The first one was filed by a Ms. Dena Layman of 1252 Sullivant Avenue in Columbus. 4 5 Is Ms. Layman here at all today? 6 (No response.) 7 MR. WALCH: Okay. She challenged the 8 right to vote on a Mr. Clyde Cunningham, III, purportedly of 1252 Sullivant Avenue. Renee and her 9 staff checked this out and Mr. Cunningham does not 10 live at that address. 11 12 The recommendation of the staff to you is 13 to place the voter in an inactive-other status in our 14 system which would keep them eligible to vote but require the voter to show identification at the polls 15 16 and cast a provisional ballot. 17 Mr. Cunningham has had a previous 18 address; we will also try and contact him at that 19 previous address to try and get this -- him into the 2.0 right place, the right address, but this is the step 2.1 before putting him in a different status so that he 22 does have to prove residency in order to vote. 23 MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, move that 24 the Board place the voter registration of Clyde

MS. MARINELLO: Second. 11 12 MR. ANTHONY: All vote in favor. 13 (All ayes heard.) MR. WALCH: Mr. Directer, if I could have 14 15 just one moment. This wasn't a scheduled item today, 16 I just want to point out there's no action of the 17 Board. Today they had little party in our PEO 18 Department for Penny Gilbert. 19 Penny, stand up and say hi. 2.0 Penny's been one of our seasonals in the 2.1 PEO department. Today's not her last day, she's 22 going to come back for a couple days to help, but 23 since they had a party today and we had a Board 24 meeting on the same day, it just came to me about ten

MS. SHAFFER: I have a question for you.

My name is Paddy Schaffer and I'm the founder of the Ohio Election Justice Campaign and I wanted to ask what happened from last fall.

There was a person from True to Vote who had wanted to use a variety of candidates on their petition for election observers that was blocked at the meeting, which was like the day before the election, and my understanding at that point was that an investigation was supposed to happen with that woman, her name's Jan Bore, and that voter falsification I think would be what we would question was supposed to be pursued and I wondered what happened with that whole situation.

MR. PREISSE: Let me ask Bill and Dan to refresh my memory. I do remember something about

8 1 that. 2 MS. SHAFFER: They were using several 3 candidates for their petition and those candidates had come forward and said they did not want them used 4 and this lore repeatedly kept submitting. 5 MR. HAAS: In fact, they xeroxed names 6 7 and reapplied them to postdated materials. 8 MS. SHAFFER: One was a judge candidate 9 who was at that meeting who also spoke about how 10 appalled she was at having her name continuously used, and those people had contacted the Board and 11 12 let you know repeatedly they did not want to be used 13 for that. MR. WALCH: When it did come to our 14 15 attention that that had happened, as you stated, we 16 did disallow those observers to be placed on Election 17 Day and that was the final disposition of the Board at that time. 18 19 Bill, I don't know if there's been 2.0 anything else since then. 2.1 MR. ANTHONY: I have to look into it. 22 I'm not sure if -- I don't think the Board took any action to send it to the Prosecutor's Office. 23 24 MR. ANDERSON: No. Not to my knowledge.

MR. ANTHONY: So I don't think it was

9 referred to the Prosecutor's Office. 1 2 MS. SHAFFER: We should still be in the 3 statute of limitations. Should not something be done with that? Because it appeared quite offensive to 4 5 those candidates, it appears to be a violation of the 6 law, and shouldn't it come -- I'm not an attorney, 7 but shouldn't it come from you guys and come from you that it should be followed up the same as if a voter 8 voted twice or three times you guys follow up on 9 t.hat.? 10 MR. WALCH: Mr. Chairman, if I may. 11 12 Mr. Director, I defer to counsel on this, but I'm a 13 little uncomfortable with us having too much of a 14 discussion on this today since it's not an item we noticed just for today. So I'll defer to everybody 15 16 else on this, but it being an issue we did not notice 17 for a discussion today --18 MR. PREISSE: Why don't we ask --MR. WALCH: -- I'm a little uncomfortable 19 2.0 continuing a discussion on that. 2.1 MR. PREISSE: Why don't we ask Bill and 22 Dana to dust off the minutes in the record of that 23 meeting and the materials and brief us. Does that 24 make sense? 25 MR. WALCH: Sure.

10 MR. PREISSE: Thanks for bringing the 1 2 I do have a recollection of the issue but 3 I don't remember the Board deciding to take specific action. You suggest that you do. 4 5 MS. SHAFFER: It was my understanding afterwards that an attorney that was there was told 6 7 that you would at the meeting --8 MR. PREISSE: Rather than speculate further, we'll check the records. 9 MS. SHAFFER: I would love that, and I'm 10 11 sorry I didn't ask the question sooner. I'm sorry I 12 wasn't more timely, but we're like a year later and 13 life gets busy. I feel like statute of limitations, 14 if I'm going to ask the question, I need to ask it at the time you have something to do something about it. 15 16 I thank you for looking into it, and I'll 17 check back with you to see. 18 Dana, would you have an idea on time on 19 how long you would need to discuss it and just look 2.0 into it so you have a good answer for me? 2.1 MR. WALCH: Directer and I will talk 22 about it and figure out a time. 23 MS. SHAFFER: Okay. If I give you a 24 card, Bill, could you give me a call and just let me

know?
