roll.

Kim Marinello.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.

MEMBER SEXTON: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug  
Preisse.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Brad  
Sinnott.

MEMBER SINNOTT: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We do have a  
quorum.

I think it's worth note that our  
Director is not here. He had a brother that passed  
away last week and he is tending to his mother. So  
we sent sympathies and good wishes to him.

The first item on the agenda is the  
approval of minutes. I think everybody was sent  
the January 10th, 2019 meeting.

Are there any additions, deletions,

1 corrections?

2 If not, I'd entertain a motion.

3 MEMBER KIMBERLY MARINELLO: I move  
4 that the Board approve the minutes of the January  
5 10, 2019 meeting of the Franklin County Board of  
6 Elections as submitted.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
9 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

10 (Vote taken.)

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
12 same sign.

13 (No response.)

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The motion  
15 carries.

16 Today is our reorganization meeting,  
17 and we are required to select a temporary chairman.

18 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move  
19 that the Board appoint Brad Sinnott as the  
20 temporary chairman for the purpose of  
21 reorganization.

22 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
24 favor of Brad Sinnott being the temporary chairman  
25 signify by saying aye.

1 (Vote taken.)

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
3 same sign.

4 (No response.)

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
6 carries.

7 We will go ahead with the  
8 appointment of the Director, and then tomorrow or  
9 whenever he returns we will make sure that he's  
10 duly sworn in.

11 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move  
12 that the Board appoint Ed Leonard as the Director  
13 of the Franklin County Board of Elections at a  
14 compensation rate of \$61.63 per hour.

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
16 second?

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
19 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

20 (Vote taken.)

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
22 same sign.

23 (No response.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
25 carries.

1           The next item on the agenda is the  
2 appointment of the Deputy Director. If the Board  
3 sees fit, I would like to be considered for  
4 reappointment.

5           MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the  
6 Board appoint David Payne as Deputy Director of the  
7 Franklin County Board of Elections at the  
8 compensation rate of \$61.63 per hour.

9           MEMBER SEXTON: Second.

10          DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
11 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

12          (Vote taken.)

13          DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
14 same sign.

15          (No response.)

16          DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
17 carries.

18          Thank you very much.

19          MEMBER SINNOTT: I believe we have  
20 Judge Lisa Sadler from the 10th District Court of  
21 Appeals with us to administer the oath to the  
22 Deputy Director. And we'll make some arrangement  
23 for the --

24          MEMBER MARINELLO: I need sworn in,  
25 too.

1                   MEMBER SINNOTT: Good. We can get  
2 Kim sworn in as well.

3                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Does the oath  
4 stick if you're not wearing a robe?

5                   JUDGE SADLER: It does. The  
6 Director asked me to do this and I really  
7 appreciate the request and it's an honor to do so.  
8 And so I want to take the opportunity to thank the  
9 Board and its staff for keeping Franklin County  
10 Board of Elections open, free, and impartial.

11                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you, Your  
12 Honor.

13                   (Discussion on positioning parties  
14 to be sworn in.)

15                   JUDGE SADLER: Raise your right  
16 hand.

17                   I, state your name.

18                   MEMBER MARINELLO: I, Kimberly  
19 Marinello, --

20                   JUDGE SADLER: Do solemnly swear.

21                   MEMBER MARINELLO: -- do solemnly  
22 swear --

23                   JUDGE SADLER: That I will support  
24 the Constitutions of the United States and of the  
25 State of Ohio.

1                   MEMBER MARINELLO:  -- that I will  
2 support the Constitutions of the United States and  
3 of the State of Ohio,  --

4                   JUDGE SADLER:  That I will enforce  
5 the election laws, protect and preserve the records  
6 and property.

7                   MEMBER MARINELLO:  -- that I will  
8 enforce the election laws, protect and --

9                   JUDGE SADLER:  Preserve.

10                  MEMBER MARINELLO:  -- preserve --

11                  JUDGE SADLER:  The records and  
12 property pertaining to elections.

13                  MEMBER MARINELLO:  -- the records  
14 and property pertaining to elections,  --

15                  JUDGE SADLER:  And perform my  
16 duties.

17                  MEMBER MARINELLO:  -- and perform my  
18 duties --

19                  JUDGE SADLER:  As a member of the  
20 Board of Elections to the best of my ability.

21                  MEMBER MARINELLO:  -- as a member of  
22 the Board of Elections to the best of my ability.

23                  JUDGE SADLER:  Thank you.  
24 Congratulations.

25                  JUDGE SADLER:  Please raise your

1 right hand.

