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1 2 PROCEEDINGS 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good afternoon, 5 everyone. I would like to call the Franklin County 6 Board of Elections meeting to order. 7 I will do the roll call. Kimberly 8 Marinello? 9 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here. 10 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Zachary Manifold? 11 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Here. 12 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Chairman Douglas Preisse? 13 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here. 15 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We're all here, sir. 16 The first item on the agenda would be to 17 approve the minutes from the August 20th, August 18 23rd, and September 4th meetings. 19 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I 20 move the Board approve the minutes of the August 21 20th, August 23rd, and September 4th, 2012 meeting of 22 the Franklin County Board of Elections as submitted. 23 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 24 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Second.

1 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And I will be passing 2 that around for everybody to sign. 3 The next item on the agenda --4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: You should 5 probably vote on that. 6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah. 7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: You didn't vote 8 on that. 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Oh, we didn't vote? I'm sorry. It's been properly moved and seconded. 10 11 All those in favor, say aye. 12 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries. Now I 14 can move on. 15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Now you can move 16 on. 17 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All right. The next 18 item on the agenda, we have to have some policies in 19 place in order for us to be able to purchase some 20 This is a good idea to have policies in place items. 21 dealing with consumable purchases that the Board 22 makes and also dealing with the Early Vote Center. 23 So before you are copies of both of those policies. The first one being done with the Health 24

1 and Safety and Personal Consumables Purchase Policy, 2 if you didn't get a chance to look at this, so if you 3 want to take a minute to look at it. 4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Bill, the 5 question is about on the Early Vote Center policy, there is still mention in there of coffee. 6 7 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yes, it is. It's 8 basically to get a coffeemaker. 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Did we -- did Kim buy one or two for here? 10 11 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: I bought two for 12 here. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: But that's not going to be enough for the vote center. At the vote center 14 15 we might have up to 50, 60 employees out there at the vote center for that 35 days and they're pretty much 16 17 stuck in the center and there's no vending. 18 We have to basically put together a vending room for that vote center in order for them 19 20 to be able to -- even if they bring their own food, 21 we have to put a refrigerator and microwave and 22 coffeemaker in that vending room because, if we 23 don't, we're going to have to figure out how to 24 supply that.

1	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Remind me how we ran		
2	afoul or were criticized by, was it the County		
З	Auditor, what we were doing with coffee here?		
4	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: It was, from my		
5	understanding, they found an Attorney General's		
6	opinion from 1986 that basically put limits or		
7	prohibited buying coffee and consumable supplies for		
8	employees. We have been doing it here through		
9	Sanese. They have provided a coffeemaker and the		
10	coffee and we had at that point we really didn't		
11	have a Board policy that said we could do it, it was		
12	just a practice that we had been doing it.		
13	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. They didn't		
14	tell us we couldn't do it; they said we needed to		
15	have a policy.		
16	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We needed to have a		
17	policy.		
18	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So you're suggesting		
19	for the extraordinary circumstances of the time limit		
20	and the concentration		
21	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The vote center.		
22	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. I understand.		
23	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And see, what we		
24	didn't want to see happen, what happened with Sanese,		

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they ended up not being paid for seven months or nine 1 2 months, for a long time. CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Got it. I'm 3 4 convinced. 5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: And what we have 6 actually looked at doing in the case of the Early 7 Vote Center, our finance folks have looked into 8 actually renting some of the stuff if it makes more 9 sense to do that --10 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Right. 11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: -- to just go 12 ahead and rent it for the compressed time period that 13 we need it instead of buying something, so we are looking into that to make sure we're spending the 14 15 money wisely. 16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Right. 17 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: So that's what that's 18 about. So that's why they broke them up into two 19 policies. 20 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I 21 move the Board adopt the Health and Safety and 22 Personal Consumables Policy drafted by the Board of Elections staff. 23 24 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Second. 2 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor, 3 say aye. 4 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 5 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The next one would be 6 the Early Vote Center Procurement Policy. 7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right. Good. 8 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I 9 move the Board adopt the Early Voting Center Procurement Policy drafted by the Board of Elections 10 11 staff. 12 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 13 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second. 14 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor, 15 say aye. 16 BOARD MEMBERS: Ave. 17 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries. 18 The last item on the agenda is we also 19 hired -- we also want to enter into personal service 20 contracts with two individuals to manage the vote 21 center; it's Fred Stratmann and Don Klco. 22 They've been out there since September 23 the 4th. I neglected to bring it up at that meeting. 24 We had a rather full agenda and, quite frankly, I

1 forgot to include it. You guys got to meet them at 2 the conclusion of the meeting, but we never voted on 3 their personal service agreement. 4 So in your packet is the personal service 5 agreements, it has been vetted by the Prosecutor's 6 office, and gives the Deputy Director and I the 7 authorization to enter into a personal service 8 agreement not to exceed \$10,500. 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: As discussed, and the guys are working, right? 10 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yes. 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And we know both of 13 them to be capable individuals, and the personnel lawyer --14 15 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yes. 16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: -- and the 17 Prosecutor's office has okayed it. DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Yup. 18 19 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And they are also a 20 signer on this as well. 21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I see that, yeah. 22 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I moved that the Board authorize the Director and 23 Deputy Director to execute personal service contracts 24

1 not to exceed \$10,500 each for Fred Stratmann and Don 2 Klco to manage the Early Vote Center located at 1700 Morse Road, Columbus, Ohio. 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 5 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second. 6 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor, 7 say aye. 8 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Motion carries. 10 Is there a motion to adjourn? 11 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I 12 move that we adjourn. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 14 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second. 15 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor? 16 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye. 17 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We stand adjourned. 18 (Thereupon, the proceedings concluded at 19 2:25 p.m.) 20 21 22 23 24
