DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: All right.

I would just remind everybody before they speak if they could state their name so our court reporter can get the right comments to the -- treated to the right person.

I will call roll.

Kim Marinello.

MEMBER MARINELLO: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Mike Sexton.

COMMISSIONER SEXTON: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Doug

Preisse.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Josh

Jaffe.

MEMBER JAFFE: Here.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We have a quorum.

The first item on the agenda is the approval of the minutes from the September 6, 2022 Board meeting. I think Erin sent out all of the minutes. If there are any additions or deletions

1 or corrections?

2 MEMBER JAFFE: Hearing none, this is  
3 Josh Jaffe. I move the Board approve the minutes  
4 from the September 6, 2022 meeting of the Franklin  
5 County Board of Elections as submitted.

6 MEMBER MARINELLO: Kim Marinello,  
7 second.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
9 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
10 the motion signify by saying aye.

11 All opposed, same sign.

12 Motion carries.

13 (Vote taken; motion passed)

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on  
15 the agenda is the purchase of a barrier wall  
16 outside of the Early Vote Center. And I will turn  
17 that over to Matt Kelly, who's the manager of our  
18 absentee department.

19 Thanks, Matt.

20 MR. KELLY: Thank you.

21 Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman,  
22 members of the Board.

23 Actually, this is a request for  
24 rental of a barrier wall. We are not purchasing  
25 it. We are renting the barrier wall for an

1 extended period of time that covers the early  
2 voting period. We are asking for approval of  
3 \$10,694. And that would cover these orange barrier  
4 walls that we used in the 2020 election, kind of to  
5 serve a number of purposes. It literally is voter  
6 protection, because we are protecting the voters  
7 who are standing in line waiting for the Early Vote  
8 Center line to go down. And it serves as a visual  
9 barrier so people know where to line up around the  
10 building. We anticipate a large crowd this early  
11 voting period, especially during those last two  
12 weeks. If you remember in 2020 we had a line that  
13 wrapped all the way around the building. This  
14 barrier that we're renting would be 500 plus feet,  
15 just a little bit over 500 feet. That would cover  
16 barrier all the way around the front of the Early  
17 Vote Center, in front of the main entrance here,  
18 the Papa Johns and Sam Ash, and just around the  
19 corner to where HomeBuys starts. So the 500 feet  
20 that we measured out would gives us plenty of  
21 protection for those areas that are the most  
22 vulnerable areas for people standing in line.

23 We've met with our Homeland Security  
24 team and partners. We do that every election  
25 cycle. And they suggested we purchase or rent a

1 barrier wall to help with all of these safety  
2 measures. So we are also including with this  
3 \$10,694 some other protection measures, including  
4 where we have gaps in the barrier wall, some bike  
5 racks that we set up to kind of control the traffic  
6 flow of our voters in line, and we've added some  
7 parking or speed bumps, temporary speed bumps to  
8 the \$10,694. That would help control traffic,  
9 especially right in front of the Early Vote Center  
10 entrance and exit. There tend to be a lot of  
11 people just driving very quickly in our parking  
12 lot. So we thought the temporary speed bumps would  
13 also serve the purpose.

14 So with that, I ask for your  
15 approval of these --

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: These things are  
17 filled with water?

18 MR. KELLY: Yes.

19 Paul Peterson Company will install  
20 them, which in fact means coming out and placing  
21 all of the barriers and then having a water truck  
22 follow and filling up each barrier as they're  
23 connected.

24 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: We used them in  
25 2020?

1 MR. KELLY: We did, yes.

2 MEMBER JAFFE: Josh Jaffe. So this  
3 extends sort of to the end of the sidewalk and then  
4 it's parking lot from there on out; is that right?

5 MR. KELLY: It extends -- it mimics  
6 the sidewalk. So it's just off the sidewalk and  
7 it, again, protects our voters from themselves,  
8 going into the parking lot or trying to stand in  
9 line in the parking lot. And it helps us just  
10 control the line as well.

11 MEMBER JAFFE: I remember in 2020 we  
12 had the line actually go all the way around behind  
13 the building. In '18, last gubernatorial, did we  
14 have lines that long?

15 MR. KELLY: In the last  
16 gubernatorial, I was not here. So I don't recall  
17 exactly how far the lines went, but I believe --

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: They were  
19 not that long. But they were well --

20 MEMBER JAFFE: Past.

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yeah.

22 MEMBER JAFFE: Okay. Another  
23 question. There's a space that -- we have  
24 candidates in the parking lot, too, trying to talk  
25 to the voters in line. Are the barriers far enough



1 away that candidates can be 10 feet away from the  
2 line or are the candidates going to be traffic?

3 MR. KELLY: Well, the candidates are  
4 allowed to approach the voters if the voters engage  
5 the candidates to come forward and give them  
6 something. And surprisingly enough, the barrier  
7 does kind of fit that ten feet range. So it does  
8 help with that as well.

9 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Does that mean  
10 the candidates are in the parking lot?

11 MR. KELLY: The candidates are all  
12 over the place.

13 MEMBER JAFFE: They can't be inside  
14 of the barrier because --

15 MR. KELLY: Right. If they were  
16 inside of the barrier wall they would be within 10  
17 feet.

18 DIRECTOR WHITE: The barrier wall  
19 extends beyond the 100-foot campaigning line that  
20 we have painted out in the parking lot. So really  
21 it's nice to have that because it does act as a way  
22 to separate the campaigning from the voter, right.  
23 And so that creates that 10-foot barrier.

