19	The first item on the agenda is the
20	approval of minutes for the September 9, 2024
21	meeting of the Franklin County Board of Elections.
22	I believe we sent out copies of the minutes for you
23	to take a look at.
24	MEMBER MARINELLO: Mr. Chairman, I

1	move that the Board approve the minutes from the
2	September 9, 2024 meeting of the Franklin County
3	Board of Elections as submitted.
4	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,
5	second the motion.
6	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: It's been
7	properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
8	the motion signify by saying aye.
9	All opposed same sign.
0	Motion carries.
.1	The next item on the agenda we have
.2	a voter challenge. And I believe we have Charles
L3	Morrison here. And I will call on Sara Ziemba, the
4	supervisor of Voter Services, to give us an
.5	overview of the challenge by Mr. Morrison.
<b>.</b> 6	MS. ZIEMBA: Thanks, David.
<b>.</b> 7	Good afternoon everyone. I'm Sara
<b>.</b> 8	ZIEMBA, supervisor of the Voter Services
<b>.</b> 9	Department. And I will give you a brief overview
20	of the information regarding the challenge against
21	Mr. Nigell Kelso, brought to us today by Charles
22	Morrison, both registered at 4734 Funston Court,
23	Columbus, Ohio, 43232.

Mr. Kelso originally registered to

vote at 4734 Funston Court on 2-15-2007. Mr. Kelso had one address change and then no activity following that 2008 registration change. So his record was removed in 2013.

And then Mr. Kelso re-registered at 4734 Funston Court on 7-3-2015 on a paper form that was collected by the office of the Ohio Secretary of State. And that was what led to him being registered at 4734 Funston Court and what brought the challenge from Mr. Morrison here today.

acknowledgement letters, confirmation notices, and other mail that the Board sends to voters regularly to make sure that they're registered where they say they are to confirm their registration. And all of that for Mr. Kelso came back to the Board undelivered. And that's what you are seeing in your documents there. There's an acknowledgement notice, confirmation notice, and another confirmation notice sent to Mr. Kelso in 2008 and 2023. And then, of course, 2015 and 2007 when he first registered, all of those notices came back to us undelivered as addressed, and unable to be forwarded at the post office to some other address

for Mr. Kelso. Mr. Kelso has never voted in
Franklin County. He did, however, sign three
petitions, which sort of kept his registration
active. Those are listed on the overview there, if
you're interested in that. But other than those
three petition signatures, Mr. Kelso has not had
any voter activity since 2016.

In January of 2023, we sent a -- the Board sent Mr. Kelso a confirmation notice to 4734 Funston Court because of inactivity. And that confirmation notice was sent back to the Board undelivered as addressed.

Mr. Morrison has registered to vote at 4734 Funston Court, Columbus, 43232 on October 5, 2023 through an online registration.

And Mr. Morrison has voted most recently from that address for the November 2023 General Election.

Based off of the pattern of acknowledgement letter, confirmation notices coming back to the Board undelivered, the lack of voter activity from Mr. Kelso, voter services found nothing on file to contradict Mr. Morrison's assertions on his challenge form that Mr. Kelso does not live at 4734 Funston Court. And so, therefore, voter services

1	recommends the Board uphold the challenge after you
2	talk to Mr. Morrison today.
3	MEMBER MARINELLO: Sara, the
4	original challenge for right to vote that
5	Mr. Morrison filled out it says 4737 Funston.
6	DIRECTOR WHITE: It's a four and
7	it's cut off.
8	MS. ZIEMBA: Yeah, we have them at
9	4734.
10	DIRECTOR WHITE: At the top of the
11	voter challenge form it looks like 4737, I think
12	that's supposed to be a four, though.
13	MS. ZIEMBA: It is a four. I gave
14	my copy of the challenge form to Erin. I'm sorry.
15	Maybe I cut it off when I copied it. Sorry.
16	MEMBER SEXTON: It does that say
17	below 3734.
18	MS. ZIEMBA: Where we have them both
19	registered is at 3734 Funston Court.
20	MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Sara, when we or
21	if we say we accept this, is he no longer will
22	he be flagged from signing petitions?
23	MS. ZIEMBA: He can sign a petition,
24	but when it comes back to be verified by the Board,

1	it will be marked as not registered and that
2	signature won't count.
3	MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Whereas these
4	three signatures that are listed there did count,
5	because he was registered or is still registered
6	at the time he signed it.
7	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The last one was
8	nine years ago it looks like.
9	MS. ZIEMBA: Yep, 2016.
10	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: So do we wish to
11	hear then from Mr do we have any more
12	questions? Do you wish to hear from Mr. Morrison?
13	He's here.
14	Would you like to address the Board?
15	We would invite you to.
16	MR. MORRISON: Sure.
17	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Please do.
18	For the record, will you allow the
19	court reporter to swear you in?
20	
21	CHARLES MORRISON,
22	being by me first duly sworn, as hereinafter
23	certified, and says as follows:
24	MR. MORRISON: I'm Charles Morrison.

