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DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Looks like we have a quorum, but I'll go ahead and take roll.

Kim Marinello.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.

MEMBER SEXTON: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug

Preisse.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Josh

Jaffe.

MEMBER JAFFE: Yes.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We do have a quorum.

The first item on the agenda is

approval of the minutes from the January 3rd, 2022, meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections.

I think you should have received those in the mail.

I don't know if you have any additions,

corrections, or deletions, but --

MEMBER MARINELLO: Hearing none, I

move the Board approve the minutes of the January

1 3rd, 2022, meeting of the Franklin County Board of  
2 Elections as submitted.

3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
5 properly moved and seconded.

6 All those in favor of the motion  
7 signify by saying aye.

8 (Vote taken.)

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: ALL opposed,  
10 same sign.

11 (No response.)

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
13 carries.

14 The next item on the agenda is a  
15 voter challenge by David Rosso against Saniqua  
16 Marshall. I'm going to ask Mel Fuhrmann of our  
17 Voter Services Department to come up and give an  
18 overview of the voter challenge. And David Rosso  
19 is here, so we'll probably call upon him at some  
20 point.

21 MS. FUHRMANN: Thank you. My name  
22 is Mel Fuhrmann appearing for Voter Services this  
23 afternoon.

24 We received a voter challenge form  
25 from Mr. David J. Rosso who lists his address as

1 4797 Hoseah Street, H-o-s-e-a-h, in Columbus, Ohio,  
2 challenging the right to vote of Saniqua L.

3 Marshall. Saniqua, S-a-n-i-q-u-a, L. Marshall.

4 The research that I conducted on  
5 this matter includes the following. David J. Rosso  
6 is a qualified elector in Franklin County. As far  
7 as Saniqua Marshall, we have a returned  
8 acknowledgment notice that came back to us as  
9 undelivered. Our records also showed that she  
10 registered online through the Bureau of Motor  
11 Vehicles on December 6th of 2001, and on her online  
12 registration she listed 4797 Hoseah, H-o-s-e-a-h,  
13 Street as her address.

14 Research also shows a previous  
15 address for Miss Marshall of 639 Riverview,  
16 Apartment 3, Columbus, and that was in 2018.  
17 Suspecting that this may have been an error on the  
18 part of the BMW, I reached out to our BMW liaison,  
19 Sarah Burton, over at Alum Creek, and she responded  
20 by email, which I think you have there in your  
21 packet, that Saniqua renewed her vehicle  
22 registration on 12-6-21, she updated her address to  
23 4797 Hoseah Street, she appeared in person at the  
24 BMW to renew her registration and she verbally  
25 provided that as her address. And then Miss Burton

1 goes on to give instructions as to what needs to  
2 happen if the person who claims that Saniqua's  
3 address is wrong would need to do to file a  
4 complaint. That is what my research has shown.

5  
6 And then I assume the Board might  
7 like to hear from Mr. Rosso since he is here today.

8 MR. JAFFE: So this was just a  
9 couple of months ago that she registered at this  
10 address, so there's been no activity from her at  
11 the address?

12 MS. FUHRMANN: That's right.

13 DIRECTOR WHITE: Mel, can you speak  
14 to notification to the voter in question?

15 MS. FUHRMANN: Sure.

16 As far as the voter challenge?

17 DIRECTOR WHITE: Yes.

18 MS. FUHRMANN: That's right.

19 So in terms of the notification,  
20 this voter, we ran a notice in The Daily Reporter  
21 for five days last week, starting on February 7th  
22 through 11th. We gave notice to Saniqua Marshall  
23 of the voter challenge. We also sent a subpoena to  
24 the address that she listed on her registration,  
25 the Hoseah Street, 4797 Hoseah Street address, and  
we also sent a subpoena to her previous address,

1 the registration we have from 2018, which is 639  
2 Riverview, Apartment No. 3. And to the best of my  
3 knowledge, we did not hear anything from  
4 Miss Marshall.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Mel, you were  
6 just saying -- the second thing you just said on  
7 that list was we contacted Saniqua with no  
8 definition and then you went on to define the three  
9 things. So that statement was precursor to the  
10 three definitions. Those are the only three ways  
11 available to us to try to connect?

