Director that was created with the leaving of Director Ed Leonard.

I'm going to turn it over to Mike
Sexton for any comments and recommendations for a
person to fill the directorship.

MEMBER SEXTON: Thank you, Deputy Director Payne. And I'm excited today to have the opportunity to nominate Mr. Antone White as our next director. You know, for the last two years he's been working with us as our executive assistant where he has assisted both the Director and Deputy Director with day-to-day operations, administrative functions, and special projects during the 2020 presidential election and before that. And he just has a wide range of background in public service going back to working for nearly ten years for Mary Ellen O'Shaughnessy as our Franklin County Clerk of Courts as director of the legal operations for the state's busiest clerk's office in Ohio. He's also served Mayor Michael Coleman and his administration as a specialist and a public safety spokesperson. And, you know, he's

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1	a Franklin County person. He was born here, he
2	went to Columbus Public Schools, and graduated with
3	bachelor of arts from The Ohio State University and
4	from Franklin University. I just feel he has the
5	leadership, administrative and supervisory skills
6	to make a great director for our board.
7	And I would, therefore, move that
8	the Board hire Antone White as Director of Franklin
9	County Board of Elections beginning January 4th,
10	2021, at a compensation rate of \$66.39 per hour.
11	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Any
12	comments, questions?

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1 I'm sure that the Board is in good hands under your 2 leadership and I wish you the best of luck. Thank you for inviting me. It's been an honor to be able 3 4 to swear you in. 5 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Judge 6 Brown. 7 JUDGE BROWN: Thank you everyone. 8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: This is 9 David Payne again. 10 The next item on the agenda is the 11 TMH contract extension. And this is for our 12 project manager, Jo Campbell, as we transition from 13 our Integrity voter system to Tenex. She has done 14 a fantastic job. This is the same rate of pay that 15 we have been paying her. And I would just like to 16 ask the Board for an extension of Jo Campbell's 17 contract with us through TMH. 18 MEMBER SINNOTT: This is Sinnott. I 19 think that's in order. 20 I move that the Board authorize the 21 Director and Deputy Director to enter into a 22 contract with TMH Solutions to continue its service 23 as project manager with the Tenex migration at the 24 hourly rate of \$115, with hours not to exceed 1,040

and the total amount of the contract not to exceed

3	Tenex voter registration system, we need to
4	continue our contract with Integrity. And this
5	is we can cancel this contract by either party
6	giving a 90-day notice. So unless there are any
7	questions about our relationship with EMCS or the
8	Integrity system, I would entertain a motion to
9	authorize the extension of this contract.
10	MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,
11	Michael Sexton. I move the Board authorize the
12	now-Director and Deputy Director to enter into a
13	contract extension with Election Management
14	Consulting Services in the amount of \$68,413.49 for
15	continued support on the Integrity system in
16	calendar year 2021.

10	audit of the November 3rd, 2020 general election
11	results. And this is an amendment. I believe I'm
12	calling on Carla Patton who is in Aspen or Vail,
13	Colorado or some luxurious ski resort.
14	Are you there, Carla?
15	MS. PATTON: I am here. Can you
16	hear me?
17	MEMBER MARINELLO: I hear you good.
18	MS. PATTON: Okay. Good.
19	So beginning the week of
20	December 14th we conducted an audit of the results
21	from the November 2020 general election. That was
22	five Five percent was the requirement. We did a
23	little over five percent. We hand counted over
24	35,500 ballots. And the results have been provided
25	to you as amended results with the original results

showing in black and the new amended results are showing in red with the original struck through.

So overall the results of the audit showed that we had a net gain of one ballot that was found in the presidential race. We had one additional vote to Biden and then we had a write-in. So a certified candidate Kacie Wells, Rachel Wells picked up one vote.

In the justice race, full term commencing January 1, 2021, Kennedy picked up three votes and John O'Donnell picked up three votes and under votes went down five votes. So it would be an issue of, one, you have the additional ballot that was cast, and then, two, pencil markings on the ballots to mark the candidates were most likely not seen by the machine and originally counted as an under vote. So that's where the difference of those votes would come from.

In the Court of Appeals judge race, full term commencing 2-9, Michael Mentel picked up two votes, Colleen O'Donnell picked up three votes, and the under votes were reduced by four votes.

Again, similar to the justice race, under votes were counted where they should have actually been counted for a candidate plus you have the one

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1	additional ballot that was found to make up that
2	additional vote.
3	With that, we recommend that you
4	certify the results as appears in the amended
5	results for those three races.
6	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Are there
7	any questions for Carla?
8	If not, I'd entertain a motion to
9	accept the amended audit report.
10	MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I
11	move the Board amend and declare as final the
12	official canvass of the votes cast at the
13	November 3, 2020 general election. This is Kim
14	Marinello.
15	MR. PREISSE: And this is Doug
16	Preisse. Second the motion.
17	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I'll take
18	roll. All those in favor of the motion signify by
19	saying aye.
20	Kim Marinello.
21	MEMBER MARINELLO: Yes. Aye.
22	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.
23	MEMBER SEXTON: Yes.
24	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug

7	The next and final item on the
8	agenda is a two percent raise. This is was
9	approved in December by the County Commissioners
10	for all non-bargaining employees, which would
11	include if approved by the Board here the staff of
12	the Franklin County Board of Elections, all
13	full-time employees. Again, it's a two percent
14	raise. I think you were given a chart that shows
15	what all of our full-time employees make now and
16	what they would make with a two percent raise.
17	So unless there are any questions,
18	I'd entertain a motion to accept or approve,
19	rather, the two percent pay increase for all
20	full-time BOE staff.
21	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: David, this is
22	Doug. I'm looking at this chart. What's 2021 new
23	overtime mean?
24	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: So that
25	would be if there are any overtime hours. I do see

1	that David Payne. I do not get paid for
2	overtime. So that wouldn't count for myself or
3	Antone White. But other folks, that is the hourly
4	rate that they would make for working overtime. We
5	try to limit overtime hours, obviously, when we
6	can. During the presidential election that we just
7	went through there was obviously a lot of overtime,
8	but we budget for that and it has been accounted
9	for when we deal with the Secretary of or rather
10	the County Commissions in their budget.
11	MR. PREISSE: Thank you.
12	MEMBER SINNOTT: This is Sinnott.
13	If no Board member has another question, I move
14	that the Board approve a two percent pay increase
15	to all full-time Board of Elections staff for
16	calendar year 2021.
17	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a
18	second?
19	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse.
20	Second.
21	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I will take
22	roll.
23	Kim Marinello.
24	MEMBER MARINELLO: Yes.
25	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.
