APPROVAL OF MINUTES

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: First item of the business is the approval of the March 6, 2017, Board minutes. If there aren't any corrections, additions, or deletions, I'd like a motion to approve.

MEMBER SEXTON: I move the Board approve the minutes of the March 6, 2017 meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections as submitted.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.

(Vote taken; motion passed.)

PAPER BALLOT ALLOCATION

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The first three items, the next items on the agenda, are Ballot Allocation, Machine Allocation, and Electronic Pollbook Allocations, and Carolyn Gorup will go through each of those. Start with paper ballot allocation.

1 MS. GORUP: Looking at the 2013 and 2015  
2 elections, the most provisional ballots cast in any  
3 one precinct was 12. If we increase it by 5 percent,  
4 round it up to a full pad, that would be 25 for one  
5 pad, and so the recommendation is to do one full pad  
6 for every style and party in every precinct.

7 MEMBER SINNOTT: One full pad is the  
8 minimum number?

9 MS. GORUP: Twenty-five, that's the  
10 minimum we do. Thirteen is the legal minimum  
11 required.

12 MEMBER SINNOTT: But we get these in pads  
13 of 25?

14 MS. GORUP: Yes.

15 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move the Board provide  
16 25 paper ballots for each ballot style for  
17 provisional voting and machine back-up at polling  
18 locations for the May 2, 2017, Primary Elections.

19 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
21 favor, signify by saying aye.

22 All opposed, same sign.

23 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.

MACHINE ALLOCATION

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next item is Machine Allocation. I believe you have an exhibit marked Exhibit A.

MS. GORUP: Yes. We are allocating one machine for every 175 active voters in a location. There's a LID-by-LID detail in Exhibit A, for a total for those of 4,260 machines put out on election day. Some may think that might be too many, but that's what the law requires.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The law requires one machine per 175 voters?

MS. GORUP: Active voters.

MEMBER MARINELLO: I move the Board adopt the voting machine allocation formula in Exhibit A compiled by the Board staff for the May 2, 2017, Primary Election.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

All opposed, same sign.

(Vote taken; motion passed.)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.



1 those will be put on the paper ballot table, and it  
2 will be a back-up should one of them fail during the  
3 day, and having it at the paper ballot table allows  
4 that table to look up the correct ballot style for  
5 somebody who has to vote provisionally.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And is this allocation  
7 intended to absorb the entirety of the voting that  
8 takes place?

9 MS. GORUP: Yes, in each location.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: In other words, we are  
11 going full out. This covers it all.

12 MS. GORUP: Covers it all.

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Now, we are  
14 required by the Secretary of State's directive to  
15 have paper back-up in case the electronic pollbooks  
16 malfunction for some reason. So we will have the  
17 system we've been using for a number of elections in  
18 our back pocket if we need that.

19 MEMBER SINNOTT: Have you reached the  
20 conclusion that one e-Pollbook per 905 voters is the  
21 correct ratio?

22 MS. GORUP: That was what the vendors  
23 were telling us when we're looking at them. They  
24 recommended that allocation. Personally, I think in

1 the future we may just want to look at the active  
2 voters. Those are the people who actually come out  
3 and vote, but we want to be safe this time, probably  
4 this year.

5 MR. SINNOTT: Okay. Thank you.

6 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move the Board adopt  
7 the e-Pollbook allocation formula in Exhibit B  
8 compiled by Board staff for the May 2, 2017, Primary  
9 Election.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is there a  
11 second?

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second and one more  
13 question. So the books assigned also correspond to  
14 that number of staff?

15 MS. GORUP: There would be one roster  
16 judge for each e-Pollbook.

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What do you do about  
18 queuing-up signage?

19 MS. GORUP: It will be any line any time.  
20 It is sort of like when you go to the bank and go to  
21 the next teller available.

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So we don't have to  
23 bother to, even though we have the back-up paper  
24 system there.

1 MS. GORUP: If the back-up paper system  
2 should be activated, there are signs, and they will  
3 take it to the front of their desk.

