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MR. PAYNE: Chairman Preisse won't  
be here. We will take roll. Kim Marinello.

MS. MARINELLO: Here.

MR. PAYNE: Mike Sexton.

MR. SEXTON: Here.

MR. PAYNE: Doug Preisse.

Brad Sinnott.

MR. SINNOTT: Here.

MR. PAYNE: We do indeed have a  
quorum.

The first item on the agenda is the  
approval of the February 19 and March 4th minutes.  
Are there any deletions, additions, corrections?

MS. MARINELLO: I move the Board  
approve the minutes of February 19, 2019 and March  
4, 2019 minutes of the Franklin County Board of  
Elections as submitted

MR. SINNOTT: Second.

MR. PAYNE: All those in favor of  
the motion, signify by saying aye.

MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

MR. SEXTON: Aye.



1 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

2 MR. PAYNE: All those opposed, same  
3 sign.

4 Motion carries.

5 The next item on the agenda is  
6 candidate withdrawal. I will ask Jeff Mackey to  
7 speak to that, please.

8 MR. MACKEY: The city of Hilliard  
9 for the Republican Election for city council  
10 received a withdrawal from Albert Iosue.

11 MR. PAYNE: And because there were  
12 four candidates in that race --

13 MR. MACKEY: There was going to be a  
14 primary, now there is only three candidates. We  
15 confirmed with the city attorney over there,  
16 whatever they call it --

17 MR. SINNOTT: Law director.

18 MR. MACKEY: -- law director of  
19 Hilliard, our reading of the charter is correct,  
20 three candidates for three seats, there no longer  
21 needs to be a primary in Hilliard. We kind of have  
22 a two-step process here, we've accepted his  
23 withdrawal and nominate those three remaining  
24 candidates to the General Election, and certify  
25 those candidates to the General Election, instead

1 of Primary Election.

2 MR. SINNOTT: Jeff, Mr. Iosue had  
3 earlier resigned from Hilliard City Council, right?

4 MR. MACKEY: I believe he's taken a  
5 position in Hilliard incompatible with him serving  
6 on council.

7 MR. SINNOTT: That sounds familiar,  
8 too.

9 MR. SEXTON: So in Hilliard, there  
10 will be no precinct at all?

11 MR. MACKEY: Correct.

12 MR. SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move  
13 the Board accept the request of Albert Iosue to  
14 withdraw as candidate for Hilliard City Council.

15 MR. SINNOTT: Second.

16 MR. PAYNE: All in favor, signify by  
17 saying aye.

18 MR. SEXTON: Aye.

19 MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

20 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

21 MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.  
22 Motion carries.

23 We also have Exhibit A, Jeff just  
24 spoke to it, where we have the three remaining  
25 candidates for Hilliard City Council. And because

1     there is no May primary, we would ask the Board to  
2     certify those candidates to the November General  
3     Election.

4                   MR. SINNOTT: I move that the Board  
5     certify to the November 5, 2019 General Election  
6     ballot those candidates listed on Exhibit A, and  
7     that these petitions were filed timely and found to  
8     be valid and sufficient.

9                   MS. MARINELLO: Second.

10                  MR. PAYNE: All in favor, aye.

11                  MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

12                  MR. SEXTON: Aye.

13                  MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

14                  MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.  
15     The motion carries.

16                  MR. PAYNE: We are required by  
17     directive from the Ohio Secretary of State to do  
18     three paper ballot allocations, as well as three  
19     voting machine e-pollbook allocations. This will  
20     be our second. We really need to do it anyway,  
21     because we had a situation that we just addressed  
22     the last time, we had Hilliard paper allocation and  
23     pollbook allocations, so that changes a little bit.

24                  Carolyn, you want to talk to the  
25     paper ballot allocation?

1 MS. GORUP: So removing the Hilliard  
2 ballots, increases the number of ballots we expect  
3 by 575. And those ballot styles that will not be  
4 printed are on the last page of your Exhibit B.

5 MR. PAYNE: That's on the back page  
6 of Exhibit B?

7 MS. GORUP: Yes. I moved them all  
8 back there.

9 MR. PAYNE: And you struck a line  
10 through them?

11 MS. GORUP: Struck a line. And  
12 those won't be done. Technically, we have already  
13 printed them, but -- the print shop printed them,  
14 but we will sequester those.

15 MR. PAYNE: Okay.

16 MS. GORUP: That's the only change  
17 in this. If you have any questions.

18 MS. MARINELLO: I don't have any  
19 questions.

20 MR. LEONARD: You will speak to the  
21 e-pollbook allocation as well?

22 MS. GORUP: Carla will be doing  
23 that. That's my polling place, so.

24 MS. MARINELLO: I move that the  
25 Board adopt the paper ballot allocation formula in

1 Exhibit B compiled by the Board staff for the May  
2 7, 2019 Primary Election.

3 MR. PAYNE: Is there a second?

4 MR. SEXTON: I'll second.

5 MR. PAYNE: All in favor, signify by  
6 saying aye.

7 MR. SEXTON: Aye.

8 MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

9 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

10 MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.  
11 Motion carries.

12 The next item on the agenda is the  
13 voting machine and e-pollbook allocation Carla  
14 Patton will speak to that.