24 MEMBER JAFFE: We should encourage  
25 candidates and volunteers to watch out for traffic.

1 MR. KELLY: Yes, we always do.

2 Other questions?

3 MEMBER JAFFE: Okay. Well, this is  
4 Josh Jaffe, I will move that the Board rent a water  
5 barrier wall from the Paul Peterson Company in the  
6 amount of \$10,694 to protect the voters lined up at  
7 the Early Vote Center.

8 MEMBER SEXTON: Michael Sexton, I'll  
9 second.

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
11 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
12 the motion signify by saying aye.

13 All opposed, same sign.

14 Motion carries.

15 (Vote taken; motion passed)

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on  
17 the agenda is the Polling Location Notification  
18 Cards. I will turn that over to Antone White, our  
19 Director, to give a brief explanation of that.

20 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, David.

21 Good afternoon. I believe it was  
22 the June 8th Board meeting, I was not present, I  
23 was on vacation, but I believe there was some  
24 discussion at that meeting about polling locations,  
25 particularly for our August 2nd Primary election.

1 We had to close a number of polling locations  
2 because of the unexpected August Primary. We had  
3 to close a number of locations just for logistical  
4 reasons. A lot of them were not available for  
5 August. And so we closed, I think, approximately  
6 half of our locations for the August election. And  
7 I believe there was some conversation by the Board  
8 during that June meeting that we should notify all  
9 of our voters in the county for the November  
10 election, notify of them of their polling location  
11 as a reminder to cut down on confusion for Election  
12 Day for the November election. So we were tasked  
13 with trying to come up with an outreach piece to  
14 notify voters of their polling location. So what  
15 we did was our staff came up with this piece here,  
16 it should be in your packet, the Polling Location  
17 Notification Card. And it should be --

18 MS. GIBBONS: It's at the end of the  
19 back of the second tab.

20 DIRECTOR WHITE: And so this  
21 notification will be sent out to 660,000 registered  
22 voting households in the county. We chose  
23 households instead of actual registered voters to  
24 cut down on costs. So this notification will alert  
25 every voter, registered household of their polling

1 location for the November election.

2 But in addition to that, we took the  
3 opportunity to also remind our voters of some other  
4 critical information. So we took the opportunity  
5 to remind them of how they can vote by mail, Early  
6 Vote Center hours for the upcoming election. We  
7 took the opportunity to remind them about proper  
8 voter identification, which helps cut down on  
9 provisional ballots, which I know our voter  
10 services departments appreciates. And we also took  
11 the opportunity to promote being a poll worker. So  
12 there's a QR code on this piece that we sent out  
13 that can be scanned, and it takes you to where you  
14 can sign up to be a poll worker. So this will go  
15 out to 660,000 registered households in the county.  
16 We are asking for the approval of \$66,005 for the  
17 printing of the formal location notification cards,  
18 with CPMM Services.

19 And I want to thank Gretchen James,  
20 who is our Community Affairs Manager, who led this  
21 project and effort.

22 Gretchen, I don't know if you have  
23 anything you want to add.

24 MS. JAMES: Director, Mr. Chairman,  
25 Members of the Board, I believe Director White

1 pretty much summed it up perfectly. This piece,  
2 the only thing I would add is that it is going out  
3 to our voters as we speak. And today we have  
4 mailed 211,977 pieces.

5 So thank you.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Gretchen, if  
7 I may. That piece is eight and a half -- not eight  
8 and a half by eleven, but eight and a half by five  
9 and a half. I mean, I think what they are looking  
10 at, it's actually not folded, but it's a card  
11 stock. It would be printed on front and back.

12 MEMBER JAFFE: That probably answers  
13 my question, but I'll ask it anyway. I don't see  
14 any space on here to tell them their polling  
15 location. Is that --

16 DIRECTOR WHITE: I'm sorry. What is  
17 in your packet may not be representative of the  
18 full piece. It's a front and back piece. So the  
19 front piece has the voter's address and next to it  
20 has their polling location here. And so this piece  
21 folds like this, and then you put tabs across, and  
22 this is what gets sent to the voters.

23 MEMBER JAFFE: A poll worker's  
24 message, too.

25 DIRECTOR WHITE: Sorry about that.

1                   We always want to take the  
2 opportunity to recruit for poll workers.

3                   MEMBER JAFFE: How many polling  
4 locations did we change for this election compared  
5 to May?

6                   DIRECTOR WHITE: So, yeah, in May we  
7 had 320. So for this election, we will have 309.  
8 So for every election we always have some changes  
9 for one reason or another. And I think there were  
10 11 locations for this election that became  
11 unavailable for various reasons, construction,  
12 parking issues, we do an assessment of ADA, to  
13 ensure all of these locations are ADA compliant.  
14 And sometimes, for whatever reason, they do not  
15 become ADA compliant; so we make a change. We've  
16 had to consolidate a couple locations. So between  
17 May we had 320, for November we will have 309. So  
18 this is even more of a reason why we should send  
19 this out so that everyone knows what their correct  
20 location is come November 8th.

21                   MEMBER JAFFE: Right. Particularly,  
22 because we changed it for August pretty  
23 significantly.

24                   DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah.

25                   MR. SEXTON: Seeing no other

1 questions -- you guys did some great work and I  
2 think it will help with a lot of the confusion we  
3 had from the second Primary to June because a lot  
4 of people consolidated and moved around; so this  
5 will tell them not only they are registered to vote  
6 but obviously all of the other information that  
7 goes along with it. So I think this is a great  
8 toolkit.

