- BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Second.
- 3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 4 favor say aye?
- 5 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: The
- 7 motion carries.
- 8 The next is we have three challenges of
- 9 right to vote that were filed. The first -- we'll
- 10 let Renae introduce these one by one, and then
- 11 we'll act on each one afterwards.
- MS. CHLOE: The first one we have is
- 13 Elise Von Borries challenging Elise P. Von Borries.
- 14 Looking at the registration it looks like it was
- 15 taken right out of the phonebook. It just looks
- 16 like a bogus registration. They registered in '08,
- 17 have never voted. It's not the same person. The
- 18 signatures are different. My recommendation is to
- 19 go ahead and cancel them.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: So why
- 21 don't we do a vote on that one?
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman,
- 23 I move that the Board grant the challenge of right
- 24 to vote and correction of registration list filed

- 1 by Elise Von Borries of 3996 Foster Street against
- 2 Elise P. Von Borries, purportedly of 3996 Foster
- 3 Street, and order that Elise P. Von Borries'
- 4 registration be immediately canceled.
- 5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Is there
- 6 a second?
- 7 BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- 8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 9 favor say aye?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: The
- 12 motion carries.
- The next one, Renae?
- MS. CHLOE: Is Michael A. McGrew is
- 15 challenging Ennis Brown. This person registered in
- 16 '08. Again, has never voted, does not reside at
- 17 that address. I recommend -- recommendation,
- 18 again, is to cancel this voter.
- 19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: And
- 20 Mr. McGrew is here?
- UNKNOWN SPEAKER: Yes.
- 22 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Say
- 23 anything to the Board? You are certainly welcome
- 24 to if you'd like.

- 1 MR. MCGREW: Just what's written on the
- 2 form.
- 3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Did you get mail or
- 4 something?
- 5 MR. MCGREW: Junk mail. Anybody that
- 6 buys the mailing list from the Board of Elections
- 7 sends me stuff.
- 8 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: That's
- 9 irritating.
- MR. MCGREW: And, of course, duplicates
- 11 for (inaudible) -- political stuff.
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman,
- 13 I move that the Board grant the challenge of right
- 14 to vote and correction of registration list filed
- 15 by Michael A. McGrew of 2596 Bryden Road against
- 16 Ennis Brown, purportedly of 2596 Bryden Road, and
- 17 order that Ennis Brown's registration be
- 18 immediately canceled.
- 19 BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 21 favor say aye?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: The
- 24 motion carries.

- 1 And the last one, Renae?
- MS. CHLOE: The last one is, again,
- 3 Elise Von Borries is challenging B. Jewel Crooks.
- 4 She's saying that Mrs. Crooks is deceased.
- 5 Mrs. Crooks is in the purge cycle and is due to be
- 6 purged next year, and I would -- my recommendation,
- 7 she has been inactive for many years now, since
- 8 '07. My recommendation is let her to go through
- 9 the purge cycle and have her purged as we would
- 10 normally do.
- 11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: And we
- 12 did not receive a Notice of Death Record from the
- 13 Health Department, correct?
- MS. CHLOE: Correct.
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman,
- 16 I move the Board deny the challenge of right to
- vote and correction of registration as filed by
- 18 Elise Von Borries of 3996 Foster Street against B.
- 19 Jewel Crooks formerly of 3996 Foster Street.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Is there
- 21 a second?
- BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 24 favor say aye?

- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: That
- 3 concludes the -- that portion of the meeting.
- 4 Mr. McGrew, thank you for coming down.
- 5 MR. MCGREW: Thank you.
- 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: You are
- 7 certainly welcome to stay for the balance of the
- 8 agenda if you'd like.
- 9 MR. MCGREW: Not if somebody can escort
- 10 me?
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All
- 12 right. Renae?
- MS. CHLOE: I'd be delighted.
- MR. MCGREW: Thank you.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Thank
- 16 you. Thank you for coming down.
- 17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you.
- MR. MCGREW: Thank you.
- 19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Bye-bye.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: The next
- 21 item is a fiscal matter that we've discussed
- 22 previously. The Secretary of State is upgrading
- 23 the State Wide Voter Registration System. That is
- 24 requiring -- and they're -- they've done most of