15 MS. PATTON: Again, basically the  
16 only changes on Exhibit C are the results of the  
17 precinct from Hilliard no longer being in the  
18 election. You will notice that on page 5 and on  
19 page 7, that there were reductions in machines in  
20 the two locations that are highlighted, as a result  
21 of Hilliard no longer being in the election.

22 The E-pollbooks, there were a few  
23 minor changes based on inactive voters, based off  
24 of the NCOA mailing that was recently completed  
25 So with those minor changes, it would be our

1 recommendation you approve the allocation as set  
2 forth in Exhibit C.

3 MR. PAYNE: Any questions about  
4 Exhibit C?

5 MR. SEXTON: Mr. Chairman, I move  
6 the Board adopt the voting machine allocation  
7 formula in Exhibit C, compiled by the Board staff  
8 for the May 7, 2019 Primary Election.

9 MR. SINNOTT: Second.

10 THE COURT: All in favor, signify by  
11 saying aye.

12 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

13 MR. SEXTON: Aye.

14 MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

15 MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.  
16 Motion carries.

17 The next item on the agenda is to  
18 set a date for the protest hearing against the  
19 nominating petitions and statement of candidacy for  
20 Stephanie Mingo. I believe there was some  
21 discussion about a --

22 MR. SEXTON: Ed, did you have --

23 MR. LEONARD: We were able to reach  
24 out to counsel for both the protestor, as well as  
25 the candidate, and both were agreeable to -- so

1 when we determined dates of availability, it  
2 appeared May 2 -- and coordinating with board  
3 members, May 2 appeared to be the date that was  
4 best for all parties involved, as well as board  
5 members.

6 MR. SINNOTT: That was agreeable for  
7 lawyers and works for us.

8 MR. LEONARD: Plenty of time.

9 MR. SINNOTT: Then I move the Board  
10 set the date of May 2, 3:00 p.m. to hear the  
11 protest against the nominating petition and  
12 statement of candidacy of Stephanie Mingo for the  
13 unexpired term of the Franklin County Municipal  
14 Court, Environmental Division.

15 MR. PAYNE: Is there a second?

16 MR. SEXTON: Second.

17 MR. PAYNE: All in favor of the  
18 motion, signify by saying aye.

19 MR. SEXTON: Aye.

20 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

21 MR. MARINELLO: Aye.

22 MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.  
23 Motion carries.

24 Next item on the agenda, I really  
25 just need direction, unless we want to set a date.

1 I have not reached out to the candidate for  
2 Reynoldsburg City Council. We have a protest  
3 hearing there. I didn't know if the Board was  
4 inclined to try to hold that the same day, or do we  
5 want to reach out to the two interested parties and  
6 ask them about dates and times?

7 MR. SINNOTT: Well, this one doesn't  
8 relate to anything that comes before the General  
9 Election; so why don't we do the same thing with  
10 this protest as we did with the other, that is  
11 check to see when the two parties are available and  
12 pass that by the Board. It may work out such that  
13 May 2nd, a little earlier in the afternoon, would  
14 work. This one, I don't think, will take a long  
15 time because of the nature of the challenge. Let's  
16 make sure the combatants are available.

17 MR. LEONARD: Okay. I will do that.

18 MR. PAYNE: I don't believe that  
19 requires a motion, or does it?

20 MR. SINNOTT: Not at this point.

21 MR. PAYNE: Very good. Another item  
22 on the agenda is the 2% cost-of-living raise for  
23 the staff for the two pay periods April 12th and  
24 April 26th. As the Board is aware, we are still  
25 constrained by the month-to-month budgeting; so if



1 the --

2 MR. SINNOTT: I move that the Board  
3 approve a 2% cost-of-living pay increase to all  
4 full-time board staff for the two pay periods,  
5 April 12th and April 26th. This increase stands as  
6 a one-time approval for increases specific to the  
7 upcoming pay periods for the entire month of April,  
8 as we are presently constrained by month-to-month  
9 budgeting.

10 MR. PAYNE: Is there a second?

11 MR. SEXTON: Second.

12 MR. PAYNE: All those in favor of  
13 the motion, signify by saying aye.

14 MR. SEXTON: Aye.

15 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

16 MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

17 MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.

18 Motion carries.

19 The next items are for discussion  
20 only. The first item is the update on voter  
21 registration software. And I will turn that over  
22 to Carolyn, who I think will turn that over to  
23 Adam, or maybe you will do it tandem. Adam is with  
24 our county commissioners

25 MS. GORUP: We put out an RFP for a

1 new voter registration system, and got four bids.  
2 And we decided to ask all four to come in and give  
3 a presentation Two of them actually voluntarily  
4 withdrew from the bid, and the remaining two came  
5 in and gave a presentation One of them was much  
6 better than the other. Tenex was the company, and  
7 so that's the company that we chose.

