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4	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good afternoon. I
5	would like to call the Franklin County Board of
6	Elections Special Meeting to order.
7	Roll-call. Kim Marinello.
8	MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.
9	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Zachary Manifold.
10	MEMBER MANIFOLD: Here.
11	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Douglas Preisse.
12	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.
13	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Bradley Sinnott.
14	MEMBER SINNOTT: Here.
15	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We have a quorum,
16	Mr. Chair.
17	First item on the agenda would be the
18	approval of the minutes for the May 6 meeting.
19	MEMBER SINNOTT: Mr. Chairman, I move the
20	Board approve the minutes of the May 6, 2013, meeting
21	of the Franklin County Board of Elections as
22	submitted.
23	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?
24	MEMBER MANIFOLD: Second.

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All those in favor say aye. Motion carries, Mr. Chairman. 2 3 The second item on the agenda is the 4 certification of the May 7 Primary Special Election 5 results. 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: In your packets 7 in front of you you've got a listing of the results 8 put together by staff here at the office that includes both just Franklin County numbers, and 9 10 second and third and fourth packaged together I think are those that are from Franklin County with our 11 12 overlap county races we had too. 13 Any questions about the numbers by the Board? 14 15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Not for me. 16 MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move 17 the Board certify and declare as final the official 18 canvass of votes cast in the May 7, 2013, Primary Special Election submitted by staff. 19 20 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor. 21 MEMBER MANIFOLD: I'll second. 2.2 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second? 23 MEMBER MANIFOLD: I'll second. 24 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor say

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6 1 aye. 2 Mr. Chair, the next item on the agenda --3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Bill, I'm sorry. 4 If I could interject one second, we are going to send 5 around for each member of the Board to sign just the 6 letter that we send over to the Secretary of State's 7 Office certifying the results of our election, three 8 Board Members and one for the Chair and one for you, Bill, as the Director. Pass that along and we can 9 10 move on. 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The next item is the 12 Groveport-Madison School District issue and possible 13 recount. DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We did -- on 14 15 election night this issue was 16 votes different, I believe it was, Jeff, to the no vote. After we 16 included the provisional ballots that could be 17 18 counted and one absentee ballot that was postmarked by the day before election day, came in afterwards, 19 it now stands at 12 votes different so that falls 20 21 within the 1/2 of 1 percent margin necessary for an 2.2 automatic recount so we do need to move forward with an automatic recount on Issue No. 14 which was the 23 24 Groveport-Madison School District levy.

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1	MEMBER SENNOTT: Mr. Chairman, I move the
2	Board set a recount on Issue No. 14, the
3	Groveport-Madison School Tax Levy, to begin May 29 at
4	9 a.m. until completed and that the recount be
5	conducted in accordance to the Secretary of State's
6	Directive 2012-52 and be held simultaneously at both
7	280 East Broad Street and 719 Alum Creek Drive.
8	MR. ANDERSON: 1719.
9	MEMBER SENNOTT: 17
10	MR. ANDERSON: 19, 1719.
11	MEMBER SENNOTT: 1719 Alum Creek Drive.
12	MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.
13	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor.
14	The motion carries.
15	The as a result of that, the next item
16	on the agenda we have to decide which precincts we
17	are going to count, and we've decided we are going to
18	do all 19 precincts.
19	DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: The way a recount
20	works by directive is we pick precincts. We suggest
21	doing voting locations since that's how we have
22	Franklin County set up. We pick voting locations
23	that equal 5 percent at least 5 percent of the
24	total vote for the total number of votes cast in

1 this -- from that race.

2	We then do a hand count on those, match
3	those against the machines to make sure that it is
4	accurate. If it matches, we are then permitted to do
5	the remainder of the recount by electronic means. If
6	it's not, then we have got to do some more hand
7	counting. But it is our recommendation that we use
8	voting locations as we've done in the past for audits
9	for this purpose. So we look for a motion on using
10	voting locations for this; then we select the actual
11	voting locations to use for that 5 percent number.
12	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We need a motion.
13	MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I move
14	that the Board conduct the recount by voting
15	locations using the location number for each of the
16	19 voting locations in the Groveport-Madison School
17	District.
18	MEMBER SENNOTT: Second.
19	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor.
20	Motion carries.
21	DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Now, Mr. Mackey
22	has in his little cup the voting locations that were
23	in the Groveport-Madison School District that we
24	shall have one of you select which locations to use.

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9 1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: How many are we 2 selecting? 3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We have to select 4 a number equal to at least 5 percent of the vote cast 5 in that race for this election. Jeff has a little 6 spreadsheet over here that once we put in that voting 7 location will tell us how many votes were cast in 8 there so we know when we are at the 5 percent 9 threshold. 10 MR. MACKEY: Would the Chairman like to 11 verify all the --12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We should verify that each voting location is included in the count by 13 the number of -- this is per directive that we verify 14 all the numbers of possible locations are in. 15 16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right. We'll do that. 2071, 1157, 1128, 1196, 4017, 2048, 2045, 17 18 1082, 1098, 1115, 1005, 1109, 2011, 1156, 2161, 3058, 2037, 5008, 1155. 19 20 MR. MACKEY: That's all of 19. 21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Jeff, if you 2.2 would like to hold it out. CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That is a tax. Let's 23 24 let a Democrat pick. I'm kidding.

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1	MEMBER MANIFOLD: 2161.
2	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Carol, you are
3	calculating when we get to the 5 percent?
4	MS. GORUP: Yes. 3.29.
5	MEMBER MANIFOLD: 2071.
6	MS. GORUP: Okay. Now, you're over.
7	DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: So we will do the
8	hand count on lids 2161 and 2071 and we'll match
9	against the electronic count and if that matches,
10	then we will do the remainder of the recount via
11	electronic means. That's per directive.
12	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Good.
13	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: That's all we have.
14	MEMBER SENNOTT: Move to adjourn.
15	MEMBER MANIFOLD: Second.
16	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor.
17	We stand adjourned.

19	3:25 p.m.)
