2 May 7, 2018.

3 - - -

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It looks to me  
5 like we have a quorum, but to make sure that we do, I  
6 will take roll. Kim Marinello.

7 MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Michael Sexton.

9 MEMBER SEXTON: Here.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug Preisse.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Brad Sinnott.

13 MEMBER SINNOTT: Here.

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We do indeed have  
15 a quorum.

16 I believe you were sent the minutes from  
17 our April 2, 2018, meeting. If there aren't any  
18 corrections or deletions, I would take a motion to  
19 approve those.

20 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move the  
21 Board approve the minutes of the April 2, 2018,  
22 meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections as  
23 submitted.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
25 second?

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
3 favor signify by saying aye. Opposed same sign.  
4 Motion carries.

5 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next item on  
7 here is the Educational Service Center, our Kids  
8 Voting contract. And I'll bring up Steve Bulen to  
9 just have a few comments.

10 MR. BULEN: Thank you, Deputy Director  
11 Payne, Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board. Once  
12 again our Youth in the Booth students are invaluable  
13 to us.

14 Since 2005, we've had 14,748 precinct  
15 election official positions filled by our Youth in  
16 the Booth students, and this election, spring is  
17 always smaller numbers for various reasons, we have  
18 154 students who are filling key spots for us so I  
19 would ask that you consider renewing that so we can  
20 continue our partnership with Kids Voting.

21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And this is for what  
22 time period? Is this for all -- this goes to the  
23 fall as well?

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yes, it's for the  
25 entire year. We should have probably --

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is this a bigger  
2 figure than it has been in recent years past?

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I don't believe  
4 so. I believe the 45 is -- do you know if that's --

5 MR. BULEN: I personally don't know.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. That's all  
7 right. Struck me as maybe a little inflationary but  
8 that might make sense if indeed it is.

9 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the Board  
10 authorize the Director and Deputy Director to execute  
11 a contract with Educational Service Center of Central  
12 Ohio, also known as Kids Voting, for the recruitment  
13 and training of student poll workers in the amount of  
14 \$45,000.

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
16 second?

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
19 favor signify by saying aye. All opposed same sign.  
20 Motion carries.

21 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: In my experience  
23 running into the kids at the polls has always been  
24 great too.

25 MEMBER SINNOTT: Agree.

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Great.

2 MR. BULEN: Thank you.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Thank you, Steve.

4 The next item on the agenda are  
5 candidates that have withdrawn. Both of these  
6 candidates will appear on the ballot but there will  
7 be notices by each machine to let people know that  
8 any votes cast for these two candidates will not be  
9 tallied.

10 The first one is Alex Thomas who is  
11 running -- was running for Republican State Central  
12 Committee in the 15th District, and then the second  
13 candidate is Michael Vinson who was running for  
14 Franklin County Green Party Central Committee. In  
15 one case we received an e-mail from Mr. Thomas and  
16 Mr. Vincent sent us a handwritten note and I believe  
17 both of those, Susan, are in their packets?

18 MS. BROWN: Yes.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Okay.

20 MEMBER MARINELLO: All right. I move  
21 that the Board accept the request of Alex Thomas to  
22 withdraw as a candidate for Republican State Central  
23 Committee, 15th District, and that any votes cast for  
24 Mr. Thomas in the May 8, 2018, Primary Election shall  
25 not be counted.

1 MEMBER SINNOTT: Second.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
3 favor signify by saying aye. Opposed same sign.  
4 Motion carries.

5 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

6 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the Board  
7 accept the request of Michael Vinson to withdraw as a  
8 candidate for Franklin County Green Party Central  
9 Committee and that any votes cast for Mr. Vinson in  
10 the May 8, 2018, Primary Election shall not be  
11 counted.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
14 favor signify by saying aye. Opposed same sign.  
15 Motion carries.

16 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next item on  
18 the agenda is the paper ballot allocation followed by  
19 the voting machine and e-pollbook allocation. We  
20 have already approved these, but the Secretary of  
21 State's directive requires us to approve these  
22 allocations twice, so I don't believe there are any  
23 changes but.

