DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All right.
I would just remind everybody before they speak if they could state their name so our court reporter can get the right comments to the -- treated to the right person.

I will call roll.
Kim Marinello.
MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton. COMMISSIONER SEXTON: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug
Preisse.
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Josh Jaffe.

MEMBER JAFFE: Here.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We have a quorum.

The first item on the agenda is the approval of the minutes from the September 6, 2022 Board meeting. I think Erin sent out all of the minutes. If there are any additions or deletions
or corrections?
MEMBER JAFFE: Hearing none, this is Josh Jaffe. I move the Board approve the minutes from the September 6, 2022 meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections as submitted.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Kim Marinello, second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.
Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on
the agenda is the purchase of a barrier wall outside of the Early Vote Center. And I will turn that over to Matt Kelly, who's the manager of our absentee department.

Thanks, Matt.
MR. KELLY: Thank you.
Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman, members of the Board.

Actually, this is a request for rental of a barrier wall. We are not purchasing it. We are renting the barrier wall for an
extended period of time that covers the early voting period. We are asking for approval of \$10,694. And that would cover these orange barrier walls that we used in the 2020 election, kind of to serve a number of purposes. It literally is voter protection, because we are protecting the voters who are standing in line waiting for the Early Vote Center line to go down. And it serves as a visual barrier so people know where to line up around the building. We anticipate a large crowd this early voting period, especially during those last two weeks. If you remember in 2020 we had a line that wrapped all the way around the building. This barrier that we're renting would be 500 plus feet, just a little bit over 500 feet. That would cover barrier all the way around the front of the Early Vote Center, in front of the main entrance here, the Papa Johns and Sam Ash, and just around the corner to where HomeBuys starts. So the 500 feet that we measured out would gives us plenty of protection for those areas that are the most vulnerable areas for people standing in line.

We've met with our Homeland Security team and partners. We do that every election cycle. And they suggested we purchase or rent a
barrier wall to help with all of these safety measures. So we are also including with this $\$ 10,694$ some other protection measures, including where we have gaps in the barrier wall, some bike racks that we set up to kind of control the traffic flow of our voters in line, and we've added some parking or speed bumps, temporary speed bumps to the $\$ 10,694$. That would help control traffic, especially right in front of the Early Vote Center entrance and exit. There tend to be a lot of people just driving very quickly in our parking lot. So we thought the temporary speed bumps would also serve the purpose.

So with that, I ask for your approval of these --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: These things are filled with water?

MR. KELLY: Yes.
Paul Peterson Company will install them, which in fact means coming out and placing all of the barriers and then having a water truck follow and filling up each barrier as they're connected.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We used them in 2020?

MR. KELLY: We did, yes.
MEMBER JAFFE: Josh Jaffe. So this extends sort of to the end of the sidewalk and then it's parking lot from there on out; is that right?

MR. KELLY: It extends -- it mimics
the sidewalk. So it's just off the sidewalk and it, again, protects our voters from themselves, going into the parking lot or trying to stand in line in the parking lot. And it helps us just control the line as well.

MEMBER JAFFE: I remember in 2020 we had the line actually go all the way around behind the building. In '18, last gubernatorial, did we have lines that long?

MR. KELLY: In the last
gubernatorial, I was not here. So I don't recall exactly how far the lines went, but I believe -DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: They were not that long. But they were well --

MEMBER JAFFE: Past.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yeah.
MEMBER JAFFE: Okay. Another
question. There's a space that -- we have candidates in the parking lot, too, trying to talk to the voters in line. Are the barriers far enough
away that candidates can be 10 feet away from the line or are the candidates going to be traffic?

MR. KELLY: Well, the candidates are allowed to approach the voters if the voters engage the candidates to come forward and give them something. And surprisingly enough, the barrier does kind of fit that ten feet range. So it does help with that as well.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Does that mean the candidates are in the parking lot?

MR. KELLY: The candidates are all over the place.

MEMBER JAFFE: They can't be inside of the barrier because --

MR. KELLY: Right. If they were inside of the barrier wall they would be within 10 feet.

DIRECTOR WHITE: The barrier wall extends beyond the 100-foot campaigning line that we have painted out in the parking lot. So really it's nice to have that because it does act as a way to separate the campaigning from the voter, right. And so that creates that 10-foot barrier.

