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DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good morning. I am going to call the Franklin County Board of Elections Special Meeting to order. I will do the roll call.

Kimberly Marinello.

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Greg Haas.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Here.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Douglas Preisse.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And Brad Sinnott.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Here.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Mr. Chairman, we are all here and accounted for.

The first item on the agenda has to do with provisional ballots, and Dana has been working on this really hard, so I'll let Dana kind of take it from here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Thank you for that, Mr. Director, but it's actually Renee and Julie that have been working really hard on it, but we have, to present to you today, 964 provisional

ballots that our bipartisan teams have determined should be counted, and 179 that we believe should be rejected.

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There are still some we need to make a determination on which will be done at your meeting this afternoon, but, to get the ball rolling on this, these are ones, for the purposes of this morning's meeting, that we bring before you for approval for us to get counting on.

move the Board accept the staff recommendation for the validation of 964 provisional ballots and the rejection of 179 provisional ballots as submitted by staff and that these provisional ballots approved for counting be included in the official canvass of results of the May 6th, 2014, Primary Election.

BOARD MEMBER SINNOTT: Second.

The second item on the agenda is remaking of absentee and provisional ballots.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: On this, with the absentees that came in after Election Day, but are

okay for counting because they were mailed prior to Election Day, we have 20 absentee paper ballots that our bipartisan teams have determined need to be remade for various errors on them of people putting X's in instead of filling the oval in or circling the the name, et cetera.

And of the 964 provisionals that you just gave us approval to count, there are 39 we know need to be remade due to they are ballots that were cast in the correct polling location, but in the wrong precinct and, thus, by directive, we only count those portions of the ballot that the voter was eligible to vote in that precinct. So there are 39 provisionals, at this time, along with the 20 absentee papers that we ask for approval to remake.

BOARD MEMBER HAAS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board authorize the staff to remake 20 absentee paper ballots and 39 provisional ballots and that these remade ballots shall be tabulated and included in the official canvass of results of the May 6th, 2014, Primary Election.

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on this morning, those were scanned in and there were 6 of those that needed to be remade because they wouldn't go through the counters, and then there were 7 additional that were from the 140 that were right polling location, wrong precinct that will need to be remade for those portions of the ballot that can't be counted. So that's how we get to the total of 13 provisional ballots that we need to get your authority on to remake.
