MS. GIBBONS: He was here a second ago and now he's not. Go ahead maybe he will come back on.

MR. SIMMONS: Should I start?

MS. GIBBONS: Go ahead. Maybe he will come back on. Here he is.

MR. SIMMONS: Good afternoon. I'm Travis Simmons. I'm the manager over the voter services department. I'm here to present the voter challenge of Mr. Wilson. Mr. Wilson is challenging the voter registration status of Anthony Wilson. Carlos Wilson originally registered to vote in our county in 2002. He had voted regularly between 2002 and 2004. Following a period of no voter activity. He was removed from our list of maintenance procedure — he was removed from our voter rolls in 2011. Mr. Wilson re-registered to vote in 2021, via a register form from the Bureau Motor Vehicles. Once again he registered to vote at 254 Park Road. Mr. Wilson requested an absentee

1 ballot for 2022 general election, but he did not 2. return a complete ballot. On his challenge, Mr. Wilson affirms that Anthony Wilson no longer 3 lives in Ohio and lives in South Carolina. 4 5 lack of voter activity of Mr. Wilson's voter record 6 and the fact that the US Postal Services shows that 7 he now lives in South Carolina supports the assertion that Mr. Wilson claimed on his challenge. 8 9 Anthony Wilson registered to vote here in Franklin 10 County originally in 2001. He has updated his 11 address twice. The last time he updated his 12 registration was in 2016 and it was at 925 Hart 13 Road. Mr. Wilson voted in several elections 14 between the first time he registered to vote in 15 2001 and the last time he voted in the general 16 election of 2016. Mr. Wilson has had no voter 17 activity since the 2016 general election and his 18 voter registration status has been moved to 19 inactive. In February 2018 the US Postal Service 20 reported that Mr. Wilson's address was now 43 Big 21 House Road in St. Helena Island, South Carolina. 22 This was part of our NCOA, National Change of 23 Address, maintenance process. At the time, the 24 Board sent Mr. Wilson a confirmation notice to that 25 address in South Carolina and that confirmation

1 notice was neither returned, completed or returned undelivered. He is scheduled to be removed from 2. our voter rolls in 2025. The voter services 3 4 department recommend the Board approve the 5 challenge against Mr. Anthony Wilson presented by 6 Carlos Wilson. To the best of our knowledge 7 Mr. Wilson has not lived in Franklin County since February of 2018 or voted in Franklin County since 8 9 November 2016 general election and should no longer 10 remain registered to vote at that address in 925 11 Hart Road address in Franklin County. 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you. 13 MEMBER MARINELLO: There are a lot of different addresses on these -- on Hart Road. 14 15 948, 947. 16 MR. SIMMONS: He originally 17 registered at 947 Hart Road in 2011. 18 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Just for 19 clarity because it's a little hard to tell, if you 20 could say -- use their first names. 21 MR. SIMMONS: Anthony Wilson 22 registered to vote at 947 Hart Road on December 5th 23 of 2001. He updated his address to 948 Hart Road 24 in 2008 and updated his address again to 925 Hart

Road on March 15th of 2016.

13 1 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: And then 2 question, Carlos Wilson is 953 Hart Road, so we're 3 not -- many of the recent challenges we've dealt with is someone who has someone registered at their 4 address. That's not the case here. These are 5 6 people that may be related to him that live near 7 him on the same street it looks like? MR. SIMMONS: He's registered --8 9 yeah. 10 MEMBER JAFFE: 953 for Carlos 11 Wilson, the person filing. I also see 925. 12 MR. SIMMONS: He's currently -- he 13 first registered in 2002 he registered at 953 Hart 14 Road, but he is currently registered to vote at 925 15 Hart Road. If you turn to -- if you turn to the 16 third page that has his voter history, that's his 17 current address right there, Carlos Wilson, the 18 petitioner. 19 MS. HUMMER: So he is currently 20 registered at 925 Hart Road? 21 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, ma'am.

On February 16th, following that meeting, we received from Mr. Gil a request for the Board to reconsider its decision to deny him certification. I believe you have that request for reconsideration in your packet. Then on February 27th he filed three affidavits, which I believe are also in your packet. Those affidavits were collected from three individuals who purported to sign his petition but whose signatures we invalidated because we could not find a match to the signatures we had on file in our database. The affiants' ballots that they did indeed sign this petition, indicated where on the petition they signed it. You can find that there on the copy of the petition submitted with the affidavit and have indicated that they wish to have their signatures validated. Mr. Gil is here to present his arguments to you if you would like. CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Give me one more minute to look through the exhibit. counsel want to walk us through our next steps?

MR. GIL: Well, I submitted around 318 signatures back in February 13th. It was a Monday and got a letter stating that I needed one more signature. I inquired about the instructions that this would take place and I have to tell you how hard it is you need to get one signature. Let me tell you this, it was one of the hardest things I've ever done running for politics, because you need to go talk to the client or voter, you need to have a notary with you at the time, and I needed to be present, and it was hours waiting and driving, you know, at their house, waiting for them to get home and having a notary with you for hours. was quite an undertaking. So I needed to meet in a way that it is not easy, very tough, and to explain to the voter what was taking place is something that also was an undertaking because, you know, now they -- you show up in their place and require some things, especially signature and address. It took a lot of convincing to apprehend, but at the same time, they knew -- not knowing of the process, they knew what it would take place for me and trust was

placed and they were in a way believing what I said and here we are trying to request a reformation that I can run for city council in District 2, and that it will make the process, you know, for me especially to participate in the elections for November.

MS. HUMMER: I'm going to clarify the matter before the Board through the witness so that we have a clear understanding that there was — the number of signatures presented were 300 and ——

I witnessed this with two of them, and granted enough I have their original signature on my phone and they will remember the way they sign but they remember they change through their lifetime or in the process of, you know, going forward with their professional, you know, jobs or whatever reason. That's what I was told. Yes, I remember that signature, but I changed it, so my education moment at that point was, you know, let's, you know, every two years, three years you should send a new petition with your new signature

What we don't have control over is number of provisional ballots, which is wrapped up in the equation. We do have the ability also to produce paper ballots on demand here in house on election day in the event that any location would be running short on their supply.