12 MS. FUHRMANN: Well, let me clarify.  
13 We -- Not myself, but Erin Gibbons, executive  
14 manager, attempted to reach out to Miss Marshall by  
15 phone.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

17 MS. FUHRMANN: No answer. No reply.  
18 We sent subpoenas to both the Riverview address and  
19 the Hoseah Street address. No reply. And we  
20 also -- the third method of notice was we ran an ad  
21 in The Daily Reporter last week for five days. So  
22 those were the three methods we attempted to  
23 contact her.

24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Thank you.

25 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Mel.

1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Any more  
2 questions of Mel or do we want to hear from  
3 Mr. Rosso?

4 Do we need to swear Mr. Rosso in?

5 MS. HUMMER: Yes.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Mr. Rosso,  
7 welcome. Thanks for coming down. And please take  
8 the podium and we need to swear you in here.

9 (Witness sworn by court reporter.)

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you.

11 MR. ROSSO: You're welcome.

12 - - -

13 EXAMINATION OF DAVID J. ROSSO

14 BY CHAIRMAN PREISSE:

15 Q. Tell us what brought you here today.

16 A. Well, I was concerned that maybe I  
17 had an identity theft going on because I got a  
18 notice with somebody else's else name and my  
19 address. I didn't know the person. And then  
20 shortly after that I got one from the BMW, as well.  
21 So that really had me worried. So that's what kind  
22 of started this.

23 I suspect that it's a new person in  
24 my neighborhood that just doesn't know her address.  
25 There's new people across the street from me that I

1 have not met and I don't know them. So I kind of  
2 suspect that that's the problem, but I just wanted  
3 to nip this in the bud before she starts using my  
4 address everywhere.

5 Q. Okay.

6 A. And she didn't get the subpoena  
7 because I got it and I sent it back. I marked on  
8 it "return to sender." I opened up the first  
9 letter because I didn't know what it was when I  
10 first got the very first letter which started this  
11 whole mess.

12 MS. HUMMER: Can I establish a few  
13 questions?

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yeah. Sure.

15 - - -

16 EXAMINATION

17 BY MS. HUMMER:

18 Q. Mr. Rosso, your current address is  
19 4797 Hoseah Street?

20 A. Uh-huh. Yes.

21 Q. And is that your permanent address?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Do you own that home?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. And how long have you lived there?

1 A. Since 2003.

2 Q. And do you have any knowledge or  
3 have you ever been in contact with Saniqua  
4 Marshall?

5 A. No.

6 Q. And to the best of your knowledge  
7 she has never lived there?

8 A. No.

9 Q. Stayed there?

10 A. No.

11 Q. You have never subleased to her?

12 A. Just me and my wife. That's it.

13 Q. And are you seeking or requesting  
14 that she be removed at that address from her voter  
15 registration?

16 A. Yes.

17 MS. HUMMER: Thank you. Nothing  
18 further.

19 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Any  
20 questions from the Board?

21 MR. ROSSO: I brought some documents  
22 in case you wanted to see proof of address besides  
23 my license, obviously.

24 MS. HUMMER: I'd like to look at it,  
25 if you have any kind of proof of ownership of your

1 home.

2 MR. ROSSO: Sure.

3 MS. HUMMER: Let the record reflect  
4 I'm looking at Mr. Rosso's license reflecting the  
5 address of 4797 Hoseah Street and a mortgage  
6 statement reflecting the same address. I think  
7 that's sufficient.

8 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't have any  
9 questions. Do you guys?

10 MEMBER MARINELLO: No.

11 MR. JAFFE: I think I'm satisfied.

12 I will move that the Board approve  
13 the challenge of right to vote filed by David J.  
14 Rosso of 4797 Hoseah Street, Columbus, Ohio,  
15 against Saniqua L. Marshall of 4797 Hoseah Street,  
16 Columbus, Ohio, and that Saniqua L. Marshall's  
17 registration be removed in the Franklin County  
18 voter file.

19 MEMBER SEXTON: I'll second.

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
21 properly moved and seconded.

22 All those in favor of the voter  
23 challenge signify by saying aye.

24 (Vote taken.)

25 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,

1 same sign.

2 (No response.)

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
4 carries.