4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. I seconded  
5 already.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
7 favor, signify by saying aye.

8 All opposed, same sign.

9 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.

11 MEMBER SINNOTT: Before we leave the  
12 subject of the May primary, someone explain, what is  
13 this?

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think we have  
15 Steve Bulen on the agenda. Do you want him to  
16 explain that now?

17 MEMBER SINNOTT: We don't need to go out  
18 of order. I just wanted to make sure we are hearing  
19 what this is.

20 MR. BULEN: Yes.

21 MEMBER SINNOTT: Keep going then.

22 - - -

23 PURCHASE OF EXTENSION CORDS AND SURGE PROTECTORS

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Because we have

1 electronic pollbooks, we need to have a number of  
2 extension cords that we had to purchase as well as  
3 surge protectors. Normally what we do is bring those  
4 to the Board prior to authorizing the expense, but in  
5 this case we needed to purchase those, so I'm asking  
6 for a motion retroactively.

7 I'll let Aaron Sellers, who took the lead  
8 on getting all this.

9 MR. SELLERS: Here's my props. Good  
10 afternoon. Back on the 14th of March at our weekly  
11 managers meeting, I was tasked with ordering power  
12 extension cords and surge protects to accommodate the  
13 electronic pollbooks or Poll Pads we were rolling out  
14 for the May 2 primary.

15 A stress test was conducted in  
16 consultation with the Data Center to simulate an  
17 election on pollbooks. This test was successful,  
18 however, delayed us in ordering supplies that were  
19 needed. The supplies will be used in all 369 voting  
20 locations and is critical to the use of the Poll  
21 Pads.

22 Because of the time constraints and the  
23 sensitivity of this purchase, we are now asking for  
24 this Board's approval at its next regularly scheduled

1 Board meeting, which is today.

2 I worked with managers of the operations,  
3 the PEO of the warehouse. As I said, we had very  
4 short turnaround to purchase and receive the items.  
5 Supplies were being packed in the voting machine  
6 carts last Tuesday, March 27.

7 I was able to secure three quotes from  
8 The Data House, Staples, and Granger. We needed  
9 1,100 extension cords, 550 surge protectors. The  
10 quotes were all very similar in price, but The Data  
11 House, which is a local vendor, was able to meet the  
12 tight deadline.

13 We received all the supplies by the 27th,  
14 so they are in the process of being packed with all  
15 the stuff. The outlet power extensions came out to  
16 about \$11.27 per extension cord and the surge  
17 protectors were \$24.94 apiece. That totals \$26,114.

18 I also have copies of all the  
19 documentation, if you would like to look at it, and  
20 these are industrial strength surge protectors.

21 MEMBER SINNOTT: How long are those  
22 extension cords, Aaron?

23 MR. SELLERS: I think they're 25 feet.

24 MEMBER SINNOTT: Will that be long

1 enough?

2 MR. SELLERS: Yes. Yes.

3 MEMBER SINNOTT: I want to make an  
 4 extension cord motion. I move that the Board  
 5 authorize the director and deputy director to  
 6 purchase 1,100 extension cords at \$11.27 each in the  
 7 amount of \$12,397 and 550 surge protectors at  
 8 \$24.94 for each for the amount of \$13,717 for  
 9 e-pollbooks for the 2017 Primary Election.

10 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
 12 favor, signify by saying aye.

13 All those opposed, same sign.

14 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The motion  
 16 carries.

17 - - -

18 KIDS VOTING CONTRACT

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mr. Bulen, the  
 20 next thing on the item is the Kids Voting Contract.  
 21 Then if you could answer at the end of that  
 22 Mr. Sinnott's question about the signage.

23 MR. BULEN: Thank you, Deputy Director  
 24 Payne.

1           Mr. Chairman, members of the Board, good  
2 to see you again. We have a great relationship with  
3 Kids Voting. They provide our Youth at the Booth  
4 students for each election. And we began the program  
5 in November of 2005, and all the way through  
6 November 2016 over 14,000 positions have been filled  
7 by Youth at the Booth students throughout those  
8 elections. Last election alone we had 686 students  
9 participate.