2 I, David R. Payne.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I, David R.

4 Payne, --

5 JUDGE SADLER: Do solemnly swear.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- do

7 solemnly swear --

8 JUDGE SADLER: That I will support  
9 the Constitutions of the United States of America  
10 and of the State of Ohio.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- that I  
12 will support the Constitutions of the State of Ohio  
13 and the United States of America, --

14 JUDGE SADLER: That I will enforce  
15 the laws.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- that I  
17 will enforce the laws, --

18 JUDGE SADLER: Protect and preserve  
19 the records and property.

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- protect  
21 and preserve the records and property --

22 JUDGE SADLER: Pertaining to  
23 elections.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: --  
25 pertaining to elections --

1 JUDGE SADLER: And perform my  
2 duties.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- and  
4 perform my duties --

5 JUDGE SADLER: As Deputy Director of  
6 the Franklin County Board of Elections.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- as Deputy  
8 Director of the Franklin County Board of  
9 Elections --

10 JUDGE SADLER: To the best of my  
11 ability.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: -- to the  
13 best of my ability.

14 JUDGE SADLER: Congratulations.

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Thank you so  
16 much.

17 MEMBER SINNOTT: Kim and David, did  
18 Judge Sadler execute your oath?

19 JUDGE SADLER: I just did.

20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thanks, Your  
21 Honor.

22 MEMBER SINNOTT: I believe those  
23 have to be submitted to the Common Pleas Clerk by  
24 the 15th of March.

25 MS. BROWN: This one has to be

1 within 15 days of her appointment, and his has to  
2 be submitted to the Secretary of State by the 8th  
3 of March.

4 MEMBER SINNOTT: Your appointment is  
5 effective 3-1, isn't it?

6 MEMBER MARINELLO: Uh-huh.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next  
8 item on the agenda is the appointment of a  
9 Chairman.

10 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the  
11 Board appoint Douglas Preisse as Chairman of the  
12 Franklin County Board of Elections.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
14 second?

15 MEMBER SEXTON: Second.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
17 favor of the motion of Doug Preisse as the Chairman  
18 of the Franklin County Board of Elections signify  
19 by saying aye.

20 (Vote taken.)

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
22 same sign.

23 (No response.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
25 carries.

1           The next item on the agenda is the  
2 appointment of full-time clerks, and you have a  
3 list of the individuals, full-time employees here  
4 at the Franklin County Board of Elections.

5           You'll note that there is one  
6 Republican vacancy, and that's the vacancy of Cindy  
7 Balach who passed away in September. Other than  
8 that, all of the individuals, both Republicans and  
9 Democrats, are the same individuals that are here  
10 now with the same pay scale as they've had since  
11 last year.

12           MEMBER SINNOTT: This exhibit  
13 reflects the 2018 rates of compensation because  
14 we're month to month?

15           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: That is  
16 correct.

17           MEMBER SINNOTT: All right.

18           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is this 40 or 42?  
19 How many employees are there?

20           MEMBER SEXTON: This says a total of  
21 49 with Board members. That would be a total of 46  
22 with the one vacancy?

23           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Correct.

24           MEMBER SINNOTT: It would have to go  
25 the other way, wouldn't it?

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: There are  
2 22 -- 21 Republicans and one vacancy, and 22  
3 Democrats on this list.

4 MEMBER SINNOTT: Yeah.

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And then  
6 there are four Board members.

7 MEMBER SEXTON: Just a simple  
8 question. Would it be 49 total?

9 MEMBER SINNOTT: You're right.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: That was the  
11 error.

12 MEMBER SEXTON: Should be 47 total?

13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, with Board  
14 members.

15 MEMBER SINNOTT: There are two  
16 vacancies?

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: There's one  
18 vacancy.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So should it be  
20 44?

21 MEMBER SINNOTT: We have a member of  
22 staff with an observation. Please speak up.

23 MR. COLLINS: Gary Collins with OMB.  
24 David, the 49 is your total. There  
25 should be two vacancies. One was for a position

1 that's always been vacant. So there is two  
2 vacancies.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I'm sorry.  
4 You are correct. I apologize. So you are correct,  
5 Mr. Sexton, that the 49 is the --

6 MEMBER SEXTON: 49 is the current  
7 total with four Board members; and then when the  
8 vacancy is filled, the one that we have, it will be  
9 a total of 50. Is that correct?

10 MEMBER MARINELLO: Or 49 including  
11 the one that's --

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think it's  
13 49 including the two vacancies. Is that correct?

14 MR. COLLINS: Yes.

15 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the  
16 Board appoint the employees listed on Exhibit A as  
17 full-time clerks of the Board and fix as their  
18 hourly compensation the rates listed with their  
19 respective names.

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
21 second?

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
24 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

25 (Vote taken.)

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
2 same sign.

3 (No response.)

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
5 carries.

6 The next item on the agenda is a  
7 voter registration challenge. And I will note that  
8 Mr. Eitel and Deborah Thompson are both here. It  
9 was Deborah Thompson who filed the challenge to  
10 Donnie Varga.

11 So I'll turn the -- turn this over  
12 to Mel Fuhrmann.

13 MS. FUHRMANN: Good afternoon. Mel  
14 Fuhrmann for voter services this afternoon.

15 We received a voter challenge on  
16 behalf of Deborah Thompson challenging the right to  
17 vote of Donnie Thomas Varga. And the research I  
18 conducted shows the following.

