MR. WALCH: All those in favor, say

- 1 MEMBERS: Aye.
- 2 MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.
- The last Board meeting minutes are
- 4 approved.
- 5 The next item on the agenda is
- 6 certification of candidates to the ballot.
- 7 I'd ask that Jeff Mackey come on up and give a
- 8 summary to the members of the Board, if you
- 9 would, please.
- MR. MACKEY: The Board accepted 390
- 11 individual petitions, which covered nine
- 12 different counties that I had to communicate
- 13 with to make sure that we were validating
- 14 signatures in all the appropriate counties.
- We ended up with 333 valid petitions and 29
- 16 invalid petitions for a validity rate of about
- 17 92 percent.
- Due to Sub House Bill 369 which was
- 19 passed yesterday, or signed yesterday, I
- 20 guess, we voided 28 petitions for Congress and
- 21 an alternate delegate to the Republican
- 22 National Convention.
- You have Exhibit A in front of you.
- 24 Exhibit A includes all the candidate petitions

- 1 that we recommend for certification to the
- 2 March 26, 2012 primary ballot.
- 3 MR. WALCH: Just so the members
- 4 know, we were in communication with the
- 5 Secretary of State's office yesterday as House
- 6 Bill 369 was being debated and then approved
- 7 and signed last night, and their advice to us
- 8 was to just set aside and not bring up for
- 9 certification today those petitions for folks
- 10 running for Congress or the presidential
- 11 campaign, since there is a new filing deadline
- 12 with the legislation that passed yesterday, so
- 13 that's why they are not included in Exhibit A,
- 14 as Jeff said.
- 15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
- MR. WALCH: Any questions for Jeff?
- 17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Are we going to
- 18 discuss or are we not going to discuss -- we
- 19 are discussing Exhibits C and B in further
- 20 discussion?
- MR. WALCH: Yes, we are.
- 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: In separately
- 23 handled motions?
- MR. WALCH: Yes. This section is

- 1 just to handle those candidates that the staff
- 2 at the Board recommends for certification to
- 3 the March 6 primary ballot.
- 4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And remind me the
- 5 deadline of people who wish to have their
- 6 names removed from the ballot.
- 7 MR. MACKEY: We have instructed
- 8 those that have inquired thus far to have that
- 9 information of withdrawal by December 30th to
- 10 facilitate our production of the ballots and
- 11 programming of the machines without their
- 12 names appearing on them.
- MR. WALCH: There is no date by
- 14 which they cannot withdraw. A candidate can
- 15 withdraw up until the day of the election, but
- 16 the issue becomes if they withdraw after the
- 17 period in which we'd started to prepare
- 18 ballots and that sort of thing, then we have
- 19 to send notices out with absentees, et cetera,
- 20 et cetera.
- 21 So the date we had recommended folks
- 22 to do, so it doesn't interfere with our
- 23 preparation of ballots, is December 30th. But
- 24 a candidate legally -- the court has ruled

- 1 previously that you can't compel somebody to
- 2 run for an office. They can withdraw when
- 3 they wish, but it interferes, obviously, with
- 4 the ballot preparation, et cetera.
- 5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
- 6 MR. MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 7 that the Board certify to the March 6, 2012
- 8 Primary Election ballot those candidates whose
- 9 petitions have been timely filed on or before
- 10 Wednesday, December 7th, 2012, were found to
- 11 be valid and sufficient, and that the list of
- 12 those candidates submitted by the Director and
- 13 Deputy Director and reviewed by the Board be
- 14 attached to the record of these proceedings as
- 15 Exhibit A.
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- 17 MR. WALCH: We have a motion and a
- 18 second. All those in favor, say aye.
- 19 MEMBERS: Aye.
- MR. WALCH: Those opposed, say nay.
- 21 Motion passes.
- Now, we do have a couple of
- 23 situations where you, the members of the
- 24 Board, are also candidates for committee