8 And Adam will tell you why and what  
9 we are doing.

10 MR. LEONARD: I should interject, we  
11 have been working in conjunction with the county  
12 purchasing department to make sure that we adhere  
13 to all of the requirements for the competitive  
14 bidding process. So they were involved when the  
15 vendors were brought in, purchasing department was  
16 involved in that process as well to make sure all  
17 of the vendors were treated equally and asked the  
18 same questions and so forth.

19 MR. LUCKHAUPT: My name is Adam  
20 Luckhaupt, L-u-c-k-h-a-u-p-t, for the Board of  
21 Commissioners I'm the Chief Information Officer.  
22 I have been working with Carolyn and the Board of  
23 Elections on this initiative Just like Director  
24 Leonard said, purchasing was involved in the  
25 process. They do these RFPs all the time; so they

1 were kind of the referees for the whole process,  
2 making sure everything was done correctly.

3 So the formal bid process, that went  
4 out across the country. It was advertised And  
5 then the four individuals -- the four individual  
6 companies submitted bids, two withdrew, and now,  
7 this next step is the negotiation process.

8 And in the negotiation process, all  
9 things are negotiable So purchasing in  
10 conjunction with the Board of Elections, we will  
11 try to negotiate the best price for Franklin  
12 County. I believe this vendor is not in the State  
13 of Ohio yet.

14 MS. GORUP: Not as VR vendor.

15 MR. LUCKHAUPT: And so the  
16 significance of this is to get the Board of  
17 Elections the state-of-the-art system. Because, as  
18 you know, voter registration systems are a huge  
19 target right now. And so giving you a system  
20 that's safe, secure and stable is important.

21 So are there any questions?

22 MR. SEXTON: Does the data center  
23 play any role in this?

24 MR. LUCKHAUPT: I guess the data  
25 center will play a role when it comes time to

1     configure and secure the software to help out. I  
2     imagine when we do contract negotiations, we will  
3     try to negotiate the terms and conditions that  
4     protect your data, protect your information. If  
5     you decide not to use the vendor anymore, you can  
6     get your data back. They will be involved in some  
7     of the configuration, making sure the security is  
8     good.

9                     MR. SINNOTT: Sounds we are on the  
10    path to buy the system, and then give it to the  
11    data center and say, here, you use the system we  
12    are giving you.

13                    MR. LUCKHAUPT: That's not correct.

14                    MR. SINNOTT: So where does the  
15    input from the data center come prior to that?

16                    MR. LUCKHAUPT: I would say more of  
17    a -- this is a software service; so it will be  
18    hosted with the vendor. The data center is usually  
19    for advisory purposes, especially, when it comes to  
20    security. They have a security department for the  
21    data center, and they will be involved at that  
22    point. And I imagine they will be involved during  
23    contract negotiations to make sure any kind of  
24    security questions are answered.

25                    MR. SINNOTT: That sounds like a

1 good idea.

2 MR. LEONARD: The staff will be  
3 using -- the voter registration system will be on  
4 the county's network. And in doing so, a lot of  
5 that operation -- the data center's role will be in  
6 terms of strength and security of that network  
7 system, the firewalls, protecting us from  
8 intrusions, from external attempts to infiltrate  
9 the system. And we also have the monitors that are  
10 in the periphery of the network to guard against  
11 central intrusions. Those are both the data  
12 center's monitors, as well as monitors we receive  
13 from Homeland Security, through their process. So  
14 they will be involved, the data center will be  
15 involved in that security level.

16 MR. LUCKHAUPT: And to your point,  
17 the data center is helping us right now with  
18 negotiating a contract for a new court case  
19 management system. Along the same lines, they have  
20 been providing valuable input, what to look for in  
21 security, what to write in the contract's terms and  
22 conditions to make sure your information is secure,  
23 voter information is secure.

24 MR. SINNOTT: When do you think  
25 these negotiations will probably be concluded?

1 MS. GORUP: I don't know concluded  
2 We are hoping to start --

3 MR. LUCKHAUPT: Yeah, probably  
4 within the month. To answer your question on  
5 negotiations, sometimes they go smooth and done in  
6 a month. We are in negotiations now for the new  
7 court case management system, it's been since last  
8 July, but we are negotiating five different  
9 agreements in that particular situation

10 MR. LEONARD: And the negotiations  
11 of the voting machines took a couple months to  
12 knock out all of the fine print in some of the  
13 provisions the vendor had. You will have similar  
14 situations, there are fine print we have to hash  
15 through purchasing has problems with, data center  
16 has problems with, or we, the Board, says, no, we  
17 are just not comfortable Those should take a  
18 while.

19 MR. LUCKHAUPT: I do want to thank  
20 Carolyn and her staff, they have been wonderful  
21 through the process. They leveraged the work for  
22 masses, doing the whole system architecture  
23 basically reverse engineering and used that to  
24 create the architecture So, well done.

25 MR. SINNOTT: Well, thank you.

1 MR. PAYNE: Thank you, Carolyn.

2 Thank you, Adam.

3 The next item is for discussion, and  
4 it's a report on expenses in excess of \$10,000. At  
5 a recent board meeting, the Board gave  
6 authorization to the Director and the Deputy  
7 Director for a limited period of time through the  
8 main primary to spend on items in excess of  
9 \$10,000, knowing that we just purchased new voting  
10 equipment, and there would be items that come up  
11 that we need to purchase in order to pull off that  
12 election.

