Registration forms are available at our office and on the Web at http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov. Forms may also be found at many government offices throughout the county.

Below are the requirements one must meet to be a qualified voter:

- Must be a U.S. citizen
- A resident of Ohio for at least 30 days before the election
- Registered to vote at least 30 days before the election
- At least 18 years old on or before November 7, 2023

To register or update registration online please visit, http://voteohio.gov. Registrants will need to provide the following:

- Ohio driver's license or Ohio identification card number
- Name
- Date of Birth
- Address
- Last four digits of your Social Security number

Only two communities, the <u>City of Gahanna</u> and the <u>City of Hilliard</u>, will have candidates on the ballot to vote on for the May 2 Primary/Special Election. Voters in the <u>Madison-Plains Local School District</u> will decide a school bond issue.