9                   So Michael Sexton, I move that the  
10 Board authorize the printing of 666,052 Polling  
11 Location Notification Cards from the CPMM Services  
12 Group in the amount of \$66,005.

13                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,  
14 second the motion.

15                   DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
16 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
17 the motion signify by saying aye.

18                   All opposed, same sign.

19                   Motion carries.

20                   (Vote taken; motion passed)

21                   DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I will call  
22 on Matt Kelly again. The next item on the agenda  
23 is the hiring of Early Vote Center managers.

24                   Matt.

25                   MR. KELLY: Thank you.





1 at a daily rate of pay set by the Board. And the  
2 Board usually sets that period for their management  
3 from 32 to 35 days. This election season we have  
4 some unique challenges, we are anticipating a  
5 higher number of voters at early vote than we had  
6 in 2018. You take into consideration population  
7 growth, more voter registrations, and just the  
8 overall popularity increasing of people voting  
9 early. So we're anticipating anywhere from 62 to  
10 68,000 potential early voters this time. Couple  
11 that with an extended ballot in the city of  
12 Columbus with, I believe, five bond issues, and I  
13 don't know how many charter amendments they have,  
14 three charter agreements, the ballot length has now  
15 extended to four sheets -- or I'm sorry,  
16 four-sided, two sheets. So we know that it will  
17 take voters a little bit longer this time around to  
18 go through their ballot, especially ones that read  
19 everything on the ballot. We normally have a  
20 ballot that takes around seven and a half minutes  
21 in a Presidential year if everybody votes  
22 everything on the ballot. With this lengthy ballot  
23 and lengthy issues on the ballot, we anticipate  
24 that may increase to eight or nine minutes per  
25 person, depending on how quickly they read. So

1 with all of those challenges in place, we found it  
2 necessary to look at our managers to do a number of  
3 things. We think we will have more training with  
4 our machine judges, who will probably be engaged  
5 with voters who have questions about the issues and  
6 how to vote through those issues on the ballot. So  
7 we wanted to extend the usual 32 to 35 days that  
8 you would hire managers for the Early Vote Center,  
9 we would like to extend that to 40 days. Because  
10 we need to work in a week's worth of training and a  
11 week's worth of early vote setup, because we have  
12 to add some more machines up there to accommodate  
13 all of the voters we anticipate. So we propose the  
14 hiring of a Democrat and Republican manager.

15                   The Democrat manager, Nasir, if  
16 you'd stand up.

17                   Nasir Abdullah. He has served with  
18 the Early Vote Center since 2020. He took on that  
19 responsibility as an actual management or lead  
20 seasonal employee in the Early Vote Center the past  
21 few elections. Especially, in the May '22 Primary.  
22 He has a strong working knowledge of the entire  
23 Early Vote Center operation, and has experience  
24 with opening and closing procedures, as well as the  
25 day-to-day audit procedures. So the Early Vote

1 Center can continue to operate as part of the  
2 absentee division and be in good hands. We  
3 recommend the appointment of Nasir as our  
4 Democratic manager.

5 On the Republican side, Julie Kyle.  
6 And Julie, she serves in voter services as a  
7 seasonal employee. And she's been at the Board of  
8 Elections since 2016 in several different roles,  
9 including as an absentee seasonal employee. And as  
10 I said, currently serve a key role in voter  
11 services. She's one of those staff members you can  
12 go to and ask her to find all of the permanent  
13 detail on a voter, and she'll even dive into the  
14 microfiche files, if needed, to find what we need  
15 to find. So we recommend Julie as the Republican  
16 manager for the Early Vote Center.

17 And we recommend that both managers  
18 be paid at the rate of \$312.50 a day, and not to  
19 exceed 40 days.

20 MEMBER JAFFE: I have one question.

21 MR. KELLY: Sure.

22 MEMBER JAFFE: Can the Voter  
23 Services Department survive without Julie?

24 MR. KELLY: They're always calling  
25 her. She's been pivoting back and forth the last

1 couple days. But we are confident we can keep her  
2 up at the Early Vote Center, and only release her  
3 back to voter services as needed.

4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Good question and  
5 good answer.

6 MS. MARINELLO: I move that the  
7 Board hire Nasir Abdullah as the Democratic manager  
8 of the Early Vote Center, and Julie Kyle as the  
9 Republican manager of the Early Vote Center at a  
10 rate of 312.50 per day, and a total not to exceed  
11 40 days, total 12,500.

12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,  
13 second the motion.

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
15 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
16 the motion signify by saying aye.

17 All opposed, same sign.

18 Motion carries.

19 (Vote taken; motion passed)

20 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on  
21 the agenda is the employee shuttle service. And I  
22 will turn that over to our Director, Antone White.