MEMBER JAFFE: We should encourage candidates and volunteers to watch out for traffic.

MR. KELLY: Yes, we always do. Other questions?

MEMBER JAFFE: Okay. Well, this is Josh Jaffe, I will move that the Board rent a water barrier wall from the Paul Peterson Company in the amount of $\$ 10,694$ to protect the voters lined up at the Early Vote Center.

MEMBER SEXTON: Michael Sexton, I'll second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.
Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on the agenda is the Polling Location Notification Cards. I will turn that over to Antone White, our Director, to give a brief explanation of that.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.
Good afternoon. I believe it was the June 8th Board meeting, I was not present, I was on vacation, but I believe there was some discussion at that meeting about polling locations, particularly for our August 2nd Primary election.

We had to close a number of polling locations because of the unexpected August Primary. We had to close a number of locations just for logistical reasons. A lot of them were not available for August. And so we closed, I think, approximately half of our locations for the August election. And I believe there was some conversation by the Board during that June meeting that we should notify all of our voters in the county for the November election, notify of them of their polling location as a reminder to cut down on confusion for Election Day for the November election. So we were tasked with trying to come up with an outreach piece to notify voters of their polling location. So what we did was our staff came up with this piece here, it should be in your packet, the Polling Location Notification Card. And it should be --

MS. GIBBONS: It's at the end of the back of the second tab.

DIRECTOR WHITE: And so this notification will be sent out to 660,000 registered voting households in the county. We chose households instead of actual registered voters to cut down on costs. So this notification will alert every voter, registered household of their polling
location for the November election.
But in addition to that, we took the opportunity to also remind our voters of some other critical information. So we took the opportunity to remind them of how they can vote by mail, Early Vote Center hours for the upcoming election. We took the opportunity to remind them about proper voter identification, which helps cut down on provisional ballots, which I know our voter services departments appreciates. And we also took the opportunity to promote being a poll worker. So there's a $Q R$ code on this piece that we sent out that can be scanned, and it takes you to where you can sign up to be a poll worker. So this will go out to 660,000 registered households in the county. We are asking for the approval of $\$ 66,005$ for the printing of the formal location notification cards, with CPMM Services.

And I want to thank Gretchen James, who is our Community Affairs Manager, who led this project and effort.

Gretchen, I don't know if you have anything you want to add.

MS. JAMES: Director, Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board, I believe Director White
pretty much summed it up perfectly. This piece, the only thing I would add is that it is going out to our voters as we speak. And today we have mailed 211,977 pieces.

So thank you.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Gretchen, if I may. That piece is eight and a half -- not eight and a half by eleven, but eight and a half by five and a half. I mean, I think what they are looking at, it's actually not folded, but it's a card stock. It would be printed on front and back.

MEMBER JAFFE: That probably answers my question, but I'll ask it anyway. I don't see any space on here to tell them their polling location. Is that --

DIRECTOR WHITE: I'm sorry. What is in your packet may not be representative of the full piece. It's a front and back piece. So the front piece has the voter's address and next to it has their polling location here. And so this piece folds like this, and then you put tabs across, and this is what gets sent to the voters.

MEMBER JAFFE: A poll worker's message, too.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Sorry about that.

We always want to take the opportunity to recruit for poll workers.

MEMBER JAFFE: How many polling locations did we change for this election compared to May?

DIRECTOR WHITE: So, yeah, in May we had 320. So for this election, we will have 309. So for every election we always have some changes for one reason or another. And I think there were 11 locations for this election that became unavailable for various reasons, construction, parking issues, we do an assessment of ADA, to ensure all of these locations are ADA compliant. And sometimes, for whatever reason, they do not become ADA compliant; so we make a change. We've had to consolidate a couple locations. So between May we had 320, for November we will have 309. So this is even more of a reason why we should send this out so that everyone knows what their correct location is come November 8th.

MEMBER JAFFE: Right. Particularly, because we changed it for August pretty significantly.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah.
MR. SEXTON: Seeing no other
questions -- you guys did some great work and I think it will help with a lot of the confusion we had from the second Primary to June because a lot of people consolidated and moved around; so this will tell them not only they are registered to vote but obviously all of the other information that goes along with it. So I think this is a great toolkit.