19 Deborah Thompson is in fact a  
20 qualified voter under the Ohio Revised Code. Her  
21 voting history shows that she is in fact registered  
22 and has voted in almost every election for which  
23 she has been eligible going back to 2005. And she  
24 is registered to vote at 565 East Town Street.  
25 That is her current address.

1                   Donnie Thomas Varga, V-a-r-g-a, we  
2 show a registration that we have on Mr. Varga that  
3 shows him registered at 565 East Town Street,  
4 number 16, and that registration and his voting  
5 history show that he really has no voting history  
6 with us. So we don't have any record of him ever  
7 having voted at the 565 East Town Street, number  
8 16, address. I checked the Secretary of State's  
9 records and they show the same as of September 27th  
10 of 2018.

11                   Our recommendation based on this  
12 research would be that Mr. Varga would be removed  
13 from the voter rolls.

14                   MEMBER SINNOTT: Mel, from where did  
15 we get the registration of Mr. Varga at this  
16 address?

17                   MS. FUHRMANN: Well, interestingly  
18 enough -- I'm so glad you asked -- we have a  
19 registration here from the BMV, and it looks like  
20 we received that registration on May 14th of '18.  
21 That registration shows him at 262 East Hinman  
22 Avenue. Then we also have an acknowledgment notice  
23 that came back to us as undeliverable that was  
24 addressed to him at the 565 East Town Street  
25 address.

1           Then, after taking the research a  
2 step further, looking to see what the Secretary of  
3 State had on file, they show him at the 565 East  
4 Town Street, number 16, address. So there's a  
5 discrepancy there. He's at two different  
6 addresses, one for the BMV and one for the Ohio  
7 Secretary of State's office.

8           MS. BROWN: He did an online  
9 update --

10          MS. FUHRMANN: Right.

11          MS. BROWN: -- at 565.

12          MS. FUHRMANN: Right.

13          MS. BROWN: That's how it came  
14 through the Secretary of State.

15          MS. FUHRMANN: Yep.

16          MS. BROWN: Because I looked that up  
17 myself. And I did a Google search, and there's a  
18 big apartment building right next to the house.

19          MS. THOMPSON: But that's not where  
20 he is.

21          MS. BROWN: I thought maybe he keyed  
22 in the wrong digits or something.

23          MS. THOMPSON: No.

24          MS. FUHRMANN: That is correct. He  
25 did do an online update and that is why we have him

1 at the 565 East Town Street address despite the  
2 fact that the BMV registration that we received on  
3 May 14th of '18 shows him at 262 East Hinman  
4 Avenue.

5 MEMBER SEXTON: When did he do the  
6 online update?

7 MS. FUHRMANN: Let me see.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Do we have  
9 evidence of the update or just this page from the  
10 Secretary of State that's just their record?

11 MS. FUHRMANN: Yeah. The page  
12 that's from the Secretary of State registration  
13 lookup, that's a copy of the online registration  
14 record that was submitted on 9-28-18.

15 So there's about a four-month  
16 difference between the BMV registration and then  
17 the online update he did with the Secretary of  
18 State's office. And as I said, when I look at his  
19 voting history, we have no history of him having  
20 voted at the 565 East Town Street address. In  
21 fact, he's currently in an inactive voting status.

22 MEMBER SINNOTT: But Mel, in the  
23 year 2018 you have somebody purporting to be  
24 this Mr. -- I'm sorry -- purporting to be this  
25 Mr. Varga --

1 MS. FUHRMANN: Yes.

2 MEMBER SINNOTT: -- who is  
3 affirmatively registering his address as being  
4 565 East Town Street?

5 MS. FUHRMANN: Yes, sir.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Miss Thompson, do  
7 you know Mr. Varga?

8 MS. THOMPSON: No. And I thank you.  
9 And I'd like to tell you what I got out of this.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Would you mind  
11 stating your name for the court record?

12 MS. THOMPSON: Yes. I am Deborah  
13 Elizabeth Thompson. My address is 565 East Town  
14 Street, Columbus, 43215. The home is owned by my  
15 husband, Charles Eitel. I have a dower interest in  
16 the property. We bought the house for more than  
17 20 years.

18 We don't know Mr. Varga. But what  
19 concerned me the most is that I received in the  
20 mail tax information from Columbus State where  
21 Mr. Varga was getting his tax information for  
22 apparently his federal grants and aid using  
23 565 East Town Street as his address.

24 I called Columbus State legal  
25 division. I talked to a Karen Fabrius, and that is

1 F-a-b-r-i-u-s, on February 19th. She referred me  
2 to someone in student services whose name I don't  
3 have on this note who told me that Mr. Varga,  
4 quote, is one of theirs and she reached out to him  
5 and told him that they've had information that he  
6 didn't live there. So he gave Columbus State  
7 allegedly his current address.

8 So Mr. Varga used our address for  
9 federal grants that I know of and established our  
10 house as his voting address. I saw online that  
11 effective May 23rd, 2018, he did receive a state ID  
12 using 262 East Hinman Avenue as his address. We  
13 don't know this man. I called Townley Court  
14 Apartments building. We know the people who own  
15 Townley Court. They don't know who this is either.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So there's a  
17 mystery behind this that we probably can't solve  
18 today and probably don't need to for the purposes  
19 of cleaning up the record, I think.