- 1 positions, so we were going to deal with each
- 2 of you that are running for some kind of
- 3 committee position individually, as our
- 4 recommendation is those of you who are running
- 5 for a position would abstain on, obviously,
- 6 voting for yourself to be on the ballot.
- 7 The first one we wanted to take up
- 8 is Mr. Colley and his candidacy.
- 9 MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 10 that Michael F. Colley be certified to the
- 11 March 6, 2012 Primary Election ballot as a
- 12 candidate for member of the Republican State
- 13 Central Committee from the 16th Ohio Senate
- 14 District.
- MR. MANIFOLD: I'll second.
- MR. WALCH: It's been moved and
- 17 seconded. We should go ahead and do a roll
- 18 call on this.
- 19 Kim Marinello.
- MS. MARINELLO: Yes.
- MR. WALCH: Zach Manifold.
- MR. MANIFOLD: Yes.
- MR. WALCH: Doug Preisse.
- 24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

- 1 MR. WALCH: Motion passes.
- 2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Should he have an
- 3 opportunity to abstain?
- 4 MR. WALCH: I'm sorry. How do we go
- 5 about doing that, counselor?
- 6 MR. ANDERSON: Call him and he'll
- 7 say, "I abstain."
- 8 MR. WALCH: Okay. Mr. Colley.
- 9 MR. COLLEY: Abstain.
- MR. WALCH: Thank you. Thank you
- 11 for mentioning that, Mr. Chairman.
- 12 Next, Chairman Doug Preisse is a
- 13 candidate for the Republican State Central
- 14 Committee. Can I have a motion on his
- 15 candidacy?
- MR. MANIFOLD: I move that Douglas
- 17 Preisse be certified to the March 6, 2012
- 18 Primary Election ballot as a candidate for
- 19 member of the Republican State Central
- 20 Committee from the 15th Ohio Senate District.
- 21 MR. WALCH: Can I have a second on
- 22 that?
- MS. MARINELLO: Second.
- MR. WALCH: Okay, it's been moved

- 1 and seconded.
- 2 Kim Marinello.
- 3 MS. MARINELLO: Yes.
- 4 MR. WALCH: Zach Manifold.
- 5 MR. MANIFOLD: Yes.
- 6 MR. WALCH: Michael Colley.
- 7 MR. COLLEY: Yes.
- 8 MR. WALCH: And Doug Preisse.
- 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I abstain.
- 10 MR. WALCH: Okay. And finally, the
- 11 candidacy of Kim Marinello running for
- 12 Democratic County Central Committee from
- 13 Columbus Ward 49. Can I get a motion on that?
- MR. COLLEY: So moved.
- MR. WALCH: Do we have a second?
- MR. MANIFOLD: I'll second.
- 17 MR. WALCH: Okay. It's been moved
- 18 and seconded.
- 19 Zach Manifold.
- MR. MANIFOLD: Yes.
- MR. WALCH: Doug Preisse.
- 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.
- MR. WALCH: Michael Colley.
- MR. COLLEY: Yes.

- 1 MR. WALCH: Kim Marinello.
- MS. MARINELLO: Abstain.
- 3 MR. WALCH: Thank you. Now let's
- 4 move on to Exhibit B, which you've been given.
- 5 These are candidate petitions that the Board
- 6 has recommended not be certified for the
- 7 March 6 primary ballot, and again we'll pass
- 8 it over to Jeff to talk a little bit about
- 9 that, if you would, Jeff.
- MR. MACKEY: Each candidate has a
- 11 brief description there of why we found his
- 12 petition to be insufficient or invalid. If
- 13 you have any questions, I will entertain
- 14 those.
- 15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And that would be
- 16 Exhibit B.
- 17 MR. WALCH: Exhibit B.
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And they're
- 19 listed here?
- MR. MACKEY: They are. Kind of in
- 21 order by reason of invalidity. It starts with
- 22 the insufficient valid signature folks.
- 23 That's pretty much the first page. The back
- of that page starts with invalid declarations