So Michael Sexton, I move that the Board authorize the printing of 666,052 Polling Location Notification Cards from the CPMM Services Group in the amount of $\$ 66,005$.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse, second the motion.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.
Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I will call
on Matt Kelly again. The next item on the agenda is the hiring of Early Vote Center managers. Matt.

MR. KELLY: Thank you.

Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board, in past high-volume elections it's been the practice of the Board to hire a bipartisan set of managers to assist with the daily operations of the Early Vote Center. And these managers carry the responsibility of managing our 50 plus seasonal employees that we will have up there serving as machine judges, keyers, and ballot judges.

Besides that, and just managing the staff up there. They are also heavily responsible for any troubleshooting issues that come up during early vote. Since myself and Darlene Tompkins, who runs the absentee department, can't be up there every single hour, we do need a good set of eyeballs up there, and trained folks that can help us manage the operation of the Early Vote Center. Ultimately, they're responsible for the nightly reconciliation of all of the ballot boxes, the ballots that are in the ballot boxes, getting them secured and safely stored back in the ballot vault, and making sure we audit all of the items that come from the Early Vote Center each day, and that all of the ballot counts balance with the machine counts.

Typically, these managers are hired
at a daily rate of pay set by the Board. And the Board usually sets that period for their management from 32 to 35 days. This election season we have some unique challenges, we are anticipating a higher number of voters at early vote than we had in 2018. You take into consideration population growth, more voter registrations, and just the overall popularity increasing of people voting early. So we're anticipating anywhere from 62 to 68,000 potential early voters this time. Couple that with an extended ballot in the city of Columbus with, I believe, five bond issues, and I don't know how many charter amendments they have, three charter agreements, the ballot length has now extended to four sheets -- or I'm sorry, four-sided, two sheets. So we know that it will take voters a little bit longer this time around to go through their ballot, especially ones that read everything on the ballot. We normally have a ballot that takes around seven and a half minutes in a Presidential year if everybody votes everything on the ballot. With this lengthy ballot and lengthy issues on the ballot, we anticipate that may increase to eight or nine minutes per person, depending on how quickly they read. So
with all of those challenges in place, we found it necessary to look at our managers to do a number of things. We think we will have more training with our machine judges, who will probably be engaged with voters who have questions about the issues and how to vote through those issues on the ballot. So we wanted to extend the usual 32 to 35 days that you would hire managers for the Early Vote Center, we would like to extend that to 40 days. Because we need to work in a week's worth of training and a week's worth of early vote setup, because we have to add some more machines up there to accommodate all of the voters we anticipate. So we propose the hiring of a Democrat and Republican manager.

The Democrat manager, Nasir, if you'd stand up.

Nasir Abdullah. He has served with the Early Vote Center since 2020. He took on that responsibility as an actual management or lead seasonal employee in the Early Vote Center the past few elections. Especially, in the May ' 22 Primary. He has a strong working knowledge of the entire Early Vote Center operation, and has experience with opening and closing procedures, as well as the day-to-day audit procedures. So the Early Vote

Center can continue to operate as part of the absentee division and be in good hands. We recommend the appointment of Nasir as our Democratic manager.

On the Republican side, Julie Kyle.
And Julie, she serves in voter services as a seasonal employee. And she's been at the Board of Elections since 2016 in several different roles, including as an absentee seasonal employee. And as I said, currently serve a key role in voter services. She's one of those staff members you can go to and ask her to find all of the permanent detail on a voter, and she'll even dive into the microfiche files, if needed, to find what we need to find. So we recommend Julie as the Republican manager for the Early Vote Center.

And we recommend that both managers be paid at the rate of $\$ 312.50$ a day, and not to exceed 40 days.

MEMBER JAFFE: I have one question.
MR. KELLY: Sure.
MEMBER JAFFE: Can the Voter
Services Department survive without Julie?
MR. KELLY: They're always calling
her. She's been pivoting back and forth the last
couple days. But we are confident we can keep her up at the Early Vote Center, and only release her back to voter services as needed.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Good question and good answer.

MS. MARINELLO: I move that the Board hire Nasir Abdullah as the Democratic manager of the Early Vote Center, and Julie Kyle as the Republican manager of the Early Vote Center at a rate of 312.50 per day, and a total not to exceed 40 days, total 12,500.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse, second the motion.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.
Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on
the agenda is the employee shuttle service. And I will turn that over to our Director, Antone White. DIRECTOR WHITE: Good afternoon again.

