The first issue is provisional ballots 16 17 for the August 5 Special Election. We had 17 18 provisional ballots that were cast and staff -- our 19 bipartisan teams have gone through them and believe 20 that all 17 of them should count, so we are here to get authority from you for the counting of those 21 2.2 ballots.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I move

provisional ballots and the rejection of no provisional ballots in the August 5, 2014, Special Election in Licking Heights Local School District and that all provisional ballots deemed valid will be counted and included in the official canvass of results.

MEMBER SINNOTT: Second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: All those in favor say aye. The ayes have it.

Jeff has just sent a message out to the warehouse for them to open those envelopes, count those ballots in the official canvass. The rest of it took place a little earlier today, and hopefully we will have a message back in a few minutes.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: How do you know it has been received?

MR. MACKEY: I am looking for it to change from sent to received here.

MEMBER MARINELLO: No one can hack that?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: In the meantime we will move to our next item on the agenda which is certification of issues for the General Election.

You do have Exhibit A in front of you which is all the issues that staff believed were timely filed and

sufficient and valid. There are a number of municipal issues, one countywide issue; is that correct, Jeff?

MR. MACKEY: One countywide.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Who is that?

MR. MACKEY: It's the fourth one down for the Children Services Levy.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: And then a number of local option election issues that are on this, so we need a motion to certify Exhibit A, issues to the ballot.

MEMBER SINNOTT: Dana, for anybody else who aspired to be on the ballot but doesn't do it properly or sufficiently, I guess, to staff, those people are going to learn of that by virtue of not being on this list?

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: We will do a separate motion for one issue that we need to not certify to the ballot. There was one issue, a local option petition in Columbus Ward 21, Precinct C, that had an insufficient number of signatures to qualify. We are going to do that in a separate motion.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, I see.

MR. MACKEY: We are going to call them in

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the morning.
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MEMBER SINNOTT: So there is a very short disapprove list too.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: That's correct.

MEMBER SINNOTT: And then that filing that was made down at City Hall relative to the charter that city government didn't think was sufficient, it hasn't even made it to this level.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR WALCH: This -- the charter -- oh, no, it never even made it to this level; that's correct, yes. I'm sorry. I was thinking of the charter amendment issues that are on this list. But the other one is not because it never got sent over to us from the city.

MEMBER SINNOTT: Okay. I move that the Board of Elections certify to the November 4, 2014, General Election ballot the issues appearing on Exhibit A which were timely filed and found by staff to be sufficient and valid.