- 1 of candidacy, which means that they just
- 2 didn't sign their declaration of candidacy or
- 3 somehow did not fill it out completely.
- 4 The last page is kind of the invalid
- 5 circulator statements, which was the person
- 6 that witnessed the signatures. A couple of
- 7 odds and ends.
- 8 MR. MANIFOLD: So only Central
- 9 Committee office, if they miss they can file
- 10 as a write-in, right?
- 11 MR. MACKEY: Correct. I believe
- 12 controlling boards of parties of, I think, the
- 13 State Central also falls in there.
- MR. WALCH: Any questions?
- 15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I may. Let's see
- 16 here.
- 17 In this case with Patricia Powell,
- 18 the declaration was signed after the petition
- 19 was circulated?
- MR. MACKEY: Where are you looking
- 21 at?
- 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Patricia Powell,
- 23 Central Committee, Columbus Ward 27 on the
- "not recommended for Board" --

- 1 MR. WALCH: Second page.
- 2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second page of
- 3 candidates.
- 4 MR. MACKEY: I believe when she
- 5 brought her petition in, she realized that she
- 6 had not signed the declaration of candidacy,
- 7 signed it on the day that she brought it in.
- 8 The signatures she collected were all previous
- 9 to that signing, so that would make it
- 10 invalid.
- 11 MR. WALCH: The declaration of
- 12 candidacy has to be signed prior to the
- 13 collection of signatures.
- 14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And to what
- 15 authority are we turning to understand that?
- MR. MACKEY: I believe Revised Code
- 17 3513.09 includes that information.
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And that would be
- 19 considered a fatal flaw, as is commonly said?
- MR. WALCH: It always has been. As
- 21 long as I've been doing it, yeah, it always
- 22 has been.
- MR. MACKEY: Additionally, the
- 24 petition says on its face that the candidate

- 1 must fill in, sign and date this statement of
- 2 candidacy before the petitions are circulated.
- 3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Before it's
- 4 circulated. Is this the only case in this
- 5 batch that --
- 6 MR. MACKEY: No, I don't think so.
- 7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, I see here,
- 8 too, Michael Weinman happens to be somebody
- 9 where the declaration was signed after the
- 10 petition was circulated
- 11 MR. WALCH: That's correct.
- 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Thank you.
- MR. MANIFOLD: I have a question on
- 14 the final one. There must be something wrong
- 15 with our voter file. Kelli Arthur Hykes,
- 16 Hilliard Ward 4.
- 17 MR. MACKEY: Yes, the City of
- 18 Hilliard, which you are going to take up at
- 19 the end of this meeting, voted to redesignate
- 20 their ward structure. As a result of that
- 21 re-warding, she no longer lived in the ward
- 22 that she filed her petition to run in.
- 23 MR. MANIFOLD: Oh. I'm looking at
- 24 it on our Website right now.

- 1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.
- 2 MR. WALCH: She'll be unable to
- 3 serve in that position because she no longer
- 4 lives in that ward due to the redoing of the
- 5 ward boundaries by the City of Hilliard. So
- 6 that on its face says she cannot hold the
- 7 office.
- 8 MR. MANIFOLD: Surprise.
- 9 MR. WALCH: Any other questions on
- 10 these?
- 11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: No, not from me.
- MR. COLLEY: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 13 that the Board deny certification to the
- 14 candidates appearing on Exhibit B on the basis
- 15 that their declarations of candidacy and
- 16 nominating petitions were either not timely
- 17 filed or found by staff to be invalid or
- 18 insufficient.
- MS. MARINELLO: Second.
- MR. WALCH: We have a motion and a
- 21 second. All those in favor, signify by saying
- 22 aye.
- MEMBERS: Aye.
- MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.

