DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It appears that we have a quorum, but I'll go ahead and take role. Kim Marinello?

BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton?

BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug Preisse?

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Meredith Freedhoff?

BOARD MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE:
Mr. Chairman, we do have a quorum. The first item on the agenda is the approval of the minutes from the August 8th, September 9th, and the October 2nd meetings of the Franklin County Board of Elections. I believe Erin sent out all of those minutes for you to peruse.

BOARD MEMBER FREEDHOFF: I move

1 that the Board approve the minutes from the
2 August 8th, September 9th, and October 2nd meetings
3 of the Franklin County Board of Elections as
4 submitted.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,
6 second the motion.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
8 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
9 the motion, signify by saying aye.

10 All opposed, same sign.

11 Motion carries.

12 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
14 item on the agenda is the paper ballot allocation
15 for the November 7th general election, and I'll
16 call upon Carla Patton, who is our manager of
17 operations, Carla.

18 MS. PATTON: Good afternoon.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SEAKER: Good
20 afternoon.

21 MS. PATTON: Before you is the
22 Exhibit A, which is final paper ballot allocations
23 for tomorrow's election. There were no -- we made
24 no changes to the allocations from the initial

1 report that was given earlier this month. Again we
2 are meeting the requirements of the Secretary of
3 State for provisional allocation with the
4 five percent of the like -- of the previous like
5 election, plus -- or I'm sorry. Number of
6 provisional ballots plus five percent of that
7 number of previous like election. And again
8 instead of going to the previous mayoral election,
9 we went to the 2022 general anticipating higher
10 turnouts than normal mayoral elections. So with
11 that allocation then also included is the election
12 day ballots, which we took 20 percent of the
13 election day turnout and added to that provisional
14 number, so altogether that equals 95,800 ballots
15 being sent out to the polling locations for
16 tomorrow's use. We also do have the ability to
17 print on demand here in house in the event that a
18 location were to need more ballots.

19 So we would ask that you approve
20 the final paper ballot allocation for tomorrow's
21 general election on November 7, 2023?

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We never
23 question you because we always know you have the
24 answer.

1 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Kim
2 Marinello. I move that Board adopt the paper
3 ballot allocation formula in Exhibit A compiled the
4 board staff for the November 7, 2023 general
5 election.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse
7 second the motion.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
9 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
10 the motion, signify by saying aye.

11 All opposed, same sign.

12 Motion carries.

13 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Carla, if
15 you can stay up there and tell us about the voting
16 machine allocation and the Touch Pad allocation
17 formula?

18 MS. PATTON: Exhibit B is the
19 final equipment allocations. For each location we
20 have ExpressVote tabletops, ExpressVote kiosk, with
21 a column in there for the total number of
22 ExpressVotes for marking devices and we also have
23 the ballot counters. ExpressVote tabletops and
24 kiosk, they're about one marker for every 375

1 voters at this point in time, with a total number
2 of markers going out of 3,031 marking devices, the
3 counters -- and there's no less than two tabletops
4 and no less than one kiosk in any one location.
5 The ballot counters are based on about one counter
6 for every 2,500 and so voters. There's --

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: How many?

8 MS. PATTON: About 2,500 voters
9 per ballot counter, and that's a total of 504
10 ballot counters going out with no less than
11 obviously one to any location up to five in our
12 largest location. We also have two locations that
13 will be using the Tenex Touch Pads to pilot this
14 election, the electronic poll book use. Those
15 locations are the Thompson Recreation Center and
16 the Ohio Union, and each of those locations will be
17 getting eight Touch Pads.

18 We would ask that you would -- and
19 again this is no change from the previous reading
20 of the allocations earlier this month, so we would
21 ask that you approve the allocation as set forth.

22 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON:

23 Mr. Chairman -- Mike Sexton. I move that the Board
24 adopt to voting machine and Touch Pad allocation

1 formula in Exhibit B compiled by the Board staff
2 for the November 7th, 2023, general election.

3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,
4 second the motion.

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
6 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
7 the motion, signify by saying aye.

8 All opposed, same sign.

9 Motion carries.

10 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
12 item on the agenda is the Baesman printing invoice.
13 Earlier last month we sent out 627,000 voter
14 information guides, which also had a recruitment of
15 Republican poll workers in there because we were
16 running well shy of Republican poll workers. Also
17 in the voter information guide it told all of
18 Republican voters their polling location for the
19 November 7th election, so this is retroactive, but
20 obviously we had to send those out so.