20 MS. THOMPSON: Right.

21 So Mr. Varga has established an  
22 identity using our address where he shouldn't have.

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You don't live in  
24 one of those houses that the gentleman built for  
25 his two daughters, do you? They're right there on

1 East Town Street, the big old --

2 MS. THOMPSON: Our house was built  
3 in 1875.

4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah. Nice  
5 neighborhood.

6 MS. THOMPSON: Thank you.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Across from  
8 the --

9 MS. THOMPSON: The Kelton House.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The Kelton House,  
11 yeah.

12 MS. THOMPSON: Two doors down from  
13 Brunners' old property, for anybody who knows the  
14 Brunners.

15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you.

16 MEMBER SINNOTT: Okay. Well, Mel,  
17 unless you have something to add.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You made the  
19 recommendation.

20 MS. FUHRMANN: I stand by it.

21 MEMBER SINNOTT: Okay. Fair enough.  
22 I think we've heard enough.

23 I move that the Board approve the  
24 challenge of right to vote filed by Deborah  
25 Thompson of 565 East Town Street, Columbus, Ohio,

1 against Donnie Thomas Varga of 565 East Town  
2 Street, Columbus, Ohio, and order that Donnie  
3 Thomas Varga's registration be removed from the  
4 Franklin County voter file.

5 MEMBER SEXTON: Second.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
7 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

8 (Vote taken.)

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
10 same sign.

11 (No response.)

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
13 carries.

14 MS. THOMPSON: Thank you.

15 MEMBER MARINELLO: Thank you.

16 MEMBER SINNOTT: Thanks for bringing  
17 it to our attention.

18 MS. THOMPSON: New scam, guys. I  
19 mean, I don't know.

20 MR. EITEL: We couldn't figure out  
21 the reason he did that unless he was going to vote  
22 twice.

23 MS. THOMPSON: Until the tax  
24 information from the feds came.

25 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you very

1 much. Thanks for your due diligence.

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next  
3 item on the agenda is asking the Board for approval  
4 to enter into a contract with Inclusion Solutions  
5 for the purchase of 700 voting booths.

6 I took the liberty of setting up one  
7 of the voting booths that we're asking to purchase.  
8 This would be for individuals that are using --  
9 they come into our polling locations and request to  
10 use a paper ballot to vote. So they would either  
11 walk up to the highest location or the lowest  
12 location is handicap accessible. There are five  
13 quadrants on there in order to vote.

14 MEMBER SINNOTT: The lowest ledge is  
15 suitable for somebody who's in a wheelchair?

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yes.  
17 Correct.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Are all of them  
19 configured that way?

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: They all  
21 would be configured with one ADA compliant level  
22 and three of the higher levels.

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Do we need that  
24 many?

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: They're all

1 configured that way, and they can handle four  
2 individuals at once.

3 MEMBER SINNOTT: Why do we need 700  
4 stations of that sort?

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Because  
6 we'll need at least -- we have 350 some polling  
7 locations and we'll have one of these in each of  
8 the -- at least one, two in some of the other  
9 polling locations, and we'll have some in our early  
10 vote center as well.

11 MEMBER MARINELLO: Is it pretty  
12 sturdy?

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's really  
14 sturdy.

15 The other thing I was going to  
16 mention is that we asked for -- we worked with the  
17 purchasing department and we asked for five  
18 different vendors to bid. There were three vendors  
19 that responded, two did not. One of the vendors  
20 that responded had only an individual voting booth  
21 and it was very flimsy. The other vendor did  
22 supply a four-up configuration, but it was also  
23 very flimsy. And it was only -- I think it was  
24 about \$150 cheaper, but it was not sturdy.

25 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, here's --

1 this is the first I've heard of this subject. So  
2 walk me through the basics.

3           What I find interesting is our  
4 decision that we need to put seemingly two of those  
5 multi-voter stations in every polling place in  
6 Franklin County at the cost of \$580,000 when  
7 they're only going to be used by those who are  
8 electing to vote by paper ballot. I think we're  
9 expecting there to be a distinct minority of the  
10 voting population; and plainly, four persons could  
11 be voting at any one time using a single one of  
12 those stations.

13           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Right.

14           MEMBER SINNOTT: How did we --  
15 What's the math that got us to a need for 700?

16           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Well, first  
17 of all, the math is somewhat difficult to figure  
18 out because we are promoting the machines; but  
19 the -- the great thing about this hybrid voting  
20 system is that people can use a paper ballot if  
21 they choose. And so we're hopeful that the vast  
22 majority, like you suggested, choose to use the  
23 electronic version; but we're simply not certain of  
24 the math and we want to make sure that in a  
25 presidential year -- Clearly, the math won't be a

1 problem in 2019.

2 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, what portion  
3 in 2018 of all voters asked for a paper ballot?  
4 Because that was an option then, too, right?