- 1 the changes, I think, on their end of the system,
- 2 but it's requiring changes on the county ends of
- 3 the system with our individual software systems.
- 4 As you recall, the County took over the
- 5 source code of the Sequoia Voter Registration
- 6 System last year after Sequoia stopped supporting
- 7 the system, and we had in place a day-to-day
- 8 maintenance contract with Eddie Bernoski who is the
- 9 individual who used to work for Sequoia who
- 10 designed the system, and we asked Eddie for two
- 11 quotes for what it would cost to upgrade the system
- 12 to the new specifications set up by the Secretary
- 13 of State.
- 14 The first quote would be to just have
- 15 him do it completely and quickly, and that would
- 16 be -- and his quote came back at \$167,000.
- 17 He also -- we also asked him for a
- 18 quote of what it -- what he would charge us to just
- 19 kind of oversee the process and have us do it
- 20 ourselves, and his quote for that was -- both of
- 21 those documents are in your packets -- 69,750.
- 22 Given that the data center is changing
- 23 leadership -- Dana Hughes has resigned, and we're
- 24 kind of in the middle of an election cycle and we

- 1 don't have existing programming experience in
- 2 Sequoia, the learning curve would be too steep for
- 3 what is likely going to be a quick mandate from the
- 4 Secretary of State to get up and running early this
- 5 summer.
- 6 Staffs' recommendation is to go with
- 7 the larger amount and just have Eddie take care of
- 8 it and do it and be done with it, and so this
- 9 motion would -- because supplemental funding
- 10 requests to the County Commissioners -- or from the
- 11 County Commissioners for \$167,000 to pay the cost
- 12 of that -- of that necessary and proper expense,
- 13 the commissioners -- the previous director sent an
- 14 e-mail to Mr. Brown and Mr. Wilson on January 22nd
- of this year notifying them that this was in the
- 16 pipeline, and at that time we didn't have the
- 17 quotes for what it would cost, but just kind of
- 18 give them a head's up that this was going to be an
- 19 unbudgeted expense for this year.
- 20 So if there's any questions? I don't
- 21 know exactly if you have any input at this time?
- 22 All right. No problem. Don't want to put you on
- 23 the spot, but since you're here, we can give you an
- 24 opportunity if you want.

- 1 Any questions from the Board?
- BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I
- 3 move that the Board of Elections request \$167,000
- 4 in supplemental spending from the Franklin County
- 5 Commissioners to cover the unbudgeted, but
- 6 necessary and proper expenses of upgrading
- 7 components for the county owned Voter Registration
- 8 System to comply with new requirements of the
- 9 Secretary of State for the State Wide Voter
- 10 Registration System.
- 11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Is there
- 12 a second?
- BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- 14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 15 favor say aye?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Great.
- 18 That motion carries and we will get that formal
- 19 request off to Don and the commissioners probably
- 20 Wednesday or Thursday of this week.
- The next item is every year Harold buys
- 22 donuts for the folks at supply pick-up day, and we
- 23 ask for reimbursement for that under the auditing
- 24 rules from the State, and County Auditor requires a

- 1 Board vote for that authorization.
- Also, this coming Saturday, we're going
- 3 to have a post-election -- kind of post-mortem with
- 4 the folks who were the poll-worker trainers. As
- 5 you know Barcy, this is her first election heading
- 6 that up, and so Barcy and Mary wanted to do a
- 7 post-election wrap up with them this Saturday, and
- 8 they're going to request that the Board approve
- 9 reimbursement for Barcy to buy, you know, donuts
- 10 and bagels and juice for them -- for that meeting
- 11 on Saturday.
- BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I
- 13 move that the Board authorize the reimbursement of
- 14 Harold Fielder and Barcy McNeal for food expenses
- 15 incurred on behalf of the Board for student
- 16 volunteers on May 2nd and poll-worker trainers on
- 17 May 5th, respectively.
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: 8th.
- BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: 8th. Sorry.
- 20 May 8th, respectively.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Is there
- 22 a second?
- BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- 24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All those