21 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: So these --
22 are these the cards we got maybe a couple weeks
23 ago?

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yes.

1 DIRECTOR WHITE: So we did this in
2 November of last year in the general -- 2022
3 general election and then with the legislative
4 changes to election law this year we thought it was
5 prudent to send out another voter information guide
6 to the households in the county, registered
7 households in the county and then as Deputy spoke
8 to, we targeted Republican households with an extra
9 insert recruiting them to be a poll worker, so we
10 could bump up Republican numbers.

11 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: Is that --
12 do you guys feel that helped?

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think we
14 thought we got at least 150 poll workers from that,
15 Republican poll workers. It's sort of hard to
16 tell, but we think at a minimum we got 150 new
17 Republican poll workers from that.

18 DIRECTOR WHITE: And I want to
19 thank Gretchen James, who is sitting here,
20 community affairs manager, helping me with this
21 effort and put this piece together and see that it
22 gets out. So thank you, Gretchen.

23 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Thank
24 you, Gretchen.

1 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: I've heard a
2 lot of compliments about this piece, the
3 information. I know the new place I live I voted
4 in three different places in the last three
5 different elections.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Right.

7 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: But, Mr.
8 Chairman, I move the Board approve the expenditure
9 of \$61,432 for 627,277 voter information guides
10 that were mailed to voters in Franklin County.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisee,
12 second the motion.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
14 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
15 the motion, signify by saying aye.

16 All opposed, same sign.

17 Motion carries.

18 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
20 item on the agenda is just an overview. It doesn't
21 require any Board action at the point, but it's to
22 discuss our Tenex Touch Pad pilot program for not
23 only tomorrow where we have two locations where
24 we're using the Tenex Touch Pads but in our early

1 vote center where we used the Tenex Touch Pads,
2 I'll turn it over to Director White to talk a
3 little about that.

4 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.
5 Just as a bit of a background, so Carla mentioned
6 we're doing a Tenex Touch Pad pilot. As the Board
7 is aware, Tenex is our current voter registration
8 vendor. We use Tenex for voter registration for
9 other election management tools. That was fully
10 implemented in the August of 2021, so we've worked
11 well with that company. We like the voter
12 registration product. At the end of 2022, we were
13 at the end of life at our current electronic poll
14 book solution, so that means that the devices that
15 we were using were no longer going to be supported
16 by Apple for updates, IOS updates, operating
17 updates, and so we needed to make a decision as to
18 whether or not we were going to purchase new E-poll
19 books from our current vendor or explore another
20 solution. There are three vendors in the State of
21 Ohio that are certified to sell electronic poll
22 books. One of those vendors is our current vendor.
23 The other vendor is Tenex. A solution called Touch
24 Pad. So we decided let's take a look at Touch Pad

1 because we wanted to explore what that would like
2 in integrated environment. And what Board staff
3 did was we went out and got feedback. We talked to
4 current Ohio customers who used the Touch Pads. We
5 solicited feedback from them. We also visited
6 Hamilton County Board of Election in January of
7 this year. We got a full demonstration from the
8 Hamilton County Board of Elections. They used a
9 Touch Pad and used it for a number of years, so we
10 were able to get a demonstration, ask questions.
11 We then invited Tenex to come on site here in May
12 and perform a demonstration over two days. So
13 Board staff were able to play with the solution,
14 ask questions. We got a very thorough
15 demonstration, and so subsequent to that, we wanted
16 to move forward. However, the state legislator had
17 appropriated some money for county boards of
18 elections to purchase new poll books, and that
19 money got delayed through the legislative process
20 so we weren't able to use that money. It wasn't
21 available yet. It is now, but it wasn't then, to
22 purchase new poll books. So what we decided to do
23 was as a prudent next step was to pilot this
24 program. And so we piloted the Touch Pads in our

1 early vote center over the 30-day voting period,
2 and then on the election day at two of our larger
3 locations. So we wanted to just update the Board
4 on that. Brandon Johnson is here. I will have him
5 come up. Brandon is with Tenex. He is our project
6 manager assigned to Franklin County on our current
7 products and he works well with us. He knows our
8 environment, and he's helping us out with this
9 pilot, so I wanted to have Brandon say a few words
10 to the Board.