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Differently  
6 configured; but, yes, that's true.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It was very  
8 small at the polling locations, very small. I  
9 don't have an exact figure. I can --

10 Do you know that figure, Carla?

11 MS. PATTON: We had less than 500  
12 paper ballots that were requested in the general  
13 election last year as paper-by-choice voters.  
14 However, to come up with a number that we needed,  
15 basically because we have fewer machines, per se,  
16 than what we've had in the past, we took the  
17 difference of what would have been allocated in  
18 that location with the iVotronics and took the  
19 difference of what we can allocate with the  
20 ExpressVotes and are making up with these voting  
21 stations to allow for a voting station for one for  
22 at least every 175 active voters.

23 MEMBER MARINELLO: And these will  
24 last forever, hopefully?

25 MS. PATTON: Yeah. There was a

1 warranty as part of the bid that was submitted.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I didn't follow  
3 the calculation.

4 MEMBER SINNOTT: So --

5 MS. PATTON: For example, if the  
6 location in the past had 20 iVotronics allocated  
7 based on the one for every 175 active voters, now  
8 we can only provide ten ExpressVotes because we  
9 have less than half of what we had in iVotronics  
10 basically. So that ten voting stations that would  
11 have been iVotronics are being made up with two of  
12 these or three of these to allow for the same  
13 number of voting stations.

14 MEMBER SINNOTT: Is there a legal  
15 standard we're dealing with? You keep talking --  
16 or twice you mentioned a standard or a ratio of 1  
17 to 175, 1 station to 175 voters.

18 MS. PATTON: So Ohio law has  
19 required with electronic machines, which we did  
20 with the REs, that we had one for every 175 voters.  
21 However, since we've gone to the marking devices  
22 with the hybrid system of a paper ballot there is  
23 no legal ratio that we have to deal with now. It's  
24 at the Board's discretion now.

25 So we were just kind of basing those

1 based on the iVotronics voting stations how many  
2 voting stations we should offer up for voters,  
3 whether they vote on the markers or they vote on a  
4 paper ballot at the table. Currently there is no  
5 legal ratio requirement.

6 MEMBER MARINELLO: How many is  
7 that -- You really would have no idea who is going  
8 to choose what?

9 MS. PATTON: Exactly.

10 MEMBER MARINELLO: So you have to be  
11 prepared.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What's the  
13 timeline for acquisition of these if we delay? Are  
14 we getting into some kind of trouble?

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We could --

16 MS. PATTON: The vendor has these on  
17 hand, already produced. So I believe they were  
18 able to meet our requirements for this primary  
19 election by April 1st in time for us to be able to  
20 pack those into the carts as we ready the machines  
21 for deployment, with the remainder of them being  
22 able to be delivered in the summer.

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: If we dealt  
24 with a number less than this for the primary and  
25 for the general in November and then kind of did

1 our calculations to see how many people would show  
2 up to see if we need, is that --

3 MEMBER SINNOTT: It looks like we're  
4 paying about \$830 apiece for these.

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Correct.

6 MEMBER SINNOTT: And they're needed  
7 because of the prospect of somebody wanting to cast  
8 a paper ballot. Right?

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Correct.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Those are to be  
11 used for paper ballot only?

12 MS. PATTON: Correct.

13 MEMBER SINNOTT: In the very large  
14 turnout in 2018 we had fewer than 500 voters who  
15 asked for a paper ballot.

16 MS. PATTON: I would anticipate the  
17 paper ballots increasing on the simple fact that  
18 some of the marking devices may be full at the time  
19 and that the voter for timing they may elect then  
20 to go with the paper ballot rather than waiting for  
21 the marking device.

22 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, we know that  
23 the machines that we're purchasing are more user  
24 friendly and can more efficiently be used than the  
25 machines that we're abandoning. We're also not the

1 first jurisdiction in the United States to buy from  
2 this vendor the new type of voting machines here in  
3 Franklin County.

4 Do we know what the experience has  
5 been elsewhere in terms of an uptake in the number  
6 of people wanting to use a paper ballot upon seeing  
7 the machine that we just purchased? That, I think,  
8 would be interesting.

9 MS. PATTON: I can look into that.  
10 I do know I spoke with a jurisdiction in Kansas and  
11 they did have an increase in their paper ballots.  
12 Even as they were using the paper ballots as a line  
13 control method, they did have some increase in  
14 paper ballots being cast versus their marking  
15 devices.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: With the same  
17 technology we're implementing?

18 MS. PATTON: Same technology that  
19 we're moving into.

20 MEMBER SEXTON: So would we need at  
21 least one of these for each polling location?

22 MS. PATTON: Yes. We're  
23 recommending at least one and then --

24 MEMBER SEXTON: At least one. And  
25 you said for some. But for the purpose of this

1 primary would be -- would it be your opinion that  
2 we need at least one for every polling location?

3 MS. PATTON: There's some that we're  
4 looking at having two or three. I think the most  
5 that we have allocated at this time would be five  
6 of them because they had a drastic cut from the  
7 iVotronics to the ExpressVotes.