24 MS. GORUP: There are no changes. The  
25 paper ballot allocation is the same. We haven't



1 added or removed any paper ballots.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Sounds great.

3 MEMBER SINNOTT: We'll do it again.

4 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move that  
5 the Board adopt the paper ballot allocation formula  
6 in Exhibit A compiled by the Board's staff for the  
7 May 8, 2018, Primary Election.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
10 favor signify by saying aye. All opposed same sign.  
11 Motion carries.

12 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The voting  
14 machine and e-pollbook allocation.

15 MS. GORUP: Has not changed.

16 MEMBER SINNOTT: Good. Then I move that  
17 the Board adopt the voting machine allocation formula  
18 in Exhibit B compiled by the Board staff for the May  
19 8, 2018, Primary Election.

20 MEMBER MARINELLO: I second.

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
22 favor signify by saying aye. All opposed same sign.  
23 Motion carries.

24 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next item is

1 actually an addendum to the present Securitas  
2 contract. I'll let the Director talk to that.

3 DIRECTOR LEONARD: We've been -- the  
4 Board of Elections has been in contract with  
5 Securitas for several years, I believe pretty much  
6 since we moved to -- the staff to this location  
7 because we didn't have Sheriff Deputy security any  
8 longer; we had private security.

9 In March of this year, they approached us  
10 about a -- an addendum because their employees have  
11 now come under union contract, Service Employees --  
12 Service International Employee Union. They are now  
13 under -- the security staff is under that contract  
14 and so Securitas costs have increased and they are  
15 looking to us to execute an addendum. There hasn't  
16 been an addendum since 2015.

17 I inquired of our budget analyst should  
18 we look to the County Sheriff's Office. Could they  
19 potentially provide security below a Deputy level?  
20 And at this point they are really not in a position  
21 to do that. According to our budget analyst, that  
22 they really don't have the personnel to provide, and  
23 the cost, I don't know that the cost would be  
24 comparable to what we get from Securitas.

25 MEMBER SINNOTT: What was the old billing

1 rate?

2 DIRECTOR LEONARD: I'm sorry?

3 MEMBER SINNOTT: What was the old billing  
4 rate?

5 DIRECTOR LEONARD: \$18.49 an hour. It  
6 will go from \$18.49 to \$19.51 an hour for a base  
7 officer. For -- and then they have created this rate  
8 of a supervisor officer bill rate of \$20.59 for a  
9 40-hour week. And then also there is an insurance  
10 coverage, insurance compliant charge of 431 per month  
11 for each participating officer.

12 This insurance has never existed before  
13 but that's with their new contract, under the union  
14 contract they offer their employees an opportunity to  
15 exercise -- to purchase into their health care  
16 coverage. If that employee opts to exercise  
17 insurance coverage, then we would be charged an  
18 additional 431 per month to -- as our -- the employer  
19 contribution of it. And then they would certify to  
20 us each month that the employee is actually  
21 participating in the health care coverage.

22 MEMBER SINNOTT: So for each employee who  
23 opts into Securitas's health care coverage, we're  
24 billed \$431 a month?

25 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Right.

1 MEMBER SINNOTT: Hmm.

2 DIRECTOR LEONARD: My thought would be if  
3 not, then they'll increase the rate per officer.  
4 It's essentially we would end up paying that one way  
5 or the other. This way it's only being paid in the  
6 event that an officer elects to participate in their  
7 health care coverage.

8 MEMBER SINNOTT: How many officers will  
9 be employed under the contract by us?

10 DIRECTOR LEONARD: It's only -- my  
11 understanding is only the base officer, the  
12 supervisor rate does not, so it would only be of the  
13 three officers that typically work here, only two  
14 would be eligible to participate in their health care  
15 coverage. So we could be paying \$860 plus per month  
16 if both officers choose to participate in the health  
17 care coverage.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is there a Sheriff  
19 Deputy next door right now?

