### **Today marks Close of Registration for May 2, 2023 Primary/Special Election**

**(Columbus)** The Board of Elections, located at 1700 Morse Road, will remain open today until 9:00 p.m. for voters to register or deliver their completed forms to our office.

Registration forms are available at our office and on the Web at <http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov>. Forms may also be found at many government offices throughout the county.

Below are the requirements one must meet to be a qualified voter:

- Must be a U.S. citizen
- A resident of Ohio for at least 30 days before the election
- Registered to vote at least 30 days before the election
- At least 18 years old on or before November 7, 2023

To register or update registration online please visit, <http://voteohio.gov>. Registrants will need to provide the following:

- Ohio driver's license or Ohio identification card number
- Name
- Date of Birth
- Address
- Last four digits of your Social Security number

Only two communities, the City of Gahanna and the City of Hilliard, will have candidates on the ballot to vote on for the May 2 Primary/Special Election. Voters in the Madison-Plains Local School District will decide a school bond issue.

Voters in the below precincts in Franklin County will have local options on the ballot to decide.