This is a purchase request for
\$12,069.20 for transportation services for Columbus Coach. And this is to shuttle our Board of Elections employees to off-site employee parking between October 24th and November 7th. So that is the last two weeks of early vote. So as our manager Matt Kelly indicated earlier, we expect that in the ramp-up to early vote will be busy in the last couple weeks of early vote. And so to help with traffic congestion here, similar to what we did in 2020, we will ask that our employees, Board of Election employees park off site. So we have secured a parking lot across the street over at Ascension Lutheran Church, right next to Chase Bank. They also serve as an election day polling location. They have a very large parking lot in back. So we will pay a small fee to the church to utilize their parking lot. And we can shuttle employees back and forth for the last two weeks of early vote. That takes approximately 150 to 175 cars off of this parking lot. And it frees up additional space for voters for all of the campaign volunteers, all of the people that will come up here to early vote during that time period. That's just one small piece of what we do to try to minimize traffic congestion up here.

So in addition to that, we also implement the Early Vote Center parking policy, which this Board adopted in 2019. And part of that parking policy states that campaign workers who are coming to engage voters, come to the Early Vote Center not park their cars in front of the Early Vote Center. We ask that they park in other areas around the complex that are not directly in front of the Early Vote Center. We had some correspondence go out to all of the campaigns and candidates. I think it went out, Gretchen, Friday. It went out this past Friday.

In addition to that, we will also have our ballot tent, drop-off ballot tent. We will have trained bipartisan staff who will accept absentee ballots for voters who wish to drop off their ballot in a secured ballot box. So that way they don't have to park, get out of the car, and walk the ballot up. They can just drive up, drop it off to a bipartisan team. In addition to that, we will have electronic billboards up here.

So we do a number of things up here to sort of minimize traffic congestion during very busiest time of our early vote period. So this shuttle service is one piece of that.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Does this cover weekends?

DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, weekends that we are open for voting. If we are not open for voting, employees can park here who are working on the weekend. But when the Early Vote Center is open, we ask our employees to park off site.

MEMBER JAFFE: I remember seeing a map of the parking areas and like approved, not approved for candidates. I assume that's what we sent out to them. Can I have that? Because they ask me for that sometimes.

DIRECTOR WHITE: That's what we sent out. We will get you one today.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse. I am comparing what may or may not be the final suggestion of the contract for Erin's explanatory timing, but it looks like maybe there's some purposeful thinking going on here that the shuttle service may stop before early voting ends or at the same time?

DIRECTOR WHITE: It will stop that Monday. So run from October 24th through Monday, the 7th.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What I'm saying
is as I look at this document, our lovely voting at the Board of Elections, for instance, weekdays October 31 to 4.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The first week, right, we are not having shuttles?

DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, the first couple weeks we are not having shuttle service. We're not asking employees to park off site, because we don't anticipate the volume will be such we need to do that.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, I see. I think I was looking at it wrong.

So October 31 to November 4, two shuttles ending at 8:00 p.m. because voting ends at 7:00 p.m.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Right. So what we do is for some of our later staff, early vote staff, we run the shuttle a little later so they have an opportunity --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I understand. Thank you.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Yep.
MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,
Michael Sexton. I move the Board of Elections contract with Columbus Coach to provide shuttle
service in the amount of $\$ 12,069.20$ to shuttle Board of Elections employees from October 24th through November 7th, except for the days during this period when the Early Vote Center is closed. CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse, second the motion.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign. Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
item on the agenda is the employee healthcare contribution. And I will turn that over to our HR manager, Chris Walter.

MR. WALTER: Good afternoon, Board Members. My name is Chris Walter, I'm the Human Resources Manager.

What you have in front of you is for calendar year 2023, the Board of Commissioners bi-weekly contribution health rate for health insurance for its employees. The single rate will increase from $\$ 75$ to $\$ 81$ per pay. And the family and domestic partner rate will increase from \$167
even to $\$ 180.50$ per pay. I recommend that we accept the Board of Commissioners rate agreement and request Board approval.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Questions anybody?

MEMBER MARINELLO: No questions.
Mr . Chairman, I move the Board approve the employee healthcare contribution rates as listed and described in Exhibit C.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse, second the motion.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.
Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
item on the agenda is the retention incentive. And I will turn that over to Antone White.