8 MEMBER SEXTON: So if we looked at  
9 at least one, you're saying -- what would be the  
10 criteria of why we would have -- Is it multiple  
11 precincts in one location?

12 MS. PATTON: Yeah, the more large --  
13 the more precincts in the location. Like I said,  
14 it was kind of based on the difference from what  
15 the iVotronics allocation would be to what the  
16 ExpressVote allocation is going to be.

17 MEMBER SEXTON: So if you had a  
18 voting location that had, say, five, six maybe  
19 precincts in the same location, what you're saying  
20 is we will need more than just one of those for the  
21 primary?

22 MS. PATTON: Correct.

23 MEMBER SINNOTT: Why couldn't we use  
24 a table, in all seriousness?

25 MEMBER MARINELLO: Not a lot of

1 privacy, but --

2 MS. PATTON: The idea was with a  
3 table then the voter is more inclined to sit down  
4 and take a lot longer to vote their ballot than if  
5 they're in a standing position. So to keep the  
6 flow of voters moving, we felt it best to leave the  
7 voter in a standing position rather than at a  
8 sitting position at a lower table.

9 MEMBER SEXTON: So what's the  
10 thought on how many -- if we're saying we need to  
11 purchase at least one for the primary for 350  
12 voting locations, what would -- how many do you  
13 think we'd need for here for early vote?

14 MS. PATTON: For early vote I would  
15 recommend at least five hundred. Because we also  
16 need to have some for training available as well as  
17 for the early vote center. Because some locations  
18 you're going to make sure -- you want to have more  
19 than just one in those larger locations where  
20 there's six, seven, eight, nine precincts.

21 MEMBER SEXTON: Well, what would be  
22 the estimate here -- They'll be using them here at  
23 the Board of Elections, too, in the early vote.  
24 Right? What's the estimate on what is needed here,  
25 not out in the precincts?

1 MS. PATTON: Probably at least five  
2 for the early vote, I would expect; but then you  
3 have the ability to set up more if we find that we  
4 have a higher increase of the paper ballot voters  
5 versus the ExpressVote voters.

6 MEMBER SEXTON: So somewhere -- if  
7 we did one per location, five here, we're looking  
8 at somewhere between 355 and -- what's the  
9 number? -- 700.

10 MS. PATTON: We'd need at least 20  
11 for training purposes to be able to have those  
12 available in any training classes poll workers are  
13 being trained in so they can set those up.

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is there an  
15 impact on the bulk and number of these devices as  
16 it relates to the work that EE Ward does?

17 MS. PATTON: We haven't done all the  
18 calculations for the hauling of the carts as of  
19 this time right now with EE Ward. These are able  
20 to be fit into the current carts that we do have.  
21 So we would not anticipate a huge increase, but the  
22 increase is going to be greater anyway with the  
23 hauling of the ES200 and the kiosk machines in  
24 addition to the voting machines.

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It will fit

1 into the cart or it could fit on top of the cart.

2 MS. PATTON: We would not anticipate  
3 additional cost for hauling based on this.

4 MEMBER SEXTON: In terms of cost, I  
5 don't know if we've broken this out; but would  
6 our cost -- if we just did, you know, based on  
7 recommendations of what the minimum staff thought  
8 was for this year, would our cost -- let's just say  
9 we did, just throwing out there, if we did --  
10 you're saying at least 375, would the cost go up?  
11 I mean, obviously, we're going to need these I  
12 think we know in 2020. Would the cost go up  
13 significantly if we ordered some now and some  
14 later?

15 MS. PATTON: Because it came through  
16 on a bid based on the quantity of 700, I can't  
17 speak for the vendor as to whether they'd go up in  
18 price. The list price was \$879 a unit on their web  
19 page. So I can't speak that they would increase  
20 the amount that we have to pay per unit with a  
21 lower amount, with a lower quantity versus, you  
22 know, if they'd just keep the price the same based  
23 on the 700 quantity.

24 MEMBER SINNOTT: David just said  
25 something that we should all hear.

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I was just  
2 going to say, beyond the idea of voters sitting  
3 down and we're worried about how long they take in  
4 the polling location, there really isn't anything  
5 prohibiting us, is there, from using tables and  
6 chairs like Board Member Sinnott indicated?

7 MS. PATTON: No.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That's what we've  
9 done up to this point. Right?

10 MS. PATTON: We've always had  
11 suitcase voting booth stations, single voting booth  
12 stations, that have been available for provisional  
13 voters.

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

15 MS. PATTON: But the idea was to  
16 give a regular paper voter a different area to vote  
17 in than what a provisional voter would vote in to  
18 keep -- simply keep them segregated to make sure  
19 that a provisional voter doesn't try to scan their  
20 ballot.

21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So this is for  
22 regular paper?

23 MS. PATTON: This is for your  
24 regular paper.

25 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The provisional

1 would be directed to a table?

2 MS. PATTON: They would be directed  
3 to the suitcase voting stations that we've always  
4 had.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And those are  
6 seated?