1	I live at 4/34 Funston Court, Columbus, it's
2	Madison Township. And I moved in there about 2018.
3	I purchased it from somebody else who is not Nigell
4	Kelso. And as far as I know he's never lived at
5	that address. And the previous time, 2023 or
6	something, you sent out a notice for him. I got
7	it, looked at it, and I looked him up in the voter
8	registration list, found out he wasn't there, and
9	he hadn't voted in a while. Did an online search,
10	and the only one by that name that I could find
11	was, I think, in a prison in Texas. And I'm not
12	sure if it's the same person. I tried to find out.
13	And I thought, well, this is supposed to be purged
14	after so much this length of time. I knew that
15	from other things I'd done in the past. So then I
16	got it in the mail again, and I thought, well, this
17	is a potential for voter fraud; so I probably ought
18	to do something about it. And I got kind of
19	irritated about it. I just decided to do
20	something. I found out this is the way to do it,
21	and I'm here.
22	Do you have any questions for me?
23	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Questions?

MEMBER SEXTON: Just one, how long

1 have you lived at the address, sir? 2 MR. MORRISON: Since 2018, about six 3 years. 4 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Well, we thank 5 you for your diligence, and staying on top of the 6 matter that you noticed. We appreciate it. 7 MR. MORRISON: Yep. I didn't want 8 to get it in the mail and have to research it and 9 all of that stuff. 10 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you. 11 MEMBER MARINELLO: Thank you. 12 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't have any 13 comments or questions beyond that. Anybody else? 14 MEMBER MARINELLO: No, I don't. 15 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: I don't think 16 Mr. Kelso is here. He was notified repeatedly, 17 right, Sara? 18 MS. ZIEMBA: Yes. 19 MEMBER SEXTON: Okay. Well, if 20 there's no other questions, Michael Sexton, I move 21 the Board approve the challenge of the right to 22 vote filed by Charles Morrison of 4734 Funston 23 Court, Columbus, Ohio, against Nigell Kelso of the 24 same address, and order that Nigell Kelso's

1	registration be removed from the Franklin County
2	BOE voter file.
3	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Doug Preisse,
4	second the motion
5	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
6	properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
7	the motion signify by saying aye.
8	All opposed same sign.
9	Motion carries.
10	The next item on the agenda is the
11	voter information guide, and I will turn it over to
12	Gretchen James, who is our Social Media Coordinator
13	as well as our Community Affairs Director.
14	MS. JAMES: Good afternoon, Chairman
15	Preisse, Board Members, and Director.
16	I'm coming before you today seeking
17	your approval for our voter information guide. As
18	you may recall, this voter information guide is
19	something we are doing annually in advance of the
20	General Election in order to inform our voters of
21	critical deadlines and information that they need
22	going into the election.
23	On your desk I've left you a copy of
24	the guide. The very top attachment is the actual

size. And that is what will be going out in the mail.

The second attachment that I left with you is to show you how creative we've been this year. So when our voters receive this guide and they unfurl it, there will be a plea to be a poll worker. So for registered voters who are not in our high priority targeted areas, they will receive the flyer that you see on that handout that I've given you. For voters in our areas of high focus, I've also shared with you the specialized poll worker plea that we've included. So the areas that you see there are historically low performing for poll worker recruitment turnout across the board, but specifically for our Republican -registered Republicans. So this is part of our ongoing efforts to boost our recruitment and have more engaged voters serving as poll workers.

Any questions?

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: There's a lot of stuff here to absorb, give us a few minutes.

