One Week Left Until November 3rd General Election

(Columbus) Today marks one week until Election Day. Franklin County registered voters have seven days to cast in-person absentee ballots for the General Election. Figures released by the Board of Elections today show more than 244,000 registered Franklin County voters have either returned their voted mail-in ballot or voted in-person at our early vote center at 1700 Morse Road.

Early voting continues at 1700 Morse Road through next Monday, see times below:

Weekdays - 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. through Friday, October 30^{th} Saturday, October 31^{st} – 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sunday, November 1^{st} – 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday, November 2^{nd} – 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

If you have already requested an absentee ballot and plan on hand delivering to the Board of Elections, it must be received at 1700 Morse Road by 7:30 p.m. on November 3rd. Completed absentee ballots **cannot** be delivered to any of the county's 324 Election Day voting locations. If mailed, it must be post marked by Monday, November 2rd, 2020 and received by the Board of Elections no later than Friday, November 13th, 2020 to be counted. It is recommended that you take your ballot to a post office facility and have it hand stamped to assure it is post marked by November 2rd.

The Franklin County Board of Elections will staff its 324 voting locations with more than 5,600 poll workers on Election Day.

Election Day is Tuesday, November 3rd, 2020. Polls open at 6:30 a.m. and will remain open until 7:30 p.m.