5 Thank, Mr. Rosso.

6 MR. ROSSO: Thank you.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mr. Rosso,  
8 this is the first time he's been up here under this  
9 circumstance, but he comes here often to fix our  
10 fire alarm. So thank you for that.

11 MR. ROSSO: I noticed it was normal  
12 when I walked in.

13 Can I go, then?

14 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Yes. And thanks  
15 a lot.

16 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thanks for taking  
17 care of our building.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next  
19 item on the agenda is the certification of  
20 candidates. And I'm going to bring Jeff Mackey up,  
21 if you would.

22 MR. MACKEY: Do you want to address  
23 that or --

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: So on the  
25 situation with Jeff Smith, Sarah came in, they did

1 find those two voter registrations. That would  
2 take him from three to five. They are valid.

3 MR. MACKKEY: Okay.

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: So at this  
5 point Jeff Smith is on our list of candidates not  
6 to recommend because he only had three valid  
7 signatures for central committee and now he has  
8 five.

9 Mel, would you mind getting Sarah  
10 and getting those applications that she has for --  
11 to show the Board if they have questions about  
12 those two additional?

13 MS. FUHRMANN: Sure.

14 MR. MACKKEY: Jeff Mackey for the  
15 petition section.

16 So we received 233 candidate local  
17 option petition filings and 34 statewide petitions  
18 from the Secretary of State's office. Validated  
19 18,042 signatures so far because those don't --  
20 actually, they do include, but we are not going to  
21 today address the legislative candidates for state  
22 senate committee petitions. So we didn't check  
23 those yet.

24 DIRECTOR WHITE: Or Congressional.

25 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Or state --

1 MR. MACKKEY: Right.

2 But for today we found that 151  
3 candidates submitted -- well, no. That's still  
4 150. Yeah, 151 candidates submitted petitions that  
5 after we reviewed them found them to be timely  
6 filed and valid and sufficient. Exhibit A before  
7 you has 149 candidates on it and you need to in  
8 your motion amend that to include Mr. Smith's if  
9 you want to do that to certify -- recommend for  
10 certification to the May 3rd primary election.  
11 Also if you'll turn to the fourth page of those, we  
12 had a small error.

13 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Page of what?

14 MR. MACKKEY: Exhibit A, all the  
15 candidates.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: To be certified?

17 MR. MACKKEY: Yep.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Page four?

19 MR. MACKKEY: Yeah.

20 Third from bottom is Christine

21 Wonski. Her name is actually Chelsea. We got the  
22 names correctly under the ballot name area, Chelsea  
23 Wonski, but keyed it wrong in the first name field.  
24 Chelsea, C-h-e-l-s-e-a, Wonski, W-o-n-s-k-i. But  
25 otherwise, those are good to go.

1                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I had heard that  
2 Lucas Denney was going to withdrawal. Did he not  
3 withdraw?

4                   MR. MACKKEY: He withdrew his  
5 petition for state central committee, but not  
6 county central committee.

7                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Excuse me.

8                   MR. MACKKEY: And Jack Etheridge did  
9 withdraw both the state central committee petition  
10 and the county central committee petition.

11                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Very helpful.

12                  MR. JAFFE: Do we want to wait on --

13                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: My question here  
14 is what are we proposing to do with Jeff Smith  
15 if -- He's on the don't recommend.

16                  DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Don't  
17 recommend presently.

18                  MR. JAFFE: We would amend Exhibit B  
19 to remove Jeff Smith, we would amend Exhibit A to  
20 add Jeff Smith, and then we would adopt.

21                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Gotcha.

22                  MR. JAFFE: I move to make those  
23 amendments.

24                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I think that's  
25 good with me. What do you think?

1 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.  
2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Is that the  
3 motion to -- Okay. Is there a second?

4 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.  
5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
6 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

7 (Vote taken.)  
8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
9 same sign.

10 (No response.)  
11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
12 carries.

13 DIRECTOR WHITE: A point of  
14 clarification. Was that a motion to amend Jeff  
15 Smith only but not to approve Exhibit A?