7 MS. PATTON: No. Those are still a  
8 standing station.

9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Those are  
10 standing.

11 Do we have a lot of those?

12 MS. PATTON: Not enough to make up  
13 for what all these would provide.

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You figured out  
15 where I was going.

16 MS. PATTON: We would have to  
17 purchase additional of those as well.

18 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well --

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Go ahead.

20 MEMBER SINNOTT: You had a question.

21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: If we don't move  
22 forward at some level with these devices today, are  
23 we pinching you, the Board, in terms of preparation  
24 for the upcoming need?

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Well, I

1 mean, we would have to buy additional tables, but I  
2 think they're probably readily available.

3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, I mean, if  
4 we delayed -- if we have a chance to digest this  
5 and discuss it some more and let's say we do move  
6 forward at some level, are we able to do that in  
7 the time frame that we can still meet the need --

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Tell me the  
9 schedule of packing the carts.

10 MS. PATTON: Our warehouse guys  
11 start on April 1st, and that's when they'll start  
12 configuring the carts and packing and setting the  
13 machines and starting to pack the equipment up into  
14 the carts to prepare them for delivery. Delivery  
15 would begin the Monday two weeks prior to election  
16 day. We have two weeks solid of hauling the  
17 equipment out.

18 So at this point we're kind of up  
19 against the wall. We do have tables that we could  
20 send out that are being delivered tomorrow, but we  
21 would also -- in that fashion would need time to  
22 get dividers for the tables to provide for privacy  
23 for the voters plus you would have to haul chairs  
24 out in some locations for that.

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We did

1 purchase tables for the setup of the actual  
2 electronic voting machines. So they are sitting on  
3 tables. So we have a number of those going out  
4 that will be loaded on our cart. So I mean, for  
5 this election, we could -- would we need to order  
6 any more tables or do we have --

7 MS. PATTON: No. We have more than  
8 enough tables coming in tomorrow.

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: So what we  
10 would need to do would be to order some sort of  
11 privacy screen?

12 MS. PATTON: Yes.

13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah. That would  
14 be preferred, but also not -- not required? I  
15 don't know what a privacy screen means, if it's  
16 like a piece of plastic that's on top of --

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It really is  
18 like a tri-fold.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh. There is  
20 such a thing?

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yeah. We  
22 actually have those.

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh. Okay.

24 MS. PATTON: It's basically a piece  
25 of corrugated plastic cut out that provides a

1 privacy shield. We want to offer our voters the  
2 most privacy as they mark their ballots so somebody  
3 walking by can't look over and see what they voted.

4 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, we want to  
5 provide voters with a reasonable level of privacy.  
6 There are all kinds of things I would imagine that  
7 would be the most privacy. And here's where I am  
8 on this. I think this is my first encountering of  
9 the subject. We're talking about spending \$580,000  
10 to buy 700 more station voting tables at a cost of  
11 about \$830 apiece, and the last time we had a major  
12 election there were about five hundred or fewer  
13 requests for paper ballots.

14 This is coming to the Board as a  
15 single option and we're being asked to choose an  
16 option. I would really like to have some options  
17 from which to choose. Because it seems to me as  
18 though we with some creativity could find a way of  
19 saving money in accomplishing our objective. So my  
20 preference would be that the staff develop options  
21 for us to consider as a board before we spend  
22 almost \$600,000 buying a very fancy version of a  
23 table.

24 MEMBER SEXTON: Well, my thought  
25 is -- I was looking at the calendar and see our

1 next meeting is April 1st. I believe it's the  
2 first Monday in April. And you were saying that  
3 that is when they start packing them?

4 MS. PATTON: That's when our --  
5 Yeah. That's when our crews begin setting the  
6 equipment and packing the -- begins the  
7 configuration of the packing of the carts.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I think I was  
9 satisfied with your answers to perhaps an interim  
10 option which is tables and inexpensive corrugated  
11 plastic privacy screens. We also would have the  
12 option if we wanted to to have a special meeting  
13 before April 1st, which was where I was kind of  
14 going about if we took a breather and revisited the  
15 idea and other options, and as Brad said, tables  
16 with corrugated screens or some lesser number of  
17 these, we would have time to discuss that and have  
18 a special meeting. We don't have enough of these  
19 meetings.

20 MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, you know, the  
21 reality is, too, we have a very low turnout primary  
22 ahead of us. So if we used existing resources to  
23 accommodate the request for paper ballots in this  
24 upcoming low turnout primary, we would have even  
25 more time then to -- the remainder of this month in

1 which to find the best option.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Can we make that  
3 work?

4 MS. PATTON: We can look at the  
5 options and have -- give them to David and Ed to  
6 present to you for another meeting.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: But in the  
8 meantime, I think what Brad's suggestion is, if we  
9 can effectively use existing resources through the  
10 upcoming primary, which is likely to be a very low  
11 turnout, certainly less than the last general,  
12 that's --

13 MS. PATTON: I can work out a plan  
14 on that.

15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right.

