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4 1 Monday Afternoon Session, 2 January 5, 2015. 3 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Good afternoon, 5 everyone, and welcome to this our first meeting of 6 the year of our Lord and Savior 2015. 7 MEMBER MARINELLO: Amen. 8 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: I will do a roll call. Kimberly Marinello. 9 10 MEMBER MARINELLO: Here. 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Gregory Haas. 12 MEMBER HAAS: Here. 13 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Douglas Preisse. 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here. DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And Bradley Sinnott. 15 16 MEMBER SINNOTT: Here. 17 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Mr. Chairman, we are 18 all here. 19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Good. 20 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And the first item on 21 the agenda each year, or probably the last several 2.2 years, the County Commissioners have given across 2.3 the -- across the board a 2 percent pay raise, and they included it in their supplemental budget, but we 24

have to -- if we want our employees to have it, we have to vote on it to agree to that 2 percent supplemental. So they actually added that to our -- to our budget as they did all the other agencies.

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So we would like for it to happen. Dana and I have talked about it. You know, we would like for it to be more, but 2 percent is better than 0 percent so.

The first motion has to do with us accepting the County supplemental 2 percent.

MEMBER HAAS: I move that the Board accept the supplement appropriation from the County Commissioners for a 2 percent pay increase for employees in the Board of Elections and that this pay increase be made retroactive to December 29, 2014.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All in favor.

Motion carries. Thank you, guys.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Absolutely. Just so you know the retroactive back to December 29 was in the motion passed by the Commissioners as that was the beginning of a pay period for -- on our pay cycle so.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And the next item on the agenda so give us money in one hand and take it away in the other hand. The health insurance, again, this is a -- we go to the same health insurance rates that -- that the County pretty much goes across the board. We could do a variation of it, but it's less complicated if we follow along with what the County gives their current employees. And this does add a slight increase, out-of-pocket increase, but health insurance that happens --

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MEMBER MARINELLO: Well worth it.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: -- all the time, but it's well worth it. You guys are also beneficiaries of that health insurance. So we have to adopt a new health insurance premium.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: It's an increase of \$5 per month for an individual plan and \$9 per month for the family plan.

MEMBER MARINELLO: That's great. I move that the Board adopt the new standard monthly employee health benefit contribution rate of \$110 for employee coverage only and \$225 for family coverage as prescribed by the Franklin County Commissioners for the time period April 1, 2015, through March 31,

1 2016.

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DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

MEMBER SINNOTT: There is.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor.

That motion carries as well.

The next item is we have a Pitney Bowes contract that we've been kind of sitting on for I bet about six months or maybe longer than six months where we -- Pitney Bowes has it's called full-service Intelligent Mail system where the post office requires that we be -- we are IBM compliant in order for us to do our mailing, and so our Pitney Bowes machine has to be prepared so we could be IBM compliant.

We've gone through several discussions with Pitney Bowes. We thought the rate was pretty high initially. And they came in and met with Dana and I and our team, and we got the rate down to what we think is at least a reasonable rate. It seems to be a lot better than where they were prior and that's out — and that's \$1,246.25 monthly.

So we think this is a pretty good deal, and we need that to get -- we will make huge savings on our mailing by going with the IBM -- I mean

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Intelligent Mail Bar -- IBM --
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DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: This allows us to sort --

4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: IMB.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: -- sort the mail down to its lowest carrier route which allows us to drop the cost of each mailing down to the lowest rate we can get. The U.S. Postal Service has been sort of experimenting with IMB for a while, and they delayed it and delayed it; but, now, they have made it mandatory to get those lowest presort rates.

And with the volume of mail that we do, we feel this amount now makes it worthwhile for a cost savings for the mail that we do here at the Board of Elections to drive that cost down. To get the discount, we need to do the full-service IMB.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: Correct.

MEMBER SINNOTT: And it's in response to a new USPS policy that requires us to do some different barcoding?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: That's correct and this Pitney Bowes does have state terms and

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1 pricing is under their state terms.
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MEMBER SINNOTT: Then I move that the Board authorize the Director and Deputy Director to execute a three-year contract with Pitney Bowes in the amount of \$1,246.25 per month to provide the Board with full-service Intelligent Mail Barcode capability on the Reliavote system.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

MEMBER HAAS: Second.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor.

That's all that we have for our regular monthly meeting.

A motion to adjourn?

MEMBER MARINELLO: So moved.

DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?

16 MEMBER HAAS: Second.