23 DIRECTOR WHITE: Good afternoon  
24 again.

25 This is a purchase request for

1 \$12,069.20 for transportation services for Columbus  
2 Coach. And this is to shuttle our Board of  
3 Elections employees to off-site employee parking  
4 between October 24th and November 7th. So that is  
5 the last two weeks of early vote. So as our  
6 manager Matt Kelly indicated earlier, we expect  
7 that in the ramp-up to early vote will be busy in  
8 the last couple weeks of early vote. And so to  
9 help with traffic congestion here, similar to what  
10 we did in 2020, we will ask that our employees,  
11 Board of Election employees park off site. So we  
12 have secured a parking lot across the street over  
13 at Ascension Lutheran Church, right next to Chase  
14 Bank. They also serve as an election day polling  
15 location. They have a very large parking lot in  
16 back. So we will pay a small fee to the church to  
17 utilize their parking lot. And we can shuttle  
18 employees back and forth for the last two weeks of  
19 early vote. That takes approximately 150 to 175  
20 cars off of this parking lot. And it frees up  
21 additional space for voters for all of the campaign  
22 volunteers, all of the people that will come up  
23 here to early vote during that time period. That's  
24 just one small piece of what we do to try to  
25 minimize traffic congestion up here.

1           So in addition to that, we also  
2     implement the Early Vote Center parking policy,  
3     which this Board adopted in 2019. And part of that  
4     parking policy states that campaign workers who are  
5     coming to engage voters, come to the Early Vote  
6     Center not park their cars in front of the Early  
7     Vote Center. We ask that they park in other areas  
8     around the complex that are not directly in front  
9     of the Early Vote Center. We had some  
10    correspondence go out to all of the campaigns and  
11    candidates. I think it went out, Gretchen, Friday.  
12    It went out this past Friday.

13           In addition to that, we will also  
14    have our ballot tent, drop-off ballot tent. We  
15    will have trained bipartisan staff who will accept  
16    absentee ballots for voters who wish to drop off  
17    their ballot in a secured ballot box. So that way  
18    they don't have to park, get out of the car, and  
19    walk the ballot up. They can just drive up, drop  
20    it off to a bipartisan team. In addition to that,  
21    we will have electronic billboards up here.

22           So we do a number of things up here  
23    to sort of minimize traffic congestion during very  
24    busiest time of our early vote period. So this  
25    shuttle service is one piece of that.

1                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Does this cover  
2 weekends?

3                   DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, weekends that  
4 we are open for voting. If we are not open for  
5 voting, employees can park here who are working on  
6 the weekend. But when the Early Vote Center is  
7 open, we ask our employees to park off site.

8                   MEMBER JAFFE: I remember seeing a  
9 map of the parking areas and like approved, not  
10 approved for candidates. I assume that's what we  
11 sent out to them. Can I have that? Because they  
12 ask me for that sometimes.

13                  DIRECTOR WHITE: That's what we sent  
14 out. We will get you one today.

15                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse. I  
16 am comparing what may or may not be the final  
17 suggestion of the contract for Erin's explanatory  
18 timing, but it looks like maybe there's some  
19 purposeful thinking going on here that the shuttle  
20 service may stop before early voting ends or at the  
21 same time?

22                  DIRECTOR WHITE: It will stop that  
23 Monday. So run from October 24th through Monday,  
24 the 7th.

25                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: What I'm saying

1 is as I look at this document, our lovely voting at  
2 the Board of Elections, for instance, weekdays  
3 October 31 to 4.

4 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The first  
5 week, right, we are not having shuttles?

6 DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, the first  
7 couple weeks we are not having shuttle service.  
8 We're not asking employees to park off site,  
9 because we don't anticipate the volume will be such  
10 we need to do that.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Oh, I see. I  
12 think I was looking at it wrong.

13 So October 31 to November 4, two  
14 shuttles ending at 8:00 p.m. because voting ends at  
15 7:00 p.m.

16 DIRECTOR WHITE: Right. So what we  
17 do is for some of our later staff, early vote  
18 staff, we run the shuttle a little later so they  
19 have an opportunity --

20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I understand.  
21 Thank you.

22 DIRECTOR WHITE: Yep.

23 MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,  
24 Michael Sexton. I move the Board of Elections  
25 contract with Columbus Coach to provide shuttle



1 service in the amount of \$12,069.20 to shuttle  
2 Board of Elections employees from October 24th  
3 through November 7th, except for the days during  
4 this period when the Early Vote Center is closed.

5 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,  
6 second the motion.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
8 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
9 the motion signify by saying aye.

10 All opposed, same sign.

11 Motion carries.

12 (Vote taken; motion passed)

13 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next  
14 item on the agenda is the employee healthcare  
15 contribution. And I will turn that over to our HR  
16 manager, Chris Walter.

17 MR. WALTER: Good afternoon, Board  
18 Members. My name is Chris Walter, I'm the Human  
19 Resources Manager.

20 What you have in front of you is for  
21 calendar year 2023, the Board of Commissioners  
22 bi-weekly contribution health rate for health  
23 insurance for its employees. The single rate will  
24 increase from \$75 to \$81 per pay. And the family  
25 and domestic partner rate will increase from \$167

1 even to \$180.50 per pay. I recommend that we  
2 accept the Board of Commissioners rate agreement  
3 and request Board approval.

4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Questions  
5 anybody?

6 MEMBER MARINELLO: No questions.  
7 Mr. Chairman, I move the Board approve the employee  
8 healthcare contribution rates as listed and  
9 described in Exhibit C.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,  
11 second the motion.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
13 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
14 the motion signify by saying aye.

15 All opposed, same sign.

16 Motion carries.

17 (Vote taken; motion passed)

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: The next  
19 item on the agenda is the retention incentive. And  
20 I will turn that over to Antone White.