10           And then another thing that we're doing  
11 is following up with those who have been a part of  
12 the program. We call them former Youth at the Booth  
13 Students, and since November of 2012 we have had  
14 1,025 participate. Once they graduated from high  
15 school, they remained as precinct election officials,  
16 so a very successful program, and we depend on them  
17 quite a bit.

18           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You answered the one  
19 question that occurred to me. Do we know if this  
20 affected their participation and civic-mindedness.  
21 Sounds like it has.

22           MR. BULEN: Yes, sir.

23           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Who is running the  
24 program, the external, not internal? The external

1 Kids Voting, who's running that?

2 MR. BULEN: It comes under the  
3 umbrella -- I'm not sure of the name of the program.  
4 Edwin England is the person ultimately responsible,  
5 and we work with Deb Koch.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Deb is still involved.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yes.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Was Jeff Cabot once?

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Cabot was.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Is he still?

11 MEMBER MARINELLO: No.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. But Deb is.  
13 She's doing it, too. Okay.

14 DIRECTOR LEONARD: It comes under the  
15 umbrella of the Education Service Center of Central  
16 Ohio. That's the umbrella agency that supports Kids  
17 Voting.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Well, my  
19 experience every time with the kids when we run into  
20 them voting has been great.

21 MR. BULEN: A very successful program.

22 MEMBER MARINELLO: How many do we expect  
23 to participate in the election?

24 MR. BULEN: It's interesting,

1 Mr. Chairman, because in the spring, I don't know if  
2 it's spring fever, testing, proms, it's usually a  
3 little lower than what was it in the fall. We will  
4 know, honestly, after May 2, but I believe we have,  
5 like, 250 signed up to serve this election, and if  
6 you would look at the numbers throughout the years,  
7 the spring is always much, much lower than the fall.

8 DIRECTOR LEONARD: Senioritis could be a  
9 term for it.

10 MR. BULEN: Could be. Could be a number  
11 of reasons.

12 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move the Board enter  
13 into a contract not to exceed \$45,000 with the  
14 Educational Service Center of Central Ohio for the  
15 Kids Voting Youth at the Booth program.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
18 favor, signify by saying aye.

19 All those opposed, same sign.

20 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.  
22 Do you want to address the signage?

23 MR. BULEN: Yes, sir. Even though it's  
24 not on the agenda, I know when they presented the

1 electronic pollbooks last time, there was a concern  
2 about a signature and how that impacts the voter  
3 record.

4           We have developed these signs. They will  
5 be posted on the roster table as each location, and  
6 we currently have poll worker training going on, and  
7 if you would look at the table where that training is  
8 taking place, we have posted the ones with the green  
9 starburst just as a reminder to share this with each  
10 voter.

11           We've also integrated it into our poll  
12 worker training -- also I just want to make sure  
13 everyone understands that unless the voter's  
14 signature is blank in their voter record here, we  
15 will not upload those signatures to the voter records  
16 when it comes back.

17           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Say that again.

18           MR. BULEN: Unless we do not have a  
19 signature on their voter record currently, when those  
20 electronic signatures come back, Carolyn will not  
21 upload them into the voter records, so they won't  
22 replace what we have currently on file. The paper  
23 signature will still be the signature on file in the  
24 voter record unless there is no signature. Then the

1 electronic signature would be uploaded.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: As I recall from  
3 previous Board meetings, we are looking at these  
4 documents, because we had a conversation about what  
5 happens if signatures don't match, so...

6 MR. BULEN: We have the ability to erase  
7 the, shall we say, the Kroger signature, Giant Eagle  
8 signature and ask the voter to re-sign it so that  
9 it's a closer match to what we show on the Poll Pad.  
10 But, still that's --

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So the suggestion that  
12 somehow we notify the voters that they're signing an  
13 official document, they're signing a legal official  
14 document, are these the words, you are signing an  
15 official election document?