- 1 Motion passes.
- Okay. Next we'll take up Exhibit C,
- 3 and this has to deal with requests for
- 4 alternate ballot names. Of course, as you
- 5 know, you file under your official name that
- 6 you are registered to vote as, et cetera.
- 7 Sometimes folks ask that they appear on the
- 8 ballot under a different name. Jeff.
- 9 MR. MACKEY: We have had three of
- 10 those requests so far that --
- 11 MR. WALCH: I'm sorry, Jeff. This
- is Exhibit C for everybody. I'm sorry I
- 13 didn't mention that.
- MR. MACKEY: Requests that fall
- outside of the normal Bill for William, Rob
- 16 for Robert type of situation. We have Traci
- 17 H. Johnson. She has requested to run as
- 18 Traci, parentheses, T.J., Johnson.
- 19 Information we received from the
- 20 directive from the Secretary of State
- 21 specifically says that, "However, quotation
- 22 marks, parentheses cannot be printed on the
- 23 ballot," so that would not be an option for
- 24 her, so we recommend that that is not allowed.

- 1 Eugene Zappitelli has requested to
- 2 run as Bud. I've actually included in your
- 3 information there some supporting
- 4 documentation that he sent as well as a letter
- 5 to you, the Board members. I don't think it
- 6 makes any difference. Bud is not a natural
- 7 derivative in the sense that we have typically
- 8 seen it for Eugene or his middle name.
- 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I want to ask
- 10 about that one, because it's quite likely that
- 11 the reason this is here is because I told him
- 12 he ought to do it. I know Bud. That's the
- 13 only way I know him. And in any circles that
- 14 I've ever seen him interact, he's known as
- 15 Bud.
- And he's included various things
- 17 like his check and letterhead, business card,
- 18 previously printed campaign material, a
- 19 utility -- we know how much he spends on his
- 20 utilities. And I told him I couldn't recall
- 21 exactly what laws and traditions and things we
- 22 need to follow. You're reminding me, Jeff,
- 23 that a -- where do these words come from,
- 24 natural derivative?

- 1 MR. MACKEY: It's in the directive
- we receive from the Secretary of State prior
- 3 to each election on the ballot creation. If
- 4 you're looking for a precedent, I guess, last
- 5 election we had Pete Otteson wanted to run as
- 6 Pete. I forget what his actual name was.
- 7 MR. WALCH: Leon.
- 8 MR. MACKEY: Leon W. Otteson.
- 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Did we deny that?
- 10 Because Pete is not a, quote/unquote, natural
- 11 derivative, like, I suppose, Bud doesn't come
- 12 from Eugene. How would somebody who really,
- 13 really wanted to do this, would they have to
- 14 go to court and change their name or
- 15 something?
- MR. MACKEY: I believe we have
- 17 precedent for that, too. Butch O'Neill
- 18 actually went to court to have his name
- 19 changed to Henry -- what is it? -- P. Butch
- 20 O'Neill.
- 21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Henry B.
- MR. MACKEY: It's his middle name
- 23 now.
- 24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah, Henry M.

- 1 Does he appear as Butch on the -- I guess he
- 2 would be in here somewhere, wouldn't he?
- MR. MACKEY: Henry P. Butch O'Neill,
- 4 I think, is how he appears on the ballot.
- 5 MR. SOULAS: I'll be honest with
- 6 you, that's not an issue that we face. I can
- 7 research, I can get back to you on Monday or
- 8 even this weekend, but I don't know the answer
- 9 to that. I believe that's correct. That is
- 10 my understanding, but I cannot cite you
- 11 chapter and verse at this point.
- 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: When's our next
- 13 Board meeting?
- MR. WALCH: It's supposed to be the
- 15 first Monday, but the first Monday we are
- 16 closed, so.
- MS. COTTON: Should be the 9th.
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Should be the
- 19 9th?
- MS. COTTON: First available Monday
- 21 is the 9th.
- 22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: But that would be
- 23 beyond printing of the -- getting the ballots
- 24 ready.