21 DIRECTOR WHITE: I'm back.

22 So on September 13th, the Board of  
23 Commissioners announced a retention incentive  
24 program. And this program they announced is to  
25 recognize the work of all county employees that

1 worked during the COVID-19 pandemic and that chose  
2 to stay employed with the county during that time.  
3 And so this retention program will provide a  
4 one-time payment of \$1,000 to eligible employees.  
5 Eligibility is defined by employees who were  
6 employed with the county as of July 1, 2021, and  
7 had continuous employment during that time and up  
8 until October 21, 2022, when that payment would be  
9 made. So we would have to opt into that program in  
10 order to be eligible to receive those one-time  
11 payments.

12 We worked with the county  
13 administration, their budget -- budget director and  
14 we were able to determine that we have 47 full-time  
15 employees and 64 seasonal employees who are  
16 eligible for that incentive, should we choose to  
17 opt into that program.

18 The way we defined continuous  
19 employment for seasonal employees was pretty much  
20 the same as full-time employee, you had to be  
21 employed by July 1, 2021, but you also had to work  
22 four consecutive elections. So during that time  
23 period between July 1, 2021 and October 21, 2022,  
24 we had four elections; so if you worked four  
25 continuous elections during that time frame, you

1 were eligible for that incentive.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse. As  
3 a seasonal?

4 DIRECTOR WHITE: As a full-time  
5 employee.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: If you are  
7 full-time, even if you have only been here a month  
8 you are eligible.

9 DIRECTOR WHITE: No. If you weren't  
10 employed with the county by July 1, 2021.

11 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: 2021. Okay.

12 DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah. The  
13 eligibility period was July 1, 2021 through the  
14 time the payment would be made, which is  
15 October 21, 2022.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: For either  
17 seasonal or full-time?

18 DIRECTOR WHITE: Correct.

19 Did I myself anything with that,  
20 David?

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I think you  
22 covered it quite well.

23 MEMBER JAFFE: I think I saw that  
24 the funding is coming from the American Rescue  
25 Plan; is that right?

1                   DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, that's  
2 correct. So the payments for this incentive would  
3 be made through the Board of Commissioners, which  
4 is a part, and they get the money from the  
5 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, which is  
6 through the American Rescue Plan.

7                   MEMBER JAFFE: I had another  
8 question. Our opportunity here today is to either  
9 opt-in to the Commissioners plan or not?

10                  DIRECTOR WHITE: Correct. We had  
11 to -- we had to tell the Commissioners if our  
12 agency wanted to opt-in. We opted in, because it  
13 was a date before this board meeting was set,  
14 pending Board action.

15                  CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I'm guessing all  
16 agencies are opting in.

17                  DIRECTOR WHITE: That's correct. I  
18 think it's a total of approximately 5,000 county  
19 employees are eligible for this.

20                  DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: 40 some  
21 agencies.

22                  DIRECTOR WHITE: 40 some agencies,  
23 yeah, across the footprint.

24                  MEMBER SEXTON: Mr. Chairman,  
25 Michael Sexton, I move the Board of Elections

1 opt-in for the one-time payment of \$1,000 offered  
2 to eligible employees by the Board of County  
3 Commissioners using the Coronavirus Local Fiscal  
4 Recovery Fund authorized by the American Rescue  
5 Plan.

6 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,  
7 second the motion.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been  
9 properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of  
10 the motion signify by saying aye.

11 All opposed, same sign.

12 Motion carries.

13 (Vote taken; motion passed)

14 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Next item on  
15 the agenda is a discussion of the employee  
16 compensation. It's possible the Board may want to  
17 go into executive session to listen to that study.  
18 We do have a voter, Franklin County voter that  
19 filled out a speaker form. I don't know if we want  
20 to address that now or how we want to approach  
21 that. Karen Rankin.

22 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, if she's  
23 been waiting why not take care of that now so you  
24 don't have to wait any longer.

25 I would like to say at the outset,

1 welcome. We don't normally handle public hearings  
2 because that's not our job, unless it's pertinent  
3 to something before us and we are investigating and  
4 having witnesses and evidence come in. However, as  
5 long as I have been around, we've liked to lean  
6 towards an open policy, if members of the public  
7 which appear, ask questions or make brief comments.  
8 We ask you to make your comments to the point and  
9 brief. And if you have a question or two, we can  
10 go there. If that's not satisfactory to you, we  
11 can, of course, have other meetings and staff  
12 availability to you and exposure to whatever  
13 information.

14 MS. HUMMER: Chairman, if I may also  
15 add to those comments. And so that the public is  
16 clear, part of the reason this is not normally done  
17 is that when there's going to be public  
18 participation or comments we like to make sure that  
19 is properly on the agenda so those interested can  
20 be in attendance and able to respond to those  
21 comments. Since that wasn't done, it's -- that is  
22 the exception. So I just want to make sure we are  
23 all clear that part of the reason we do not  
24 normally do that is really to be transparent to the  
25 public at large so they are here to respond.

1                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And with proper  
2 notice, that kind of thing. Okay. Great.

3                   MS. RANKIN: Just want to know if  
4 I'm allowed to say I called earlier to talk to  
5 someone to find out what the agenda was. The  
6 person I was speaking to two times, did not know.  
7 So that means I didn't know what your agenda was  
8 today, but I submitted a question anyway.

9                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Why don't we  
10 start, could you state your name?