- 1 in favor say aye?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: The
- 4 motions carries.
- 5 And then the last one is we have one
- 6 matter to refer to the Prosecuting Attorney of what
- 7 appears to be another double voter from the '08
- 8 Presidential Election. So with this vote we'll --
- 9 Bill and I will send it over to the Prosecutor's
- 10 Office for further investigation and possible
- 11 criminal prosecution.
- 12 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that
- 13 the Board refer one matter of possible voter
- 14 registration and voter fraud to the Franklin County
- 15 Prosecuting Attorney for additional investigation
- 16 and possible criminal prosecution.
- BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 19 favor say aye?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: And
- 22 that's all of the public business that we have on
- 23 the agenda. We do need to talk about the schedule
- 24 for certification. We can either do that now or in

- 1 the coming days, but I think the -- the sense was
- 2 that -- trying to get things wrapped up before
- 3 Memorial Day was ideal, and so I would propose that
- 4 we begin canvas on the 15th, which is the first day
- 5 we're permitted to, complete the canvas on the
- 6 17th, and then do two certification meetings, the
- 7 first on May 18 to certify all the election results
- 8 for in-county and then to send our results to other
- 9 counties, then come back on the 25th and certify
- 10 all the elections that would come back to Franklin
- 11 County. So that would be like the 15th
- 12 Congressional, the 12th Congressional, Reynoldsburg
- 13 Schools, I think are the only three that were the
- 14 majority counting for.
- So we don't have to take a formal vote
- on that, but just if you guys want to take a look
- 17 at your calendars and get back with Bill and I.
- 18 We'd like to formalize that schedule before the end
- 19 of the week.
- I'm seeing heads nodding. That's good.
- 21 All right. That's all.
- 22 Bill, anything?
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The election is
- 24 running really, really well. This has been my

- 1 first election --
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: As
- 3 Director.
- 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: As Director, yeah.
- 5 I will say that it ran as well when I was on the
- 6 Board. I'm not saying that it ran bad, now.
- 7 Strike that. I didn't -- everything ran well when
- 8 I was on the Board as well. Phew, get that right.
- 9 Next time I'm not going to say anything.
- 10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: That
- 11 should be -- should be smooth. Things are going
- 12 well for absentee. We scanned ballots yesterday,
- 13 so tomorrow the only ballots we'll have left to
- 14 scan are the ballots that came in the mail today
- 15 and tomorrow.
- 16 Poll worker training has gone very well
- 17 with Mary and Barcy at the helm, and Karen and
- 18 Harold have everything in place for tomorrow, so --
- 19 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: I hear that
- that's a well-oiled machine down there at the
- 21 warehouse as usual.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: I'll tell
- 23 you that.
- 24 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Zach got to

- 1 see -- see it and was very impressed.
- 2 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: I went down
- 3 there on a Sunday. It was a great operation.
- 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: You need to come out
- 5 election night.
- 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Yeah,
- 7 come out and see the drive-thru.
- DIRECTOR ANYTHONY, JUNIOR: Yeah,
- 9 see --
- 10 BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: How many
- 11 ballots been returned from absentee?
- 12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: It looks
- 13 like -- what were the numbers earlier today? 69
- 14 percent of the Republican ballots have been
- 15 returned, 67 percent of the Democrats, I think the
- issues only were 70 percent, and interestingly
- enough, the minor parties are at 55 percent.
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You're talking
- 19 about?
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Absentee
- 21 return.
- 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Of requests?
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Yes.
- 24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Below?

- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Yes.
- 2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: 69 percent and 67
- 3 are Republican/Democrat ballots respectively of
- 4 those requested?
- 5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Uh-huh.
- 6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What do you -- what
- 7 do you ascribe to that lower --
- 8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: We all --
- 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: -- because it's so
- 10 easy to request that --
- 11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: We always
- 12 have a lower return rate for primaries than we do
- 13 for generals.
- 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: In the
- 16 Presidential Election in '08, we only got to 80
- 17 percent return rate for absentee.
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: In the primary?
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: In the
- 20 primary. So I think it's one of those things where
- 21 people request them, they get it, they realize
- there's nothing on here except for 20 out of 23
- 23 races are uncontested, you know. It's not worth my
- 24 time, but I think that's a -- obviously a false,

