Early Voting for May 4th Special Election Begins Tomorrow

(Columbus) Absentee voting, both in-person and by mail, begins April 6th for the May 4th, 2021 Special Election. Only registered voters in **Franklin Township**, **Mifflin Township**, **Pickerington Local School District**, and the **City of Upper Arlington** will have an issue on the ballot. As of today, nearly 600 absentee ballots have been requested in Franklin County. Those will begin hitting the mail tomorrow to coincide with the first day of early voting. Below are the in-person voting hours that registered voters in these communities can vote at 1700 Morse Road, Columbus.

- Weekdays, April 6th through April 23rd from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Final week, April 26th through April 30th from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Saturday, May 1st from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Sunday, May 2nd from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Monday, May 3rd from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Registered voters can view their sample ballot by visiting our website at <u>vote.franklincountyohio.gov</u>. Voters planning to cast a ballot by mail must request one by noon on May 1st.