11                   MS. RANKIN: Karen M. Rankin.

12                   And I guess there's a formality to  
13 addressing members of the Board, Director and  
14 Director, I had a question about the election  
15 coming up about the possibilities of illegals  
16 voting. And I will be a worker at a polling place,  
17 and I just wanted to know how is that handled? If  
18 someone has a question about is that person a legal  
19 citizens? I mean, I worked the 2020 election, and  
20 a voter before she walked out the door said I  
21 thought only citizens got to vote. Because there  
22 were people of other cultures who couldn't even  
23 speak English in the room voting. And so my  
24 question is how does one find out if a potential  
25 voter coming into a polling place is a citizen?



1 And who can ask the question? And who will answer  
2 that question?

3 MEMBER JAFFE: Well, I can tell you  
4 the first answer is only citizens can register to  
5 vote in the first place. And if people aren't  
6 registered to vote on the voter rolls, then they  
7 can show up at a polling place but they won't be  
8 able to cast a ballot if they are not registered to  
9 vote. Beyond that --

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Or provisionally,  
11 then that will be checked back here before it's  
12 counted and discarded.

13 MEMBER JAFFE: Right. But beyond  
14 that, David, do you have some insight on what the  
15 particular procedures are?

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And so I  
17 will ask Sarah to correct me, if I misspeak. So on  
18 your voter registration card, it says I am --  
19 you're making an affirmation that I am at least 18  
20 years old, and that I am a citizen of the United  
21 States, and you have to check the box yes or no.  
22 If somebody checks it no, then what is our process?

23 MS. SIMBA: Our process is to send a  
24 letter to confirm -- sorry. Sarah Simba,  
25 supervisor, voter services -- send a letter to the

1 voter to ask them to confirm one more time,  
2 sometimes people check -- they don't know what they  
3 are checking, they make mistakes. So we will send  
4 them a letter. We don't process that form until we  
5 hear a response back either in the affirmative or  
6 negative that they are or are not a citizen. If  
7 they respond back and say I'm sorry, I made a  
8 mistake, I am a citizen, we will register them. If  
9 they respond back, no, I am not a citizen, we  
10 reject the application on the basis that they are  
11 not a citizen, and send them a denial notice for  
12 that.

13                   And additionally on the form, in  
14 addition to the check boxes indicating that you are  
15 or are not a citizen, the signature box as well,  
16 there's a statement down there that says I'm a  
17 citizen of the United States, I am a resident for  
18 30 days of the address listed above, I will be 18  
19 by the General election, and I sign this under  
20 penalty knowing it's a felony in the United States  
21 to sign this falsely. So they are affirming  
22 actually twice that they are a citizen, Both with a  
23 check box and their signature on the bottom of the  
24 form.

25                   MEMBER JAFFE: And then in terms of

1 double checking, they have to provide a form of ID,  
2 typically driver's license number or Social  
3 Security number. And I think there is some  
4 cross-checking through the Secretary of State once  
5 those forms of identification are provided.

6 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Yes. So  
7 occasionally we receive names from the Secretary of  
8 State, and they will ask us, because they've  
9 received information from the Bureau of Motor  
10 Vehicles or the Social Security Administration that  
11 they have questions about these particular voters.  
12 We supply them with the information, meaning the  
13 Secretary of State, with the information they are  
14 asking, which would include their voter  
15 registration.

16 MS. SIMBA: Any documents we have on  
17 file for the voter.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Correct.  
19 And then they would investigate that, and then  
20 depending on the investigation, they would turn  
21 that over to the attorney general for prosecution  
22 or for looking into it further. So does that sort  
23 of answer -- and, of course, any individual  
24 anywhere in the county, if they suspect that  
25 someone is not 18 years old, if they are not an

1 American citizen and they're attempting to register  
2 or attempting to vote, they should let us know or  
3 they should let the Secretary of State know, and we  
4 would absolutely look into that.

5 MS. RANKIN: Okay. I was just  
6 concerned because I didn't know if people were  
7 registered to vote when and if they apply for a  
8 drivers license. Are they? Do they register to  
9 vote then?

10 MS. SIMBA: You have the ability to  
11 when you go to the BMV to register to vote. But  
12 again, you're still affirming when you are there,  
13 you are affirming you are a citizen and sign again  
14 that you are. So that's on the individual if they  
15 choose to lie. It's also written on there that  
16 it's a felony.

17 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: There are various  
18 places you will find voter registration  
19 opportunities, libraries, BMVs. But it's separate,  
20 you don't get to vote just because you have a  
21 library card or a driver's license. So it's  
22 separate.

23 MS. RANKIN: Thank very much. Thank  
24 you for allowing me to speak and ask questions. I  
25 appreciate it.

1                   CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you for  
2 coming in. Thanks for your service in the upcoming  
3 election.

4                   DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you. We  
5 appreciate it.

6                   DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And Karen is  
7 an activist. I did mention to her before she came  
8 in, anytime, the staff would love to give her a  
9 tour of the Board of Elections and bring anybody  
10 that you know that has any questions. We like to  
11 show off our security and our procedures here.

12                   So thank you, Karen.

13                   The next item on the agenda is the  
14 discussion of the Employee Compensation Study. And  
15 we have Heidi Miller from Clemans Nelson here to go  
16 over that study. I don't know if there's an  
17 interest in going into executive session.

18 Oftentimes we do that, but it's not --

19                   MEMBER JAFFE: So this is a study  
20 that the county commissioners put together. Is  
21 there any confidentiality on sort of their end?

22                   MS. HUMMER: The document is a  
23 public record.

24                   MEMBER JAFFE: Okay. I feel fine  
25 with an open discussion of a public record then.

1 MS. MILLER: Heidi Miller. I am  
2 with Clemans Nelson & Associates. And that was my  
3 introduction as well, which is what I paused for  
4 anyways.

