- 1 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: We will circulate
- 2 the acknowledgment.
- 3 The second item on the agenda, we have
- 4 a challenge of right to vote/correction of
- 5 registration lists. The challenge was submitted
- 6 by Brian Smith against a Dian Williams. It is the
- 7 same address as Mr. Smith. Our records show Dian
- 8 Williams has never voted. It is not an ACORN, and
- 9 there just has been no recommendation. So it is
- 10 the staff's recommendation that we cancel Dian
- 11 Williams' registration at that 1793 Franklin
- 12 Avenue address.
- MS. MARINELLO: I move that the Board
- 14 grant the challenge of right to vote and
- 15 correction of registration list filed by Mr. Brian
- 16 Smith at 1793 Franklin Avenue, Columbus, Ohio,
- 17 43205, against Dian Williams of 1793 Franklin
- 18 Avenue, Columbus, Ohio, 43205, and order that Dian
- 19 Williams' registration be immediately canceled in
- 20 Franklin County and the name stricken from the
- 21 registration list.
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

- 1 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: The third item on
- 2 the agenda is referral of possible voter fraud
- 3 cases to the prosecuting attorney. There are four
- 4 referrals that we are recommending the Board
- 5 approve for referral. They range from a variety
- 6 of elections. One is from 2004 when we were doing
- 7 the do checklists in our voter registration
- 8 department, there is concern about double voting.
- 9 To the best of our knowledge, there is no statute
- 10 of limitations, so this would be an '04 case that
- 11 we would still -- we would be referring.
- 12 Another case is from March of '08,
- 13 another double voting that the circumstances
- 14 appeared to have some concerns.
- And then we also had an incident from
- 16 this most recent general election that we would
- 17 suggest referring where we had an individual, we
- 18 questioned if they were properly registered prior
- 19 to casting the ballot at Vets.
- MR. COLLEY: Mr. Chairman, I move that
- 21 the Board, based on the recommendation of the
- 22 director and deputy director, refer the most
- 23 recent possible voter registration and/or fraud
- 24 cases to the prosecuting attorney for further

- 1 action.
- MS. MARINELLO: Second.
- 3 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- 4 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 5 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Next is the
- 6 procurement policy. As you are all aware, the
- 7 Board adopted a procurement policy on May 21st.
- 8 In consultation with the prosecutor's office, the
- 9 threshold amount for competitive bidding was too
- 10 high, so they have asked -- or we're recommending
- 11 that we amend the policy to reflect the lower
- 12 threshold of \$10,000 and to make the policy
- 13 effective today.
- MR. MAS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the
- 15 Board implement the procurement policy adopted on
- 16 May 21st, 2009, effective July 1st, and that the
- 17 reference to the amount of \$25,000 in Section 1,
- 18 Paragraph C, triggering a competitive bid be
- 19 amended to \$10,000, pursuant to Revised Code
- 20 3501.301.
- MR. COLLEY: Mr. Chairman, I second the
- 22 motion.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

- 1 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: The next item in
- 2 your packet is correspondence with FirstCall
- 3 Solutions. We have been working on the terms of
- 4 the contract on whether or not their services are
- 5 required. Based on the recommendation of the
- 6 Prosecuting Attorney's Office, the letter is the
- 7 current status; and it is our recommendation, at
- 8 least for the Board to memorialize, proceeding
- 9 with this termination of the service agreement.
- 10 If there are any questions, I will be
- 11 more than happy to address this.
- 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Could you tell us a
- 13 little bit about this, William.
- MR. DAMSCHRODER: These were two
- 15 contracts going back to, actually, when Barb Cash
- 16 was the director of the Board of Elections. One
- 17 was for an automated outbound calling system to
- 18 deliver automated messages to poll workers.
- The other was an automated attendant
- 20 system and voting location lookup system that was
- 21 made obsolete by the procurement by the County
- 22 Commissioners last year of a newer, faster,
- 23 updated system that has a great deal more
- 24 capabilities.