20 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yes.

21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: These guys are not  
22 armed, are they?

23 DIRECTOR LEONARD: No, they are not  
24 armed. But, again, the cost of keeping an armed  
25 Sheriff's Deputy here year round would be

1 prohibitive.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

3 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the Board  
4 authorize the Director and Deputy Director to  
5 contract with Securitas Security Services for  
6 security at the Franklin County Board of Elections at  
7 an hourly billing rate of \$19.51 per hour for  
8 officers and \$20.59 per hour for supervisors in the  
9 calendar year 2018.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
12 favor signify by saying aye. Opposed same sign.  
13 Motion carries.

14 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The Project  
16 Manager contract. I'll let the Director talk to  
17 that, and then I think we have somebody from the  
18 County Commissioners that is here that maybe wants to  
19 add something to that as well.

20 DIRECTOR LEONARD: As the Board members  
21 know, we have got two big projects that are underway.  
22 First is the acquisition of the new voting machines,  
23 and the second is upgrade of the voter registration  
24 software. And either one of these by themselves  
25 would be a significant project, but having both of

1     them really requires that we have some provisional  
2     project management oversight.  They all involve  
3     pretty much every asset -- facet of what we do in the  
4     office.  And so they are going -- it's going to  
5     require a significant amount of coordination between  
6     our managers and outside vendors and really putting  
7     that responsibility on the shoulders of a manager  
8     risks having some important tasks falling through the  
9     cracks, and we don't want to have that happen with  
10    the size of the projects that we've got.

11             With an experienced, credentialed project  
12    manager, we have got someone with the experience to  
13    oversee the planning and coordination and -- and that  
14    needs to take place and hold everybody accountable,  
15    not just our staff but also the vendors alike, the  
16    need for a Project Manager representing the County  
17    administration and has their support.  They recognize  
18    the complexity of what we are doing and the need for  
19    a Project Manager.

20             We interviewed four candidates for it.  
21    Three of them came through an IT consulting service.  
22    And there -- these services are being obtained  
23    through an Ohio State term contract, and actually our  
24    rate that we are getting is below the rate that we  
25    would normally get for a Project Manager with

1 Ms. Campbell's experience and qualifications. I  
2 understand she has over 30 years of experience in  
3 operations management and at least 15 to 20 years  
4 experience focused on project management and  
5 technology implementation.

6 She has actually worked with the Board of  
7 Elections on election night with the team from  
8 Operation Buckeye that helps us in the warehouse on  
9 election night so. And I know Adam Luckhaupt is  
10 here. He is the Chief Information Officer for the  
11 Board of Commissioners. And, Adam, if you would like  
12 to add anything.

13 MR. LUCKHAUPT: Yeah. Honorable Members,  
14 projects of this magnitude and scale generally you  
15 need a Project Manager just to have predictive  
16 results. They can report any kind of risks, any kind  
17 of issues. They can make sure that the timeline is  
18 met; established first, met, and then on budget, so  
19 it's critical to something of this nature.

20 Any questions for me?

21 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, what is the budget  
22 for this project management? We will be paying for  
23 it at \$100 an hour but how many hours?

24 MR. LUCKHAUPT: It's a full-time  
25 position, if I am not mistaken.

1                   DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yeah, full-time.  
2 We've laid out 1,280 hours for the balance of this  
3 year, and then we will likely see it extended into  
4 next year with the option of renewing it next year,  
5 but the anticipation would be through probably  
6 November of next year for the Project Manager because  
7 the voting machine would be implemented by -- by the  
8 May Primary, and then the -- we would complete the  
9 upgrade of the voter registration software by the  
10 September time frame.

11                   MEMBER SEXTON: So this is a \$45,000  
12 contract from April 1 of 2018 until the end of this  
13 year?

14                   DIRECTOR LEONARD: That's a different.

15                   MEMBER MARINELLO: That's the Kids Vote.

16                   DIRECTOR LEONARD: No. This will be  
17 128,000 for the balance of the year, not to exceed  
18 128,000, not to exceed 1,280 hours.