16 MR. JAFFE: That is correct.

17 DIRECTOR WHITE: Okay. Thank you.

18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Amending both  
19 exhibits. Okay. Then we're back --

20 MEMBER SEXTON: Back to the original  
21 Exhibit A.

22 So Mr. Chairman, I move that the  
23 Board certify to the May 3rd, 2022, primary  
24 election ballot those candidates listed on  
25 Exhibit A as amended and that these petitions were

1 filed timely and found to be valid and sufficient.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
4 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

5 (Vote taken.)

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
7 same sign.

8 (No response.)

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
10 carries.

11 Jeff, do you want to talk to the  
12 next item?

13 MR. MACKAY: So unfortunately we  
14 have four candidates who submitted petitions that  
15 were either not timely filed or found to be invalid  
16 or insufficient. We can review all of those if you  
17 would like.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: May I stop  
19 you for just a second?

20 Do we want to talk to the candidate  
21 Dana Preisse?

22 MR. MACKAY: Sorry. I skipped that.  
23 It's just another motion, if you want to go ahead  
24 and do that.

25 MR. JAFFE: Yeah.

2 MS. MARINELLI: I move that the

3 Board not certify to the May 3rd, 2022, primary

4 election ballot those candidates listed on

5 Exhibit B as amended and that these petitions were

6 found to be invalid and insufficient.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in

9 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

10 (Vote taken.)

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,

12 same sign.

13 (No response.)

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion

15 carries.

16 The next item is certification of

17 issues and local options. I'll continue to call on

18 Jeff Mackey.

19 MR. MACKEY: Exhibit C includes our

20 local options and questions and issues. There were

21 six local options filed. Two of those local

22 options had both a weekday and a Sunday sales

23 question, so there are eight total questions on the

24 ballot or recommended to be approved to the ballot.

25 They've been reviewed by staff in the prosecutor's

1 office and found to be timely filed, valid and  
2 sufficient, as well as those seven tax questions  
3 which were also reviewed by staff in the county  
4 prosecutor's office and found to be timely filed,  
5 valid and sufficient.

6 MR. JAFFE: There were no issue or  
7 option filings that were not valid and sufficient?

8 MR. MACKKEY: Correct.

9 MR. JAFFE: If there's no questions,  
10 I move that the Board certify to the May 3rd, 2022,  
11 primary election ballot those issues and local  
12 options listed on Exhibit C and that these issues  
13 and local options were filed timely and found to be  
14 valid and sufficient.

15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
17 properly moved and seconded.

18 All those in favor of the motion  
19 signify by saying aye.

20 (Vote taken.)

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: ALL opposed,  
22 same sign.

23 (No response.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
25 carries.

1                   The next item on the agenda is a  
2 Board of Elections employee wage adjustments, and  
3 I'll call on our Director.

4                   DIRECTOR WHITE: Good afternoon,  
5 Board members. For our 2022 approved personnel  
6 budget the Franklin County Board of Commissioners  
7 authorized a one-and-a-half percent increase of our  
8 budget full-time payroll for the purposes of  
9 providing wage adjustments to our full-time  
10 employees.

11                   It was left up to the appointing  
12 authority to decide how those wage adjustments  
13 would be distributed throughout the office. After  
14 consulting with the Deputy Director, we recommend  
15 the following wage adjustments, which you have  
16 before you in Exhibit D. These adjustments mostly  
17 deal with issues of wage compression as well as  
18 raising some of the salaries of our lower-paid  
19 employees.

20                   Pending any questions, I'd ask for  
21 your approval.

22                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Did you say wage  
23 compression?

24                   DIRECTOR WHITE: Yes, sir.

25                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I won't pretend I

1 know what that means.

2 DIRECTOR WHITE: So wage compression  
3 is when you've got a group of employees who are  
4 similarly paid and bunched up. And so --

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Now I understand  
6 the context. Thank you.

7 DIRECTOR WHITE: This will allow us  
8 to alleviate some of those issues.

9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I understand the  
10 context. Thank you very much.

11 MS. MARINELLO: I move that the  
12 Board approve the employee wage adjustments to  
13 those full-time Board of Elections employees listed  
14 on Exhibit D and that these wage adjustments be  
15 made retroactive to the pay period beginning  
16 December 20th, 2021.

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
19 properly moved and seconded.

20 All those in favor of the motion  
21 signify by saying aye.

22 (Vote taken.)

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
24 same sign.

25 (No response.)