13 So here is some of the items: We  
14 ordered 200 or 2,800 corrugated privacy partitions  
15 for table-top ExpressVotes. And they are sort of  
16 like that, (indicating).

17 MR. LEONARD: What you see on there,  
18 except they would be used to surround the  
19 ExpressVote. So they are configured just a little  
20 differently. If you went to our voting lab, you  
21 would see the ExpressVote, that ballot marker sits  
22 inside of the confines of that privacy booth. So  
23 what it does, it gives a sense of privacy to the  
24 voters because it prevents somebody from looking  
25 over to their neighbor's ballot marker.

1 MR. SINNOTT: And those were \$4?

2 MR. LEONARD: 4.84 a piece.

3 MR. PAYNE: The next item is from  
4 ES&S, the 800 packs of 250 sheets per pack ballot  
5 stock for the ExpressVotes.

6 Carla, do you want to just speak to  
7 what those --

8 MS. PATTON: Those are the slender  
9 sheets that feed into the marking device. So we  
10 ordered enough to get us through this election, as  
11 well as for training and testing purposes.

12 MR. PAYNE: That is clearly  
13 something we could not get along without, right?

14 MS. PATTON: Yes.

15 MR. LEONARD: They were exploring  
16 buying in bulk and cut that paper ourselves,  
17 instead of having to order directly from ES&S.  
18 While we continue to explore that, we have to have  
19 a certain amount of those ballot cards available  
20 for the Primary Election.

21 MR. PAYNE: The Ohio Revised Code  
22 requires that we post notice in The Columbus  
23 Dispatch for ads for the election, and that's  
24 11,700.

25 Jeff, do you have anything to add to



1       that? We are doing that.

2                   MR. MACKEY: Happens every year.  
3       Every election.

4                   MR. SINNOTT: Those ads run just in  
5       the newspaper, daily newspaper?

6                   MR. MACKEY: Correct. That fulfills  
7       our requirement for the Revised Code.

8                   MR. SINNOTT: One day?

9                   MR. MACKEY: Depends on the issue.  
10      Tax levies are twice, bond issues are once, charter  
11      issues are once, so.

12                   MR. SEXTON: We still -- does that  
13      include the last day to register to vote, do we get  
14      charged for that?

15                   MR. MACKEY: That is separate. That  
16      already ran. That was less than \$10,000. We need  
17      to bring that one up probably.

18                   MR. PAYNE: Are there any other  
19      questions for Jeff on that item?

20                   The other is street and road guide,  
21      location roster and workbooks. Those are to help  
22      people that go to the wrong precinct to get them to  
23      their correct precinct and to make certain everyone  
24      is in the correct precinct.

25                   Next item is 18 three-sided carts

1 from moving ballot boxes out of the drive-thru on  
2 election night.

3 Carla, those are the big wire carts?

4 MS. PATTON: They are big mesh,  
5 steel carts that house all of the voted ballots in  
6 the boxes as they get taken out of VLM cards.

7 MR. PAYNE: Thank you. The Director  
8 tells me we have not ordered the next item; so that  
9 is something we will discuss.

10 MR. LEONARD: That will be dependent  
11 upon your consideration of the next item.

12 MR. PAYNE: That's true.

13 Finally, a license agreement for  
14 off-site training location of 750 -- or 750  
15 Piedmont Avenue for the Primary and General  
16 Election. With all of the machines that we have  
17 here, we really don't have enough space to train  
18 all of our people, all 4,000 poll workers; so we  
19 are off-site with our training. And we did a  
20 rental agreement. That's with the city of  
21 Columbus?

22 MR. LEONARD: Right.

23 MR. PAYNE: For the 12,000.

24 MR. LEONARD: Plenty of parking,  
25 right off -- somewhat right off the freeway, there

1 at the Carillon Drive or Piedmont location, right  
2 off of 71 and Oakland Park. It's a sizable  
3 facility. All of our staff has been through it,  
4 and feel comfortable utilizing it for training.

5 MR. SINNOTT: That's money going  
6 from the county to the city?

7 MR. LEONARD: Yes, right.

8 MR. SINNOTT: How many people do we  
9 train?

10 MR. LEONARD: Right around 4,000.

11 MR. SINNOTT: Can we go back to the  
12 street and road guide for a moment? What is it we  
13 are buying there exactly?

14 MR. PAYNE: Do you want to talk to  
15 that, Carla?

16 MS. PATTON: Those are the printouts  
17 of the county street and road guides that list all  
18 of the addresses, address ranges within the county,  
19 and whether they have a ballot or not this  
20 election. And then also indicates what location  
21 they would vote in, if their location is open.

22 The location and the roster  
23 workbooks are the various paperwork that's needed  
24 throughout the day, including the payroll sheets  
25 and any logs for problems that they may encounter

1 during the election at the polls.