MS. JAMES: Absolutely.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: So can you tell us the areas that -- I know Obetz, where we

1	are underperforming as far as recruitment of
2	Republican poll workers?
3	MS. JAMES: Yes. So our areas of
4	under performance are Obetz, Grove City, Groveport,
5	Canal Winchester.
6	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: Okay.
7	When is the deadline for absentee
8	ballots?
9	DIRECTOR WHITE: October 29th, a
LO	Tuesday.
<b>L1</b>	MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Where does the
12	barcode take you, to our Board website? Or QR
13	code.
L <b>4</b>	MS. JAMES: QR code. So the QR code
15	on this one will take you directly to our website.
16	But it is hyper focused to take you to our poll
<b>L</b> 7	worker page where it explains to you why you are
18	necessary, and why our registered voters are so
19	critical for them to participate.
20	Oh, and from that page, they can
21	also just go ahead and directly apply.
22	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: And this
23	also tells voters where their polling location is?
24	MS. JAMES: Correct. Thank you,

Deputy Director.

So the mailer, when it is in the mail and arrives at the voter's address, in this highlighted field here, there will be information about their polling location. So should they choose to go vote on election day, it will have the name and the full address of their community-based polling location.

Additionally, we were able to, in our important election information, include an update about identification. Apple Wallet, working with the Ohio BMV, has recently launched mobile Ohio ID. Unfortunately, for voting purposes, that ID is not acceptable. We do not consider that valid in that digital format. So you still must bring that physical copy of your identification. And just to be super helpful, we also share what those type of identifiers are.

Oh, and lastly, we were also able to include information on how you find your sample ballot. We find that a lot of voters get confused navigating that process, because we give them their full voter history, and they must scroll down to the bottom of that voter history for their sample

1	ballot that's attached to their precinct and
2	specific community.
3	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: We're really
4	encouraging people to look at their sample ballot
5	before they come in because of Issue 1. If they
6	are reading Issue 1 for the first time when they
7	come in, that's going to take quite a while.
8	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: The size you held
9	up is the size of the mailing?
10	MS. JAMES: Correct.
11	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: You did this
12	because we are old and we can see it better.
13	MS. JAMES: I have cheaters, too.
14	So the enlarged was to show all of the specific
15	graphics in detail.
16	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Right.
17	MEMBER FREEDHOFF: When will these
18	come out?
19	MS. JAMES: So they will be going
20	out on the 9th, that is the drop to the post
21	office. And we anticipate all of them being in the
22	mailboxes no later than the 14th.
23	MEMBER MARINELLO: Very informative.
24	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Nice job.

1	MS. JAMES: Thank you.
2	CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Looks to me, what
3	do you guys think?
4	MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Chairman,
5	Meredith Freedhoff, I move the Board authorize the
6	purchase and mailing of 505,351 Voter Information
7	Guides from Baesman in the amount of \$62,865.
8	MEMBER MARINELLO: Second
9	DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: It's been
10	properly moved and seconded. All those in favor of
11	the motion signify by saying aye.
12	All opposed same sign.
13	Motion carries.
14	The next item on the agenda is the
15	traffic mitigation plan that is required by the
16	Ohio Secretary of State's office. And I will turn
17	that over to Matt Kelly, our Absentee Manager and
18	Early Vote Center Manager.
19	Matt.
20	MR. Kelly: Good afternoon,
21	Mr. Chairman, Members of the Board.
22	As David indicated, this is a
23	required sign off that is needed by the Secretary
24	of State's office. In many ways the Board has

already approved this package, but it's been more of a piecemeal as we have been hiring traffic parking companies and ordering signs, and those type of things that will help us with our traffic control this election.

But just to give you some context and background, I've supplied a few numbers here. And that's how we do things, we look at the math. If you look at the math of the parking spaces available here in our complex, in our Morse/Karl Road complex, there are 500 regular parking spaces available in this complex. However, there's about 110 of these spaces that aren't as accessible as the others. Those are located on the far west and far east sides of our complex. And there's 60 other spaces that are located directly behind our building.

So if you subtract those spaces out from the 500 general parking spaces that are available, you will quickly see that we have around 330 parking spaces that are more of our premium, high accessible parking spaces for the general public. And those are facing the building, the south side of the building facing the parking lot.

1 Those are premium spots.

So if you start doing the math a bit little further, we are expecting thousands of voters each day coming here to early vote, you can quickly see how 330 spaces will not accommodate thousands of people if we have those spaces already captured by other entities or other people parking. Being campaigns, employees, or other people just parking in our lot without authorization. So the only way to get to a point where you can vote thousands of people a day is to do a couple things. One is to minimize the long-term parkers. sure we don't have any long-term parkers that park there all eight hours or 10 hours a day. And the other thing is that we need to maximize our short-term parkers and turn over those parking spaces a few times an hour. Hopefully, four or five times an hour. So our parking plan from the very, very beginning is based on that concept to make sure our long-term parkers have another alternative, and to maximize the use of our parking spaces for the short-term, and making sure we can use multiple spaces per hour.