1 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
2 carries.

3 The next item on the agenda is to  
4 hire three full-time employees. The first employee  
5 on the list is Joel Thomas. Joel Thomas is  
6 presently working in the Voter Services as a  
7 part-time employee. He actually ran our Early Vote  
8 Center this last election and has done a fantastic  
9 job.

10 Prior to coming here at the Board he  
11 worked as a campaign intern and team leader for  
12 Stivers and then he -- for Steve Stivers for  
13 Congress and then he worked in Steve Stivers'  
14 Congressional office. So we would like to hire him  
15 on full time at the rate of \$16.55 cents an hour  
16 and we'd like to make that retroactive to January  
17 18th, 2022.

18 DIRECTOR WHITE: And I'll say for  
19 the record Joel has been a fantastic addition to  
20 the Board. He served us well in our Early Vote  
21 Center last year and I think it would be a  
22 fantastic hire for us.

23 MR. JAFFE: Well, I will move that  
24 the Board hire Joel Thomas to serve as a full-time  
25 clerk in the Voter Services department at a rate of

1 \$16.55 an hour effective January 18, 2022.

2 MS. MARINELLO: I'll second.

3 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
4 properly moved and seconded.

5 All those in favor of the motion  
6 signify by saying aye.

7 (Vote taken.)

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
9 same sign.

10 (No response.)

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
12 carries.

13 The next item on the agenda is the  
14 hiring of Chris Walter, and I'll turn that over to  
15 our Director.

16 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.

17 Chris Walter currently serves as our  
18 part-time human resources manager. He has served  
19 in that capacity since 2020. My understanding --  
20 I've been here a little over two years. The Board  
21 has typically operated without a full-time human  
22 resources manager. And with the complexity of our  
23 workforce between our full-time, seasonal, and  
24 part-time staff, we just have the need to have a  
25 full-time human resources manager. Chris Walter

1 has been valuable to us. And you will see by his  
2 resume he has over 40 years of experience as a  
3 human resources administrator before he came to the  
4 Board in a part-time capacity. He did work for the  
5 Franklin County Board of Commissioners as a human  
6 resources administrator, as a senior human  
7 resources administrator. He's also worked in  
8 several HR roles for the State of Ohio.

9  
10 And so I'm recommending to the Board  
11 that we hire Mr. Chris Walter at a salary of \$34.50  
12 per hour retroactive to January 24th, 2022.

13 MR. SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move  
14 that the Board hire Chris Walter to serve as the  
15 Human Resource Supervisor at a rate of \$34.50 per  
16 hour, effective January 24th, 2022.

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.  
18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
19 properly moved and seconded.

20 All those in favor of the motion  
21 signify by saying aye.

22 (Vote taken.)

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
24 same sign.  
25 (No response.)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion

1 carries.

2 The next item on the agenda is to  
3 hire Tara Miller-Gnann. And I'll turn that over to  
4 Antone White, our Director.

5 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.

6 Miss Miller-Gnann currently works as  
7 a full-time employee at the Board of Elections.  
8 She serves as our customer service liaison where  
9 she manages our front reception area, she takes  
10 calls, and she manages the flow of traffic, works  
11 with security in managing packages, you know,  
12 security, and just managing visitors that come and  
13 go to the building. She's been with us in a  
14 full-time capacity since March of 2021. We now  
15 have an opportunity to place her in a new role. A  
16 long-time employee of the Board, Kim Walter,  
17 recently resigned from her position as PEO  
18 placement coordinator, and that was due to personal  
19 reasons; but during the November election of 2021,  
20 Miss Miller-Gnann worked -- I reassigned her to  
21 work temporarily in the PEO department to help  
22 cover some staffing issues that we were having.  
23 And so she found the experience to be fantastic.  
24 The staff loved her. She did a fantastic job. So  
25 now that we have an opportunity to fill this vacant

1 role as PEO placement coordinator, I'm recommending  
2 that we move Miss Tara Miller-Gnann into that role  
3 at a rate of \$18.50 per hour, effective February  
4 14th, 2022.

5 MS. MARINELLO: I move that the  
6 Board hire Tara Miller-Gnann to serve as the PEO  
7 Placement Coordinator at a rate of \$18.50 per hour,  
8 effective February 14, 2022.