2 MR. SINNOTT: It sounds as though  
3 this is information that we are generating, but we  
4 need an outside vendor to print it for us.

5 MS. PATTON: That's correct.  
6 Because it's spiral-bound, it ends up probably  
7 about 300, 350 pages long.

8 MR. SINNOTT: Okay. Thank you.

9 MR. PAYNE: The final item for  
10 discussion are voting booths. I think you will  
11 recall at the last meeting, we had a four-person  
12 voting booth by Inclusion Solutions. The price tag  
13 on that for 700 of those four-station voting booths  
14 was 580,000. And the Board thought that that was  
15 an expense we didn't want to make at that point.  
16 And it was also asked that we try to come up with  
17 other solutions.

18 We do have Hollister Bundy here, who  
19 came in today, if you are interested in talking  
20 about the Inclusion Solutions. The four-station  
21 voting booth is out there.

22 The other thing, and I have in your  
23 packet, there's information on each of these,  
24 Inclusion Solutions also indicated that they would  
25 lease 250 of the four-station options for the May

1 primary at \$99 a piece, for a total of \$24,750.  
2 And I believe that if we went that route, that that  
3 \$99 would go towards the purchase of the  
4 four-station voting booths.

5 MR. BUNDY: Correct, it will be a  
6 credit.

7 MR. PAYNE: The other item we have  
8 out there is from Starfire. It's the black model  
9 with four legs, and they are \$80.83 each. We would  
10 need 2,800 of those for a total of \$226,324.

11 The next item from Election Corp was  
12 the voting booths that sat on a table. It looks  
13 like it came in a pizza box. You get two of those  
14 in a pizza box for \$100 each. So each voting booth  
15 would cost \$50. The total there would be 140,000.  
16 With that, you would need to buy tables and so that  
17 would be an additional \$46,000, for a total of  
18 \$186,536.

19 Another thing that we went out and  
20 looked at, we sent an e-mail to all 87 county  
21 boards of election asking them if they had any of  
22 the voting booths that they were no longer using.  
23 We picked up 25 metal booths from Washington  
24 County, we picked up 150 from Belmont County, those  
25 were free. We are looking at a thousand from Clark

1 County. Ideally, they would like to sell them to  
2 us, if we decide to go that route. If we go that  
3 route, we would need 1,400 of the free voting  
4 booths, we would also need 1,400 tables at \$33  
5 each. So the total for the free booths would come  
6 to \$46,000.

7 The final item -- I will let our  
8 Director --

9 MR. SEXTON: So just a question,  
10 Clark County, would they be giving us a thousand?

11 MR. PAYNE: They have a thousand  
12 We can either -- we are talking to them to be able  
13 to purchase them, or hopefully get them for free.

14 MR. SEXTON: If we have to purchase  
15 them, it would be on top of this price?

16 MR. PAYNE: Yeah. That's just for  
17 the 1,400 tables.

18 MR. LEONARD: You would need to have  
19 2,800 stations, because the four-station voting  
20 booth, okay, you compare apples to apples, you  
21 would have 2,800 stations. Because we were looking  
22 at 700 -- the original proposal was for 700  
23 four-station booths. So you have to come up with  
24 1,400 tables, but you have to have 2,800 voting  
25 booths that it could sit on. If it's going to be

1 sitting on a tabletop, you need to have -- in order  
2 to make this up, you need to have four per  
3 configuration

4 MR. PAYNE: In some cases, the  
5 booths don't have legs. In other cases, they do.  
6 Some of them would be free-standing, but other ones  
7 would require --

8 MR. LEONARD: A table.

9 MR. PAYNE: And to be honest, they  
10 are in various forms of disarray.

11 MR. SEXTON: The reason we are  
12 talking about 2,800 different stations is because  
13 that was a part of the original proposal.

14 MR. LEONARD: That we were --

15 MR. SEXTON: So you are giving us  
16 a -- that version of apples to apples without our  
17 having made a decision whether there needs to be  
18 2,800 different stations across the county, right?

19 MR. LEONARD: Right. Again, that  
20 was based on the staff recommendation They  
21 thought in order to be able to have enough stations  
22 at all of our locations, we would need either 700  
23 of the Inclusion Solutions, the Franklin voting  
24 booth, so that would be 2,800 voting stations. So  
25 compare apples to apples, that's what -- that's why

1 the final one at the bottom is 1,400 tables and  
2 2,800 privacy shields. So that essentially would  
3 create that, which is \$33 a table. We would need  
4 1,400 tables, each table could fit two voting  
5 stations. So you would need 1,400 tables to get  
6 you 2,800 voting stations. The cost of 1,400  
7 tables, 2,800 shields and that's it, would equal  
8 \$60,000.

9 MR. PAYNE: And the other thing I  
10 want to mention is we just put up paper on the  
11 side. If we actually went with the Solution, we  
12 would actually have stickers.

13 MR. LEONARD: Decals on the  
14 exterior, and you have a decal on the interior to  
15 tell the voter here is your next step. Once you  
16 finish your ballot, filling in your ovals, you need  
17 to take it over to the ballot counter.

