by the Board as a
5 proper purpose to receive my normal day's
6 compensation as well as travel
7 reimbursement.

8 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Any
9 discussion or questions?

10 (No audible response)

11 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Matt, we
12 really appreciate your doing that. I saw
13 you on TV. I think you represented us
14 very well and we certainly appreciate it.

15 I move that to authorize as a
16 proper public purpose the Director's
17 travel expenses to Washington, D.C. to
18 participate in EAC's Best Practices for
19 Early and Absentee Voting Committee and to
20 provide testimony at the request of the
21 House Committee on Administration
22 regarding HR 811.

23 Is there a second?

24 MS. PETREE: I second.

1 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: All in favor,
2 say aye.

3 (Unanimous aye)

4 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: The motion
5 carries.

6 Thank you for allowing me the
7 opportunity to participate.

8 MR. WHITE: It puts us on the
9 map.

10 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Denny and I
11 would like the Board to go into executive
12 session to discuss some personnel matters.

13 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I move that
14 the Board go into executive session for
15 discussing personnel matters.

16 Is there a second?

17 MS. MARINELLO: Second.

18 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Mr. Colley?

19 MR. COLLEY: Yes.

20 MR. DAMSCHROEDER:

21 Ms. Marinello?

22 MS. MARINELLO: Yes.

23 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Ms. Petree?

24 MS. PETREE: Yes.

1 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: And Chairman
2 Anthony?

3 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes.

4 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: We are in
5 executive session.

6 (Brief break in proceedings)

7 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: I move that
8 we come out of executive session. No
9 votes were taken and no business was
10 conducted.

11 Is there a second?

12 MS. PETREE: Second.

13 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Mr. Colley?

14 MR. COLLEY: Yes.

15 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Ms.

16 Marinello?

17 MS. MARINELLO: Yes.

18 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: Ms. Petree?

19 MS. PETREE: Yes.

20 MR. DAMSCHROEDER: And Chairman

21 Anthony?

22 CHAIRMAN ANTHONY: Yes.

23 With no further agenda coming
24 before the Board, is there a motion to


I received your letter on Saturday, March 3. Thank you for informing me of your decision regarding my petitions. I am very disappointed with this error.

Therefore your name will not be placed on the 2007 Primary Ballot. If you should have any questions or if we might be of service to you, please do not hesitate to contact us.

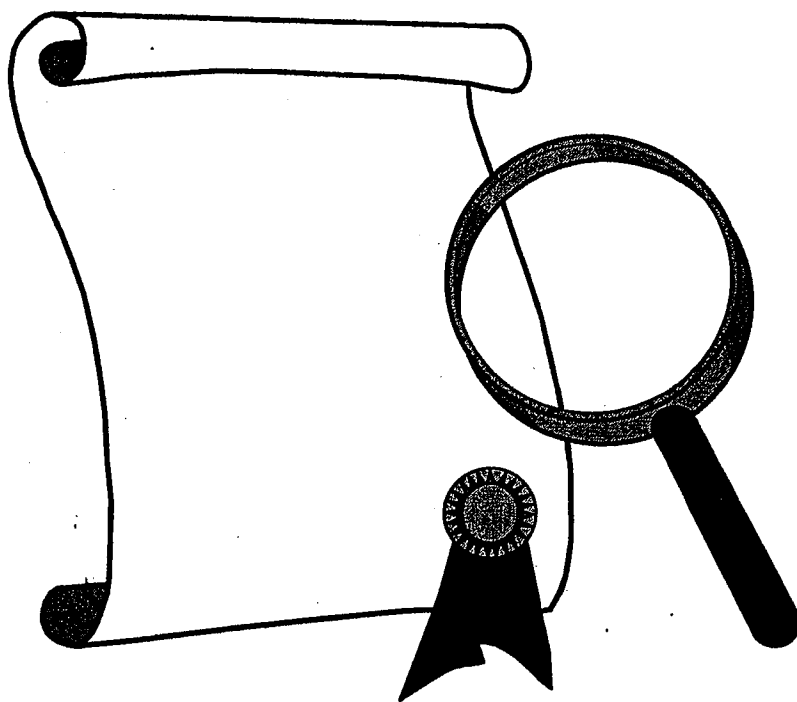

2. Signature Requirement - Intermediate and Minor Political Parties

The minimum number of signatures required for a declaration of candidacy for party nomination or election as a candidate of an intermediate or minor political party is one-half the number required for candidate of a major political party, except for state central committee, which shall be the same as for a major party.

R.C. 3513.05

3. Determination of Candidate Qualifications: A Two-Step Process

a. Is the Candidate's Petition Completed Properly?

- (1) The statement of candidacy must be completed, signed in ink, and dated by the candidate *before* any signatures of electors may be added to the petition.
- (2) An independent or nonpartisan candidate filing a nominating petition may list up to five persons who have consented to serve as a committee to represent the candidate. This committee would be called upon to fill the vacancy created by the candidate's withdrawal prior to the 76th day, or death prior to the 10th day, before the general election. A petition shall not be invalidated because a committee has not been named on the part-petition.
- (3) The name a candidate uses in the statement of candidacy may be any combination of the first and middle names or initials or a nickname, but only if it is a natural derivative from the candidate's given name; i.e., "Bill" for "William," but not "Shorty" for "John."
- (4) "Voting residence address" and "post office box" are *not* synonymous and cannot be used interchangeably.
- (5) Multiple copies of the petition with the completed statement of candidacy, including the candidate's signature, may be photocopied before the signatures of electors are placed thereon. Original petitions from which the photocopies were made must accompany all petitions at the time of filing. Statements signed and dated on two or more different dates may be accepted as one petition. However, the signatures contained on each part-petition must be obtained on or after the date appearing in the statement of candidacy.
- (6) Determining party affiliation of primary (partisan) candidates:
 - A person who either does not currently hold elective office, or holds a nonpartisan office, may be a candidate in a party primary regardless of how that person voted in any prior primary election. For example, a person who voted in the 2000 Republican primary may be a candidate in a Democratic primary in 2001 and 2002.
 - An elected office holder may be a candidate in a party primary even if he or she voted in another party's primary in the current year or the two preceding calendar years, if the office holder files a "Declaration of Intent to Change Political Party Affiliation" (Form No. 10Y) with the appropriate board of elections by 4 p.m. on
