DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I'll go	
ahead and take roll.	
Kim Marinello.	
MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.	
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.	
MEMBER SEXTON: Here.	
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug	
Preisse.	
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.	
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Josh	
Jaffe.	
MEMBER JAFFE: Here.	
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We have a	
quorum.	
The first item on the agenda is the	
certification of candidates. We received a Supreme	
Court ruling on the 24th and a Directive 2022-37	
from the Ohio Secretary of State on the 26th. And	
I think that's part of your packet, which indicated	
that we had, of the six candidates that they	
mentioned in the directive, four of them were	
Franklin County candidates.	

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1	5 And I'll turn it over to Jeff	
2	Mackey.	
3	MR. MACKEY: So per Directive	
4	2022-37 we received from the Secretary of State,	
5	staff has reviewed the four petitions that are	
6	listed before you on Exhibit A, and found them to	
7	be valid and sufficient.	
8	Just to make sure everybody's	
9	looking at the same Exhibit A, Elizabeth Thien or	
10	Thien, she is the write-in candidate, not Bridgette	
11	Tupes. Two versions of that floating around, so.	
12	MEMBER JAFFE: And the secretary has	
13	directed us to send out supplemental ballots to the	
14	military voters who have already received their	
15	ballots. How many of those are there?	
16	DIRECTOR WHITE: There's a total	
17	Sorry.	
18	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You guys calling	
19	each other?	
20	DIRECTOR WHITE: Sorry about that.	
21	There are a total of 116 ballots	
22	that, UOCAVA voters that will need to receive a new	
23	ballot; 113 of those by email, three will be	
24	mailed. And that's how we originally sent those	
25	out to those, the original ballot out to those	

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1	voters.	
2	MEMBER SEXTON: And the supplemental	
3	ballots only go to the affected districts?	
4	DIRECTOR WHITE: Those are the	
5	impacted voters that, from our original UOCAVA that	
6	we sent out back on June 17th. We sent out 192,	
7	and 116 were impacted with this change.	
8	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Will those go	
9	with some sort of clarification notification?	
10	DIRECTOR WHITE: Yes. So there's a	
11	notice that the Ohio Secretary of State sent our	
12	office as a part of Directive 2022-37 that we've	
13	formatted onto our own letterhead, and that will be	
14	sent along with the new ballot	
15	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And	
16	DIRECTOR WHITE: explaining the	
17	situation.	
18	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And if we get	
19	How will we handle the receipt of any of those	
20	ballots singularly or if two come back?	
21	DIRECTOR WHITE: So we've been	
22	directed to segregate all ballots. So the original	
23	ballot that we sent the voter, if that ballot is	
24	returned to us, we will segregate that ballot. And	
25	then any new ballots that come to us from the same	

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1	voter, we'll separate in a separate bin. And then	
2	depending on which ballot is sent back, that's the	
3	vote that's the ballot that we will count for	
4	that voter. So if a voter sends back their first	
5	ballot, but they don't send back the supplemental	
6	ballot, the second ballot that we sent them, we'll	
7	count the first. If they send back the second,	
8	we'll count the second.	
9	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: If they send	
10	back both, we'll count the second?	
11	DIRECTOR WHITE: If they send back	
12	both, we'll count the second. But we've been	
13	directed to segregate those ballots and not to	
14	count those ballots until the eleventh day after	
15	the August 2nd election.	
16	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Gotcha.	
17	MEMBER JAFFE: In terms of the	
18	timing of sending out the supplement, I guess	
19	there's a protest hearing date potential on	
20	July 5th, so we couldn't send anything out until	
21	after that point, is that right?	
22	DIRECTOR WHITE: The deadline for	
23	protest is on Friday, July or excuse me. What	
24	day is Friday? The 30th, June 30th. I believe the	
25	deadline to submit a protest is this Friday at	

8 1 noon. 2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It'd be the 3 1st. 4 DIRECTOR WHITE: So if we don't 5 submit -- if we don't get a protest --6 MEMBER JAFFE: Then we'll move right 7 away. 8 DIRECTOR WHITE: Then we'll proceed 9 with sending out those ballots. If we do receive a 10 protest, then we'll need to hear that protest by 11 Tuesday, July 5th. 12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And we do 13 already have a meeting scheduled. It would be our 14 regular July meeting for July 5th at 3 o'clock. 15 DIRECTOR WHITE: That's correct. 16 MR. MACKEY: And as usual, since the 17 ballot has changed, we'll send you a new proof to 18 make sure you have a chance to look it over. 19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't have any 20 further questions. 21 MEMBER SEXTON: All right. 22 Mr. Chairman, on June 24th, 2022, the Ohio Supreme 23 Court issued a decision that requires the Franklin 24 County Board of Elections to certify four 25 additional candidates to the ballot. Therefore I

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1	move that the Board certify to the August 2nd, 2022		
2	Primary Election ballot those candidates listed on		
3	Exhibit A, and that these petitions were found to		
4	be valid and sufficient.		
5	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.		
6	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been		
7	moved and seconded.		
8	All those in favor of the motion,		
9	signify by saying aye.		
10	(Vote taken.)		
11	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,		
12	same sign.		
13	(No response.)		
14	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion		
15	carries.		
16	I don't believe there's anything		
17	else on the agenda.		
18	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.		
19	MEMBER SEXTON: Second.		
20	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We're		
21	adjourned.
