2	PROCEEDINGS
3	
4	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Well, good
5	afternoon, everyone. I would like to call the
6	Franklin County Board of Elections meeting to
7	order. I'll do the roll call.
8	Kim Marinello?
9	BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.
10	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Zach Manifold?
11	BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Here.
12	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Doug Preisse?
13	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.
14	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: And Michael Colley?
15	BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Here.
16	DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We're all here and
17	accounted for.
18	First item on the agenda is the
19	approval of the minutes of March 24th and April
20	4th.
21	MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move
22	that the Board approve the minutes of the
23	March 24th, 2011, and April 4th, 2011, board
24	meetings.

- 1 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?
- 2 BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- 3 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in favor?
- 4 BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- 5 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The motion carries.
- 6 The next order of business: We have at
- 7 each of your desks an agreement with Babbage
- 8 Simmel. They're going to produce our Election
- 9 Administration Plan.
- 10 If you recall, the League of Women
- 11 Voters, several years ago, filed a lawsuit against
- 12 the Secretary of State, and, as a result, I think
- it was the larger counties had to prepare an
- 14 Election Administration Plan, which is basically a
- 15 step-by-step policies and procedures -- or a
- 16 standard operating procedure. That's what I'm
- 17 trying to say. Basically, how we do elections from
- 18 start to finish.
- We prepared one last year that was
- 20 pretty much a hodgepodge of our operation. It
- 21 ended up being like 500-and-some pages and not
- 22 really easy to read. And we decided that since
- 23 this isn't going away and we'll be required to do
- 24 it again in '12, that we ought to put together a

- 1 really thoughtful Election Administration Plan.
- 2 And it's going to take a lot of effort, and we
- 3 decided to hire the services of Babbage Simmel.
- 4 We basically did this when Matt was
- 5 still here. We started that process last year, in
- 6 2010, and now we'd like to get them in here and get
- 7 started so it can be ready for that plan when it's
- 8 due in 2012.
- 9 So any questions on that?
- 10 (No audible response.)
- 11 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Or did you want to
- 12 add something?
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: I think you
- 14 covered it.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yeah.
- 16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And the principal
- 17 person we'll be working with is the gentleman,
- 18 David --
- 19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: David Wirick.
- 20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: (Inaudible) and
- 21 Wirick?
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yes.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: He will probably
- 24 be in our office almost every day of the week.

- 1 We'll have to get a workspace for him, and he'll be
- 2 spending some time with Keith and staff members,
- 3 helping to evaluate what he needs to know in order
- 4 to put the plan together.
- We met with David in the middle of
- 6 March or so --
- 7 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yeah.
- 8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: -- and we had
- 9 spoken with him prior to that as well, and we feel
- 10 confident that he would be a very good person to
- 11 have on this.
- 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What's the
- difference between this state-term schedule hourly
- 14 rate and -- I don't -- I don't know how to read
- 15 that chart, state-term scheduled pricing? On Page
- 16 3.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Well, they're on
- 18 state-term contract. What page you looking at?
- 19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, the third
- 20 piece of paper, Haley Process Consulting Services.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Oh, okay. Now, what
- 22 were you asking?
- 23 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't know how to
- read that chart. It's 98,000.

- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Oh, they --
- 2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Why are there two
- 3 different rates?
- 4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: Their rate is
- 5 less than the state term?
- 6 MR. PICCININNI: One is the rate -- the
- 7 state-term contract rate that they have, and one is
- 8 the rate it looks like you guys negotiated.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: Yeah, that's --
- 10 they'll be charging us the BOE rate. Their
- 11 state-term contract would allow them to charge what
- 12 you see there, but we would be charged at the \$125
- 13 an hour.
- 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, I see.
- 15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: And that's what
- 16 the total cost is based off of.
- We had had a couple of quotes done.
- 18 This quote was the one that they believed was going
- 19 to be appropriate because they examined the
- 20 directives from the Secretary of State showing
- 21 everything that needed to be involved and this is
- 22 where they -- this is the price they felt that it
- 23 would be.
- And we'll have to turn this in, I

- 1 believe, January of next year. I think it's 60
- 2 days prior to the Presidential Primary.
- 3 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Primary.
- 4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: The Secretary of
- 5 State's Office will require us to produce this
- 6 document, and we're confident that they can get it
- 7 done in that amount of time.
- 8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Well, you
- 9 described this to me previously, so I don't have
- 10 any more questions. I don't know if anybody else
- 11 does.
- BOARD MEMBER MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I
- 13 move that the Board of Elections enter into
- 14 agreement with Babbage Simmel for the production of
- 15 the Election Administration Plan and authorize the
- 16 fiscal officer to open a purchase order in the
- 17 amount of \$98,750.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Is there a second?
- BOARD MEMBER COLLEY: Second.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: All those in
- 21 recognition, say "aye".
- BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: The next order of
- 24 business is --