- 1 MS. COTTON: Well, you're not
- 2 expected to get the state form of the ballot
- 3 until around the 9th. With the new deadline
- 4 for the congressional districts, they've
- 5 bumped our date to expect the copy from the
- 6 state back to the 9th.
- 7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, I don't
- 8 know how very important it is to these three
- 9 individuals.
- 10 MR. MANIFOLD: I would question, as
- 11 far as natural derivative, I had never heard
- of anybody go by Tei before, but Tei is --
- 13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: "Tee" or "Tay"?
- MR. MANIFOLD: She goes by "Tee."
- 15 But she dropped two Rs. All the same letters
- 16 are there. I'm not sure. I don't know.
- 17 MR. MACKEY: Our recommendation was
- 18 denial, but I would cede that that is
- 19 certainly up to you guys if you felt
- 20 differently on that one.
- 21 MR. WALCH: It was one we looked at
- 22 and said we never knew that as a natural
- 23 derivative of it. But ultimately, I would
- 24 agree with Jeff; it's up to the four of you,

- 1 if you feel differently.
- 2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, that's one
- of your people, I guess, so I'll leave it to
- 4 you, if you make a motion to separate that one
- 5 out and throw caution to the wind.
- 6 MR. MANIFOLD: With that one, do we
- 7 actually -- so we would just leave it out of
- 8 the denial?
- 9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, it hasn't
- 10 been approved, so you'd have to -- I think you
- 11 would make a motion to approve Terri Y. Street
- 12 as Tei Street, and then we'd just add that to
- 13 the approved list, or if it doesn't pass --
- MR. MANIFOLD: Okay. Mr. Chairman,
- 15 I move that the Board accept the request of
- 16 Terri Street to appear on the March 6, 2012
- 17 Primary Election ballot as Tei Street.
- MR. WALCH: Do we have a second on
- 19 that?
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- MR. WALCH: Okay. It's been moved
- 22 to accept the request of Terri Street to go on
- 23 the ballot as Tei Street. All those in favor,
- 24 signify by saying aye.

- 1 MEMBERS: Aye.
- MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.
- The ayes have it. We'll put her on
- 4 the ballot as Tei Street.
- 5 Okay. Now, to the others on
- 6 Exhibit C, how do you want to handle those?
- 7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't have a
- 8 separate motion from what has been proposed
- 9 with the exception that if Kim proceeds with
- 10 that motion, it probably drops.
- 11 MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 12 that the Board deny the requests filed by
- 13 Traci Johnson, Eugene R. Zappitelli, III, and
- 14 Terri Street -- no, wait, she's down here
- 15 twice, skip that. For their names to appear
- on the March 6, 2012 Primary Election ballot
- 17 as Traci (T.J.) Johnson, Bud Zappitelli.
- MR. WALCH: Do we have a second on
- 19 that?
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- MR. WALCH: Okay. It's been moved
- 22 and seconded. All those in favor, signify by
- 23 saying aye.
- MEMBERS: Aye.

- 1 MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.
- The ayes have it. Traci Johnson
- 3 will appear as Traci Johnson, and Eugene
- 4 Zappitelli will appear as Eugene Zappitelli.
- 5 Okay. The next item is issue
- 6 certification. For that we'll have Carla
- 7 Patton come on up and give you a brief
- 8 overview on this, which is in Exhibit D.
- 9 MS. PATTON: We had five
- 10 subdivisions timely filed, complete filings,
- 11 that place issues, local issues on the ballot,
- 12 tax levies and a bond issue. It is our
- 13 recommendation that you certify these five
- 14 issues to the ballot for March 6, 2012.
- MR. WALCH: Any questions for Carla
- on the issues that we recommend for
- 17 certification? Take a minute to look it over.
- 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Not from me.
- 19 MR. MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 20 that the Board of Elections certify to the
- 21 March 6, 2012 Primary Election ballot the
- 22 issues appearing on Exhibit D, which were
- 23 timely filed and found by staff to be
- 24 sufficient and valid.