11 MR. JOHNSON: Thank you, Director
12 White. My name, like Director White said, my name
13 is Brandon Johnson. I am the project manager for
14 Franklin County Board of Elections for Tenex
15 Software Solutions. I appreciate the time this
16 afternoon, Members of Board, not just to speak on
17 behalf of the Touch Pad pilot, so what Director
18 White and Tenex are discussing was how to
19 essentially do a pilot program for this November.
20 So we basically started discussions, preliminary
21 discussions in late July, early August about what
22 that would look like. And then basically in about
23 the end of August or so, we sat down virtually and
24 discussed what we wanted to do, how many Touch Pads

1 we wanted to use at each location. How many Touch
2 Pads at the early vote center, and kind of sorting
3 out those details. We met over a number of
4 different meetings to sort out those details and
5 what that would look like. Then after that we
6 actually what we did -- at Tenex here is we
7 actually configured 60 units, 60 Touch Pads,
8 individual electronic poll books. We sent those
9 out to Franklin County Board of Elections to
10 receive those. They decided to go ahead and use 18
11 of those at the early vote center and then like
12 Carla mentioned got 16 at the two -- eight each at
13 the two locations on election day. And then we
14 also set aside a number of those also for the
15 training, for training purposes and for testing
16 purposes and playing around and get to use, getting
17 to know the software and what the touch pads look
18 like. We also sent documentation over to the team,
19 so therefore they could create the training guides
20 and what that would look like for the PEO
21 department and everything in regards to that.
22 After both of those meetings we also set aside some
23 meetings to discuss workflows. And what those
24 workflows mean are basically how the voter -- when

1 the voter comes in to actually check in to vote
2 does that voter check in as a regular ballot. If
3 they do update an address, how does that get
4 updated on the Touch Pad. So we worked through
5 those workflows on what that would look like on the
6 Touch Pad prior to training so when we did have
7 training we could walk through those different
8 scenarios during the actual training days. And
9 then we actually conducted that training then at
10 the end of September. I came out here and visited
11 and conducted the training. We did one day of
12 training. We had an early vote training in the
13 morning where we sat down with actually early vote
14 staff and said this is how the workflows are going
15 to look. This is how the Touch Pads are used.
16 This is how you set them up, check in a voter, and
17 we worked through other additional workflows and
18 how that might work out. And then we also had a
19 training in the afternoon that day for the election
20 day. So the PEO department came in. We trained
21 them on how that would look like on election day,
22 and how the different scenarios would play out
23 early voting verse election day, the different
24 scenarios there. After that meeting, we actually

1 got some feedback, again from the Board, form the
2 Board of Elections department and staff. And we
3 made some adjustments based off of what that would
4 look like. So based off the training and then
5 internal discussions, we made some more changes.
6 Mainly the changes that we made were basically
7 messages, so how when the voter checks in, the
8 message that appears on the actual Touch Pad for
9 the poll worker to say okay, move on to this next
10 step or do this or do that. So kind of just how
11 that messages would be displayed. And then we also
12 conducted some training for our precinct central
13 consult. Now consult is back end of the actual
14 Touch Pads, and this is the monitoring basically
15 solution. So the staff here at the Board of
16 Elections had access to the consult so they could
17 see which Touch Pads are connected, which ones are
18 logged in, which voters are being checked in during
19 the early vote center, and just be able to monitor
20 those elections and run reports and things like
21 that, so we had that training as well. And then we
22 actually started early voting of course on
23 October 11th and we've done, you know, how many
24 days of early voting, well over 52,000 voters

1 checked in using the Touch Pads during the early
2 vote process, and then of course as you've heard
3 we'll have the two locations on election day. You
4 know, eight touch pads at each location. I'm here.
5 I got in yesterday and I will be here through
6 election day tomorrow, and I will depart on
7 Wednesday, but I'm here to help to support both
8 election day and, of course, any other questions
9 that come up during this process. So that's kind
10 of a little high level overview of what took place
11 during this pilot.

12 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you,
13 Brandon. Any questions for Brandon?

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Where did you
15 come from?

16 MR. JOHNSON: I live in South
17 Dakota.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I thought so.
19 Good report. Thank you.

