Special Election Day Reminders

(**Columbus**) Tomorrow's Special Election in Franklin County encompasses 282 polling locations that will be open from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. If you are in line by 7:30 p.m. you will be able to cast a ballot. Voters must vote at their assigned polling location. Only provisional and military (UOCAVA) voters will be processed at the Board of Elections office at 1700 Morse Road on Tuesday.

If you have requested a ballot by mail, it must be delivered to 1700 Morse Road, no later than 7:30 p.m. on August 8th. Voters cannot drop off absentee ballots at any other polling location other than the Franklin County Board of Elections, 1700 Morse Road. Only ballots postmarked by <u>August 7, 2023</u>, will be counted if received by <u>August 12, 2023</u>. Any voter that casts a Provisional ballot must cure and provide proper ID by <u>August 12, 2023</u>, to have a ballot counted in the official certified results.

Franklin County voters can verify their August 8th voting location by searching their voter record using the <u>My Registration</u> feature on our website at <u>http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov</u>, or by contacting our office at 614-525-3100. The Board of Elections will also place signage at all past voting locations not in use for August 8th informing voters of their temporary voting location (name & address).

VOTER IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS / TYPES OF VALID ID

There are several types of valid photo identification.

• Ohio driver's license; State of Ohio ID card; Interim ID form issued by the Ohio BMV; US passport; US passport card; US military ID card; Ohio National Guard ID card; or US Department of Veterans Affairs ID card

All photo IDs must have the following:

• An expiration date that has not passed; A photograph of the voter; The voter's name, which must substantially conform to the voter's name as it appears in the Poll List or in the Poll Book

NOTICE: An unexpired Ohio Driver License, State ID Card, or Interim Documentation with your **former address IS an ACCEPTABLE** form of ID when your current address is in the pollbook.