- 1 So the Prosecutor's Office, we asked
- 2 them to assist in the negotiation of the
- 3 termination of the contracts of these two service
- 4 items that are no longer needed by the Board.
- 5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right. Very
- 6 well.
- 7 MS. MARINELLO: I move the Board
- 8 authorize the director and deputy director to
- 9 terminate all service agreements with FirstCall
- 10 Solutions for the terms advised by the Prosecuting
- 11 Attorney's office.
- MR. COLLEY: Second the motion?
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: The next item on
- 16 the agenda is the voting machine allocation for
- 17 August 4th, 2009. Given the success with the
- 18 allocation formula we had for the primary of this
- 19 year, we are suggesting and recommending we
- 20 allocate the same amount for single precincts,
- 21 which is a minimum of three; and then based on the
- 22 amount of precincts at that location we increase,
- 23 we are adding additional machines for
- 24 South-Western City School Districts that we saw a

- 1 higher turnout and activity rate from -- in the
- 2 May primary.
- 3 So it is our staff's recommendation
- 4 that we allocate 1,270 machines for the primary --
- 5 or for the special.
- 6 MR. MAS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the
- 7 Board approve the recommendation of the director
- 8 and deputy director to allocate 1,270 ES&S DRE
- 9 iVotronic machines for the August 4th special
- 10 election.
- MR. COLLEY: Mr. Chairman, I second the
- 12 motion.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 15 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Next item is in
- 16 reference to Pickaway County voters for the August
- 17 4th, 2009, special. We wanted the Board to be
- 18 aware and to memorialize in the record that
- 19 Pickaway County voters for the special have been
- 20 temporarily assigned to Franklin County precinct
- 21 for the special, and they have the South-Western
- 22 City School issue on their ballot. It is one
- 23 precinct. Rather than have Pickaway open
- everything, it is not uncommon that we absorb, for

- 1 a certain election, voters. So we have worked
- with the Secretary of State's office and Pickaway
- 3 County's Board of Elections to make this happen.
- 4 Next, in your packet you will find
- 5 Directive 2009-08 from Secretary of State's Office
- 6 regarding poll worker compensation.
- 7 Given the dialogue and some of the
- 8 confusion, the deputy director and I encouraged
- 9 the Board to enter into agreement with a
- 10 memorandum of understanding or resolution with the
- 11 Board of Commissioners about increasing the poll
- 12 worker pay. It has been the practice of the Board
- of Elections to pay the highest per diem allowed
- 14 as provided in Secretary of State directives, so
- that would increase to \$133.72.
- MS. MARINELLO: I move that we instruct
- 17 the Director and Deputy Director to notify the
- 18 Franklin County Board of Commissioners pursuant to
- 19 Revised Code 3501.28(E) that the Franklin County
- 20 Board of Elections intends to increase per diem
- 21 poll worker pay effective January 1st, 2010, from
- \$120.82 per election day to \$133.72 per election
- 23 day, as provided in the Secretary of State
- 24 Directive 2009-08.

- 1 MR. COLLEY: Second.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 4 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: The next item, we
- 5 have two grant agreements that have been
- 6 prescribed by the Secretary of State's Office.
- 7 The first is for online poll worker training in
- 8 the amount of \$15,000. That is for those poll
- 9 workers that will be working for the special
- 10 election to go online or receive the \$10 extra
- 11 dollars on top of their fee. It is something we
- 12 did in the primary. We had success. We are
- 13 actually the county with the most participation
- 14 with the Secretary of State's online program.
- The other grant is for grant money for
- in-person poll worker training, and that is to
- 17 address ADA issues during the training, and that
- 18 grant is in the amount of \$7,700, and we're
- 19 seeking the Board's approval, since you all get
- the pleasure of signing the grants, as well.
- MR. MAS: Yes. And, Mr. Chairman, I
- 22 have had the pleasure of learning about how these
- 23 grants work a couple of weeks ago in the Secretary
- 24 of State's training.

