DIRECTOR LEONARD: Yes, she is here.

MEMBER SINNOTT: Hello.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Hello, Mel. Yeah, I read your resume, too. You have broad experience.

MS. FUHRMANN: Thank you.

MEMBER MARINELLO: I happily move that the Franklin County Board of Elections hire Mellissia Fuhrmann as Director of Voter Services, full-time position, beginning February 26th, 2018, at a rate of \$33.66 per hour.

We have had an 16 assessment done of it and determined that the 17 underlying database is very strong and robust and 18 will serve us well, but that the user interface for 19 that software does need to be upgrade. It's written 20 in old programming language, and it's only supported 2.1 by one vendor that we've been using over the years 22 that was affiliated with Sequoia when we originally 23 purchased the software, and so that kind of puts us 24 in a vulnerable position because of that very narrow 25 availability of support as well as the old

programming language, so this upgrade -- this first phase of the upgrade will evaluate the system and determine the architecture and what's going to need to be done, and then also plot out the -- the project scope and timeline for Phase 2, which will actually be the process where the rewrite would be done, but again, this is -- and MAPSYS is an organization that has a long history with the county. They've done numerous projects for the Franklin County Data Center and also the Clerk of Courts office, the Treasurer's office, the County Commissioners office, state and county Public Defender's Office as well as the Supreme Court for the State of Ohio; so they've got a long history of doing these types of IT projects, and the -- this will be a deep dive into the existing structure of the system, some of the add-ons we've had on the system, and then it will ultimately result in a project plan for the next phase, which the software will actually be rewritten. The goal is to have this all done -- the first phase will be done by May or June, with the anticipation that a Phase 2 would be completed before the general election of 2019, so that we can have a full general election operating under the new system before we go into a presidential year.

MR. MANIFOLD: Good afternoon. We have services -- you have the quote in front of you for our annual envelope purchase. We're looking to purchase 150,000 Carrier Envelopes for absentee ballots, 150,000 ID Envelopes, and 150,000 Reply Envelopes.

We've been using Envelope Solution for as long as -- probably over five years. They're the only manufacturer of envelopes that are located in Central Ohio. We've toured the plant before. They always give us an amazing price. As you can see, it's right around six cents for this, eleven by six, including printing. We actually used to pay these prices without printing. Our print shop uses Franks. We used to order the envelope by itself and then brought them back here, which our print shop was amazingly cheap. They're like three cents for -- or two cents, but actually they're basically throwing in

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the printing now for free because they can do it in

     line as they manufacture the envelopes. They're also
     giving us free storage for the year, so whenever we

     want to call and actually have them deliver here, we
 4

     can get them whenever we want. They're only maybe 15
 6
     miles north of us, in Delaware. So they've been

     really great to us. The quality has always been
     great, and the price is always amazing, so --

MR. MANIFOLD: ES&S is our election vendor. We have been purchasing ballots from them for about five years, or ballot stock from them, just the plain ballot stock, perforated with a one and a half inch stub. Before that we used to buy from Dayton Legal Blank, but Dayton Legal Blank went out of business. The only other real vendor that's in competition is Barrett Brothers in Dayton. We've used them before, and we had some issues with quality, so we haven't been using them anymore, but just about any vendor is always seven, seven and a half cents per ballot, whenever we purchase. 550,000 sheets will bring us close to about 900,000 sheets on hand. That should get us through, if we have a two-sheet ballots for the Primarily and the General, that should give us just about -- more than enough ballot stock for the year.

This contract is actually covered by a grant. The Secretary of State I think issued the grant for \$30,200, and our cost is \$29,500.

R.C. 3513.06 If any person desiring to become a candidate for public office has had a change of name within five years immediately preceding the filing of the
