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1 PROCEEDINGS 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: I would like to call 5 the Franklin County Board of Elections meeting to 6 order. I will do the roll call. 7 Kimberly Marinello? 8 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here. 9 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Greg Haas? 10 BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Here. 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Doug Preisse? 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Brad Sinnott? 14 BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Here. 15 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Mr. Chairman, we have 16 everyone here. All are here present. 17 The first item on the agenda would be the 18 approval of the minutes of the November 4th meeting. BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: I move the Board 19 20 approve the minutes of the November 4th, 2013 meeting 21 of the Franklin County Board of Elections as 2.2 submitted. 2.3 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

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BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: What I'm doing is passing this around for everybody to sign and give back to Ms. Suzanne.

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The next item on the agenda is to certify the November 4th -- November 5th General Election and you have the official results here.

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move the Board certify and declare as final the official canvass of votes cast at the November 5th, 2013 General Election as submitted by the staff.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And I'm going to pass this around for everybody's signature and it will be official.

We had a recount in Truro Township, one of the recounts we had, and we need to conduct a recount Wednesday, December the 4th.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: What's the reason for the recount?

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: They were less than, what, .5 percent.

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DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: They were less than the one-half of 1 percent.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yeah, one-half.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: There were three candidates running for that race and two spots to be elected and the two candidates that came in second and third are within the threshold necessary for a automatic recount.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: And that must be just a few votes, right?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: It's nine votes difference, yes.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: I move the Board set a recount for Truro Township Trustee to begin Wednesday, December 4th at 9:00 a.m. until completed, and that the recount be conducted in accordance with Secretary of State Directive 2012-52 and be held simultaneously at both 280 East Broad Street and 1719 Alum Creek Drive.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

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DIRECTOR ANTHONY: In order to have that recount we must now figure out which precincts will do the recount. So Jeff is here and going to kind of -- we've got all the precincts.

MR. MACKEY: I have all the locations here on little cards that are all the same size as you can see.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We do have to show everybody, prior to a recount, that they are of the same size so that we don't have one that's on an 8-1/2-by-11 sheet of paper and others that are, you know, on a little, tiny strip, so that it is --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh.

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Uh-oh.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: -- until Jeff starts throwing them around the room.

(Laughter.)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: First, we do need a motion. We're going to conduct the recount by voting location instead of by precinct and, to do that, we officially need a motion from the Board to do that. That is what we've usually done in the past.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board conduct the recount in Truro Township by voting locations, using the Location Identification Numbers for each of the voting locations in the township.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?

BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: And now what Jeff has done, Carolyn, in our office, has produced a spreadsheet for us. The procedure on this is to do -- we select precincts, in this case voting locations, that equal at least 5 percent of the total votes cast in that area.

What we do then is we do a hand count of any voting locations selected, match it to the official canvass of results done by machine. If they match then we're permitted by Directive 2012-52 to then conduct the rest of the recount by machine by reading the flashes off the machine, correct, Jeff? So Jeff has a spreadsheet over there. It's very traditional what we usually do.

Who wants to pick?

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Kim, I think.

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9 1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Kim. Kim, pick 2 away. 3 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Sure. 4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Make sure they 5 don't stick together here. They all look like 6 they're separate. Pick one out of there and read off 7 the number. 8 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: 2135. DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Play that tonight. 9 10 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Yeah. 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Do you need another? 12 MR. MACKEY: We've hit the mark, but I 13 think we usually have to pick two. DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We usually pick 14 15 another one too. They usually advise us to pick more 16 than one. 17 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: 5004. 18 (Laughter.) MR. MACKEY: Oh. 19 20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: That was the 21 wrong one, but that's okay. 2.2 (Laughter.)

MR. MACKEY: We're good.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Okay.