1 Mr. Chairman, at this time I'd move

- 2 that the Board adopt as submitted the grant
- 3 agreements drafted by the Ohio Secretary of
- 4 State's Office for '09 poll worker training and
- 5 in-person poll worker training.
- 6 MR. COLLEY: Second.
- 7 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 9 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: The next item is
- to seek the necessary and proper supplemental
- 11 appropriations for the special election. We still
- 12 currently are going forth digging into our monies
- 13 that were allocated for the general election of
- 14 this year and seeking authorization to petition
- the Commissioners for the supplemental funds to
- 16 cover this expense so it is on their plate now and
- 17 not later.
- MR. MAS: Indeed. And on that topic,
- 19 Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board authorize the
- 20 Director and Deputy Director to petition the
- 21 Franklin County Board of Commissioners for
- 22 supplemental funding to cover the necessary and
- 23 proper expenses of the Board of Elections.
- MS. MARINELLO: Second.

1 MR. DAMSCHRODER: As the Board will

- 2 remember at the previous meeting, we tied on two
- 3 different resolutions. One was for kind of a
- 4 minimal absolute rock of bare-bones election
- 5 budget of about \$725,000 covering most of the poll
- 6 worker pay for the August election, seasonal
- 7 employees, delivery of the voting machines, and
- 8 the like.
- 9 The other resolution was for that
- 10 amount plus a mailing to all active registered
- 11 voters in the City of Columbus with an unsolicited
- 12 absentee ballot application similar to what we did
- in the primary and general elections in 2008.
- 14 The Secretary of State broke those tie
- 15 votes by rejecting both resolutions, and
- 16 particularly as it related to the resolution to
- 17 mail absentee ballot applications. The Secretary
- 18 cited equal protection concerns for the couple
- 19 thousand Columbus voters that live in Delaware and
- 20 Fairfield Counties.
- 21 Interestingly enough, the Secretary of
- 22 State did not raise those equal protection
- 23 concerns last year when she broke a tie vote
- 24 telling Franklin County we open extra hours on

- 1 weekends, but didn't tell overlapping counties --
- 2 Delaware, Union, Fairfield, Lincoln, Madison and
- 3 the entirety of the Seventh Congressional District
- 4 -- to also be open those same hours. So it was a
- 5 concern this year, but not a concern last year.
- But be that as it may, the Secretary of
- 7 State did direct Michael and I to talk to our
- 8 colleagues in Delaware and Fairfield County on the
- 9 subject of mailing absentee ballot applications in
- 10 order to eliminate the equal protection concern,
- in the event that this Board revisited the issue
- 12 and wanted to do the mailing for the August
- 13 election consistent with our request for the
- 14 Commissioners in the past for funding that they
- 15 rejected and that we have done in 2008 and the
- 16 general election of '06.
- So we did have those conversations,
- 18 Michael and I drove to Delaware and drove down to
- 19 Fairfield County. The Board in Delaware County
- 20 voted three to zero, and one board member
- 21 abstaining, to do the mailing, if Franklin County
- 22 did the mailing so that the Delaware County voters
- 23 in the City of Columbus would be properly
- 24 protected, equally protected.

- 1 We had the same conversation in
- 2 Fairfield County, and that board voted four to
- 3 zero to do the mailing if Franklin County did it
- 4 in order to equally protect their voters. So
- 5 that's kind of just a quick reminder of the status
- 6 of that. And Michael and I are prepared to do
- 7 whatever the Board asks us to do.
- 8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Very nice. All
- 9 right. The -- well, on this side of the -- the
- 10 parties were divided by bipartisan board, we tried
- 11 and failed to -- having tied on the matter of
- 12 sending absentee ballot applications to all
- 13 eligible Columbus voters.
- And inasmuch as the hour grows late,
- 15 and in the interest of allowing the professional
- 16 staff here and all of the workers to proceed in
- 17 conducting an effective election, special election
- 18 brought to us by our friends down at City Hall,
- 19 and inasmuch as the County Commissioners have
- 20 twice rejected our requests for supplemental
- 21 funding to extend the absentee ballot
- 22 applications, and the pressure from City Hall,
- 23 which is perhaps unofficial, but still felt in
- various parts of the community, in having been