16 MEMBER MARINELLO: And you said this  
17 was a bid. So are we not locked into anything if  
18 we accepted the bid?

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We're not  
20 locked in, because actually the county  
21 commissioners have not even appropriated the money.  
22 We've got a willingness, I think, from them to say  
23 that they would; but this was just allowing us to  
24 enter into a contract if the Board saw fit. So the  
25 answer is, no, we're not locked into anything.

1                   MEMBER SINNOTT: Well, I'd be fine  
2 doing probably one of two things. I do think that  
3 we want to investigate finding a less expensive way  
4 of accomplishing our objective. And if we wanted  
5 to commit today to using our existing tangible  
6 resources to doing that for the upcoming low  
7 turnout primary, that would be fine. Or if we felt  
8 we needed another meeting in March, that would be  
9 okay, too. Because there's almost \$600,000 at  
10 stake, so it's worth it if that's necessary. I  
11 would be surprised that we couldn't get through  
12 this upcoming May primary using our traditional  
13 method.

14                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: It seems to me --  
15 correct me, counselor, if I'm wrong -- we just can  
16 move on to the paper ballot allocation for the  
17 May 7th primary election.

18                   DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think  
19 that's right.

20                   Next item on the agenda is the paper  
21 ballot allocation for the May 7th primary. I'll  
22 call on Carolyn Gorup.

23                   MS. GORUP: We looked at the 2015  
24 and the 2017 elections as being the most similar to  
25 this election. We took on the -- for provisional a

1 five percent increase from the highest number of  
2 provisionals cast in a location. If that number  
3 was zero, we took the ward average for that  
4 location. And then for the paper ballots --

5 What are we calling it, paper ballot  
6 on demand or --

7 MS. PATTON: Preprinted paper  
8 ballots.

9 MS. GORUP: -- preprinted paper  
10 ballots we took 20 percent of the votes cast, the  
11 largest votes cast, and then we rounded those up to  
12 a full pad of 25.

13 The report you have in front of you  
14 lists each ballot style, and then when you get to  
15 page 24 we start listing precincts that are the  
16 same as -- the ballot style is the same as what  
17 we've already allocated. So the total ballots that  
18 we're recommending is 16,225.

19 MEMBER SINNOTT: So no precinct  
20 needs more than a pad?

21 MS. GORUP: Well, there's a couple  
22 that needs a couple of pads, but I don't think any  
23 require more than two pads or I should say ballot  
24 styles.

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Any other

1 questions for Ms. Gorup?

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The allocation is  
3 based on five percent more than the highest  
4 ballots --

5 MS. GORUP: Five percent more than  
6 the highest provisional ballots in either '15 or  
7 '17.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Cast?

9 MS. GORUP: Yes.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Not allocated.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Any  
12 questions or anything?

13 If not, I would entertain a motion  
14 on the paper ballot allocation.

15 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the  
16 Board adopt the paper ballot allocation formula in  
17 Exhibit B compiled by the board staff for the  
18 May 7th, 2019 primary election.

19 MEMBER SINNOTT: Second.

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
21 favor signify by saying aye.

22 (Vote taken.)

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
24 same sign.

25 (No response.)

1                   DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The motion  
2 carries.

3                   The final item on the agenda is  
4 voting machine and electronic poll book allocation.  
5 I'll call on Carla Patton.

6                   MS. PATTON: Exhibit C is a listing  
7 of each location with a number of ballot marking  
8 devices as well as the breakdown of those between  
9 the kiosk and tabletop units. It also lists the  
10 allocation of the DS200 counters, scanners that  
11 tabulate, as well as the poll pad assignment  
12 recommendation.

13                   Marking devices were calculated on a  
14 ratio of one for every 320 active voters with no  
15 less than three marking devices being at any one  
16 location. Of those three units, at least one of  
17 them is a kiosk marking device, the others are  
18 tabletops. If they had 15 or more machines  
19 assigned to them, then we put two kiosks out there  
20 to handle any of the ADA voters who may need to  
21 utilize that equipment.

22                   The DS200 scanners, for every seven  
23 marking devices that are assigned to the location  
24 we included one DS200 scanner with no more than  
25 three going out to a location. The poll pad

1 assignments were based on one for every 800 active  
2 voters, and there's no less than three of those  
3 that go out to any location.

4 So you'll find on page five the  
5 total. It's got a total of 1,754 marking devices  
6 total as to what's being recommended to being  
7 deployed, 375 DS200 scanners, and 987 poll pads.

8 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move that the  
9 Board adopt the voting machine allocation formula  
10 in Exhibit C compiled by the board staff for the  
11 May 7th primary election.

12 MEMBER SEXTON: Second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
14 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

15 (Vote taken.)

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
17 same sign.

18 (No response.)

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The motion  
20 carries.

21 I believe that's the last item on  
22 the agenda.

23 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move we adjourn.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
25 second?

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MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in favor of adjournment signify by saying aye.

(Vote taken.)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.

(No response.)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We are adjourned.

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Thereupon, the proceedings were adjourned at approximately 4:01 p.m.
