

Ohio Election Law has changed! Here's what college students need to KnowB4UGo:

MAY I VOTE? To vote in Ohio, you must be at least 17 years old AND turning 18 on or before Election Day AND a registered voter in the state. To register or check on a current registration visit: **VOTE.OHIO.GOV**

Important Election Information | KnowB4UGo

- Your ballot will include candidates for: U.S. President, U.S. Senator, U.S. Representative, Ohio Supreme Court Justice, Court of Appeals Judge, Common Pleas Judge, State Senator, State Representative, County Commissioner, County Prosecutor, Clerk of Court, County Sheriff, County Recorder, County Treasurer, County Engineer, County Coroner, along with Levy and Liquor Options.
- Did you know that the deadline to register to vote in Ohio elections is 30 days before Election Day? Check your registration or create a new registration on-line at VOTEOHIO.GOV or visit the Franklin County Board of Elections at 1700 Morse Road, Columbus, OH and complete a paper form in person.
- Update: Apple Wallet has launched digital State of Ohio Identification. This ID is NOT an acceptable form of identification for voting purposes. Review the "What ID should I bring?" section for acceptable forms of ID.

- 2. Return the application to the Board of Elections by **Tuesday, Octber 29th, 2024.**
- 3. We will mail your ballot to you with a return envelope.
- 4. Vote your ballot and return it:
 - By Mail: Postmarked by the Monday before Election Day AND received by Saturday, November 9th, 2024
 - **In Person:** At the Board of Elections by 7:30pm on Election Day.

What ID should I bring?

Acceptable forms of ID are ONLY unexpired Ohio Driver License/State of Ohio ID Card, U.S. Passport/Passport Card, or Military ID.

















X ONLY the forms of ID listed above are acceptable. Any other documentation, including notices from the Board of Elections are **NOT** acceptable forms of ID for voting purposes.



Don't have valid ID?

For residents interested in voting but that lack valid ID, there is assistance available. As of April 7, 2023 any person ages 17 and over may apply for and receive a State of Ohio ID Card FREE of cost from the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles.