So the things we've done to

accommodate all of that, minimize long-term use of space, we have made arrangements to have all Board employees park offsite and use a shuttle service. Right there, that's 200 some cars immediately that are no longer parking in our parking lot but across the street. They won't be taking up spaces for eight, 10, 12 hours a day. That's important we have all of our Board of Elections staff, from the Director, Deputy Director all the way down to me.

CHAIRMAN PREISSE: All the way down to you?

MR. KELLY: All the way down to me.

Park across the street and we take the shuttle bus

in. It only takes a few minutes. I've even walked

it a few times, it's about seven minutes on foot.

It's not that bad.

We've also created a dedicated drive-thru location with tents or drop-off tents, where we have bipartisan teams stationed in the tent. Again, if we have a DropBox on site and it's open for business, we don't want our voters parking in a parking spot, then walking up to the building, and going back to their car. We would rather have that parking space available for voters coming to

early vote, and have them drive up the corridor and drop off their materials, be it an application or absentee ballot, or a ballot and making them sign a station form, all of that is planned into having a ballot tent, and keeping those spaces open for voters.

We also have also placed 20 new no campaign parking, no candidate parking, towing enforcement signs throughout the parking lot. A lot of times we have campaigns that want to park across three or four spaces with a flatbed truck and put their candidate's logo up there. We don't allow that. We need the spaces for voters. So by doing those three things alone we are minimizing any long-term parking at the Board and saving spaces for our voters.

Then to maximize the traffic flow, promote efficient entry and exit for the parking spaces and areas, we've hired a traffic control team. We designed the parking lot to be more one way in flow. So we get people in and out of parking spaces a lot easier. You've probably seen the electronic signs we've already placed telling people where there's overflow parking down there,

where the ballot tent is, that way, and where we have curbside voting.

Department on busy days to cue the light. A lot of you know if you are turning in from Morse Road into the complex, that light can be long sometimes, or it's a long wait before you can turn in. So if we do have traffic backed up on Morse Road, it really gets backed up to Karl or even beyond sometimes when we are busy. So having a Columbus police officer there cueing the light, they help us control the turn signal light so people have more time to turn into the property and aren't sitting in a turning lane.

We also have freshly painted parking spaces. I don't know if you've noticed when you came in, the parking lot has been freshly painted, it looks nice. That will help hopefully with people understanding where they can park very easily. And the fire lanes marked with the diagonal lines.

On top of that, we've also added some safety and security items, where we have a dedicated area for curbside building around the

Т	side of the building. That doesn't get used a lot
2	anyway. So we have our curbside dedicated parking
3	spaces over to the east side of the complex
4	building, the building in the complex. And you've
5	seen the orange water-filled barriers we've set up.
6	That's more of a line protection thing we offer.
7	We put that there to help control the line. So the
8	line is not spilling across on the sidewalk or into
9	the parking spaces or parking lot. And it kind of
LO	keeps a nice barrier where we have to tell
L1	campaigners that they can't go more than 10 feet.
12	If kind of helps with campaigning in line as well.
L3	So all of those things have been
L <b>4</b>	baked into this grand parking mitigation plan that
L5	we are required to put in front of the board. As I
L6	said, a lot of the items you've already seen or
L7	voted on, and we appreciate your support on those
L8	items because it does make a real difference.
19	MEMBER FREEDHOFF: Matt, is there
20	only one entrance into the parking lot?
21	MR. KELLY: Well, it depends on how
22	you drive. There are a number of ways to turn into
23	our complex area. If you're traveling westbound on

Morse Road, you can pull in by Firestone and use

the access road to access the property. Or the next entrance going westbound would be at the main entrance at the light. You can even go up to Karl and turn right, and then take another right over by Huntington National Bank and the old tire store, and there's an entrance over there. Again, there's an access road that there's many points of entry there. But we try to accommodate for all of that with signage and make sure people know where they can enter and exit the property.

MEMBER FREEDHOFF: What's your recourse in the event that someone is coming in, and they're not voting, but they insist on parking there?

MR. KELLY: Well, I'm usually out in the parking lot a lot. And we do have a deputy sheriff that can come with me sometimes. But the managers of early vote will let me know or they'll let the deputy know, and we will go out and address that as we can. If there's no one in the car, we will wait to find out who owns the car if we can. But we do have a trespass notice, we can use our trespass privileges if we need to get the car towed.