9 MR. JAFFE: Second.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
11 properly moved and seconded.

12 All those in favor of the motion  
13 signify by saying aye.

14 (Vote taken.)

15 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
16 same sign.

17 (No response.)

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
19 carries.

20 The next item on the agenda is the  
21 Piedmont lease; and again, I'll turn that over to  
22 Director White.

23 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.

24 This is our standard leasing  
25 agreement with City of Columbus to lease their

1 Piedmont facility over on Piedmont Avenue for  
2 purposes of poll worker training. We've used this  
3 facility since 2019. It's I think about a 10,000  
4 foot -- 10,000 square foot space that we utilize.  
5 It has ample parking. Our poll workers have come  
6 to know this location. So this agreement will  
7 allow us to remain in that location for 2022. We  
8 have the opportunity to renew. So the contract  
9 allows us to operate in that building through May  
10 31st, with one renewal that will take us through  
11 the end of the General Election if we chose to  
12 exercise, which we will when the time is right.

13 I will advise the Board, though,  
14 that this will potentially be the last year we'll  
15 be able to use that facility, as the City of  
16 Columbus is looking to repurpose that building.  
17 And so we will need to find a new facility for the  
18 purposes of poll worker training. I've been in  
19 contact with county administration to talk about  
20 what those options look like. And so once the  
21 Deputy Director and I have a plan, we'll present  
22 that to the Board. But for 2022 this agreement  
23 will cover our ability to train poll workers for  
24 the 2022 elections.

25 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Where is that

1 located right now? I know you just said it.

2 DIRECTOR WHITE: It's off of Maize  
3 Road over by I-71. It's about a seven or  
4 eight-minute drive from here, which is another  
5 reason why we like the facility is because it's so  
6 conveniently located to our building.

7 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay.

8 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the  
9 Board approve the lease agreement to rent the  
10 building space at 750 Piedmont Avenue for \$15,000.  
11 This space will be used for the training of poll  
12 workers for the upcoming May primary. The lease  
13 agreement commences January 1, 2022, and ends at  
14 midnight on May 31st, 2022.

15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All those in  
17 favor of the motion signify by saying aye.

18 (Vote taken.)

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
20 same sign.

21 (No response.)

22 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
23 carries.

24 The next item on the agenda is the

25 ES&S full ballot stock purchase. And I'll ask Matt

1 Kelly to address that issue. Thank you.

2 MR. KELLY: Good afternoon. Matt  
3 Kelly, Absentee Department.

4 On recommendation from the Secretary  
5 of State's office to double check and triple check  
6 our supply chain items that we order for each  
7 election they recommended that we not only just  
8 check the supply chain to see what we have in  
9 inventory but to start ordering early.

10 So to that note, we looked at our  
11 ballot stock and we have currently about 320 pieces  
12 of the large 14-inch ballot stock with the  
13 one-and-a-half inch stub.

14 DIRECTOR WHITE: 320,000?

15 MR. KELLY: 320,000, yes.

16 Which would get us through this  
17 primary election. So we contacted ES&S and ordered  
18 another half million to get us through the entire  
19 year. Now, looking at -- even if we had three  
20 elections, a special election in August, that  
21 should cover that election. If we have another  
22 primary election we would use more ballot stock,  
23 but this purchase will get us current to where we  
24 need to be for all of 2022 unless there is some  
25 sort of surprise with another primary election.

1                   So I ask for your approval of this  
2 purchase to get us current with all of our ballot  
3 stock for this election year.

4                   MEMBER SEXTON: I move that the  
5 Board authorize the purchase of 500,000 sheets of  
6 full-size ballot stock from ESSs in the amount of  
7 \$50,000 for use in the upcoming May primary  
8 election.

9                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I will second.

10                  DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
11 properly moved and seconded.

12                   All those in favor of the motion  
13 signify by saying aye.

14                   (Vote taken.)

15                  DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
16 same sign.

17                   (No response.)

18                  DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
19 carries.

20                   Matt, do you want to talk about the  
21 ballot stock for markers?

22                  MR. KELLY: Sure. That's what Carla  
23 will be ordering. Same principle, we checked our  
24 supply chain and we were good in some areas and in  
25 this area we also needed to boost our supply of the

1 thermal ballot cards that we use in the express  
2 voting machines. I don't have it in front of me  
3 what Carla ordered.