5 So I have been -- we were contracted  
6 by the Board of Commissioners to come in and  
7 essentially look at the compensation of not only  
8 the Board of Commissioners, but any office or  
9 department that chose to participate in that  
10 process. So you all were one of those offices that  
11 did that.

12 So what I brought for you all today  
13 is a draft report of essentially our findings and  
14 recommendations for the Board of Elections  
15 specifically. So what I will do is I like to  
16 provide this report simply because it helps me kind  
17 of walk through the process and allows you all to  
18 see what we did.

19 So to start on page 1. Usually when  
20 we do a compensation study, there's two parts to  
21 it, two main components. The first component being  
22 the marketing study, that is the wage survey.  
23 Essentially what we call our external equity  
24 analysis. So that's where we go out and we look at  
25 what other similar organizations are paying for

1 similar positions. So that part, what we looked  
2 at, we looked at eight counties across the state of  
3 Ohio, we also looked at two, kind of local  
4 competitors for the county, if you will. So that  
5 was Ohio State University and the State of Ohio.

6 The list of counties and some of the  
7 demographic information, such as population, median  
8 household income, that is on the following page.  
9 And that is the list of counties that we looked at  
10 in the wage survey.

11 The next page you will see all of  
12 the positions that we looked at under Board of  
13 Elections that we specifically compiled information  
14 on. When we look at that and what we are gathering  
15 is we are asking for if they have a wage range. So  
16 a minimum and a maximum. Where are these positions  
17 starting, where can they top out at, and we also  
18 ask for what employees are currently making right  
19 now in that role. For you all that was actually  
20 important because you don't currently have  
21 established ranges; so we need to really rely on  
22 that data of what employees are currently making to  
23 kind of figure out where we go from here. So

24 A summary of that information, and I  
25 will kind of show you or walk you through what that

1 is. That is on page 3 here, which I actually think  
2 the pages got numbered incorrectly, but we will say  
3 page 3. So essentially what you have is you have a  
4 list of all of the titles we looked at, we have an  
5 average for what you all are paying those employees  
6 in those positions right now, and then we have an  
7 average of the responses we got back. So an  
8 average minimum, average maximum, average current.

9           The important column for me anyways  
10 is this variance to market. So that's essentially  
11 how I can compare what are you guys paying compared  
12 to what others are paying. So if it read or if you  
13 see in that column 100 percent that means  
14 essentially what employees are making in that role  
15 is exactly what others are paying as well --

16           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Excuse me. Sorry  
17 for interrupting. Is that the comparison to other  
18 boards or --

19           MS. MILLER: Other boards of  
20 elections.

21           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: From those 88  
22 other counties?

23           MS. MILLER: Yes, yes. And that  
24 would include the State of Ohio and Ohio State  
25 where they may have had similar positions; so that



1 wouldn't have applied to all of the positions.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Okay. Thanks.

3 MS. MILLER: And then so 100 percent  
4 is market, anything below 100 percent would be  
5 below market, and then anything above 100 percent  
6 would be above what the market rate is for that  
7 job.

8 So, and then what I also did, I kind  
9 of tracked how many responded or how many gave me a  
10 response for a minimum, a maximum, a current. Just  
11 so when I'm looking at those percentages, I can  
12 make just sure things aren't skewed based on number  
13 of responses. Because not everybody is structured  
14 the same way; so they may not have a position  
15 that's exactly the same.

16 So overall, your office, if you look  
17 at it from a big picture, was just slightly below  
18 market, but it was about 98 percent on average. So  
19 not alarming. But, you know, in today's market, I  
20 would definitely say it's a little low. So any  
21 questions about that summary before I kind of go on  
22 to the next piece, which will be kind of diving  
23 into the recommendations a little bit?

24 Okay. So before recommendation  
25 another big piece of this as well was an internal

1 equity analysis. So part of this process, and kind  
2 of why -- I shouldn't say completely why the  
3 Commissioners included others, but part of it was  
4 we were trying to create some sort of alignment  
5 across the county with certain positions to ensure  
6 that you could kind of alleviate some of the  
7 internal competing from one office to the other  
8 office where positions might be similar. Of  
9 course, you are going to have people who might  
10 leave your office because there's a professional  
11 growth opportunity, right. But what we are trying  
12 to alleviate is the competing when it's a lateral  
13 move, a very similar move. That's what we were  
14 looking at. So that was another component of this.

15           So what this all led to is  
16 essentially proposing a wage scale for you all,  
17 something that you didn't currently have. That was  
18 kind of a big focus when I was kind of looking at  
19 everything to figure out where we should go. And  
20 so what I created is a pay scale, which is on  
21 page 8, and that has 11 pay grades in it, and  
22 positions have been grouped into these pay grades  
23 essentially based on the market results and based  
24 on kind of that internal what's going on across the  
25 county. And so they have been slotted in that

1 manner. So you will see those in kind of the  
2 minimum and maximum rate for those positions. And  
3 what that will essentially provide you all with is  
4 some guidelines for where positions should start,  
5 you know, when recruiting, and you can use it as a  
6 tool for retaining, because you now have this  
7 maximum rate of pay for a job. So that is a big  
8 piece of that.