20 DIRECTOR WHITE: I just wanted to
21 briefly call up Matt Kelly, our absentee manager to
22 talk a little bit about the experience with the
23 Touch Pads and --

24 MR. KELLY: Sure. Good morning,

1 Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board. Obviously this
2 is very preliminary as we've just closed down our
3 early vote yesterday at 5:30-ish and we did vote
4 and check in 52,462 voters using the Touch Pads,
5 the 18 Touch Pads that were placed up in the early
6 vote center. I guess the first preliminary results
7 I can say are very good. The Touch Pads did what
8 they were supposed to do. They were very easy to
9 use. They had an average check in time of around
10 56 seconds per voter. Just to give you some
11 context when we were doing our August election in
12 the early vote where we had 46,000 voters, our
13 check in time was around two minutes. And that was
14 because we were using a manual check in process,
15 and not using the Touch Pad. So you can see the
16 efficiency right there going from two minutes to
17 56 seconds. That helps move a line along pretty
18 quick. The other things that we noticed about the
19 Touch Pads and how easy they are to use, this
20 device, unlike our previous electronic poll books,
21 you'd have to spin around and have the voter sign.
22 This one you can flip the screen and the screen
23 will orient to the voter, so the voter can then
24 just easily sign their name and then we can flip it

1 back to our poll worker, so that just cuts down the
2 spinning and the moving of the device. So we
3 thought that was a very, very good feature of the
4 device. The other point that I'd like to make here
5 is because our voter registration system is with
6 the same company, the syncing of the device and our
7 voter registration system happening in realtime is
8 just unbelievably helpful. It allows us to look in
9 realtime how things are trending. We can see voter
10 check ins in the back office as they are happening
11 up at the early vote center. So those are just
12 some preliminary things we've noticed with the
13 pilot program here and we were very happy and I
14 think we had a very successful early vote period
15 this election.

16 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Great.

17 DIRECTOR WHITE: Any questions
18 from the Board?

19 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: I just in
20 observation I talked to the Director a little bit
21 afterwards and just in general was when I voted at
22 the early vote center using them, you know, on the
23 signature page, where we use signatures for a lot
24 of things around here and I kind of called it the

1 Kroger signature, you know. And it's totally
2 different than what I just signed here, so I'm
3 wondering moving forward how we come to check
4 petitions and all this stuff, how does that fit
5 into --

6 MS. HUMMER: The verification
7 process?

8 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: Right.

9 DIRECTOR WHITE: So when -- the
10 nice thing is that when we, for every voter record
11 we maintain multiple signatures, so any time you
12 sign a document, whether it's election related,
13 Board related, we scan and maintain that signature,
14 so, Chairman, we may have different signatures from
15 a number of documents over a number of years for a
16 voter, so when we check that signature against
17 multiple signature in the voter record, that's the
18 same one when we check for petition. When we check
19 petition signature, we can check against multiple
20 types of signatures, so there will be a match to
21 the most appropriate signature to that signature
22 that's on that page or on that record as it's
23 signed. Does that make sense?

24 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: Does that

1 translate like when staff checks the petitions?

2 DIRECTOR WHITE: So your Kroger
3 signature, as you refer to it as, that will get
4 copied and saved into the voter record, along with
5 all the other signatures. So presumably there's a
6 signature on file that we can match up to when
7 somebody signs a petition or some type of Board
8 document.

9 MR. KELLY: I would ask to that,
10 Mr. Chairman, Members of Board, the process that we
11 use to sign people in, we're actually handing the
12 voter a stylus, so their signature is a little
13 better than just doing it with a fingertip. So
14 that proves to be helpful for most voters giving
15 them a device like a stylus just to use.

16 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: Okay. Thank
17 you.

18 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Matt.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Thank you,
20 Matt.

21 DIRECTOR WHITE: Any other
22 questions on that?

23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Very good.
24 Thank you.

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next
2 thing that we need to do is open the polls for
3 tomorrow's election at 6:30 a.m. and close at 7:30
4 p.m. tomorrow night.

5 BOARD MEMBER FREEDHOFF: I move
6 that the polls be declared open on Tuesday,
7 November 7, 2023 for the general election beginning
8 at 6:30 a.m. and closing at 7:30 p.m., that in
9 accordance with Ohio Revised Code section 3501.32,
10 any voter in line prior to the closing of polls at
11 7:30 shall be permitted to vote.

12 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: I'll second.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
14 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
15 the motion, signify by saying aye.

16 All opposed, same sign.

17 Motion carries.

18 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We
20 probably don't want to adjourn. We probably want
21 to recess this meeting, I'm guessing.

22 BOARD MEMBER SEXTON: I think
23 that's a good idea.

24 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Chairman,

1 I move that the Board recess this meeting of the
2 Board of Election subject to the recall by the
3 Chair until after the close of the election date
4 being held on Tuesday, November 7th, 2023.

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Seeing no
6 objections. I think we're recessed.