DIRECTOR WHITE: I'm back.
So on September 13th, the Board of
Commissioners announced a retention incentive program. And this program they announced is to recognize the work of all county employees that
worked during the COVID-19 pandemic and that chose to stay employed with the county during that time. And so this retention program will provide a one-time payment of $\$ 1,000$ to eligible employees. Eligibility is defined by employees who were employed with the county as of July 1, 2021, and had continuous employment during that time and up until October 21, 2022, when that payment would be made. So we would have to opt into that program in order to be eligible to receive those one-time payments.

> We worked with the county
administration, their budget -- budget director and we were able to determine that we have 47 full-time employees and 64 seasonal employees who are eligible for that incentive, should we choose to opt into that program.

The way we defined continuous employment for seasonal employees was pretty much the same as full-time employee, you had to be employed by July 1, 2021, but you also had to work four consecutive elections. So during that time period between July 1, 2021 and October 21, 2022, we had four elections; so if you worked four continuous elections during that time frame, you
were eligible for that incentive.
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse. As
a seasonal?
DIRECTOR WHITE: As a full-time employee.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: If you are full-time, even if you have only been here a month you are eligible.

DIRECTOR WHITE: No. If you weren't employed with the county by July 1, 2021.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: 2021. Okay.
DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah. The
eligibility period was July 1, 2021 through the time the payment would be made, which is October 21, 2022.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: For either
seasonal or full-time?
DIRECTOR WHITE: Correct.
Did I myself anything with that,
David?
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think you covered it quite well.

MEMBER JAFFE: I think I saw that
the funding is coming from the American Rescue Plan; is that right?

DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, that's
correct. So the payments for this incentive would be made through the Board of Commissioners, which is a part, and they get the money from the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, which is through the American Rescue Plan.

MEMBER JAFFE: I had another question. Our opportunity here today is to either opt-in to the Commissioners plan or not?

DIRECTOR WHITE: Correct. We had to -- we had to tell the Commissioners if our agency wanted to opt-in. We opted in, because it was a date before this board meeting was set, pending Board action.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I'm guessing all agencies are opting in.

DIRECTOR WHITE: That's correct. I think it's a total of approximately 5,000 county employees are eligible for this.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: 40 some agencies.

DIRECTOR WHITE: 40 some agencies, yeah, across the footprint.

MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,
Michael Sexton, I move the Board of Elections
opt-in for the one-time payment of $\$ 1,000$ offered to eligible employees by the Board of County Commissioners using the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund authorized by the American Rescue Plan.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse, second the motion.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.
Motion carries.
(Vote taken; motion passed)
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on
the agenda is a discussion of the employee compensation. It's possible the Board may want to go into executive session to listen to that study. We do have a voter, Franklin County voter that filled out a speaker form. I don't know if we want to address that now or how we want to approach that. Karen Rankin.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, if she's been waiting why not take care of that now so you don't have to wait any longer.

I would like to say at the outset,
welcome. We don't normally handle public hearings because that's not our job, unless it's pertinent to something before us and we are investigating and having witnesses and evidence come in. However, as long as I have been around, we've liked to lean towards an open policy, if members of the public which appear, ask questions or make brief comments. We ask you to make your comments to the point and brief. And if you have a question or two, we can go there. If that's not satisfactory to you, we can, of course, have other meetings and staff availability to you and exposure to whatever information.

MS. HUMMER: Chairman, if I may also add to those comments. And so that the public is clear, part of the reason this is not normally done is that when there's going to be public participation or comments we like to make sure that is properly on the agenda so those interested can be in attendance and able to respond to those comments. Since that wasn't done, it's -- that is the exception. So I just want to make sure we are all clear that part of the reason we do not normally do that is really to be transparent to the public at large so they are here to respond.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And with proper notice, that kind of thing. Okay. Great.

MS. RANKIN: Just want to know if I'm allowed to say I called earlier to talk to someone to find out what the agenda was. The person I was speaking to two times, did not know. So that means I didn't know what your agenda was today, but I submitted a question anyway.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Why don't we start, could you state your name?