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: One million  
5 sheets.

6 MR. KELLY: A million sheets of  
7 paper. Okay.

8 So she contacted ESS&S and they had  
9 those in stock, and she's asking for your approval  
10 for those ballot cards for the remainder of this  
11 election year.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Sounds all right.

13 MEMBER JAFFE: I move that the Board  
14 authorize the purchase of one million sheets of  
15 ballot cards for the ballot markers from ESS&S in  
16 the amount of \$123,000 for use in the upcoming May  
17 primary election.

18 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
20 properly moved and seconded.

21 All those in favor of the motion  
22 signify by saying aye.

23 (Vote taken.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
25 same sign.

1 (No response.)

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
3 carries.

4 The next item --

5 And Matt, if you want to just stay  
6 up there for just a second.

7 MR. KELLY: I'm spending all the  
8 money today.

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: First I'm  
10 going to ask Antone to speak to the ESSs upgrade of  
11 the election management system.

12 DIRECTOR WHITE: Good afternoon,  
13 again.

14 So we have before you an upgrade of  
15 our ESSs voter equipment. Our voter equipment, so  
16 our ballot markers, our ballot counters, and our  
17 ballot tabulators, are due for far more upgrades  
18 for 2022. The firmware upgrades will install new  
19 operating systems on this equipment which will  
20 include security protection. In addition, the  
21 firmware upgrades will also give us better ballot  
22 layout abilities for all of our voting ballot  
23 markers. So, for example, it will allow for  
24 multiple races to be displayed on a single page on  
25 the machine as well as the ability to show the full

1 ballot language for lengthy issues that appear on  
2 the ballot rather than having to scroll through  
3 pages. So today if you have a lengthy issue you  
4 have to scroll through multiple pages in order to  
5 read the entire issue. This upgrade will allow it  
6 on one page.

7 MEMBER MARINELLO: Will the writing  
8 be big enough to see?

9 DIRECTOR WHITE: Yes. It's part of  
10 the design in the firmware upgrade. And it will be  
11 fully tested. So once we approve this, we'll  
12 schedule ES&S to come in and to conduct that  
13 upgrade which at the same time they will do the  
14 testing of the equipment for our upcoming election.  
15 So it won't be available for the May election, but  
16 it will be available for subsequent elections if we  
17 have a special and it will be ready for November.

18 MEMBER JAFFE: Are we talking about  
19 like scrolling down on a single long page instead  
20 of moving through --

21 DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah. That's  
22 essentially what it does.

23 MR. JAFFE: Okay.

24 DIRECTOR WHITE: And then also as  
25 part of this invoice we'll be upgrading our

1 computer systems and servers that are associated  
2 with our voting equipment.

3 MEMBER MARINELLO: I move that the  
4 Board authorize the purchase of an upgrade of the  
5 Election Management System including new computer  
6 equipment, upgraded operating system, upgraded  
7 ElectionWare software, firmware upgrade, and  
8 battery replacement in all voting equipment in the  
9 amount of \$185,498.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Second.

11 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
12 properly moved and seconded.

13 All those in favor of the motion  
14 signify by saying aye.

15 (Vote taken.)

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
17 same sign.

18 (No response.)

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
20 carries.

21 The next item on the agenda is the  
22 purchase of envelopes from Envelope Solutions.  
23 Matt Kelly?

24 MR. KELLY: Sure.

25 So this is the last piece to getting

1 all of our inventory up to where we need it to be.  
2 That has been the most challenging one. There is a  
3 shortage of certain types of paper right now. We  
4 need to order around 200,000 of the three different  
5 envelopes we use for mail-in ballots. You have the  
6 external envelope that has the blue stripe down the  
7 side, the internal or the return envelope where the  
8 voter sends the envelope back in to the Board of  
9 Elections, and then the voter ID envelope which is  
10 the yellow highlighted envelope where voters fill  
11 in their information so we can verify that they're  
12 who they say they are. So these three envelopes,  
13 we have a vendor. We use Envelope Solutions. And  
14 they can get us 75,000 envelopes to get us started,  
15 but we will have to come back and order another  
16 125,000 envelopes for the General Election; but the  
17 75,000 plus the 130,000 we currently have in stock  
18 will give us plenty of envelopes for this primary  
19 and should there be another primary added it will  
20 get us to that place that we need to be until we  
21 can place that second order.