- 1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.
- 2 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Move to adjourn.
- 3 (Laughter.)
- 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: You know, Patrick
- 5 Piccininni has been our legal representative for,
- 6 what, the last four years?
- 7 MR. PICCININNI: Eight.
- B DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Eight? Oh, it's
- 9 been that --
- MR. PICCININNI: It's been '04 -- since
- 11 that election of '04.
- 12 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: It has been that
- 13 long? Back when I was chair of this Election's
- 14 Board.
- MR. PICCININNI: ODOT. I'm going to
- 16 chief legal over at ODOT. Chief legal over at
- 17 ODOT. I'm sorry.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: He's leaving a round
- 19 at Brian's office to a bigger and better job, so we
- 20 certainly are going to miss you.
- MR. PICCININNI: Thank you.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: We've had a -- I
- 23 think we've had a great relationship over the last
- 24 eight years as a board member and as the director

- of the Board of Elections, and I certainly wish you
- 2 all the good luck and everything you'll need to
- 3 work for ODOT.
- 4 MR. PICCININNI: I appreciate that.
- 5 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yeah, it's --
- 6 MR. PICCININNI: It's been a whole lot
- 7 of fun over the last eight years.
- 8 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yeah. We've been
- 9 through a lot of stuff, Patrick.
- MR. PICCININNI: A lot of stuff.
- 11 (Laughter.)
- 12 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Yes, siree.
- 13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I'm glad you're
- 14 going over as their lawyer and not their
- 15 accountant, because I'm trying to figure out how
- 16 you would come up with eight years here.
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: I'm sure it
- 18 is --
- 19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: How many?
- MR. PICCININNI: I've been with the --
- 21 I've been with the --
- 22 BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: -- because --
- MR. PICCININNI: I've been with the
- 24 Prosecutor's Office for eight years -- I'm sorry,

- 1 since '03 until this year, and I've been with the
- 2 Board since election night of '07, but I started
- 3 with an election vote --
- 4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I see.
- 5 MR. PICCININNI: -- in '04, so that's
- 6 seven and a half years then.
- 7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
- MR. PICCININNI: You're right, I've --
- 9 you're right.
- 10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, that's okay,
- 11 Counselor. This is maybe --
- MR. PICCININNI: I forget a third of
- 13 anything, so --
- 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The -- well, I'll
- 15 just echo what Mr. Anthony says. I think you enjoy
- 16 this kind of work and it shows, and you've been a
- 17 reliable counselor and a friend, and a good
- 18 professional that served the voters and citizens of
- 19 Franklin County well in this capacity.
- 20 And I know you'll take those talents to
- 21 serve all the citizens in Ohio with you when you go
- 22 to ODOT to new sunny challenges. And we will miss
- you, but we'll see you in many other capacities, as
- 24 we always do, and I look forward to that.

- 1 MR. PICCININNI: I'm looking forward to
- 2 those challenges and seeing you guys on other
- 3 endeavors as well, so thank you very, very much.
- 4 It's been a true honor and a pleasure to serve the
- 5 citizens of Franklin County in this capacity, and I
- 6 thank the Board and I thank the Prosecutor for
- 7 giving me that opportunity. Faster than by fire on
- 8 election night of '04, and the ride just never
- 9 stopped from there. So every time somebody decided
- 10 to sue somebody, we got dragged in, so --
- 11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, that's a nice
- 12 point for you to make here, the gracious
- 13 professional as they say. For you to thank the
- 14 Prosecutor, as well, is appropriate, and I'll echo
- 15 that. We appreciate him recognizing your talents
- 16 and lending you to us.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: I wish we had
- 18 more time together in this capacity. I haven't
- 19 been here very long, but I appreciate the last four
- 20 months I've had working with you here, and I'm sure
- 21 we'll keep in touch.
- MR. PICCININNI: Thank you. Yes, we
- 23 will.
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO:

- 1 Congratulations.
- 2 MR. PICCININNI: Thank you.
- 3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: It makes sense.
- 4 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Do we have any kind
- 5 of recognition awards to give him?
- 6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: I didn't make a
- 7 plaque. I'm sorry.
- 8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We're going to buy
- 9 him a beer.
- DEPUTY DIRECTOR BURD: There you go.
- 11 Our meeting minutes that are memorialized forever,
- 12 so you can approve them at the next meeting.
- 13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Which is your last
- 14 bit of advice.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Last bit of advice.
- MR. PICCININNI: So we'll get to go
- 17 out. You'll still have me for the end of this week
- 18 and for this primary, so --
- 19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Right. Okay.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Oh, okay.
- MR. PICCININNI: I don't want to leave
- 22 anybody --
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Well --
- MR. PICCININNI: -- in a transition,

- 1 especially with new staff here at the BOE to
- 2 support, so --
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: Who's going to
- 4 be the replacement?
- 5 MR. PICCININNI: That's not decided
- 6 yet.
- 7 DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Oh, okay. Yeah,
- 8 because --
- 9 MR. PICCININNI: I'm sure the
- 10 Prosecutor is mulling it over. He's cogitating on
- 11 it, to use the phrase.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: That's a big word,
- 13 man.
- MR. PICCININNI: I tell lies.
- BOARD MEMBER MARINELLO: I like it.
- MR. PICCININNI: It's not my -- I don't
- 17 use that word --
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: Oh, okay.
- MR. PICCININNI: -- because I don't.
- 20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Very well.
- DIRECTOR ANTHONY: I'm looking forward
- 22 to -- well, it's too late to relive 2004 again.
- MR. PICCININNI: Yeah, I don't ever
- 24 want to relive 2004 again.
