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1 2 PROCEEDINGS 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: I would like to call 5 the Franklin County Board of Elections meeting to I'll do the roll call. 6 7 Kimberly Marinello? 8 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here. 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Zachary Manifold? 10 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Here. 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Douglas Preisse? 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We have a quorum. The first item on the agenda would be to 14 15 approve the minutes of the March 5th, 2012 meeting of 16 the Franklin County Board of Elections. 17 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I 18 move the Board approve the minutes of the March 5th, 19 2012 meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections 20 as submitted. 21 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Second. 22 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor, say 23 aye. 24 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: That's being passed around.

The second order of business, I guess we're going to have some discussion. We had two withdrawals of candidacy prior to the certification and they were W. Carlton Weddington, the 25th House seat in the Primary Election, and Al Donahey running for the 19th Seat of the Ohio House.

I sent to the Prosecutor -- I guess we need an opinion as to whether -- since they withdrew prior to certification, do the parties -- can the parties appoint their replacement, and we are waiting to try to figure out what that answer is, and they weren't able to get it to us as of this time.

The Chairman has asked that we remove those two names from being certified today, waiting on the opinion from our legal -- from the Prosecutor, and then maybe meeting again prior to the 27th if we have to, so there was some discussion.

And if you want to jump in and -
MR. ANDERSON: Well, we've -
DIRECTOR ANTHONY: -- let these guys know.

MR. ANDERSON: We've looked at the issue and we don't see a reason that the certification can't

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be done. We have asked for an opinion from the legal staff of the Secretary of State's office and haven't gotten that legal opinion back from their staff yet.
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CHAIRMAN PREISSE: As I understand it, there is no provision in the Code to replace a candidate after the primary and prior to certification. And the analogous situation which comes to my mind is that there is no provision in the Code, I believe, to replace a candidate to the ballot in that other gray zone close to the General Election. There's a point after which you cannot replace a candidate to the ballot.

and there is no monetary transaction that takes place,
you don't get paid for being on those separate
committees, that it was appropriate for the both of
you to vote on that matter and certify the results of
your own election.

MR. ANDERSON: And, further, the Ethics
Commission believes because there is a specific
statutory exemption that allows board members to run
for both County and State Central Committees, that the
legislature envisioned that this potential issue could
come up where you would vote on a certification of
your own, so they do not believe that it would run
afoul of Ohio's ethics laws.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, that's good to hear since we already voted on it.

(Laughter.)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We would have stopped you ahead of time.

MR. ANDERSON: Bill got ahead of me a

little bit, but we needed to make sure we got that on the record.

Drive.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

And that's permissible by Secretary of State directives since machines at our voting locations are not specific to precinct but to that voting location.