- 1 MR. WALCH: Do we have a second on
- 2 that?
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- 4 MR. WALCH: It's been moved and
- 5 seconded. All those in favor, signify by
- 6 saying aye.
- 7 MEMBERS: Aye.
- 8 MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.
- Those issues on Exhibit D will be
- 10 certified to the ballot.
- 11 Next, we move on to Exhibit E, which
- 12 are two local liquor options that we do not
- 13 recommend, and Carla will fill us in again on
- 14 what issues we found with those petitions.
- MS. PATTON: We had two petitioners
- 16 file local option questions, each of which
- 17 contain a weekday sales question and a Sunday
- 18 sales question. On those petitions, we were
- 19 unable to find enough sufficient valid
- 20 signatures to put it forth to the ballot. So
- 21 that's the fatal flaw that we find on those
- 22 petitions, and we do not recommend them to be
- 23 certified.
- MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I

- 1 move that the Board of Elections deny
- 2 certification to the March 6, 2012 Primary
- 3 Election ballot the local option issues
- 4 appearing on Exhibit E, which were filed by
- 5 John Lynch and Melissa Kinder, on the basis of
- 6 insufficient valid signatures.
- 7 MR. WALCH: Is there a second on
- 8 that?
- 9 MR. COLLEY: Second.
- 10 MR. WALCH: It's been moved and
- 11 seconded to not recommend for Board approval
- 12 those issues found on Exhibit E. All those in
- 13 favor, signify by saying aye.
- MEMBERS: Aye.
- MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.
- Those local option petitions found
- on Exhibit E will not be certified and will
- 18 not appear on the March 6 primary ballot.
- 19 Lastly, on certifications, we have
- 20 Exhibit F, which are local liquor options that
- 21 we recommend for approval. Carla.
- MS. PATTON: Three petitions were
- 23 filed timely and had sufficient signatures.
- One of the petitions had a weekday and Sunday

- 1 sales, where the other two only had one of the
- 2 -- had Sunday sales questions to be presented.
- 3 The Board reviewed the signatures. There were
- 4 enough. We do recommend certification of
- 5 those to the ballot.
- 6 MR. WALCH: Any questions on
- 7 Exhibit F?
- 8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Looks like
- 9 Phil Craig did his homework.
- MR. WALCH: Do we have a motion?
- MR. MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 12 that the Board certify to the March 6, 2012
- 13 primary ballot those local options which were
- 14 timely filed on or before Wednesday,
- 15 December 7, 2012, and found to be valid and
- 16 sufficient and that the list of those local
- 17 options submitted by the Director and Deputy
- 18 Director and reviewed by the Board be attached
- 19 to the record of these proceedings as
- 20 Exhibit F.
- MR. WALCH: Can I have a second on
- 22 that motion?
- MR. COLLEY: Second.
- MR. WALCH: It's been moved and

- 1 seconded. All those in favor, signify by
- 2 saying aye.
- 3 MEMBERS: Aye.
- 4 MR. WALCH: Those opposed, nay.
- 5 The ayes have it. So the local
- 6 liquor options that are found on Exhibit F
- 7 will be placed on the March 6th primary
- 8 ballot.
- 9 Our final item on the agenda today
- 10 is the acceptance of new ward boundaries for
- 11 the City of Hilliard. Jeff, or Karen, you can
- 12 talk about this a little bit, if you would,
- 13 please.
- MS. COTTON: Per the charter of the
- 15 City of Hilliard, Hilliard is required after
- 16 the census to look at their precinct and ward
- 17 boundary lines -- not the precinct, but their
- 18 ward boundary lines and make adjustments to
- 19 those boundary lines to try to equalize the
- 20 population between the various wards. Wards
- 21 in Hilliard are used for the controlling
- 22 bodies of the two major political parties.
- They started that project earlier
- 24 this summer, and they just finished the

- 1 project and passed a resolution at the end of
- 2 November to change their ward boundary lines
- 3 effective the 29th of November.
- 4 Because the Board of Elections is
- 5 not permitted to make precinct changes after
- 6 the end of December, we're asking for the
- 7 Board to approve those changes.
- 8 We will need to make some precinct
- 9 renaming adjustments to comply with our new
- 10 ward boundary lines. They did move a couple
- of precincts in their entirety from Ward 3 to
- 12 Ward 1 during this action of the council
- 13 adopting new wards. They did not adjust the
- 14 boundary lines of Ward 2.
- Two of the existing precincts from
- 16 Ward 3 stayed in Ward 3, but they also moved
- 17 three precincts from Ward 4 over to Ward 3,
- 18 and that's where that individual who had filed
- 19 for County Central Committee lived, in one of
- 20 those three precincts that got moved from
- 21 Ward 4 to Ward 3.
- 22 And then they left four of the
- 23 existing precincts in Ward 4 intact as part of
- 24 Ward 4, but we're going to have to rename some