- 1 you know, view. Every vote is important even for
- 2 an uncontested --
- 3 UNKNOWN SPEAKER: Make sure you get
- 4 that down.
- 5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER:
- 6 -- election. So I think that -- that plays into --
- 7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That -- but -- the
- 8 primary --
- 9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Yeah, the
- 10 primary always has a lower response rate.
- 11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And the -- let's
- 12 see, you said the Republican return was higher than
- 13 the Democrat? Mathew is that --
- 14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: I did
- 15 mention that.
- 16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You did mention
- 17 that.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Just --
- 19 just slightly. There were more Democratic return
- 20 requests than Republican.
- 21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, all right.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: -- you
- 23 have to be even handed in that.
- 24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: If so, they're

- 1 better intention, but less effective in the
- 2 follow-through, is it?
- 3 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: You're absolutely
- 4 right.
- 5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
- 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: So what
- 7 we -- what we expect, we'll probably get 5 or 6,000
- 8 ballots tomorrow, and then, also, folks have -- if
- 9 it's post-marked today, they can have through the
- 10 14th to return it.
- We also have a number of ballots, I
- 12 think it's 200, that are ballots that were
- 13 challenged -- absentee ballots that were challenged
- 14 where the voter either did not return any form at
- 15 all, or returned it inside the ID envelope that
- 16 those letters went out with new copies of the
- 17 challenge form asking them to come down to here --
- 18 to the Board of Elections or to mail the form back
- 19 before the 14th.
- There's also a number of ballots, I
- 21 don't remember the exact number, where voters
- 22 didn't fill out the ID envelope properly or
- 23 completely, and they have until the 14th as well,
- 24 and we've sent them letters as well notifying them

- 1 to come down.
- The growing issue that we see with
- 3 absentee -- and I think it's more this election, I
- 4 think, partially because of the challenge issue,
- 5 that we have almost 1,000 people that returned
- 6 their absentee ballots, but did not seal their
- 7 absentee ballot inside the ID envelope, and under
- 8 State Law that means the ballot can't be counted.
- 9 Even though there's only one ballot in the return
- 10 envelope, it's just not inside the ID envelope
- 11 where the envelope isn't sealed, so those ballots
- 12 can't be counted, and -- so I think that's --
- 13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And there's nothing
- 14 to be done about it, or we can --
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: State Law
- 16 is pretty clear. In fact, I think, a couple years
- 17 ago --
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Didn't we --
- 19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: -- Lucas
- 20 County asked permission. The --
- 21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Right.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER:
- 23 -- Secretary said no state law is very clear, and
- 24 it is. Those ballots -- the ballot has to be

- 1 sealed inside the ID envelope in order to count. I
- 2 think that issue is a subject of both Senate Bill 8
- and the House Bill 260, I can't remember, to be
- 4 addressed so that if it's returned outside the ID
- 5 envelope or the envelope wasn't sealed the ballot
- 6 could be counted, but neither of those bills have
- 7 been passed yet, so --
- B DIRECTOR ANTHONY: You know, I forgot,
- 9 do we have to officially open and close?
- 10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: No, the
- 11 Board doesn't officially --
- 12 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Okay.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: -- open
- 14 the polls. The polls are set by statute. What we
- will do is we'll set up adjourning. Here, we'll
- 16 just recess --
- 17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That's what I
- 18 wondered about, too.
- 19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER:
- 20 -- subject to the call of the Chair and two members
- 21 of the Board tomorrow, that way we meet the
- 22 requirement of being continuously in session.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All right.
- 24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Subject to the call

- of the Chair or two members of the Board?
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: That's
- 3 the -- that's our Board's policy.
- 4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So everybody's
- 5 schedule is pretty much in my hand; is that right?
- 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: That's
- 7 correct.
- 8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right.
- 9 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: You just like
- 10 the power.
- 11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: So unless
- 12 there's --
- 13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All right.
- 14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER:
- 15 -- anything more, is there a motion to recess?
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: So moved.
- 17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: Any
- 18 second?
- 19 BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: All in
- 21 favor of recess?
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR DAMSCHRODER: And we
- 24 are recessed. We'll come back tomorrow if needed.