MS. RANKIN: Karen M. Rankin.
And I guess there's a formality to addressing members of the Board, Director and Director, I had a question about the election coming up about the possibilities of illegals voting. And I will be a worker at a polling place, and I just wanted to know how is that handled? If someone has a question about is that person a legal citizens? I mean, I worked the 2020 election, and a voter before she walked out the door said I thought only citizens got to vote. Because there were people of other cultures who couldn't even speak English in the room voting. And so my question is how does one find out if a potential voter coming into a polling place is a citizen?

And who can ask the question? And who will answer that question?

MEMBER JAFFE: Well, I can tell you the first answer is only citizens can register to vote in the first place. And if people aren't registered to vote on the voter rolls, then they can show up at a polling place but they won't be able to cast a ballot if they are not registered to vote. Beyond that --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Or provisionally, then that will be checked back here before it's counted and discarded.

MEMBER JAFFE: Right. But beyond that, David, do you have some insight on what the particular procedures are?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And so I will ask Sarah to correct me, if I misspeak. So on your voter registration card, it says I am -you're making an affirmation that I am at least 18 years old, and that I am a citizen of the United States, and you have to check the box yes or no. If somebody checks it no, then what is our process?

MS. SIMBA: Our process is to send a letter to confirm -- sorry. Sarah Simba, supervisor, voter services -- send a letter to the
voter to ask them to confirm one more time, sometimes people check -- they don't know what they are checking, they make mistakes. So we will send them a letter. We don't process that form until we hear a response back either in the affirmative or negative that they are or are not a citizen. If they respond back and say I'm sorry, I made a mistake, I am a citizen, we will register them. If they respond back, no, I am not a citizen, we reject the application on the basis that they are not a citizen, and send them a denial notice for that.

And additionally on the form, in addition to the check boxes indicating that you are or are not a citizen, the signature box as well, there's a statement down there that says I'm a citizen of the United States, I am a resident for 30 days of the address listed above, I will be 18 by the General election, and I sign this under penalty knowing it's a felony in the United States to sign this falsely. So they are affirming actually twice that they are a citizen, Both with a check box and their signature on the bottom of the form.

MEMBER JAFFE: And then in terms of
double checking, they have to provide a form of ID, typically driver's license number or Social Security number. And I think there is some cross-checking through the Secretary of State once those forms of identification are provided.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yes. So occasionally we receive names from the Secretary of State, and they will ask us, because they've received information from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles or the Social Security Administration that they have questions about these particular voters. We supply them with the information, meaning the Secretary of State, with the information they are asking, which would include their voter registration.

MS. SIMBA: Any documents we have on file for the voter.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Correct. And then they would investigate that, and then depending on the investigation, they would turn that over to the attorney general for prosecution or for looking into it further. So does that sort of answer -- and, of course, any individual anywhere in the county, if they suspect that someone is not 18 years old, if they are not an

American citizen and they're attempting to register or attempting to vote, they should let us know or they should let the Secretary of State know, and we would absolutely look into that.

MS. RANKIN: Okay. I was just concerned because I didn't know if people were registered to vote when and if they apply for a drivers license. Are they? Do they register to vote then?

MS. SIMBA: You have the ability to when you go to the BMV to register to vote. But again, you're still affirming when you are there, you are affirming you are a citizen and sign again that you are. So that's on the individual if they choose to lie. It's also written on there that it's a felony.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: There are various places you will find voter registration opportunities, libraries, BMVs. But it's separate, you don't get to vote just because you have a library card or a driver's license. So it's separate.

MS. RANKIN: Thank very much. Thank you for allowing me to speak and ask questions. I appreciate it.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you for coming in. Thanks for your service in the upcoming election.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you. We appreciate it.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Karen is an activist. I did mention to her before she came in, anytime, the staff would love to give her a tour of the Board of Elections and bring anybody that you know that has any questions. We like to show off our security and our procedures here.

So thank you, Karen.
The next item on the agenda is the discussion of the Employee Compensation Study. And we have Heidi Miller from Clemans Nelson here to go over that study. I don't know if there's an interest in going into executive session. Oftentimes we do that, but it's not --

MEMBER JAFFE: So this is a study that the county commissioners put together. Is there any confidentiality on sort of their end?

MS. HUMMER: The document is a public record.

MEMBER JAFFE: Okay. I feel fine with an open discussion of a public record then.