19                   MEMBER SEXTON: 128,000.

20                   DIRECTOR LEONARD: 128,000. And then  
21 we'll include the request for next year in the 2018  
22 budget.

23                   MEMBER SINNOTT: Is the material on this  
24 under the Executive Session Board?

25                   MEMBER MARINELLO: Yeah. It's in the



1 Executive. We have never had anything like this  
2 before, have we?

3 DIRECTOR LEONARD: No. I don't think  
4 we've had two projects of this magnitude going at the  
5 same time. And Ms. Campbell is here, the Project  
6 Manager that's -- that was interviewed.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is Ms. Campbell an  
8 employee of TMH/Solutions or would --

9 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Contract through  
10 TMH/Solutions.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Because you are with  
12 something called Buckeye Operation right now? Is  
13 that you?

14 MS. CAMPBELL: No. I work for a  
15 nonprofit right now.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: If there is a  
18 pleasure to take this into Executive Session, we  
19 certainly can.

20 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, Ed and Dave, is it  
21 your recommendation that we enter into this contract?

22 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yes, it is.

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: That's my  
24 recommendation, absolutely and in consultation with  
25 Adam's office, County Commissioners, they have

1 already appropriated the money for this and so.

2           DIRECTOR LEONARD: When we've got, again,  
3 the projects of this size, it's really -- I mean,  
4 from -- in terms of the voter registration software,  
5 we're looking at petition management, precinct  
6 election officials section of it, absentee, our voter  
7 registration. It is every facet of how our system  
8 operates and working with the vendor that we  
9 ultimately go with for the writing of that --  
10 rewriting of that program as well as Data Center, I  
11 mean, how that interfaces with KNOWiNK which is our  
12 poll pad vendor and how it would -- how that software  
13 would interface with other functionality we have and  
14 then the acquisition of the voting machines if there  
15 are so many facets of that from our warehouses to  
16 our -- I mean --

17           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is the expectation  
18 Ms. Campbell would be working here at the Board?

19           DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yeah. We would  
20 dedicate space for her to work at the Board.

21           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And you said she  
22 worked at a Board or this Board at some time in the  
23 past?

24           DIRECTOR LEONARD: She's actually --  
25 election night they are brought in. Suzanne brings

1 groups in to help with the election night dropoff of  
2 election supplies. And Operation Buckeye is one of  
3 those organizations that provides people, so she has  
4 a little bit of experience with Board of Elections.  
5 But, again, it's the experience that she has in  
6 project management that really is the most critical  
7 for what we need. Again, there is so many things  
8 that are going to need to be done in a fairly short  
9 window of time, it really requires us to be able to  
10 have a credentialed Project Manager who can keep that  
11 on -- online.

12 MR. LUCKHAUPT: Yeah. From my view,  
13 Director Leonard and Deputy Director Payne, they  
14 involved me early on in the process when they were  
15 looking to both initiatives, and I had some time to  
16 spend with Carolyn Gorup on the system, and it was --  
17 it's a sophisticated system, that voter registration  
18 system. It's something we can't really take for  
19 granted. There is at least 300 tables. There's a  
20 lot of things going on in that system and you  
21 probably need some eyes and ears on the ground.

22 DIRECTOR LEONARD: And really to task  
23 that to Carolyn as the IT director is really not  
24 realistic because she seems to be swamped with a lot  
25 of what she's got on a day-to-day basis and then to

1 add on to it the idea of managing the project is  
2 really not -- is not realistic.

3 MEMBER SINNOTT: So we can do this  
4 contract in the absence of competitive bidding; is  
5 that correct?

6 DIRECTOR LEONARD: State term.

7 MEMBER SINNOTT: Would you very briefly  
8 acquaint us with the process -- with the process that  
9 led us to conclude that this is the right company  
10 with which to contract for this and the right amount?

