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DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We will go ahead and call this meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections to order. I will do the roll.

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But the first one is that we did get a withdrawal request from Robert Wagner. He was a write-in candidate for Republican County Central Committee in Columbus Ward 36, so I would ask for a motion to accept that withdrawal.

MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the Board accept the request of Robert Wagner to withdrawal as a candidate for the Republican Central Committee in Columbus Ward 36 and that no votes cast for him be counted in the May 6, 2014, Primary Election.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Is there a

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: All those in

Any opposed?

Motion passes.

The second issue for your consideration today is we got word from the Township Trustees in Perry Township late last week that the Perry Township JEDZ, Joint Economic Development Zone, issue that had been placed on the ballot for this — for this May, that the trustees asked that that issue be withdrawn from the ballot.

We checked with legal counsel at the Prosecutor's Office and with the Secretary of State's Office who said there was no -- nothing in state law that prohibits such an action, much along the same way as the court in the past has ruled that a

candidate can withdraw at any point in the process they want. Everybody kind of felt the same thing applied here, that if the trustees no longer wanted to put an issue on the ballot, that we couldn't force it to be on the ballot. So we did get a request from them last week to withdraw the Perry Township JEDZ issue.

MEMBER HAAS: I move --

MEMBER SINNOTT: In what way did the Trustees communicate that?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: They passed another resolution and then filed that resolution the next day. Thursday evening, I believe it was, they passed a resolution by the trustees withdrawing the issue and that was filed with us on Friday.

MEMBER SINNOTT: Very good. Thank you.

MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board accept the request of the Perry Township Trustees to withdraw the Perry Township JEDZ issue and that no votes cast for the issue will be counted in the May 6, 2014, Primary Election Ballot.