MS. MILLER: Heidi Miller. I am with Clemans Nelson \& Associates. And that was my introduction as well, which is what I paused for anyways.

So I have been -- we were contracted by the Board of Commissioners to come in and essentially look at the compensation of not only the Board of Commissioners, but any office or department that chose to participate in that process. So you all were one of those offices that did that.

So what I brought for you all today is a draft report of essentially our findings and recommendations for the Board of Elections specifically. So what I will do is I like to provide this report simply because it helps me kind of walk through the process and allows you all to see what we did.

So to start on page 1. Usually when we do a compensation study, there's two parts to it, two main components. The first component being the marketing study, that is the wage survey. Essentially what we call our external equity analysis. So that's where we go out and we look at what other similar organizations are paying for
similar positions. So that part, what we looked at, we looked at eight counties across the state of Ohio, we also looked at two, kind of local competitors for the county, if you will. So that was Ohio State University and the State of Ohio.

The list of counties and some of the demographic information, such as population, median household income, that is on the following page. And that is the list of counties that we looked at in the wage survey.

The next page you will see all of the positions that we looked at under Board of Elections that we specifically compiled information on. When we look at that and what we are gathering is we are asking for if they have a wage range. So a minimum and a maximum. Where are these positions starting, where can they top out at, and we also ask for what employees are currently making right now in that role. For you all that was actually important because you don't currently have established ranges; so we need to really rely on that data of what employees are currently making to kind of figure out where we go from here. So

A summary of that information, and I will kind of show you or walk you through what that
is. That is on page 3 here, which I actually think the pages got numbered incorrectly, but we will say page 3. So essentially what you have is you have a list of all of the titles we looked at, we have an average for what you all are paying those employees in those positions right now, and then we have an average of the responses we got back. So an average minimum, average maximum, average current.

The important column for me anyways is this variance to market. So that's essentially how I can compare what are you guys paying compared to what others are paying. So if it read or if you see in that column 100 percent that means essentially what employees are making in that role is exactly what others are paying as well --

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Excuse me. Sorry for interrupting. Is that the comparison to other boards or --

MS. MILLER: Other boards of
elections.
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: From those 88 other counties?

MS. MILLER: Yes, yes. And that would include the State of Ohio and Ohio State where they may have had similar positions; so that
wouldn't have applied to all of the positions.
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Thanks.
MS. MILLER: And then so 100 percent is market, anything below 100 percent would be below market, and then anything above 100 percent would be above what the market rate is for that job.

So, and then what $I$ also did, $I$ kind of tracked how many responded or how many gave me a response for a minimum, a maximum, a current. Just so when I'm looking at those percentages, I can make just sure things aren't skewed based on number of responses. Because not everybody is structured the same way; so they may not have a position that's exactly the same.

So overall, your office, if you look at it from a big picture, was just slightly below market, but it was about 98 percent on average. So not alarming. But, you know, in today's market, I would definitely say it's a little low. So any questions about that summary before $I$ kind of go on to the next piece, which will be kind of diving into the recommendations a little bit?

Okay. So before recommendation another big piece of this as well was an internal
equity analysis. So part of this process, and kind of why -- I shouldn't say completely why the Commissioners included others, but part of it was we were trying to create some sort of alignment across the county with certain positions to ensure that you could kind of alleviate some of the internal competing from one office to the other office where positions might be similar. Of course, you are going to have people who might leave your office because there's a professional growth opportunity, right. But what we are trying to alleviate is the competing when it's a lateral move, a very similar move. That's what we were looking at. So that was another component of this.

So what this all led to is essentially proposing a wage scale for you all, something that you didn't currently have. That was kind of a big focus when I was kind of looking at everything to figure out where we should go. And so what I created is a pay scale, which is on page 8, and that has 11 pay grades in it, and positions have been grouped into these pay grades essentially based on the market results and based on kind of that internal what's going on across the county. And so they have been slotted in that
manner. So you will see those in kind of the minimum and maximum rate for those positions. And what that will essentially provide you all with is some guidelines for where positions should start, you know, when recruiting, and you can use it as a tool for retaining, because you now have this maximum rate of pay for a job. So that is a big piece of that.