18 MR. SINNOTT: To go back over the  
19 fundamentals here, we are talking about a way to  
20 create privacy for a voter that says I want to vote  
21 by paper ballot?

22 MR. LEONARD: Correct.

23 MR. SINNOTT: And this is the  
24 approach for the May primary, we have pulled the  
25 trigger on or we are about to?



1 MR. PAYNE: We have not pulled the  
2 trigger.

3 MR. LEONARD: If the Board feels  
4 this is a solution that will work, we can go ahead  
5 and place an order for shields, we can go ahead and  
6 place an order for tables.

7 MR. SINNOTT: So that approach is  
8 what we are referring to as table, shield solution?

9 MR. SEXTON: It's my understanding  
10 this approach here, you can configure them --

11 MR. LEONARD: One of the benefits of  
12 it is you are setting up a table, it's fairly  
13 simple. It's similar to the setup for the  
14 ExpressVote, because we have people setup at a  
15 folding table. And this folding table rises to the  
16 height of 36 inches. So it would stand tall enough  
17 for a voting booth, but we can also pair it with a  
18 small table to allow for ADA compliance as well.  
19 It's adjustable, to accommodate a location.

20 So as you were pointing out,  
21 depending on the configuration of the location, it  
22 might be best to put the tables up against the wall  
23 and have all four booths facing out. You don't  
24 have to configure it like that, you can configure  
25 it in a line. Again, it would be cheap and easy to

1 replace. If a table broke for some reason or a  
2 privacy booth broke, four or five dollars to  
3 replace a privacy booth. So four privacy booths  
4 for \$4.84, essentially less than \$20 for four  
5 privacy booths, two tables at \$33 a piece.  
6 Essentially, you have got a four-person voting  
7 booth for \$86.

8 MR. SINNOTT: 2018 General Election,  
9 how many people asked to vote by paper ballot?

10 MS. PATTON: That was just under  
11 500.

12 MR. SINNOTT: Fewer than 500.

13 MR. SEXTON: Did you say that the  
14 two of you are looking for some sense of the Board?

15 MR. PAYNE: The other thing I would  
16 mention, we clearly have to -- I believe, we have  
17 to have the privacy screens. We do have enough  
18 tables, low tables. I should know how tall they  
19 are. These are 36 inches.

20 MR. LEONARD: The others are 29  
21 inches.

22 MR. PAYNE: We do have enough  
23 tables. They are not ideal, you are kind of  
24 leaning over, they are not at the right height.  
25 But if we had to, we could go with those through

1 the May primary.

2 MR. SEXTON: Is that the one out  
3 there?

4 MR. PAYNE: Yes.

5 MR. SEXTON: The major concern I  
6 have is privacy. If you go up and stand right next  
7 to, you want to clearly --

8 MR. LEONARD: We have enough privacy  
9 shields. We have 2,800 privacy shields. We aren't  
10 going to deploy all 2,800 for this election. They  
11 are designed for the ExpressVote, because they have  
12 a cutout in the back to allow for the cords and  
13 cabling. Aside from that, we can utilize those as  
14 well.

15 MR. SINNOTT: What would be the  
16 minimum number that you would need to get through  
17 the May primary in terms of the shields?

18 MR. LEONARD: I would have to turn  
19 to Carla for that.

20 MR. SINNOTT: We are talking about a  
21 very small number of paper ballot voters in May.

22 MS. PATTON: I want to say it was  
23 around 1,200 stations. We have to expect that  
24 there will be some kind of increase in the paper  
25 ballot selection. And then be able to provide an

1     ADA solution as well, you need to have the two  
2     tables, the taller and the lower table.

3                   MR. SINNOTT:    So how many would we  
4     need for all voting locations?  I think we had this  
5     discussion last time.  350 voting locations in  
6     Franklin County.  I don't think all of them will be  
7     open for the primary.

8                   MR. LEONARD:   No.

9                   MR. SINNOTT:   But I think we would  
10    need --

11                   MS. PATTON:    I'm thinking a  
12    full-county election, you are looking at about  
13    2,600 voting stations to accommodate the larger  
14    locations.

15                   MR. SINNOTT:   But in terms of just  
16    this primary --

17                   MS. PATTON:    Just this primary,  
18    roughly around 1,200.

19                   MR. SINNOTT:   Would we need one --

20                   MS. PATTON:    Most locations are  
21    calling for at least one four-person station.  You  
22    might have -- I think there was a handful that  
23    would have three sets of tables going out to them.

24                   MR. SINNOTT:   Let's go like this,  
25    how many polling places will be open?

1 MS. PATTON: 255.

2 MR. SINNOTT: 255.

3 MR. SEXTON: And you would need at  
4 least two in each location?

5 MS. PATTON: Just depends on the  
6 size of the location. At least -- right, at least  
7 one tall table and one short table if you are  
8 looking at table and shield solution. So, you  
9 know, at least two tables per each location. And  
10 then once you got up into the locations that had  
11 three or four -- three or more precincts open, you  
12 are looking at about probably two sets of tables at  
13 each, at those locations. So the larger -- so as  
14 the location grows larger, you have more stations  
15 available.