11 DIRECTOR LEONARD: That was in terms --  
12 Adam, you will have to address that.

13 MR. LUCKHAUPT: I gave them some  
14 different companies. It was really the person. It's  
15 not the company. It actually your Project Manager is  
16 what you are looking for, and it's whoever they  
17 selected. They seemed to be happy with that.

18 MEMBER SINNOTT: That being Ed and Dave.

19 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yes. And they gave us  
20 a number of resumes. We elected to see and interview  
21 a couple of candidates. We sought four total, and we  
22 all felt that Jill Campbell was the best candidate of  
23 those we interviewed.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: In all of those  
25 meetings, we also had Carolyn Gorup, our IT person,

1 so.

2 MEMBER SINNOTT: When you say they sent  
3 you resumes, who are the "they"?

4 DIRECTOR LEONARD: It's the  
5 TMH/Solutions.

6 MEMBER SINNOTT: So we're talking with  
7 one contractor all the time.

8 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Right. That was the  
9 contractor recommended to us.

10 MEMBER SINNOTT: By whom?

11 DIRECTOR LEONARD: By Adam.

12 MR. LUCKHAUPT: It was just a name, and  
13 we could have also used the state contract which  
14 is -- there's knowledge services but this was a  
15 higher level individual.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So what's TMH's  
17 responsibility going forward from today? Is there a  
18 responsibility?

19 MR. LUCKHAUPT: They are a staffing  
20 company.

21 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yeah, because we will  
22 pay TMH and TMH will --

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: TMH is a staffing  
24 company?

25 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Correct.

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

2 DIRECTOR LEONARD: With a focus on IT  
3 staffing solutions.

4 MR. LUCKHAUPT: And they are one of the  
5 many -- DAS had come up with a concept called  
6 knowledge services, and knowledge services are many  
7 companies that pull together resources and put  
8 resumes on those services. This is one of those  
9 companies.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

11 DIRECTOR LEONARD: And they won -- they  
12 are a minority business enterprise. They received  
13 numerous awards including certain from DAS.

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Yeah. Well,  
15 it's evident from your resume, Ms. Campbell, you've  
16 got a heck of a lot of project management experience  
17 which the staff has concluded is relevant to the  
18 challenges immediately ahead of us, and we are taking  
19 confidence in that analysis. Right, Mike?

20 MEMBER SEXTON: I move that the Board  
21 authorize the Director and Deputy Director to  
22 contract with TMH/Solutions for project management  
23 services at the Franklin County Board of Elections at  
24 the hourly rate of \$100 per hour for calendar year  
25 2018.

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
3 favor signify by saying aye. All opposed same sign.  
4 Motion carries.

5 (Vote taken; motion passes.)

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next items we  
7 have an appointment of a new employee and some  
8 pending litigation. If it's so desired, we could go  
9 into Executive Session for that.

10 MEMBER SINNOTT: Pursuant to Ohio Revised  
11 Code Section 121.22(G)(1) and (3), I move that the  
12 Franklin County Board of Elections go into Executive  
13 Session to consider the appointment, employment,  
14 dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, and/or  
15 compensation of a public employee and to consult with  
16 the Board's legal counsel regarding pending  
17 litigation.

18 MEMBER SEXTON: Second.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Take a roll-call.  
20 Kim Marinello.

21 MEMBER MARINELLO: Yes.

22 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Michael Sexton.

23 MEMBER SEXTON: Yes.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug Preisse.

25 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Brad Sinnott.

2 MEMBER SINNOTT: Yes.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We are now in  
4 Executive Session.

5 (Executive Session held.)

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think I would  
7 look for a motion to move out of Executive Session.

8 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the  
9 Franklin County Board of Elections adjourn from  
10 Executive Session and that no votes or official  
11 actions were taken during the Executive Session.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Kim.

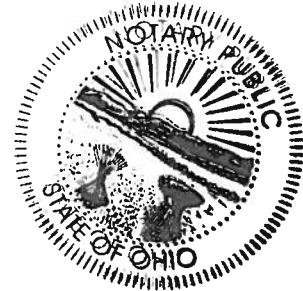
