DIRECTOR LEONARD: At the last meeting I think we talked about potentially bringing to you in sections the policy manual and adopting the policy manual that's more in line with the county's policy manual, because the employee handbook for the Board is -- is quite old, and so adopting one that's more in line with the county's employee handbook, and it would certainly make it easier from a legal standpoint. The Prosecutor's Office has reviewed the county's employee manual. The HR Department has done that, and so -- but there are some things that we still want to include in those -- the first section of it before we present it to the Board, so -particularly being a -- the county has a harassment policy, a non-harassment policy, and it really doesn't have a specific sexual harassment policy. We feel like that would be appropriate for us to have a

separate and distinct policy.

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CHAIRMAN PREISSE: When you say bring it to us now, are you talking about give the Board members something physical to examine and take with us or have a discussion?

DIRECTOR LEONARD: Have the discussion.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I'd rather have the

full copy, give us something to digest and come back.

DIRECTOR LEONARD: Okay. We had been hoping to have that for you well before today's meeting, but some of those --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah. I'd rather not discuss it until we get all four of us here; otherwise, we'll have to do it all over again.

DIRECTOR LEONARD: I just wanted to let the Board members know where we were on that process.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Sounds good. In Brad's absence, if there's nothing else to come before the Board, I move that the Board recess this meeting of the Board of Elections, subject to recall by the Chair, until the close of the election being held on Tuesday, November 7th, 2017.