16 MR. BULEN: Yes, sir.

17 MEMBER SINNOTT: You haven't printed  
18 these yet, have you, Steve?

19 MR. BULEN: We can change them in  
20 whatever way you'd like, sir.

21 MEMBER SINNOTT: I want to make sure I  
22 understand the context. When you went to vote in the  
23 past, there would be on the paper that you would sign  
24 your signature, your legal signature, as it was

1 recorded at the Board. And each precinct worker  
2 would compare that to the signature that was being  
3 placed on the document by the person in front of her.  
4 The precinct workers will still have the official  
5 signature on display.

6 MR. BULEN: Yes, sir.

7 MEMBER SINNOTT: But it will be part of  
8 the electronic display.

9 MR. BULEN: Yes, sir.

10 MEMBER SINNOTT: And the precinct worker  
11 will still be looking for a match between the  
12 signature entered onto the computer and the signature  
13 that is the legal one, the official one.

14 MR. BULEN: Yes, sir.

15 MEMBER SINNOTT: If that's the case, I  
16 think we can maybe come up with language that better  
17 conveys "use your legal signature" than the phrase  
18 that appears here.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That's where I was  
20 going, too. It almost sounds like a warning, oh, you  
21 know, it almost brushes up against even maybe a  
22 little too harsh.

23 MEMBER SINNOTT: When I saw it, I read it  
24 as being a reminder you are performing an act of

1 legal significance, not a solicitation for someone to  
 2 use his "official" signature.

3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: That's how I read it.

4 MEMBER SINNOTT: When signing the  
 5 electronic pollbook, please remember to use your  
 6 official signature or use your legal signature.  
 7 Could we do that instead?

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Or full. Now we  
 9 are -- I mean, are they seeing their old signature,  
 10 too, when they are signing?

11 They're not. That's where we get jammed  
 12 up a little bit. If full legal, full official.

13 MEMBER SINNOTT: In common parlance what  
 14 is the way we sign legal documents? When we trying  
 15 to be formal, what do we call that in everyday  
 16 discussion? Do we call an official signature, legal  
 17 signature?

18 MEMBER MARINELLO: Legal signature.

19 MEMBER SINNOTT: Can we do that, Steve,  
 20 instead?

21 MR. BULEN: We will change it today.

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: When signing the  
 23 electronic pollbook, please remember to use your  
 24 legal signature.



1 through this year and through the 2018 elections.  
2 The project manager assigned to Franklin County is  
3 Dan Shebesta. He's been working through several  
4 elections with us as our support person from ES&S and  
5 has a strong track record of support and works well  
6 with the folks on our staff. We're very confident of  
7 his ability to provide that support to us through  
8 ES&S.

9 This isn't the first time we've had these  
10 types of contracts. We've had these contracts over  
11 the years at least dating back to 2007, and it's a  
12 total of 50 election support days, and those 50 days  
13 come at a cost per day amount which equals \$82,500  
14 for the 50 days. We could use those 50 days  
15 throughout the two-year period, anytime we needed  
16 them in support of our election. Then we would be  
17 invoiced on a monthly basis when we use those  
18 election days.

19 MEMBER SINNOTT: Ed, what is it exactly  
20 that ES&S does for us?

21 DIRECTOR LEONARD: In terms of the  
22 support activity, well, they're definitely here  
23 election -- I could ask Carla to stand and speak to  
24 that in terms of what they do for us. But, again,

1 they provide assistance to us, whatever we might need  
2 for set-up of the election, election-night activity.  
3 They're typically here election day.

4           Carla, is there anything else I'm  
5 missing?

6           MS. PATTON: No. He basically comes and  
7 helps us do all the coding, makes sure we do things  
8 properly and helps us with finer tuning with the  
9 difficulties of our county. He helps us run the  
10 logic and accuracy on the scanners, being able to  
11 fine-tune those if there's any problems if we  
12 encounter them. He is basically here as the main  
13 support for us to make sure what we are doing is  
14 correct and accurate.

15           MEMBER SINNOTT: Thank you. What did we  
16 pay for that last year?

17           DIRECTOR LEONARD: I don't have a figure  
18 on the last go-around.

19           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's a 5 percent  
20 increase from the last one.

