Countdown is on to May 3rd Primary Election

(**Columbus**) Franklin County registered voters have six days to cast in-person absentee ballots for the Primary Election. Figures released by the Board of Elections today show more than 11,000 registered Franklin County voters have either returned their voted mail-in ballot or voted in-person at our early vote center at 1700 Morse Road.

Early voting continues at 1700 Morse Road through next Monday, see times below:

Wednesday, April 27^{th} - 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. through Friday, April 29^{th} Saturday, April 30^{th} - 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sunday, May 1^{st} - 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday, May 2^{nd} - 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

If you have already requested an absentee ballot and plan on hand delivering to the Board of Elections, it must be received at 1700 Morse Road by 7:30 p.m. on May 3rd. Completed absentee ballots cannot be delivered to any of the county's 320 Election Day voting locations. If mailed, it must be post marked by Monday, May 2nd, 2022 and received by the Board of Elections no later than Friday, May 13th, 2022 to be counted.

Election Day is Tuesday, May 3rd, 2022. Polls open at 6:30 a.m. and will remain open until 7:30 p.m.