- 1 of those because we no longer have an A and a
- 2 C and a D, because they got moved elsewhere.
- 3 So we're asking for your adoption of
- 4 their plan. We really have no say on the
- 5 municipalities defining the ward boundary
- 6 lines. We only define the precincts within
- 7 the wards.
- 8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And Hilliard is
- 9 doing this because -- is Hilliard the only
- 10 municipality affected by this?
- MS. COTTON: That's the only one
- 12 that has submitted anything as yet. Many of
- 13 the charters say that they need to look at
- 14 them, but it could be -- we did get something
- 15 earlier this year from City of Dublin saying
- 16 that their wards were still in alignment
- 17 pretty much to what they had previously been,
- 18 so they weren't adjusting their ward boundary
- 19 lines at all.
- But several of the charters require
- 21 them to at least look at those lines during
- 22 the year after the census. In the case of
- 23 Hilliard, certain areas of their city have
- 24 grown quite a bit, so they decided that they

- 1 did want to make an adjustment to those ward
- 2 boundary lines to get more fair
- 3 representation.
- 4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And as far as we
- 5 know, it only affects one member of the
- 6 Central Committee?
- 7 MS. COTTON: Yes.
- 8 MR. MANIFOLD: And did you say there
- 9 was a certain date we had to approve it by?
- 10 MS. COTTON: Because County Central
- 11 Committees are on the ballot in March, the
- 12 Board is not allowed to make precinct boundary
- 13 line or ward boundary line changes after the
- 14 end of December this year. If we were not to
- do this now, we would have to wait till the
- 16 summer of next year to do it.
- 17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Here's a
- 18 clearer map of what's going on.
- MS. COTTON: They were good to us,
- 20 inasmuch as they moved whole precincts from
- 21 one ward to another ward, rather than
- 22 splitting a lot of things and going with air
- 23 lines. They were very good to us in this
- 24 plan.

- 1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Well, that
- 2 is good to know. Thank you.
- MR. WALCH: Any other questions of
- 4 Karen at all? Do we have a motion to accept
- 5 those?
- 6 MS. MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 7 that the Board accept the new ward boundary
- 8 lines submitted by the City of Hilliard and
- 9 approve the resulting proposed precinct
- 10 boundary revisions.
- MR. WALCH: Do we have a second on
- 12 that?
- 13 MR. COLLEY: Second.
- MR. WALCH: It's been moved and
- 15 seconded. All those in favor, signify by
- 16 saying aye.
- MEMBERS: Aye.
- MR. WALCH: All those opposed?
- The ayes have it.
- Mr. Chairman, that's all I have on
- 21 the agenda today. Do we have a motion to
- 22 adjourn?
- MR. MANIFOLD: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 24 that we adjourn.

As used in the sections of the Revised Code relating to elections and political communications, whenever a person is required to sign or affix a signature to a declaration of candidacy, nominating petition, declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate, initiative petition, referendum petition, recall petition, or any other kind of petition, or to sign or affix a signature on any other document that is filed with or transmitted to a board of elections or the office of the secretary of state, <u>"sign" or "signature" means that person's written, cursive-style legal mark written in that person's own hand.</u>

- (B) For persons who do not use a cursive-style legal mark during the course of their regular business and legal affairs, "sign" or "signature" means that person's other legal mark that the person uses during the course of that person's regular business and legal affairs that is written in the person's own hand.
- (C) Any voter registration record requiring a person's signature shall be signed using the person's legal mark used in the person's regular business and legal affairs. For any purpose described in division (A) of this section, the legal mark of a registered elector shall be considered to be the mark of that elector as it appears on the elector's voter registration record. [R.C. 3501.011]