16 MR. SEXTON: And then I think last  
17 meeting you said you need so many for training?

18 MS. PATTON: Correct. We need for  
19 the vote center and for training purposes as well.

20 MR. SEXTON: So what would your --  
21 what would your recommendation be for two -- you  
22 said 255 locations, in the terms of the number that  
23 we would need to adequately --

24 MS. PATTON: We believe the number  
25 was falling just a little over a thousand for the

1 polling locations. So then to allow enough for  
2 extra, in the event somebody would -- the crews  
3 would carry around in the event they needed extra  
4 voting stations on Election Day and allow for  
5 training purposes and they vote. I would like --  
6 1,200 is the number I would target for the Primary  
7 Election.

8 MR. SEXTON: So a thousand for the  
9 location and 200 for training and for the early  
10 vote setup?

11 MS. PATTON: Yep.

12 MR. LEONARD: Would you divide that  
13 equally between high tables and low tables?

14 MS. PATTON: Right. So that was,  
15 you know, if you have 200 -- yeah, so basically one  
16 high and one low for each one. You want to give me  
17 a minute, I can go get an exact number.

18 MR. SINNOTT: I would like to backup  
19 further. As I understand, what we are talking  
20 about doing is coming up with a way in this low  
21 turnout, off-year election, Primary Election that's  
22 ahead of us to provide space for paper ballot  
23 voting at 255 locations. Right?

24 MR. PAYNE: Correct.

25 MR. SINNOTT: And in the massive

1 turnout of the 2018 General Election, there was  
2 fewer than 500 people who elected to vote by paper.  
3 Perhaps because of the new machines, there will be  
4 a small uptick in the percentage of people who ask  
5 to vote by paper. But I think it would be  
6 completely unrealistic to think there's thousands  
7 of Franklin Countians wanting, showing up at the  
8 May primary wanting to vote by paper.

9 So during the course of this  
10 upcoming election, I'm having a hard time seeing  
11 how we would need more than one short table to  
12 accommodate those who are in a chair, and one large  
13 table at each of the polling places. Does that  
14 make sense?

15 MR. SEXTON: Well, maybe in a single  
16 precinct polling location, but, you know, you have  
17 some, you know, the attritional driving parts, rec  
18 centers that have five, six precincts in there, you  
19 have a lot more voters. I don't know if one, two  
20 per location there would do, but you would probably  
21 have to come up with a formula. Because we have,  
22 what, 800 some precincts, only 200 locations.

23 MR. SINNOTT: Good point, Mike.  
24 It's always playing out against the background, the  
25 paper ballot --

1 MS. PATTON: It deals with 600 of  
2 each size table with the privacy shields. Two  
3 privacy shields per table, which would be 2,400.

4 MR. SINNOTT: Do these have to be  
5 purchased in boxes of four, if you will?

6 MR. LEONARD: No. I got a bid from  
7 the company, directly from Lifetime, the maker of  
8 the tables, based on the figure we were talking  
9 about before, I asked how much would it be for 800  
10 tables. They gave me a cost figure of \$33 and  
11 change per table for the 800 tables. Again, we  
12 don't have to order 800 tables, we can order an  
13 amount less. If we figure out a price differential  
14 for ordering 200, 300, 500, however the Board may  
15 feel best in terms of the direction to go in this  
16 case.

17 MR. SINNOTT: Well, we would -- if  
18 we are going to spend more than twenty grand on  
19 this, wouldn't we have to make this an agenda item  
20 and have action by the members of the Board.

21 MR. LEONARD: Right now, you have  
22 given us authority to take action above \$10,000.

23 MR. SINNOTT: What up to?

24 MR. LEONARD: Up to 50, I think it  
25 was, before we have to get board approval. So



1 again --

2 MR. BUNDY: There is another option,  
3 if I may. May I speak?

4 MR. SINNOTT: Please. Go ahead.

5 MR. BUNDY: I'm with Inclusion  
6 Solutions. And obviously, we originally came here  
7 talking about a four-station booth. We think there  
8 is a lot of advantages, such as setup, no pieces to  
9 lose, ability to put up Express. It doesn't sound  
10 like that's the discussion today. Sounds like the  
11 discussions -- the Board is trying to determine  
12 what the minimal usage might be and the low-end  
13 solution to survive this election as a barometer.

14 We offered the lease option, But  
15 there is another option. Montgomery County,  
16 Pennsylvania was in line to purchase 450 of these  
17 same four-station booths. Just as Ohio,  
18 Pennsylvania is going away from paper. They asked  
19 us to come up with a low-end solution, just for  
20 this election, to allow them to gauge the use of  
21 paper. We developed a cardboard disposable -- it  
22 will probably work more than one election -- booth,  
23 ended up being about \$9.50 each. They will use it  
24 for this election as their barometer to test the  
25 use. Figure out how many are voting paper, if they

1 want to go to those, or go to the four-station, or  
2 try something else.