MEMBER FREEDHOFF: How long do you consider long for the car to be there?

MR. KELLY: I would say more than an hour. Unless they are reading every single thing on the ballot.

option for us. We obviously want to be sensitive to that. But if we know there are people who are not here for Board business or vote, that's an option we have. We have utilized it, not often, but there's some circumstances that require it.

MEMBER FREEDHOFF: I think it would be really hard to keep track of 300 cars in a lot, and know when they got there and when they left.

DIRECTOR WHITE: Yeah, we have a lot of eyes and ears outside, between our traffic control team, our Homeland Security volunteers, who come from Franklin County Homeland Security, emergency management. So they are on site, as well as deputy sheriffs. And we have staff that regularly walk the parking lot. Deputy Director and I regularly walk the parking lot. There's a number of ways to recognize who should be there and who shouldn't.

MR. KELLY: There are tells, I

2 guess, by day three, if the same car has been

3 | there, and you don't recognize the car or the

4 bumper sticker, whomever, you see it on day three,

5 you kind of have an idea they're not doing what

MEMBER SEXTON: What are the parking arrangements in relation to the curbside voting?

MR. KELLY: Curbside voting is a dedicated area. We have up to 20 spaces and we have cueing space for people in cars to get in line when we are really, really busy. We will have limited access there. We will have some of our Homeland Security volunteers, as well as our curbside employees, that will be motioning for cars to come in and park at curbside voting station one, two, three, four, et cetera. So we will be managing that traffic flow as the curbside voters approach that area, and making sure they have a place to park where our team will come out and service the car. Unless all 20 would be filled, then we cue up the cars. So the cars are next in line as soon as one pulls out another one can pull in.

1	MEMBER SEXTON: So we have 20 spots
2	just for curbside?
3	MR. KELLY: Yes.
4	MEMBER SEXTON: Thank you.

our operations manager, to give an overview of 1 2 that. 3 MS. PATTON: Good afternoon. 4 you is Exhibit A, which is the final paper ballot 5 allocation for the 2024 General Election. From the 6 last time that we heard the -- saw this exhibit 7 there have been no changes. So the requirements 8 set forth by the Secretary of State within the 9 election official manual has been met regarding the 10 provisional ballots, as well as paper by choice 11 ballots for our system. With the allocation there 12 are a total of 129,825 preprinted paper ballots 13 that are going out to the polling locations on 14 Election Day. There are no changes because paper 15 ballot allocations are calculated based on previous 16 like elections. Which we went back to 2012 and 17 2016 as our higher turnout elections for 18 provisional and election day ballots. 19 So we ask you adopt the paper ballot 20 allocation plan as submitted before you today. 21 CHAIRMAN PREISSE: Thank you, Carla. 22 Ouestions? Concerns? 23 Standard question, MEMBER SEXTON:

DEPUTY DIRECTOR PAYNE: I'll ask

Carla to stay up there, talking about our voting

machine and Touch Pad allocation for the November

5th General Election.

MS. PATTON: You have Exhibit B in front of you there. Now, there were some changes in this allocation. As it was previously stated at a previous board meeting, when the initial allocation was presented, we had purposely left about 40 pieces of equipment not allocated at that time in anticipation of some increases in the voter registration numbers. Equipment is allocated based on voter registration totals. So we have reran the calculations, and using the same formulas as before, the numbers did not change in terms of the voters per machine. But with the increase of voter registration, there were 35 pieces of equipment that were added to the allocations throughout the county, and about 25 locations received additional equipment. And that was in the express vote and

the express vote kiosk. So instead, we are now looking at deploying a total of 3,304 marking devices. Which was an increase of 10 of the tabletop units, and an increase of 25 of the kiosk machines. Allocations for the Touch Pads and the DS200 ballot counters did not change as the thresholds were not large enough to require change in that.

So with that, we would ask that you approve Exhibit B, which is the final voting machine and Touch Pad allocation for the 2024 General Election.

DIRECTOR WHITE: And, Carla, can you remind the Board what the formula is?

MS. PATTON: Yeah. So the table tops were allocated one for every 320 voters. The kiosk -- and that's where I ran the numbers. So instead of including additional tabletops, we shifted those to kiosk machines for ease of -- a little easier for deployment. And we have more of the kiosks that were available to go out at this time. So again, running that, basically the express vote table top is one for every 320 voters is what resulted in an increase of the equipment to