9           The other thing that we ended up  
10 doing across most of the offices that participated  
11 was essentially a tenure adjustment. So one-time  
12 tenure adjustment. Where -- so what happens is  
13 when you create a scale and you kind of determine  
14 how it impacts your current employees, you can  
15 often have a lot of employees that sit at the  
16 bottom of the scale, even though they may have been  
17 here 10 years, 15 years, whatever the case may be.  
18 So what we have proposed is a one-time adjustment  
19 based on their years of service with the county  
20 that would provide for either 25 cents, 50 cents, a  
21 dollar or a 1.50 that would be added to their  
22 hourly rate.

23           CHAIRMAN PREISSE: See if you can  
24 talk about again this idea of compression exists  
25 for older -- not chronologically older, but longer

1 term employees, is that what you are saying?

2 MS. MILLER: Yes. So there's two  
3 types of compression. You can have compression  
4 that goes this way. So essentially you have a lot  
5 of employees that are lumped near the bottom of the  
6 pay scale. And so if it's new employees, that's  
7 fine. But where it's an issue is when you have new  
8 employees at the bottom, you have five-year,  
9 10-year, 15-year employees and they're all kind of  
10 grouped down here at the bottom versus being spread  
11 out. Typically, you know, if you have a pay scale  
12 and you're implementing it and you're kind of  
13 giving pretty regular increases, employees should  
14 be quite scattered throughout in a perfect world.  
15 So that's one type of compression.

16 Another type is the up and down.  
17 And that's where you have the issues with  
18 supervisors making more than subordinates -- or  
19 they should be. I said that backwards.  
20 Subordinates making more than supervisors. And a  
21 lot of times that can happen, you know, with years  
22 of service or just kind of how they have moved  
23 through the agency. So that's another type of  
24 compression. But my bigger focus was the other,  
25 which is making sure you don't have too many

1 employees down near the bottom of the scale.

2 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you.

3 MS. MILLER: And that's not a  
4 perfect -- you know, this tenure adjustment, it's  
5 not perfect, but it is a small movement to help  
6 kind of alleviate that a little bit.

7 MEMBER JAFFE: Just to follow up on  
8 that. The scales, we are talking about people  
9 being compressed at the bottom of are based on  
10 other organizations and how their distribution is  
11 or what determines the scales --

12 MS. MILLER: So it would strictly be  
13 based on you all. Because this is a scale that's  
14 specific just to the Board of Elections. This is  
15 not a scale that we recommended county-wide. Now,  
16 obviously, like a starting rate, the rate for the  
17 pay grade one kind of lines up internally. But  
18 it's a scale that's been created for you all  
19 specifically, and for the number of positions that  
20 you have, and that is how it's been done.

21 MEMBER JAFFE: So is the scale a  
22 recommendation or is the scale the current salary  
23 ranges of people in similar positions?

24 MS. MILLER: The scale is the  
25 recommendation, yes.

1                   Any other questions?

2                   Okay. So the last piece to this is  
3 there obviously is a -- whenever you create a  
4 scale, there's usually an implementation costs with  
5 that. So what that essentially means or what we  
6 are costing, we are looking at here is our pay  
7 scale, how many employees -- or what employees do  
8 we have sitting below that, what we are saying  
9 should be the minimum rate of pay for their job.  
10 And then so we provide a cost to at least get them  
11 to that minimum rate of pay. So that  
12 implementation cost to do that for the employees is  
13 \$69,164.94, and that's on page 7.

14                   And then that tenure adjustment is  
15 an additional cost of -- and that's, again, moving  
16 people through based on their years of service with  
17 the county, that's \$92,560. So they are kind of  
18 two separate pieces, if you will.

19                   So that's essentially kind of a  
20 quick summary of the major components of the study  
21 and what we have brought to you all to consider.  
22 So if anybody has any questions, I would be happy  
23 to answer any other questions.

24                   MEMBER JAFFE: Can you give a little  
25 detail about how, in particular, the ranges in the

1 recommended scale were arrived at in terms of  
2 comparisons to market?

3 MS. MILLER: Yep. So essentially  
4 what I did or how I started it is I looked at -- so  
5 there's -- I'm sure it's been public at this point,  
6 the Commissioners set a starting rate of \$17 per  
7 hour on the minimum. And so for everybody that was  
8 kind of my starting point. Now for you all, it  
9 went a bit higher than that at 18.47. So why that  
10 differs is because I looked back at what the market  
11 results say and what those counties are paying, and  
12 that's kind of how I established the starting rate.  
13 So it's truly kind of a market-driven approach, and  
14 then I build out the scale from that, that pay  
15 grade one. And I do it in a way that you kind of  
16 have a consistent percentage between each pay  
17 grade, and you have a consistent percentage between  
18 your starting and your max.

19 Anything else? Any other questions?

20 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't think I  
21 have anything at this point. But I'm interested in  
22 reading it more closely.

23 MS. MILLER: That's a lot to digest,  
24 too, to get all at once.

25 And I'm open to answering questions,

1 you know, later on down the road as they may come.  
2 Director White can get in contact with me. So if  
3 there's anything that comes up.

4 Thank you all for your time today.  
5 I appreciate it.

6 DIRECTOR WHITE: Thank you, Heidi.  
7 I appreciate your report.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: If there's  
9 nothing else on the agenda.

10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.

11 MS. O'BRIEN: I have a question real  
12 quick. Would it be okay if I had a copy of the  
13 report?

14 MS. HUMMER: Just follow our normal  
15 records process.

16 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Move to adjourn.

17 MS. MARINELLO: Second.

18 DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We are  
19 adjourned.
