November 30th and December 8th the Absentee and Operations Departments conducted a recount of contests for the 16th State Senate District and the Issue 22 Gahanna-Jefferson City School District bond and levies issue. To conduct these recounts, five teams of sworn Board of Elections employees retained two Republicans and two Democrats to perform and check and balance the hand recounting of five percent of the ballots in each of these contests. The hand recount totals matched the machine count tally of the contests.

Upon verifying the hand recounts to five percent in these contests, the recount continued with full machine recounts of both contests. The results of the combined hand recount and the machine recounts in both contests confirm that no previous contest results were overturned and the recount results affirm the outcomes as stated in the official results from the November 18th certification, with Stephanie L. Kunze winning the State Senate

District 16 contest and the approval of the Gahanna City School bond issues and levies. The breakdown of these results have been provided to all Board

members and an exhibit, and you all have that.

While no outcome changes were determined as part of this hand and machine recount in both contests, the results of the recount did produce adjusted numbers different from the original results submitted on November 18th as part of the election certification process and the Board will need to recertify these results and submit these changes to the Ohio Secretary of State.

And Carla will walk us through the results as they follow. Carla.

MS. PATTON: Good morning. Carla Patton here.

In the race for the State Senate District 16 the recount resulted in Republican Stephanie L. Kunze receiving a total of 106,056 votes in the recount as compared to 106,053 votes as reported in the official canvass, and Democrat Crystal Lett receiving 105,926 votes in the recount as compared to 105,937 votes in the official canvas. And there were 19 over-votes as compared to 18 over-votes as reported in the official canvass. Overall, this resulted in candidate Kunze gaining a total of three votes and candidate Lett seeing a net loss of nine votes in the contest

seeing a gain of one additional over-vote as part of the recount.

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In the bond and levies issue contest for the Gahanna-Jefferson City School District, the adjusted results are as follows. The recount resulted in for the bond issue and tax levies receiving a total of 14,491 votes in the recount as compared to 14,496 votes as reported in the official canvass, and against the bond issue and tax levies receiving 14,416 votes in the recount as compared to 14,420 votes in the official canvass. Overall, this resulted in -- And also there were two over-votes as compared to one over-vote as reported in the official canvass. Overall, this resulted in the approval of the affirmative vote for the issues with a total of five votes and against the issue seeing a net loss of four votes and the entire contest seeing a gain of one additional over-vote as part of the recount.

Both contests and breakdown of the recounted votes in these contests are included in the summary results that were provided to you prior to the meeting for your approval as an exhibit. We ask that the Board accept these numbers and instruct the staff to transmit the results to the