The other thing that we ended up doing across most of the offices that participated was essentially a tenure adjustment. So one-time tenure adjustment. Where -- so what happens is when you create a scale and you kind of determine how it impacts your current employees, you can often have a lot of employees that sit at the bottom of the scale, even though they may have been here 10 years, 15 years, whatever the case may be. So what we have proposed is a one-time adjustment based on their years of service with the county that would provide for either 25 cents, 50 cents, a dollar or a 1.50 that would be added to their hourly rate.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: See if you can talk about again this idea of compression exists for older -- not chronologically older, but longer
term employees, is that what you are saying?
MS. MILLER: Yes. So there's two types of compression. You can have compression that goes this way. So essentially you have a lot of employees that are lumped near the bottom of the pay scale. And so if it's new employees, that's fine. But where it's an issue is when you have new employees at the bottom, you have five-year, 10-year, 15-year employees and they're all kind of grouped down here at the bottom versus being spread out. Typically, you know, if you have a pay scale and you're implementing it and you're kind of giving pretty regular increases, employees should be quite scattered throughout in a perfect world. So that's one type of compression.

Another type is the up and down. And that's where you have the issues with supervisors making more than subordinates -- or they should be. I said that backwards. Subordinates making more than supervisors. And a lot of times that can happen, you know, with years of service or just kind of how they have moved through the agency. So that's another type of compression. But my bigger focus was the other, which is making sure you don't have too many
employees down near the bottom of the scale. CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you. MS. MILLER: And that's not a perfect -- you know, this tenure adjustment, it's not perfect, but it is a small movement to help kind of alleviate that a little bit.

MEMBER JAFFE: Just to follow up on that. The scales, we are talking about people being compressed at the bottom of are based on other organizations and how their distribution is or what determines the scales --

MS. MILLER: So it would strictly be based on you all. Because this is a scale that's specific just to the Board of Elections. This is not a scale that we recommended county-wide. Now, obviously, like a starting rate, the rate for the pay grade one kind of lines up internally. But it's a scale that's been created for you all specifically, and for the number of positions that you have, and that is how it's been done.

MEMBER JAFFE: So is the scale a recommendation or is the scale the current salary ranges of people in similar positions?

MS. MILLER: The scale is the recommendation, yes.

Any other questions?
Okay. So the last piece to this is there obviously is a -- whenever you create a scale, there's usually an implementation costs with that. So what that essentially means or what we are costing, we are looking at here is our pay scale, how many employees -- or what employees do we have sitting below that, what we are saying should be the minimum rate of pay for their job. And then so we provide a cost to at least get them to that minimum rate of pay. So that implementation cost to do that for the employees is $\$ 69,164.94$, and that's on page 7.

And then that tenure adjustment is an additional cost of -- and that's, again, moving people through based on their years of service with the county, that's $\$ 92,560$. So they are kind of two separate pieces, if you will.

So that's essentially kind of a quick summary of the major components of the study and what we have brought to you all to consider. So if anybody has any questions, I would be happy to answer any other questions.

MEMBER JAFFE: Can you give a little detail about how, in particular, the ranges in the
recommended scale were arrived at in terms of comparisons to market?

MS. MILLER: Yep. So essentially what I did or how I started it is I looked at -- so there's -- I'm sure it's been public at this point, the Commissioners set a starting rate of $\$ 17$ per hour on the minimum. And so for everybody that was kind of my starting point. Now for you all, it went a bit higher than that at 18.47 . So why that differs is because I looked back at what the market results say and what those counties are paying, and that's kind of how I established the starting rate. So it's truly kind of a market-driven approach, and then I build out the scale from that, that pay grade one. And I do it in a way that you kind of have a consistent percentage between each pay grade, and you have a consistent percentage between your starting and your max.

Anything else? Any other questions?
CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't think I have anything at this point. But I'm interested in reading it more closely.

MS. MILLER: That's a lot to digest, too, to get all at once.

And I'm open to answering questions,
you know, later on down the road as they may come. Director White can get in contact with me. So if there's anything that comes up.

Thank you all for your time today. I appreciate it.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Heidi.
I appreciate your report.
DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: If there's nothing else on the agenda.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn. MS. O'BRIEN: I have a question real quick. Would it be okay if I had a copy of the report?

MS. HUMMER: Just follow our normal records process.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn. MS. MARINELLO: Second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We are
adjourned.

Thereupon, the proceeding adjourned at approximately 4:00 p.m.