- 1 rejected by the Secretary of State, I am going to
- 2 not push the issue further at this point so that
- 3 we can proceed.
- 4 In anticipation of another series of
- 5 perhaps disagreements and delays, let's -- I am
- 6 not going to bring up the issue, and I don't think
- 7 Michael is going to either. So those are my
- 8 thoughts on the matter.
- 9 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: There is a motion
- 10 and a second.
- 11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Any more discussion?
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Take a vote. All
- in favor?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Next, the staff
- 16 recommends that the Board move into executive
- 17 session to consider the appointment, employment,
- 18 and/or compensation of a public employee.
- MR. MAS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the
- 20 Board adjourn into executive session to consider
- 21 the appointment, employment, and/or compensation
- 22 of a public employee.
- MS. MARINELLO: Second.
- 24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We will go into

- 1 executive session.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Roll call vote.
- 3 Mr. Colley?
- 4 MR. COLLEY: Yes.
- 5 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Chairman Preisse?
- 6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.
- 7 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Mr. Mas?
- MR. MAS: Yes.
- 9 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Ms. Marinello?
- MS. MARINELLO: Yes.
- 11 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: In executive
- 12 session.
- 13 (Board went into executive session.)
- 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We will come back
- into public session. And for the record, I would
- 16 like to state that no motions were made, nor votes
- 17 taken, during our executive session.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Roll call vote.
- 19 Mr. Colley?
- MR. COLLEY: Yes.
- 21 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Chairman Preisse?
- 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Mr. Mas?
- MR. MAS: Yes.

- 1 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Ms. Marinello?
- 2 MS. MARINELLO: Yes.
- 3 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Next item is the
- 4 hiring of the -- for the IT position. It is the
- 5 staff's recommendation to hire Dennis Landuyt for
- 6 the IT vacancy.
- 7 MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 8 the Board hire Dennis Landuyt as the assistant
- 9 database manager, effective July 13th, 2009, at
- 10 the hourly rate of \$29.
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 14 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: It is also the
- 15 staff's recommendation that we provide courtesy
- 16 temporary parking for handicapped spots out in the
- 17 Memorial Hall parking lot to Peggy Howell and
- 18 Darlene Tompkins.
- 19 MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 20 the Board pay for the temporary parking of Peggy
- 21 Howell and Darlene Tompkins in the Memorial Hall
- 22 parking lot.
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.

- 1 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 2 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Second-to-last
- 3 item, I believe in all of your packets were the
- 4 current mission statement and a couple of
- 5 alternatives. The internal staff committee that
- 6 is reviewing the mission statements and employee
- 7 handbook asked that these be circulated to you all
- 8 and for any input that you may have.
- 9 Not looking to a recommendation at this
- 10 point in time, but wanted any Board input that
- 11 could be there, so you are all aware of it.
- And then the final issue is it is the
- 13 staff's recommendation to cancel the meeting --
- 14 regularly scheduled meeting for July 6th, since we
- 15 have met on July 1st. Are there any questions?
- 16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Not very patriotic
- 17 of you.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: We are meeting in
- 19 July.
- 20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That's true.
- MR. COLLEY: Will be happy to meet on
- 22 the 4th, if you would prefer.
- 23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I won't push it any
- 24 farther.

- MR. MAS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the
- 2 Board cancel this regularly scheduled meeting of
- 3 Monday, July 6th, 2009. The Board would hold its
- 4 next meeting at either at the call of the Chairman
- or two Board members or August 3rd, 2009.
- 6 MR. COLLEY: Second.
- 7 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- 8 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 9 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: At that, there are
- 10 no items from the staff.
- 11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Then we will
- 12 be adjourned.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: Motion to adjourn.
- 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move we be
- 15 adjourned.
- MS. MARINELLO: Second.
- 17 DIRECTOR STINZIANO: All in favor.
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DIRECTOR STINZIANO: We are adjourned.