22           So it has been a challenge, but we  
23 ask for your approval to get us to where we need to  
24 be for this primary and hopefully where we need to  
25 be for the General.

1 MEMBER MARINELLO: Do they know to  
2 hold on to those when they get more in?

3 MR. KELLY: Yes. It's been a dance  
4 with just getting a quote from these folks.  
5 Because they have to call their paper vendor, and  
6 if the paper vendors can't fulfill what they need  
7 to construct the envelopes we can run into a big  
8 delay. So they're well aware that we may have  
9 another need of 125,000.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Matt, I  
11 think maybe the motion will include -- rather than  
12 the amount, it says 75 cases of each. Is that  
13 correct?

14 MR. KELLY: Yes.

15 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move  
16 that the Board authorize the purchase of 75,000  
17 carrier envelopes, 75,000 inbound/reply envelopes,  
18 and 75,000 of ballot ID envelopes from Envelope  
19 Solutions in the amount of \$23,366.25 for use in  
20 the upcoming May primary election.

21 MR. JAFFE: Second.

22 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
23 properly moved and seconded.

24 All those in favor of the motion  
25 signify by saying aye.

1 (Vote taken.)

2 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: ALL opposed,  
3 same sign.

4 (No response.)

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
6 carries.

7 The next item on the agenda is to  
8 amend and clarify the health and benefits program.

9 And I'll turn that over to Antone White, our  
10 Director.

11 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.

12 As part of your packet you have an  
13 amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement for  
14 the Franklin County Cooperative Health Benefits  
15 Program. This is a program that the Board entered  
16 into with the Franklin County Board of  
17 Commissioners on April 1st, 2012. And this  
18 agreement essentially allows the Board of Elections  
19 to participate in the health benefits program so  
20 that we can provide benefits to the employees of  
21 the Board. This amendment to that agreement was  
22 sent out and asked to be adopted by all the county  
23 offices who participate in this program. The  
24 agreement -- or the amendment to the agreement  
25 essentially covers three items. One, the agreement

1 is intended -- was never intended to permit a  
2 reimbursement or a refund of any previously paid  
3 premiums or any reserves to a member upon a  
4 member's voluntary withdrawal from the Cooperative.  
5 So this amendment clarifies that language. It also  
6 clarifies that the program administrator may at its  
7 sole discretion modify the type of and options for  
8 health insurance benefits offered under the  
9 program. And three, it also reflects the updated  
10 name of the program.

11 So that's what the amendment is that  
12 we put before you today, and we ask for your  
13 approval to adopt that amendment.

14 MR. JAFFE: Are they seeking these  
15 changes because somebody was seeking reimbursements  
16 on premiums after withdrawing from the program?

17 DIRECTOR WHITE: I think that's my  
18 understanding.

19 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: In a  
20 different county. I think it's Fairfield County.

21 MR. JAFFE: Not somebody at the  
22 Board?

23 DIRECTOR WHITE: No, no. Yeah.

24 This is program wide.

25 MS. HUMMER: It's a countywide

1 program and there are other local governments that  
2 participate in it. And the entire program was  
3 meant to be in the manner that is in front of you.  
4 This is more of a clarification, not a new element.  
5 But because of the requests that had come forward  
6 through another entity we wanted to be clear this  
7 is how the program was set up and putting it in  
8 plain language.

9 MR. JAFFE: If there are no other  
10 questions, I move that the Board adopt the  
11 amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement  
12 for the Franklin County Cooperative Health Benefits  
13 program to better reflect the intent of the  
14 program.

15 MEMBER MARINELLO: I second.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
17 properly moved and seconded.

18 All those in favor of the motion  
19 signify by saying aye.

20 (Vote taken.)

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All opposed,  
22 same sign.

23 (No response.)

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Motion  
25 carries.

1 I don't show any other items to come  
2 before the Board.

3 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.

4 MEMBER MARINELLO: Second.

5 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We're  
6 adjourned.