21           MEMBER SINNOTT: Thank you.

22           MEMBER MARINELLO: Did this cover all  
23 elections if we have Special Elections?

24           DIRECTOR LEONARD: Right. We can use

1 those days during any election we have now through  
 2 2018, so, yes, any Special Election if we would need  
 3 their support for that, yes.

4 Any other questions?

5 I would ask for approval.

6 MEMBER SEXTON: I move that the Board  
 7 authorize the director and deputy director to enter  
 8 into a two-year contract not to exceed \$82,500 with  
 9 ES&S for election service support.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
 12 favor, signify by saying aye.

13 All those opposed, same sign.

14 (Vote taken; motion passed.)

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.

16 - - -

17 3SG/PRIME CONTRACT

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next item on  
 19 the agenda is the 3SG/Prime contract. If you  
 20 remember, Prime/3SG, we contracted with them in the  
 21 November election, and they actually did our web page  
 22 on election night where we had mapping, and by all  
 23 accounts it was pretty successful. We got a lot of  
 24 great feedback on that.

1           What we would like to do is to do that  
2 again. We used to have somebody that served as our  
3 GIS person back in Jeff Mackey's area. We no longer  
4 have that person, and we would like to contract with  
5 3SG/Prime for that.

6           Additionally, we have maps back there  
7 that are hard copy, and they are the only copies that  
8 we have, and we'd like to see 3SG/Prime scan those,  
9 all of those, so that we have those maps  
10 electronically. If we had a situation of a fire or a  
11 flood right now, those are the only copies of the  
12 maps we have.

13           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Maps of what?

14           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Our boundaries,  
15 our precincts. Our boundaries and precincts  
16 basically.

17           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We only have that in  
18 hard copy?

19           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: A lot of it right  
20 now.

21           DIRECTOR LEONARD: It's historical.

22           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, historical.

23           DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Historical, I'm  
24 sorry.

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I was worried what we  
2 were doing around here.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: No, historical.

4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I understand.

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: So by entering  
6 into the contract, it is less expensive to do all  
7 three of these things than it was to have an  
8 individual back there doing the GIS support. So  
9 we're very satisfied with 3SG Prime, and so I would  
10 look for a motion.

11 MEMBER MARINELLO: Is this contract for  
12 2017?

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: That is correct.  
14 That is correct. It anticipates three elections,  
15 although right now we only have scheduled the Primary  
16 and the General, but it would also include a Special  
17 Election if that should happen.

18 MEMBER SINNOTT: I move the Board  
19 authorize the director and deputy director to enter  
20 into a contract not to exceed \$25,300 with 3SG/Prime  
21 for GIS support, election night support, and large  
22 format conversion services.

23 I think we need a second other than from  
24 Mr. Preisse.

1 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

2 MEMBER SINNOTT: I think Mr. Preisse  
3 wants to record his abstention.

4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I was going to do that  
5 in the roll call. If you weren't going to do that,  
6 will you please do that.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Kimberly  
8 Marinello.

9 MS. MARINELLO: Yes.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Michael Sexton.

11 MR. SEXTON: Yes.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Douglas Preisse.

13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I will abstain from  
14 voting.

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Bradley Sinnott.

16 MR. SINNOTT: Yes.

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion carries.

18 - - -

19 EXECUTIVE SESSION

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We have some  
21 items to go over as it relates to promotion and an  
22 organizational chart that we probably should go into  
23 Executive Session.

24 MEMBER SINNOTT: Pursuant to ORC

1 Section 121.22(G) (1&3), I move that the Franklin  
2 County Board of Elections go into Executive Session  
3 to consider the appointment, employment, dismissal,  
4 discipline, promotion, demotion, and/or compensation  
5 of a public employee.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Kimberly  
8 Marinello.

9 MS. MARINELLO: Yes.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Michael Sexton.

11 MR. SEXTON: Yes.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Douglas Preisse.

13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes.

17 you can get a voice recording, a text message, or