3 I apologize, I wasn't aware --

4 MR. LEONARD: Is it a standalone?

5 MR. BUNDY: It's a standalone.

6 MS. MARINELLO: Is it ADA enabled?

7 MR. BUNDY: What it is, is a  
8 standalone, cardboard booth. That's the same sort  
9 of corrugated cardboard, but it stands, and builds  
10 a shelf.

11 MS. MARINELLO: Can't be a very  
12 sturdy shelf, I wouldn't think.

13 MR. BUNDY: It's relatively sturdy.  
14 It's been on the market for a while. It's not  
15 something I would recommend the county keep for 10,  
16 15 years. It's sturdy enough to handle a paper  
17 election. And again, if the goal of the Board is  
18 to gauge the interest in paper, it will gauge that.

19 MS. MARINELLO: We can't predict the  
20 paper outcome, how many will show up and want  
21 paper.

22 MR. SINNOTT: We are sort of  
23 benefitted by the low turnout primary we had ahead  
24 of us. It will allow us to test the premise, that  
25 there is going to be an increase in number of

1 people asking for paper ballots. Probably also now  
2 sort of drifting into this discussion is becoming  
3 something to vote, we want to avoid that.

4 We do have a May primary coming up.  
5 Would it be -- it sounds as though we are in a  
6 structure where we would not need to convene  
7 another board meeting to vote, so long as the  
8 expenditure is 50 grand or less.

9 MR. LEONARD: Right.

10 MR. SINNOTT: Are we all in  
11 agreement with that? Having heard everything from  
12 today's discussion, what if we tasked Ed and David  
13 with developing a plan. And, of course, there will  
14 never be a time when there will be board member  
15 discussion outside of public meeting. But why  
16 don't we see a plan, in relatively short order,  
17 from the two of you on the subject, and we will try  
18 to bring resolution to this, within the Board  
19 granted spending authority of 50K in coming days.

20 MR. SEXTON: Well, if we would go  
21 with -- seems to be the staff is recommending kind  
22 of a, you know, the least amount option that we  
23 would need standing, if I'm wrong about this,  
24 coming up with a number of 1,200, you know, I don't  
25 know how that would adjust. The figure on the

1 bottom, at the last, you know, table shield, it  
2 seems like that would come down some. Whether it  
3 would come down below 50,000 or not, I am not sure.  
4 That could be -- that could be an option.

5 MR. LEONARD: It would. You are  
6 talking about a lower number. We would utilize as  
7 many of the existing low tables that we have,  
8 because we bought -- because of the price advantage  
9 we were able to get when we purchased the low  
10 tables, we were able to get a large quantity of  
11 them, more than we needed. We will utilize those  
12 as a part of this configuration. Then we are  
13 looking at buying a smaller number of high tables.

14 And then privacy booths, what we  
15 will do, we will use what we aren't deploying of  
16 those shields that go around the ExpressVotes.  
17 There is a certain number of those we will not be  
18 deploying this election cycle, we can use those for  
19 the privacy shields for the paper voting booths.

20 MR. SINNOTT: What I hear from this  
21 discussion is that there is a general interest on  
22 the part of the Board in taking an incremental  
23 approach, and a frugal one, to the May primary.  
24 And doing so, I would say spending as little money  
25 as possible in the May primary in order to see what

1 the demand is for paper ballot voting. Is that --

2 MR. SEXTON: I think we need to be  
3 adequately -- you know, we need to have the  
4 equipment adequately serviced in the upcoming  
5 primary. If staff is telling us this is the bare  
6 minimum, we know turnout will be low, but we  
7 also -- you know, strange things have happened, so.

8 MR. SINNOTT: Want to make sure the  
9 job is getting done.

10 MR. LEONARD: Exactly.

11 MR. SINNOTT: Is that enough  
12 direction from the Board?

13 MR. PAYNE: There are no more items  
14 on the Agenda, so.

15 MR. LEONARD: I do continue to work  
16 on the mailer concept for communicating information  
17 to the voters about the new voting equipment, as  
18 well as voter information. I've collected some  
19 information about what some other counties have  
20 done, and I will continue to do that.

21 MR. SINNOTT: And your work is much  
22 appreciated. And I know that some plans -- some  
23 additional time thinking about that this week, we  
24 can continue to have discussions.

25 MR. LEONARD: Particularly, trying

1 to get -- we would like to see something, when it  
2 comes to the design of the mail piece, something  
3 closer to a final form so the Board members have a  
4 better sense of what is going to be communicated so  
5 you can determine if there is a value. And what we  
6 are trying to communicate to the voters about the  
7 new equipment, as well as some of the other  
8 election information we would like to make sure  
9 people know about. And this would be mindset  
10 towards the November election, communicating  
11 information about the November election.

12 MR. SINNOTT: Thank you for your  
13 good work, Ed. A work in progress.

14 MR. LEONARD: Thank you.

15 MR. SINNOTT: I move we adjourn.

16 MS. MARINELLO: Second.

17 MR. PAYNE: All in favor, signify by  
18 saying aye.

19 MR. SINNOTT: Aye.

20 MR. SEXTON: Aye.

21 MS. MARINELLO: Aye.

22 MR. PAYNE: All opposed, same sign.

23 We are adjourned
